Dear Tamil Americans;

It is with great honor and pride we welcome you all for the 40th Annual General Meeting of Ilankai Tamil Sangam USA and our Ruby Jubilee Celebrations. We are delighted to release this souvenir in marking our Ruby Anniversary.

Four decades ago, our organization was formed as Tamil Americans came together in a small town in New York in the aftermath of the vicious violence unleashed on the Tamil minority in Sri Lanka. Our founding principles were to promote Tamil culture in this nation, to protect the human rights of the Tamil speaking minority in ilankai and to provide humanitarian aid to them. In forty years, Sangam has achieved what any other organization could ever imagine to accomplish, spreading its activities in arts and culture, humanity and human rights.

Sangam has started Tamil schools, taught our history and language to our younger generation and hosted hundreds of cultural programs. Time and again Sangam has mobilized Tamil Americans to support the aspirations of our people.

As we step into the fifth decade, we assure our members and the Tamil American community that Sangam will continue its efforts for a brighter future for our community here in the United States and for our people in Ilankai.



கடந்த நாற்பது ஆண்டுகளாக நடைபெற்றுவரும் இலங்கைத் தமிழ்ச் சங்க விமா. தொடர்ந்து நூற்றாண்டுகளைக் கடந்து நடைபெற வேண்டுமென உலகத் கமிழ் அமைப்ப பாராட்டுதலையும் कलका நல்வாழ்த்தையும் தெரிவித்துக்கொள்கிறது. மாபெரும் இனப்படுகொலைக்கு ஆட்பட்டத் தமிழினத்தின் மீட்சிக்கும் விடுதலைக்கும் இவ்விழா உறுதுணையாக இருக்கும் என்பகை நம்புகிறோம். அமெரிக்கா உறுதியாக உள்ளிட்டப் பல மேற்குலக நாடுகளில் ஏதிலிகளாக வந்து குடியேறிய அல்லது தொழில் சார்ந்து குடியேறிய ஈழத் தமிழர்களும், தமிழ் நாட்டுத் தமிழர்களும் ஒருங்கிணைந்து தாயகத்தில் வாழும் தமிழர்களின் விடுதலைக்கு உற்ற துணையாய் இருக்க வேண்டியது காலத்தின் கடமை. அதற்கான கருத்துப் பரிமாற்றமும், திட்டமிடலும், அமைப்புகளின் ஒற்றுமையும் அடிப்படைத் தேவை.



Sangam Story



he year was 1977, The Tamil United Liberation Front (TULF) an alliance representing Tamil parties in Sri Lanka sweeps the election in Northern Sri Lanka and becomes the main opposition party in Sri Lanka. The election victory takes place less than year after the TULF adopted the historic "Vaddukoddai Resolution" calling for the restoration and reconstitution of the Free, Sovereign and Secular State of Tamil Eelam based on the right of self-determination inherent to every nation. With the TULF winning the election on the promises of a separate state for Tamils, The Sri Lankan Government unleashes the most ruthless ethnic program to that date. Tamil civilians, along with their homes, businesses and religious establishments are attacked and burned down throughout the country. India expressed concern but no protection given to Tamils.

As the violence was unleashed the Tamil Americans are restless and become concerned for their people back home and search for ways to act in solidarity. With the lack of a wider network or political power, they huddle in homes all around the United States in small groups. A particular group that met in a private home in Nanuet, New York takes the initiative to bring the Tamil Americans together to create a nationwide network to work towards protecting the freedom and safety of Tamils in Sri Lanka and organize a larger meeting at a near by public school in New York. In October of 1977, Tamil Americans from all over the country meet in Nanuet, New York and announced that a Tamil American Organization called 'Ilankai Tamil Sangam America' is being created to protect the human rights of the Tamil speaking minority in Ilankai, to provide humanitarian aid to them and to promote Tamil language and culture in the U.S. At that team meeting a president, secretary, treasurer and a committee were elected. In the following months a constitution was prepared and Sangam was registered as a charitable organization in the state of New Jersey. That was the beginning of four decades of relentless effort and our historic journey to serve Tamil Americans and Tamils in Ilankai.

- Doctors from the organization 'Doctors without Borders' who worked in the North and East of Sri Lanka, were the guest of honors and keynote speakers at the Sangam AGM.
- Sangam organized massive protests in New York in front of the United Nations protesting the killing of civilians together with the blockage of food and supplies to civilians by the Sri Lankan Government.

