## LOCAL BOARD NOTICES.

THE following by-laws for the management of the public slaughter-house at Negombo, framed by the Local Board of that town, and confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, are published for general information.

*By-laws referred to.*

1. No licensed butcher shall slaughter any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs within the limits of the Local Board, except at the public slaughter-house.
2. The place appointed under section 12 for exposure of cattle about to be slaughtered shall be the pound adjoining the Local Board Store.
3. A register shall be kept (in the form annexed) by the Inspector of Nuisances, who shall inspect all animals exposed before slaughter, and the same shall be submitted weekly to the Chairman, or, in his absence, to the Medical Officer or some other Member of the Board.
4. It shall not be lawful for any person to sell or expose for sale within the Local Board limits the flesh of any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs slaughtered outside the Local Board limits without the same having been previously inspected and passed as fit for human food by the Inspector of Nuisances or the Medical Officer.

5. It shall be lawful for the Local Board to levy the under-mentioned fees in connection with the public slaughter-house :—

For housing cattle brought for slaughter	...	...	6 cents a day
For housing sheep or goats brought for slaughter	...	...	3 do.
For using slaughter-house	Rs. 5 a month, or	25 cents per head.

## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

**Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Kachcheri on Wednesday, January 16, 1895, at 3 o'clock p.m.**

*Present:*—The Hon Allanson Bailey, Chairman ; J. B. Siebel, Esq. ; J. H. Sproule, Esq. ; E. Beven, Esq. ; B. de Alwis, Esq. ; Dr. J. T. Morgan.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Regular and Special Meetings held on December 15, 1894, were read and confirmed.

2. Read letter No. 1 dated January 5 from the Colonial Secretary, acknowledging the receipt of the Chairman's letter No. 76 of December 20, applying for the extension of the water-rate limits, so as to include Deyannewela in accordance with the resolution of the Council at their Meeting on December 15, and requiring certain information. Read memorandum by the Secretary submitting the information asked for.

Resolved unanimously, on motion of the Chairman, that a reply be sent to the Colonial Secretary in terms of the memorandum submitted.

3. The Chairman submitted Supplemental Budget No. 5, which had obtained the approval of the Standing Committee, and a copy furnished to each Member as required by section 113.

It was unanimously resolved that the Supplemental Budget No. 5 be sanctioned as follows :—
