8. Any alterations made in the tender should bear the initials of the tenderers, and all tenders containing alterations not bearing the tenderers' initials will be treated as informal and rejected.

Persons whose tenders are accepted by Government will be required to bear the expense of having security bonds prepared for the due fulfilment of their contract. which bonds will be subject to the approval of the Attorney-General, together with a fee of Rs. 10-50, to be paid by the tenderer, but the bonds may be drawn by the tenderers' own lawyers, and when bonds have been drawn by the tenderers' own lawyer, the name or stamp of the Proctor who drafted the bond should be affixed to the document.
