## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, December 15, 1894, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

Present :--Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman ; Dr. Fred. Keyt ; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; J. N. d'Esterre, Esq.; Barnes de Alwis, Esq.; Dr. J. T. Morgan.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 17 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table :--General Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on The following documents were laid on the table :--General Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund; also separate Statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1893 to November 30, 1894; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of November, and also Health Officer's Report.
 Resolved,--That the several statements be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, and also Health Officer's report.
 3. Read letters dated November 27 and December 7 from the Deputy Assistant Adjutant-General (b) on the subject of the supply of water to the Baracks in Kandy.
 Resolved.--That till the working of the two meters be more fully tested, the consideration of the subject remain

Resolved,-That till the working of the two meters be more fully tested, the consideration of the subject remain over; that the Deputy Assistant Adjutant-General be informed that as regards the consumption of water in the past the Council waive all claim for any excess.

4. Considered the following recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the extension of the water-rate limits to the south, so as to include Deyannewela :

"Resolved,-That the Standing Committee recommend that the Government be asked to alter the southern limits of the present water-rate limits as fixed by the schedule of Ordinance No. 29 of 1884, by amendment of the said schedule so as to include Deyannewela within the water-rate limits, it being considered advisable to do so on sanitary grounds."

Resolved unanimously, on motion of the Chairman, that the recommendation be adopted, and that application be made to Government for the amendment of the schedule of Ordinance No. 29 of 1884.

5. Read the following recommendation of the Standing Committee in respect to the charge for water used in private premises in excess of the allowance :--

"It was resolved that it be recommended to the Council to reduce the charge as fixed by the resolution of September 18, 1880, to 50 cents per 1,000 gallons, so as to approximate the charge to the rate charged for water supplied to premises on which no water-rate is payable."

Resolved,-That as recommended, the charge for water so used be reduced to 50 cents per 1,000 gallons.

Read letter No. 32, dated November 27, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of a report by the Special Committee of the Ceylon National Association on the proposed amendment of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance.

Resolved, on motion of the Chairman, that the report be referred to a Special Committee consisting of Messrs. J. B. Siebel, J. H. Sproule, E. Beven, and Dr. J. T. Morgan.

Considered recommendation of the Standing Committee, and resolved that Mr. G. Poulier's salary be 7. increased by Rs. 10 per month from January 1, 1895, and that the amount be included in the Budget for that year.

Read letter No. 790, dated December 10, from the District Engineer, stating that the reconstruction of the 8 drain at the southern end of Trincomalee street is now being carried out, that there are numerous encroachments on the pavement, owing to the construction of steps; and requesting authority to remove all such encroachments as are necessary, and that the owners of the premises be required to provide approaches to their houses within the boundaries of their own land.

Resolved,-That the District Engineer be authorized to remove all such encroachments as he mentions on the pavements in the locality mentioned.

Confirmed this 16th day of January, 1895.

The expenditure, estimated at Rs. 62,470:57, would have to be increased by Rs. 60, increase granted to Mr Berlin to the Dr. 60:500 for the sum of the s
