#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir Joseph West Ridgeway, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 1 of "The Muhammadan Marriage Registration Ordinance, 1886," it is enacted that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in such district or respective districts as shall be defined, and at such time or respective times as shall be appointed, by the Governor in Executive-Council, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Ordinance should come into operation in the districts defined in the schedule hereto, as from and after the date hereinafter mentioned:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor in Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation appoint that the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1886, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the registration of Muhammadan Marriages contracted in this Colony," shall come into operation in the districts defined in the schedule hereto as from and after the 1st day of July, 1896.

Given at Badulla, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-six.

## ABSTRACT OF SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 1896.

## WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: sowing for yala was almost completed. Fields sown early in the season show signs of bearing fairly good crops.

Dry grain: what little kurakkan cultivation there is promises well.

Other products: the supply of vegetables and fruit was plentiful, and prices were reasonable. Prices of staple products: rice, from Rs. 3 to 4 a bushel; cocoanuts, from Rs. 30 to Rs. 36 a thousand.

Rainfall: a few good showers of rain fell early in the month, but the weather generally was dry, though some heavy showers fell again towards the close of the month.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: the rains, though late, have benefited cultivation generally, and a good yala harvest may be expected.

NEGOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: the usual agricultural operations for the yala season in the Hapitigam korale and in Alutkuru korale north have been successfully carried on.

Dry grain: chenas are being sown

Other products: fruit and vegetables are scarce.

Prices of staple products: rice, from Rs. 3.50 to Rs. 4.25 per bushel; cocoanuts, from Rs. 30 to Rs. 35 a thousand.

Rainfall: there were a few good showers during the month.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: the yala harvest at present promises to be good.

#### KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy, yala harvest: the condition of the plants is said to be good in every part of the district.

Other products: fruit and vegetables are abundant in Rayigam korale, but scarce in other parts of the district. Prices of staple products: imported rice, Rs. 3 to Rs. 4 per bushel; country-grown rice, Rs. 3 to Rs. 4 per bushel; coccanuts, Rs. 30 to Rs. 40 per 1,000.

Rainfall: moderate.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: good.

#### CENTRAL PROVINCE.

#### KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy, maha: the crops in Pata Dumbara and Uda Dumbara are being harvested, and in other divisions harvesting is over.

Crop: fair.

Yala: paddy in the fields in Udunuwara, Yatinuwara, Pata Dumbara, and Harispattu is being transplanted; in Tumpane and Uda Dumbara fields are being ploughed and sown; and in Udapalata being weeded.

Crop or prospects of crop: too early to form an opinion.

Dry grain, maha: hill paddy chenas in Tumpane are being cleared. In Udunuwara, Yatinuwara, and Udapalata sowing of kurakkan is over. The chenas in Pata Dumbara and Uda Bulatgama are being cleared for kurakkan. cultivation.

Crop or prospects of crop: too early to form an opinion.

Rainfall: sufficient in Yatinuwara, Tumpane, Udapalata, and Uda Bulatgama, and in other divisions insufficient.

Prices: paddy, Re. 1.50 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1.25 per bushel; cocoanuts, Rs. 50 per 1,000.

#### MATALE DISTRICT.

Matale South.

The rainfall recorded for the month at Matale is 1.91 in. The yala cultivation has rapidly extended, and the prospects are promising.

Matale North.

The yala cultivation is better than that of last year. The tanks in Inamaluwa are partly filled. The cultivation under them is very satisfactory. The people have begun to cultivate kanata lands with fine grains, for which the present weather is favourable. The rainfall recorded at Dambulla is 4.73 in. A 1\*

#### Matale East.

The yala cultivation in Gangala korales, where the fields are irrigated by rivers, is fine, and promises a good outturn. The clearing of chenas for kurakkan and hill paddy has begun.

#### NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Paddy: no work in paddy fields. Walapane—paddy ready for harvest!; a full crop is expected. Uda Hewa-Gannewa, Diyatilaka, and Gangapalata korales harvested; Kohoka and Maturata korales ready for harvest,

Dry grain: Kotmale—chenas being cleared. Walapane and Uda Hewaheta—no work on chenas; crops recently harvested in excellent condition.

Rain: dry throughout the district.

Fruits and vegetables: good supply of vegetables but very little fruit.

Prices of staple articles: paddy, Re. 1.25 to Re. 1.50 a bushel; kurakkan and Indian corn, Re. 1 to Re. 1.25 a bushel; cocoanuts, Rs. 7 to Rs. 8 a hundred.

Health: chickenpox prevails in Kotmale and Uda Hewaheta, measles in Nuwara Eliya. Health of cattle: hoof disease still prevails in Walapane.

#### NORTHERN PROVINCE.

#### JAFFNA DISTRICT.

Weather: there was a drizzle in portions of the district on the 3rd, 10th, and 17th of the month, the quantity of rainfall shown by the return furnished by the Public Works Department being 37 in. The regular south west monsoon set in during the month.

Paddy: lands are being manured and ploughed.

Dry grain crop: the harvesting of ellu, payaru, and kurakkan is over; the outturn is not satisfactory for want of rain. Thinai and sami are being raised in some parts.

Tobacco: the crop has already been harvested. There is a fall in the price of tobacco, as compared with last

year. The quality of the crop has been somewhat affected by the want of sufficient rain.

Prices of grain: paddy, Re. 1.50 per bushel; varaku, Re. 1.25 per bushel; chamy, Re. 1.50 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1.50 per bushel; payaru, Rs. 3.50 per bushel; uluntu, Rs. 4 per bushel; lellu, Rs. 4.50 per bushel; kollu, Rs. 2.25

## MANNAR DISTRICT.

Rainfall: no rain fell during the month.

State of crops: paddy stacks being threshed in some villages. Fields are being manured for the next kalapokam. A small extent sown for sirupokam under Akattimurippu tank doing well.

Prices of grain, &c.: paddy Re. 1 to Re. 1.25 per bushel; rice, Rs. 3 to Rs. 3.50; kurakkan, 87½ cents to Re. 1 per bushel; tobacco, Rs. 6 to Rs. 15 per 100 leaves.

#### VAVUNIYA DISTRICT.

There were two or three good showers of rain at the early part of the month in Vavuniya and Melpattu Rainfall registered at Vavuniya 3.65 in.

The kalapokam crop is being threshed. The prospects of idaipokam cultivation very good, except in Panan-

kamam, where the crop is likely to fail for want of water. Sirupokam cultivation in progress in some villages.

Prices: paddy, Re. 1 12 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1 per bushel; rice, Rs. 3 per bushel.

Health of people satisfactory, except in Kilakkumalai, where fever prevails to a great extent.

Cattle disease: a case of murrain is reported in Sinnacheddiknlam east. The disease has died out in other places.

#### MULLAITTIVU DISTRICT.

Paddy: threshing going on, and sowing for chirupokam has commenced.

Tobacco: cutting and curing nearly finished.

Prices of articles: paddy, Re. 1.25 per bushel; rice, Rs. 3 per bushel; kurukkan, Re. 1 per bushel; varaku, 75 cents per bushel; ellu, Rs. 4 per bushel; uluntu, Rs. 3.50 per bushel; payaru, Rs. 4 per bushel.

Weather: there was good rain during the early part of the month. South-west monsoon has fairly set in.

Cattle murrain is reported to have broken out in Tunukkai.

Health of people good.

## SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

#### GALLE DISTRICT.

Paddy and dry grain, yala: the condition of the crops is good. Crop raised during the month in the low-lying lands of the interior divisions of Bentota-Walallawiti korale has been greatly damaged by floods.

Miscellaneous: jak, breadfruit, plantain, and all vegetables are abundant. Cocoanut crop is plentiful, and

price per 1,000 nuts is Rs. 25.