- Sangam members were very affected by the destruction of livelihood, infrastructure and the economy due to
 military activity against civilian targets and a severe economic blockade. Large sums for refugee relief funds were
 raised, along with contributions for the scholarship & orphan funds.
- Sangam organized a Genocide Day for education of the American public and officials on the dire circumstances of Tamils in Sri Lanka.
- Sangam organized a successful demonstration in Washington, DC to draw attention to the human rights abuses and war crimes being committed.
- Sangam contributed to a convention in Australia to discuss Tamil issues.
- The Tamil Voice continued to be produced & distributed.
- The Sangam.org website was inaugurated in December.
- Sangam encouraged members to be in regular touch with their legislators to inform them of the need for US
 influence to push for a negotiated settlement and an end to human rights abuses. Of particular note was the
 relationship developed with the Chair of the House Foreign Affairs Committee by a constituent.
- The Sangam website became one of only two sources of information on Tamil issues easily available.

- Sangam renews effort to broaden its appeal to all Tamil community members. Implements incentives for
 more community participation. Organizes committee meetings and events at geographically
 easy-to-reach locations, including expansion of host families. Various cultural events are considered:
 exhibition of traditional dress, spring cultural event etc. (Under prevailing conditions many potential
 members remained aloof to avoid politically sensitive debates.)
- Mailing of "Sangam Newsletter" started in 1996 continues with vigor and dedication by a Sangam member on a monthly basis. About 5-10 pages of Eelam news was assembled and mailed. Goal was to forcefully counter news blockade on HR violations by SLA imposed by GOSL, and to develop a working relationship with important US policymakers with the hope of mitigating atrocities committed against Tamils.
- "Sangam Research" team formulates graphical material to introduce Eelam history.
- Sangam informally hosts many leaders and journalists visiting US from Eelam preparing grounds for active
 participation with US Congress and NGOs (like Human Rights Watch and Amnesty International). Except
 for a few congressional relationships, wider membership remained disconnected from US political
 discourse on Tamil issues.
- Sangam members develop a working relationship with UN officers for South Asia and organizes frequent visits to brief them on ground level HR violations in Eelam.









- The Sri Lankan Foreign Minister, late Lakshman Kadirgamar was publicly challenged on US soil on GOSL

 Sangam member. Kadirgamar was painting a picture of normalcy to the western audience while crude
 barrel bombs were unleasehed on Tamil civilians.
- Mailing of "Sangam Newsletter" on a monthly basis to counter news blockage on Tamil struggle by GOSL. New emblem established to reflect Eelam freedom effort.
- For the first time AGM program is extended to include performances from accomplished artists as well

 "Tribute to Padmini" which was well received by the audience.

- Presented a recorded speech by then India's Foreign Minister George Fernandes expressing solidarity with Eelam Tamils.
- Representative of Jesuit Refugee Agency Mr. William Coley speaks of INS Detention Center, NY holding Tamils. Sangam donates books for the detainees.







- Participated in a rally in front of UN commemorating 50th anniversary on Declaration of Human Rights
 (observed as the best organized event among many other groups including groups linked to Tibet and East
 Timor struggle).
- Sangam participated in US Congressional HR Caucus Hearing on Sri Lanka (Feb.'99). Effort by the GoSL to scuttle this open hearing failed for the first time.
- Disturbingly, GoSL establishes a SL Caucus to counter Eelam Tamil effort.
- Sangam organizes a large scale letter writing campaign to US Congress (2000 letters sent).
- Sangam periodically mailed "Sangam Newsletter" to 250 media, NGO and government policymakers, sending about 1500 hard copies. Intent was to build a solid foundation of relationship through well researched material to counter SL propaganda against Tamils.
- Sangam joined in a legal battle in US through renowned lawyer Prof. David Cole.
- Subcommittee formed to address the challenges faced by Tamils in immigration detentions centers in NY and NJ.

- First "Spring Cultural Event" organized successfully by Sangam providing a model for geographically separated Tamil communities to replicate the model. Kumar Ponnambalam attends the event and gives a speech about Eelam situation. (Year later he was assassinated.)



