PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir Joseph West Ridgeway, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

"West Ridgeway.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 1st day of February, 1886, the Central Province of this Island was divided for revenue and administrative purposes into two distinct Provinces, one of which was called the Province of Uva, and it was appointed that the said Province of Uva should consist of certain districts:

And whereas it is expedient to alter and re-define for revenue and administrative purposes the districts of Buttala and Wellawaya, being two of the districts in the said Province of Uva:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and appoint that from and after the 1st day of June, 1896, so much of the Wellawaya district in the Province of Uva, as lies to the east of the Menik-ganga, shall be transferred to the district of Buttala, bounded as follows:—

North by the southern boundaries of Gampaha and Buttala kóralés.

North-east by the Kumbukkan-oya.

South-east by the boundary between the Southern Province and the Province of Uva. West by Menik-ganga.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Fifteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-six.

(4) Conversation and interpretation between an Englishman and a native of Ceylon, either Sinhalese or Tamil.

(Special marks will be (5) Shorthand-writing. awarded for a competent knowledge of this subject.)

Candidates who fail to satisfy the Examiners in sections (1) and (2) will be ineligible for the remainder of the examination.

All candidates must apply for certificates of admission to the examination on printed forms, which will be supplied by the Director of Public Instruction. These supplied by the Director of Public Instruction. These forms must be filled up and forwarded by the candidates so as to reach the Director of Public Instruction not later than noon of Wednesday, June 10.

Candidates not already in the Railway Service must be between the ages of 18 and 25. They should forward to the Director of Public Instruction, with their application forms

(1) Certificates of the registration of their birth (affidavits will not be accepted), showing them to be between the ages of 18 and 25 on

June 29. (2) Certificates of good character signed by the candidates' Teachers or Schoolmasters by preference, or a Member of the Public Service,