Prices of staple food: rice, from Rs. 3 to Rs. 3.50 per bushel; paddy, Re. 1.50 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 2 per bushel; amu, Re. 1.25. per bushel. Rainfall: 16.56 in.

Health: dysentery, fever, and influenza have prevailed in both the Wellaboda and Talpe pattus, and several cases of dysentery in the former pattu have proved fatal. In the latter pattu a case of smallpox is reported to have occurred three days ago.

Cattle: free from disease.

#### MATARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: good. Dry grain: good.

The crop prospects are reported good owing to seasonable rains.

Prices: paddy and fine grain, Re. 1.50 per bushel.

#### HAMBANTOTA DISTRICT.

#### West Giruwa Pattu.

Second maha crop has been reaped. A fair extent sown and being sown for yala. Prospects of irrigated lands Fine grain doing well. Vegetables: jakfruit and sweet potatoes plentiful; cocoanuts have suffered from drought.

#### East Giruwa Pattu.

A good second maha being reaped under Liyangaha-ela. A small extent sown for yala. Want of water much felt Scarcity in Paranagampalata and Wewgampalata, where people eke out their subsistence with milk and jakfruit.

#### Magam Pattu.

Maha crops reaped and threshed. Sowing for yala nearly finished. Scarcity is felt in inland villages. Rainfall: hardly any.

Health: good in Magam pattu. A good deal of cold and fever in Giruwa pattu. Cattle: healthy.

Prices of articles: paddy; Re. 1.25 to Re. 1.50 per bushel; rice, Rs. 3 to Rs. 4 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1 to Re. 1.25 per bushel; Indian corn, 75 cents per 100 pods; sweet potatoes, 62½ cents per cwt.

#### EASTERN PROVINCE.

#### BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

Paddy: munmari crop being threshed; pinmari crop in ear. Not short of water, but is likely to be damaged by blight.

Price: paddy, Re. 1.25 a bushel. This is high price here at harvest time, and caused chiefly by competition between Jaffna traders and Mr. Le Mesurier, who buys up a large supply for the steam rice mill be started here.

Rainfall: 4.10 in.

Health: health of the people and cattle good.
Other vegetable products of food supply are getting rare owing to the dry weather.

#### TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

Rainfall: 2.47 in.

Paddy: plants of the pinmari cultivation look healthy. The munmari paddy is being threshed, and the yield is fair, except in some parts of the Kottiar pattu.

Dry grain: the crops have been harvested, and the return is reported fair.

Tobacco: the crops have been harvested and cured; the yield is satisfactory. Cassava: the cultivation looks fair.

Fisheries: fishermen from Negombo have arrived and commenced operations.

Prices of staple articles: paddy, Re. 1·12 per bushel; rice, Rs. 2·75 per bushel; dry grain, Re. 1·75 per bushel; cassava, 2 cents per lb.

## NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

### KURUNEGALA DISTRICT.-Report not received.

#### PUTTALAM DISTRICT.

Paddy: in Puttalam, Rajakumarawanni pattu, Demala hatpattu, and Pomarippu pattu, no cultivation has been carried on for the present yala for want of rain and insufficiency of water in tanks. In Akkarai pattu south there are young crops in some villages, and in others no cultivation for want of rain.

Fine grain: in Demala hatpattu the meneri crops are failing for want of rain. Gingelly crops fairly thriving. In Puttalam, Akkarai pattu, and Rajakumarawanni pattu there are young crops. No chenas in Kalpitiya division. Staple products: rice, from Rs. 3 to Rs. 3:50 per bushel; coccanuts Rs. 4 to Rs. 4:50 per 100.

Rainfall: weather has been dry and boisterous, but little rain has fallen. The record for the month was 5:19 in.

