MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on April 28, 1900, at 1.45 p.m.

Present :—The Chairman ; E. Venning, Esq. ; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz ; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq. ; D. G. Goonewardene, Esq. ; and Dr. E. Ludovici.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on March 10 last.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Anthonisz put the following questions :—

(a) How long has the Mahamodara iron bridge been out of repair, and when is it likely to be built for heavy traffic as before ?

In reply the Chairman read letter from the Provincial Engineer, dated April 19, No. 102, in which it was stated that the bridge showed signs of decay many years ago, and that this state of things became so bad three years ago that it was determined to replace the bridge by a new structure. A vote was taken in the Supply Bill this year on account of the cost of rebuilding the Gintota as well as the other three bridges from Bentota southwards, and the Gintota bridge will be taken on hand when the two bridges at Bentota had been completed.

(b) How often have the side drains in Church street and Leyn Baan street, where the Moorish community live, been flushed during last year, and when were they flushed last ?

The Chairman replied that the Inspector of the ward report that he is unable to state how often these drains were flushed last year, as he took charge of the ward in September last, and that they were last flushed on April 16.

(c) Is it a desirable practice to remove the refuse and mud of drains and place them on the side of the road for hours to be acted upon by sunlight, instead of carting them at once ? Where is the difficulty of emptying the mud at once into a cart ?

The Chairman replied that he thought the practice objectionable, and that he will call the attention of the Inspector.

(d) As disinfecting is better done by responsible Municipal officers instead of trusting to irresponsible householders, would it not be desirable that all cesspits in the Fort be disinfected once a week by a Municipal officer with some disinfectant and a small quantity of kerosine oil to kill the grubs of mosquitoes ?

The Chairman replied that he will ask the Head Inspector to report whether it is practicable to carry out the suggestion.

(e) According to the Venice Conference, are ten days' segregation made on shore of all lascars or native crews shipped from Bombay, an infected port, in P. & O. and other steamers ? The P. & O. steamers more than once carried plague in them.

In reply the Chairman read letter from the Plague Committee, dated March 13 last, No. 56, stating that so far as is known persons embarking at infected ports are not kept under observation for ten days previous to embarkation, and that they are subjected to a rigid medical examination at all infected ports of India before being allowed to embark.

(f) Would it be desirable to request Government to ascertain from authorities of infected ports when persons leave the port, whether they had had the plague and have recovered from it, in order that the officers of the port of arrival of such vessels may be informed of this to enable them to have a bacterial examination made to know if the persons carry the germs of disease, as it has been stated by Dr. Haffkin that persons who have quite recovered from plague and although free from it may have the germs of disease in them, and thereby be the means of spreading the contagion ?

The Chairman replied that he was of opinion that it is desirable to obtain the information sought, and suggested that Dr. Anthonisz do put his question in to form a motion requesting Government to furnish it.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Ludovici asked—What steps the Fort Inspector has taken with regard to the ruinous and dangerous building in Rampart street, at one time used as the Mahinda College ?

The Chairman replied that notice was served on the owner on June 6, 1899, to take down or secure the house, and portions that were dangerous were removed. Notice was again issued on the 26th instant.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Ludovici submitted a letter from Rev. M. J. Burrows regarding the playing of golf in the Victoria park and esplanade, and moved that it be read and considered.

Seconded by Mr. D. G. Goonewardene.

Resolved,—That the Secretary report to the next Meeting of Council whether there are any regulations in regard to the playing of golf at the esplanade and park.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Ludovici submitted a letter from the Moor residents of the Fort regarding the proposed new roads in the Fort, and moved that it be read and considered.

Seconded by Mr. D. G. Goonewardene.

The petition was accordingly read, and it was resolved,—That the scheme sanctioned by the Council cannot be deferred as requested, but on application at this office any information required may be obtained.

6. Submitted letter from the Assistant Superintendent of Police, dated April 7, 1900, No. 3,806, giving a list of beats within the police limits, and statements from the Secretary giving (1) estimated amount of assessment tax for maintenance of police for the year 1900 to be levied in each ward ; and (2) the relative expenditure for each ward.
