## PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir JOSEPH WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

✓ **W**HEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1894 it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in that behalf made, to bring any Court of Justice in the Island under the operation of the said Ordinance, and such Proclamation to amend, alter, or revoke as and whenever the said Governor shall, with the like advice, determine:

And whereas it is expedient to bring the District Court, Court of Requests, and Police Court of Kégalla under the operation of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation bring the District Court, Court of Requests, and Police Court of Kégalla under the operation of the said Ordinance No. 12 of 1894, intituled "An Ordinance to authorize the destruction of valueless Documents preserved in Courts of Justice," as from and after the 15th day of June, 1896.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-second day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-six.

## GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE following rule, amending rule 10 of the rules published for general information in the *Government Gazette* of December 4, 1891, made by the Commissioners of the Loan Board under the provisions of section 10 of "The Loan Board Ordinance, 1865," and approved by the Governor in Executive Council, is published for general information.

*Rule referred to.*

10. (a) No larger amount than one-half of the appraised value shall be lent on the mortgage of any property, and no mortgage except a primary mortgage shall be accepted.

(b) The rate of interest to be charged on such loans shall be not less than five per cent. per annum in respect of property situated within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo.

(c) The rate of interest to be charged on such loans shall usually be seven per cent. per annum in respect of all other property. But the Commissioners may in their discretion in exceptional cases (depending upon the value of the property mortgaged with reference to the amount of the loan asked for) reduce the rate of interest to six or five per centum per annum.

### Railway Probationers' Examination.

**NOTICE** is hereby given that an Examination for the admission of Probationers into the Railway Service will be held at the Colombo School of Agriculture on June 29 and 30 next, commencing at 11 A.M.

A fee of Rs. 2.50 must be paid by candidates who present themselves for examination if not already in the Railway Service. This fee must be paid in revenue stamps, to be affixed to each application for leave to undergo the examination.

The examination will consist of—

- (1) English Dictation and Handwriting.
- (2) Arithmetic.
- (3) A General Paper to test the knowledge of the English Language.
- (4) Conversation and interpretation between an Englishman and a native of Ceylon, either Sinhalese or Tamil.
- (5) Shorthand-writing. (Special marks will be awarded for a competent knowledge of this subject.)

Candidates who fail to satisfy the Examiners in sections (1) and (2) will be ineligible for the remainder of the examination.

All candidates must apply for certificates of admission to the examination on printed forms, which will be supplied by the Director of Public Instruction. These forms must be filled up and forwarded by the candidates so as to reach the Director of Public Instruction not later than noon of Wednesday, June 10.

Candidates not already in the Railway Service must be between the ages of 18 and 25. They should forward to the Director of Public Instruction, with their application forms—

- (1) Certificates of the registration of their birth (affidavits will not be accepted), showing them to be between the ages of 18 and 25 on June 29.
- (2) Certificates of good character signed by the candidates' Teachers or Schoolmasters by preference, or a Member of the Public Service, Justice of the Peace, or Minister of religion.

When the results of the examination are made known, the successful candidates must present themselves at the office of the Principal Civil Medical Officer for examination as to physical fitness.

Results of METEOROLOGICAL OBSERVATIONS in Ceylon during the Month of January, 1896.