Memorial to Mamanithar held in NJ by Sangam








 Mr. T. Pathmakumar and supported by other organizing committee members.



- Sangam donates USD 8,800 to the Jaffna University medical faculty to provide Scholarships to medical students.
- Tamil Health Organization started by Sangam decides to rebrand with a new name called International Medical Health Organization (IMHO) and a decision is made that IMHO will operate independently as an organization with a president and an executive team.






Ambassador Dewey Speaking at the 2009 AGM



 Members of Parliament from the Tamil National Alliance Mr. M.A.Sumanthrian and Mr. Mavai Senathirajah.











- · Sangam reinitiated the "Tamil American youth meet" as part of the AGM.



LIFETIME SERVICE AWARD:

Awarded for the first time in 2016, the Lifetime Service Award recognizes individuals, groups or organization for their contribution to human rights or humanity, or for an act of valor. This is the Sangam's highest recognition award for service.

MOST EMINENT TAMIL AMERICAN AWARD / TITLE:

Awarded was the first time in Sangam history in 2005, Sangam's "Most Eminent Tamil American Award" is a posthumous title bestowed to Tamil Americans in recognition of their life-long dedication and service to the development and freedom of Tamils in Ilankai.

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD:

Sangam's Lifetime Achievement Award is awarded to individuals who, during their lifetimes, have made significant contributions to the Tamil Community or to the field of their expertise.

Lifetime Service Awards



Medical Profession Team that served the Civilians in the last phase of civil war in Sri Lanka (awarded 2017)

Ilankai Tamil Sangam USA recognizes the medical profession team comprising doctors, nurses, technicians, ambulance drivers and other volunteers who have gone above and beyond in their service to the internally displaced and war-affected people during the final phases of the civil war in Sri Lanka. During the times of war and great distress, they heroically stood by their people.

During the first five months of 2009, as an intense war ravaged the densely-populated coastline of northeastern Sri Lanka, more than 300 000 civilians were trapped in between. A government-imposed media blackout meant the world was largely unaware of what the United Nations later called a "bloodbath." The team established makeshift hospitals and coordinated emergency medical efforts under the most difficult conditions. According to the ICRC, the team coordinated the evacuation of nearly 14,000 patients and their caregivers from the warzone between February and May 2009.

The physicians' team treated acute trauma and burns, performed surgical amputations and provided much needed first aid amidst shortages of food, medicine, clean water and supplies. Compounding the situation was that hospitals were under artillery attack. Although they had the option to leave, the team chose to stay and serve the civilian population who needed them more than ever. At a time when journalists were barred, the team also communicated with the outside world about the casualties they saw.

Ilankai Tamil Sangam USA on behalf of the Tamil American Community awards their highest recognition award of "Lifetime Service Award" to this team of brave and self-less team of men and women for their courageous service to humanity and for their acts of valor in the face oppression, intimidation and violence.




















Mr. Callum Macrae (awarded 2017)



Mr.Callum Macrae is an award-winning filmmaker, writer and journalist. Mr.Macrae was the producer of a series of documentaries that exposed war crimes committed during the last phase of civil war in Sri Lanka. His first documen tary released in 2011 which brought worldwide attention to the war crimes and human rights abuses committed by

the Sri Lankan armed forces won the Current Affairs - International category of the Royal Television Society's Television Journalism Awards 2010–11, won two One World Media Awards and earned a BAFTA TV Award nomination. It has also has won other awards, including The Audience Awards at the Nuremberg Film Festival and Watch Docs in Poland, as well as the Human Rights award at the Festival des Liberties in Brussels. McCrae and his team were nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize in 2012.

Mr. Macrae grew up in Nigeria and Scotland. He studied painting at Edinburgh College of Art for five years, was a dustman for two years, ran a pirate radio station for six months and was a teacher for seven years. He was a member of the Official Edinburgh Festival's governing Council and President of Edinburgh and District Trades Council.

