# GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

WHEREAS by the 10th section of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, intituled "An Ordinance to provide against the spread of Contagious Diseases in this Island," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time to make such regulations or orders as may be necessary and expedient to prevent the introduction or spread of infectious diseases in the Colony:

And whereas some cases of smallpox are reported to have occurred in the District of Kégalla, whereby it has become necessary that precautionary measures should be taken for securing the public health of the District:

The following regulations made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him under and by virtue of the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, and in pursuance of every other power and authority vested in him in this behalf, are published for general information: and such regulations shall have effect and operation from the date hereof.

REGULATIONS made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the 10th section of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, intituled "An Ordinance to provide against the spread of Contagious Diseases in this Island."

1. The following officers shall be deemed "authorized persons" under and for the purposes of carrying out these regulations within the District of Kégalla:—

The Government Agent of the Province.

The Assistant Government Agent of the District.

The Police Magistrate,

The Chairman of the Board of Health (if any), or, in his absence, the Secretary of the Board of Health (if any).

Any Medical Officer of the District.

- 2. It shall be lawful for any authorized person to cause persons infected with cholera, small-pox, chickenpox, or other infectious or contagious disease in any house or place hereunder described to be removed to some public hospital or other place provided by Government:—
  - (1) In any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale.

(2) In any house or place of public resort.

(3) In any building in which there are no means of isolating the patients from the other inmates, or in any building where the retention of the patient is likely to prove a source of danger to others.

Provided that it shall be competent for any such authorized person as aforesaid, in case the removal of any person so infected in any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale is objected to, and the house or place is not otherwise open to objection, to allow the patient to be retained, on condition, however, that the sale of goods shall not be carried on in such house or place during such time as any person shall remain so infected in such house or place.

Provided further, that it shall be lawful for any such authorized person as aforesaid to allow any patient to be removed to any locality which such patient or his or her friends may choose, and to which the medical authorities of the town or place, if any, do not object, instead of to the public hospital or place provided by Government.

- 3. Except as provided by these regulations, and except as provided by the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, it shall not be lawful for any person to remove or assist in removing any person suffering from cholera, smallpox, chickenpox, or other infectious or contagious disease from the house or place in which such person shall be to any other house or place, without the sanction in writing of some duly authorized person.
- 4. It shall be lawful for any authorized person to prohibit the removal from any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale, or from any house or place of public resort, or from any building in which cholera, smallpox, chickenpox, or other infectious or contagious disease may have occurred, of any articles of merchandise or trade, or goods of any kind, until such time as such

building or place is declared to be free from infection by the medical authorities of the town or place in which such building is situated.

Provided that it shall be lawful for such authorized person, acting as aforesaid, to permit any goods from an infected house or place in which goods are exposed for sale, or from any house or place of public resort, or from any building in which cholera, smallpox, chickenpox, or other infectious or contagious disease may have occurred, to be removed to any other locality which the owner or occupier of such building may choose, and to which removal the medical authorities of the town or place do not object.

- 5. It shall be lawful for any authorized person to prohibit the removal for interment of the corpses of persons who have died of any contagious disease along any particular thoroughfare, and to prescribe the thoroughfares leading to the place of interment along which such corpses shall be carried. Information of such prohibition shall be given by notice in writing under the hand of some authorized person, which shall be posted in two or more conspicuous places in the prohibited thoroughfare, and by publication in such other way as may be deemed necessary by such authorized person.
- 6. These regulations shall come into operation on this date, and shall continue in force until May 13, 1895, or to such other time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall extend the same.

## SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH ENDED JANUARY 31, 1895.

#### CENTRAL PROVINCE.

#### KANDY DISTRICT.

Maha paddy being transplanted or blossoming or ripening: crop fair, except in Harispattu and Pata Hewaheta, where prospects are good.

Dry grains: maha blossoming or ripening or harvested; crop fair, except in Pata Hewaheta, where prospects are good, and in Udunuwara, where prospects are bad, being damaged by drought and by flies.

Reinfall generally sufficient

Rainfall generally sufficient. Prices: paddy per bushel Re. 1.50, kurakkan per bushal Re. 1.25 to Re. 1.50, cocoanuts per 100 Rs. 3 to Rs. 6.

#### NORTHERN PROVINCE.

### MANNAR DISTRICT.

In the villages in Mantai division, where paddy (maha) was cultivated, the crops are about two-thirds good, and the paddy has commenced to ripen.

In Muchali and Nanaddan pattus there will be no crop except in one or two villages.

Dry grain cultivation in Mannar island and on the mainland is generally good.

The crops in Mannar island have been reaped, and are being threshed. Those on the mainland are now

being reaped. Paddy sells at Re. 1.75 per bushel; kurakkan at Re. 1.25 per bushel. Rainfall in January 1.53 in. Health of cattle good.

#### NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

#### PUTTALAM DISTRICT.

Maha paddy crop: early sowings earing, late sowings in young plants; prospects good and fair. Early sowings of kurakkan ripened and are being gathered in; late sowings maturing; crop very good and fair.

## NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

EALED Tenders (in duplicate), marked on the envelopes "Tender for provisioning Hospitals," will be received by the Hon. the Colonial Secretary at his Office up to 12 noon on Monday, February 25, 1895, from persons willing to contract for supplying raw provisions to the under-mentioned Government Lunatic Asylum in Colombo commencing from date of acceptance of tender till December 31, 1895 :-

> Security in Cash.

Lunatic Asylum, Jawatta, including Rs. House of Observation, Borella 2,000

The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form, and unless accompained by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given. engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

3. Every tenderer will be required to make a deposit (on applying for forms) of Rs. 100, and should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned after the contract has been signed. deposit must be made at the Treasury, and the deposit receipt must be produced to the officer issuing the form as his authority for making the issue.

4. Provisions should be of the best quality, approvable by the Medical Officer of the hospital, and samples must

be deposited when required.

5. The successful tenderers will be required to give cash security as given opposite the name of the station, and it will be optional for them to allow the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals to deduct the amount in three equal monthly instalments from their first dues. They will also be required to sign the bond given in the tender for the due fulfilment of the contract.

6. Every alteration in the tender should bear the initials of the tenderers; all tenders containing alterations not bearing the tenderers' initials will be treated as informal and rejected.

7. Any further information can be obtained on application to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals.

8. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.
