MINUTE BY THE GOVERNOR.

IT is hereby notified that the following rules for the regulation of the payment by the Government of the reasonable expenses of complainants and witnesses attending for the purposes of any inquiry, trial, or other proceeding before the Supreme Court, have been made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 502 of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1883 :—

1. Complainants and witnesses who attend the Supreme Court from a distance of more than ten miles shall be entitled to payment of batta and travelling allowances; those residing in the Western, North-Western, Southern, Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, according to the rates set out in Schedule A; and those residing in the Northern, Eastern, and North-Central Provinces according to the scale prescribed in Schedule B.

2. In calculating batta payable to complainants and witnesses who are not entitled to mileage, one day's batta shall be allowed for every ten miles fully completed and travelled; provided the journey is not performed by public conveyance or otherwise paid for.

3. The travelling allowances of Jurors residing at a distance of more than five miles from the Sessions town shall be regulated by this Notification, and the lowest rates of batta and travelling allowance payable to them shall be those prescribed in Class IV. of the Schedule.

4. Planters and superintendents of estates (Europeans and respectable descendants of Europeans) and native planters, proprietors, and superintendents of estates of not less than 150 acres

in extent in cultivation, residing more than ten miles from the Sessions town, shall be entitled to a special rate of batta of Rs. 7.50 per day.

5. No batta is payable either to Witnesses or Jurors for days on which mileage is drawn. The rules published by Minute of August 26, 1898, are hereby cancelled.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things provided that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by as Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance for each of the said Circuits into which the Island is divided for the purposes of the administration of justice, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Midland Circuit three times at least at Kandy and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Kandy on the 10th day of March, 1st day of August, and 1st day of December in every year:

And whereas by the said Ordinance it is also provided that it shall be competent for the Governor for sufficient reasons to him appearing, after previous consultation with the Judges, to alter the dates fixed by the said Ordinance for holding Criminal Sessions of the said Court at any of the places therein mentioned and to fix any other date for the commencement thereof:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to alter as hereinafter the date fixed for holding the Second Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court at Kandy, viz., the 1st day of August:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reason to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that the Sessions of the Supreme Court, appointed by the said Ordinance to be holden at Kandy on the 1st day of August, shall, instead of that date, commence to be holden this year at Kandy on Monday, the Thirtieth day of July.

RULES REFERRED TO.

Management.

1. The slaughter-house at Welapura Kalutara proclaimed in *Government Gazette* No. 5,333 of 25th January, 1895, shall be in charge of such person or persons as the proper authority may from time to time, by writing under his hand, appoint.

Fees.

2. The following fees shall be paid to the Board for the use of the slaughter-house :—

	Cents.
For cattle	50 each
For sheep, goats, and pigs	25 "

These rates shall cover exposure in the proper place for twenty-four hours. The above fees shall be increased by one-half for each further period of twelve hours exposure.

Inspection of Animals.

3. All cattle intended for slaughter shall prior to being exposed at the place appointed under section 12 (1) be inspected at that place by the Secretary of the Board as to their apparent fitness for slaughter. After exposure they shall be inspected at the place of exposure before slaughtering by the Medical Officer of the station as to their health.

Period of Exposure.

4. No cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs intended for slaughtering shall be kept or left at the place of exposure for more than forty-eight hours, and no animal shall be removed or taken from such place of exposure except in the presence of its owner, keeper, or watcher.

Fees to be paid in Advance.

5. All fees shall be paid in advance.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter the Third Class of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service will take place on Monday, August 20, 1900, and following days.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Public Instruction, must bear a stamp of Rs. 10, and must be in the form (Schedule A) attached to this notice. Forms are to be obtained at any Post Office on application, or within four days' notice. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be on the 1st August, 1900, between the ages of 18 and 21, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Instruction, must be attached to the form of application. If a certificate of birth for a previous examination was sent in, reference may be made to it by mentioning name and date of examination. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted.

3. Clerks belonging to the Fourth Class of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service, who have completed three years' satisfactory service, and those employed by Provincial and District Road Committees, whose appointments date prior to July 1, 1875, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Public Instruction through the heads of their Departments. When forwarding the application forms of Clerks who are employed under them in the Fourth Class of the Clerical Service, Heads of Departments are requested to note the following particulars on the back of the application forms of the candidates:—

- (1) The appointments held by the candidates and salaries.
- (2) Whether the appointments were permanent or temporary.
- (3) Whether the salary was paid from vote for Personal Emoluments or Other Charges or from certain Fees.

4. Applications are to reach the Director of Public Instruction not later than 12 noon on Monday, July 23, 1900; any applications received after that hour, by whatever cause delayed, will be absolutely rejected.

5. The Director of Public Instruction will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved, as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination at the station at which they present themselves their forms of application, approved by the Director of Public Instruction. A candidate not producing such form, whatever may be the reason for his not so doing, will be refused admittance to the examination.

6. Examinations will be held at Colombo and Jaffna only, in the places and under the supervision of the officers specified in Schedule B. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications to present themselves for examination have been returned to them approved by the Director of Public Instruction, leave to present themselves at the most conveniently situated station at which the examination is to be held.

7. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for competition shall be thirty.

8. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule C to this notice. The examination shall be held in two parts: the first part, a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting and half those allowed for Spelling and Arithmetic respectively shall be excluded from the remainder of the examination. The second part of the examination shall be in the remaining subjects in Schedule C. Should a candidate obtain less than one-fourth marks in any of the subjects other than Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic, or, if he be a Sinhalese or Tamil, less than two-thirds marks in his native language, such marks shall not be counted in his favour. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

9. Officers who have served continuously in the Fourth Class of the Clerical Service for over six years will be allowed to compete amongst themselves and be eligible for one-third of the appointments offered for competition, if they obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. in the compulsory subjects. No service under the age of sixteen years will be reckoned in this term.
