India, West-Sind Coast-Hajamro Beacon washed away; temporary Beacon erected.

The Bombay Government has given notice (No. 33 of 1900) that information, dated March 16, 1900, has been received from the Port Officer, Karachi, that the Hajamro beacon on the bank of the Indus has been washed away, and that a temporary beacon, consisting of a single spar, 38 ft. high, has been erected about one mile inland and three miles south of the original beacon site.

Eastern Archipelago—Borneo North-West Coast.

(1) Gaya Harbour Reef in the Approch to.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 127 of 1900) of the existence of a reef of small extent, awash at low water, in the approach to Gaya harbour : it is situated with the outer Plompong island bearing N. 56° W., distant 9 cables, and Snake rock S. 45° W.