Judge Navanethem Pillay (awarded 2016)





Judge Navanethem Pillay, a South African national of Tamil origin, was born in 1941. Ms. Pillay received a BA and a LLB from Natal University South Africa and holds a Master of Law and a Doctorate of Juridical Science from Harvard University. She was the first woman to start a law practice in her home province of Natal in 1967. She acted as a defense attorney for anti-apartheid activists, exposing torture, and helping establish key rights for prisoners on

Robben Island - the notorious prison where Nelson Mandela was imprisoned for over 23 years. She also worked as a lecturer at the University of KwaZulu-Natal, and later was appointed Vice-President of the Council of the University of Durban Westville. In 1995, after the end of apartheid, Ms.Pillay was appointed as acting judge on the South African High Court. Later the same year she was elected by the UN General Assembly to be a judge on the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda, where she served a total of eight years, the last four (1999-2003) as President. She was appointed as UN High Commissioner for Human Rights in July 2008.

Judge Pillai visited Sri Lanka, and met with victims of the war and made stern statements on all parties to the conflict and delivered a firm message. Judge Pillay is the first recipient of Sangam's 'Lifetime Service Award' in recognition of her decades-long dedication to seeking truth, justice and human rights around the world and her contribution to all humanity.

Late Dr. Ananthan Satchi (1939-2015)

Dr. Ananthan Satchi was one of the founding members of Ilankai Tamil Sangam. Born in 1945 in Sri Lanka and raised in Malaysia, he received his medical degree from the University of Colombo. He moved to the United States in 1971 and retired as an Anesthesiologist. Since forming the Ilankai Tamil Sangam in 1977 with the other founding members, Dr. Satchi gave his unconditional support to the Sangam for the past 38 years. He has extended his philanthropic activities through the Sangam and his generosity has helped improved the lives of orphans, war widows and disabled freedom fighters.

Ilankai Tamil Sangam posthumously bestow the title of "Most Eminent Tamil American" to Late Dr. Ananthan Satchi in recognition of his decades-long dedication to the development and freedom of Eelam Tamils. In the forty-year history of Sangam, this will be the first posthumous title recognition bestowed. Sangam is honored in recognizing one of our founding fathers.


Dr. Nagalingam Jeyalingam (awarded 2017)

Dr. Nagalingam Jeyalingam graduated from the University of Ceylon with a medical degree, and specialized in Ear Nose and Throat and Head & Neck Surgery at Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital. He became a Fellow of the American Academy of Otolaryngology and Head & Neck Surgery in 1979. In 2003, he was appointed Assistant Clinical Professor, Department of Otolaryngology, Mt Sinai Medical Center, New York, NY. He practiced as Ear, Nose & Throat and Head and Neck Surgeon in Newburgh, NY till Dec. 2011. After his retirement, he worked as Director of Clinical Research at ENT and Allergy Associates for two years.

Dr.Jeyalingam was the President of Ilankai Tamil Sangam from 1994 to 1996. He was also the president of the World Tamil Coordinating Committee (WTCC). He was on the Advisory Committee and is currently a Senator and in the Ethics Committee of TGTE. He is also a Governing Council member of USTPAC. Sangam awards the 'Lifetime Achievement Award' to Dr.Nagalingam Jeyalingam in recognition of his contribution to the Sangam over two decades, to the Tamil community in United States and the Tamils in Ilankai.



Dr. Nagalingam Ethirveerasingam (awarded 2015)



Dr.Nagalingam Ethirveerasingam represented Sri Lanka (then Ceylon) at the 1952 and 1956 Olympic Games and three Asian Games. He finished eleventh in the 1958 British Empire and Commonwealth Games high jump. He won the first Asian Games gold medalfor Sri Lanka in 1958. He taught at universities in Sierra Leone, Papua New Guinea, Nigeria and Sri Lanka. He also worked for UNESCO for five years. He was a student at Jaffna Central College, where apart from his accomplishments in athletics, was a cricketer, which is not

well publicized because of his athletic achievements. In later years whilst lecturing in Sierra Leone he captained the University cricket team in the local cricket tournament and in 1973 was appointed vice captain of the national team that played against the neighboring country of Gambia.

Dr. Ethirveerasingam, only Olympian of Tamil heritage, now lives in the US and Jaffna, Sri Lanka. In addition to engaging in various humanitarian relief efforts in Jaffna and Vanni, he coaches young athletes in that area. He passionately believes that sport can heal trauma and provide hope for the young. Sangam awarded the 'Lifetime Achievement Award' to Dr. Ethirveerasingam in recognition of his achievements in sports, his dedication to the development of sports and education in the Northern Province and humanitarian activities among Eelam Tamils.



