APPOINTMENTS. &c., BY THE GOVERNOR.

W HEREAS by Her Majesty's Instructions dated the Ninth day of May, 1890, it is provided that every person who at the time of the receipt of Her Majesty's Instructions dated the Sixth day of December, 1889, was an Unofficial Member of the Legislative Council, shall vacate his seat at the end of five years from the date of receipt of the Instructions dated the Sixth day of December, 1889, namely, from the Twenty-first day of January, 1890: And whereas by the aforesaid Instructions every such Unofficial Member is eligible to be re-appointed by the Governor for the like period of five years: It is hereby notified that, in pursuance thereof, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to re-appoint the unler-mentioned gentlemen (who have thus vacated their seats) to be Unofficial Members of the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, with effect from the Fifteenth day of February, 1895 :--

WILLIAM WILSON MITCHELL, Esq. ALEXANDER DE ALWIS SENEVIRATNE, Esq. Sir John Joseph Grinlinton, KT. Mohamed Cassim Abdul Rahiman, Esq.

The Governor wishes it to be understood, that although on this occasion he has judged that it would be advantageous to re-appoint to be Unofficial Members of the Legislative Council the PART I—Page 107 gentlemen whose names appear above, it is not intended to convey by the action now taken that re-appointment of Members who have vacated their seats after a tenure thereof of five years should always be a matter of course. His Excellency desires also that it should be understood that no personal slur is involved when the Governor, in the exercise of his discretion, may think it to be for the general interest that new blood should be infused into the Legislative Council.
