Gulf of Tokyo.—Passage between Hasiri Mizu and Third Fort closed to Navigation.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 34 of 1895) that vessels are prohibited from passing between Hasiri Mizu (Hashiririmidzu) point and fort No. 3 (Daisan Kaiho) to the northward of that point.

Approximate position on chart No. 2,657, fort No. 3, lat. 35° 17′ 10″ N., long. 139° 43′ 35″ E.

Gulf of Aden-Berbera.-Alterations in Lights.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 39 of 1894) that an additional light would be exhibited at Berbera on December 1, 1894, forming with the old one leading lights to the anchorage.

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The front light is a fixed red light, visible from a distance of 6 miles, shown from the red roof of a house, and is in the same position on the chart as now marked.

Approximate position: lat. 10° 26′ 45″ N., long. 45° 0′ 55′ E.

The additional (rear) light is a fixed red light, visible from a distance of 6 miles, shown from a red framework above one of the highest houses, and situated N. 77° E.,

about 300 yards from the front light.

The above lights in line, bearing N. 77° E., lead in the the fairway up the harbour to the anchorage. Variation, 4° westerly in 1895.

The Officer in charge of the Marine Survey of India has given notice that until the end of April a number of buoys will be laid for the purposes of the marine survey on and in the neighbourhood of the banks between the north coast of Ceylon and Point Calimere. The buoys are marked with flags 20 to 30 ft. high, and are moved about