#### CHILAW DISTRICT.

#### Pitigal Korale.

Northern Division.—The paddy crop which had been reaped and stacked is being threshed. Fine grain, such as mun and meneri, is being sown

Central Division.—650 bushels of paddy and 73 of fine grain have been sown during the month, of which about 14 bushels have suffered from want of water. Both paddy and fine grain are much affected by the want of rain. Southern Division.—Only 30 bushels of paddy and 38 of fine grain have been sown during the month. Further sowing has been prevented by the insufficient rainfall, and the growing paddy suffers from the same cause.

#### NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

The rainfall for the month registered at Anuradhapura was 3.97 in. Meda crops have been reaped in all the divisions, except Nuwaragampalata, where it is still going on. Yala crops are at various stages of growth. In some villages yala cultivation has just commenced.

Gingelly crops are thriving Tanks are more or less half full.

Cattle murrain is still prevailing in Nuwaragampalata.

Health of the people is fairly good.

#### PROVINCE OF UVA.

Yatikinda: paddy plants thriving well, and crop prospects good. Fruit and vegetables scarce. Weather dry, with a few showers at distant intervals. Health of people and cattle good.

Udukinda: Paddy plants thriving well, and crop prospects good. Kollu plants on high land suffered from drought, and crop prospects consequently bad. Fruit and vegetables scarce owing to high wind. Weather, dry. Health of people good. Foot-and mouth disease amongst cattle in Gampaha korale.

Wellassa: paddy grop ripening and prospects good. Fruit and receive bles plostiful and cheep. Weether dry.

Wellassa: paddy crop ripening, and prospects good. Fruit and vegetables plentiful and cheap. Weather, dry. Health of cattle good. Fever and colds prevalent.

Buttala: paddy crop ripening, and prospects good. Fruit and vegetables scarce. Weather dry, with occasiona rs. Health of people and cattle good.

Viyaluwa: paddy crop ready for harvesting, and prospects good. Paddy plants sown for yala thriving well.

Fruit and vegetables scarce. Weather, dry. Hoof disease amongst cattle. Fever and dysentery prevalent.

Bintenna: paddy crop ripe and ready for harvesting; crop prospects good. Fruit and vegetables scarce.

Weather, dry. Health of cattle and people good. Sore-eyes prevalent.

Wellawaya: paddy crop ready for harvesting, and prospects good. Fruit and vegetables scarce. Weather dry. Health of cattle good. Fever and colds prevalent.

## PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

#### RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy: the second maha crops are being harvested in favourable weather; crops satisfactory. Yala fields have been sown, and the plants in Kukulu korale are half grown. The cultivation for the first maha is commencing.

Fine grain: yala chenas and owitas have been sown, and the chenas for maha are being cleared.

Health: no cattle disease has been reported. Diarrheea and dysentery prevail in parts of Meda and Kadawatu korales, otherwise the health of the people is good.

#### KEGALLA DISTRICT.

Paddy, yala: cultivation is in progress.

Dry grain: chenas are being cleared for the cultivation of hill paddy and kurakkan. Gingelly sown in Beligal

korale is thriving well.

Prices: paddy, Re. 1·25 per bushel; hill paddy, Re. 1 per bushel; kurakkan, 75 cents to 87 cents per bushel; amu, 62 cents to 75 cents per bushel; mun, Rs. 3 to Rs. 3·25 per bushel; meneri, 87 cents per bushel; gingelly, Rs. 3·50 per bushel; tana, Re. 1·25 per bushel.

Rainfall: registered at Ambanpitiya, 9 in.; Ruanwella, 12·12 in.
Cattle disease: murrain has occurred at Yatalawala in Gandolaha pattu of Beligal korale. Five new cases were reported during the month, all of which proved fatal. Every precaution is being taken to prevent the spread of the disease. Foot and mouth disease reported from parts of Mawata pattu in Paranakuru korale and in Galboda and Kinigoda korales.

Health of the people is generally good. The fever season has been less deadly than any year for five

years past.