Dr. Nagaratnam Arul Ranjithan received his medical degree MBBS from University of Ceylon, in 1969. After an year of internship he emigrated to USA in 1971. Following his residency in Internal medicine, he did Nephrology fellowship in VA Hospital in Bronx, New York. He is a diplomate of the American Board of Internal Medicine and has been in private practice of Nephrology and Internal Medicine from 1976 to the present time in Cumberland, Maryland. He was Medical director of Hemodialysis unit of Western MD Health Systems, over thirty years.

Dr. Ranjithan was the president of Tamils Rehabilitation Organization(TRO) from its inception in 1997 till 2007. He currently serves as a governing council member of USTPAC. Sangam awards the 'Lifetime Achievement Award' to Dr. Nagaratnam Arul Ranjithanin recognition of his generous contributions to the Tamil People in Ilankai and his tireless and dedicated efforts to improve their livelihood for several decades.

Rev. Dr. S. J. Emmanuel (awarded 2014)



Prof. Dr. S. J. Emmanuel, born in Jaffna, Sri Lanka in 1934, had his early education in Jaffna and later graduated in physical sciences from the University of Ceylon, Colombo in 1958. After a short period as teacher and journalist, he did his studies in Rome, graduating in Philosophy and Theology at the Pontifical Urban University in Rome and was ordained a priest in December 1966. In Sri Lanka, he was then pastor and diocesan director for lay apostolate. From 1976 till 1986,

he was Professor and Dean of Theology at the National Seminary in Kandy, Sri Lanka. From 1986 onwards, he has been a direct victim and witness of the ethnic conflict and war in Jaffna. In October 1995, he along with his staff and students of the Seminary joined the 500,000 in their historic Exodus out of Jaffna. After a year in the jungles of Kilinochchi he moved to Europe in 1997 in self-exile. In 1996 and 1997 he was a visiting Scholar at Heythrop College of the University of London. In September 1997 he moved to Germany.

During these seventeen years in self-exile, besides his lectures in various universities in Europe, he has been bearing credible witness at many international conferences to the horrendous events happening behind closed-doors in the North and East of Sri Lanka. During the last fifteen years he has attended the annual sessions of the UN Human Rights Council held in Geneva and has been lobbying support for his people from the international community. In February 2010 he was elected President of the Global Tamil Forum – a network of Diaspora Tamil organizations around the world. He has given numerous interviews to media and written articles to several journals in English, Tamil and German.

Mr. Visuvanathan Rudrakumaran, Esq.

Mr. Visuvanathan Rudrakumaran is a practicing attorney in New York, USA. He studied at Jaffna Central College and Colombo Law College. He holds an LLM in International Law/Comparative Law from the Harvard Law School and is a former co-chair of the Committee on International Law and Comparative Law, New York County Bar Association.

Mr. Visuvanathan has participated in the peace talks between the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) and the Government of Sri Lanka as a legal advisor of the LTTE. He is the Prime Minister of the Transnational Government of Tamil Eelam (TGTE). He published and presented papers on self-determination, use of force by non-state entities. He has also been co-counsel in cases challenging the terrorist designations and litigation involved constitutional challenges of 1996 antiterrorism and effective death penalty Act.

He has written extensively on the conflict in the island of Sri Lanka and participated in the Norwegian sponsored Peace Process as Legal Adviser to the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam delegation. Dr. Rajan Sriskandarajah graduated from the University of Ceylon with a medical degree and was 'Board Certified' by the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, England in 1977. Dr. Sriskandarajah became a Fellow of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists in 1980 and was awarded 'Board Certified' by the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists in 1981. In 1989, he was appointed Clinical Assistant Professor at the New York Medical College. He obtained a Master's degree in Public Health from the New York Medical College in 1993.

Along with his busy medical practice he has been actively involved in Ilankai Tamil Sangam's activities. He was the founder as well as long-time editor ofllankai Tamil Sangam's "Tamil Voice" publication and of the Sangam website. He has published numerous articles and essays and has given many speeches about the Sri Lankan Tamil issue.Dr. Sriskandarajah has been actively involved in promoting peace and human rights in Sri Lanka.

Mr. J.M.Rajaratnam, a graduate of the University of Ceylon, was the winner of a five-year open Government Scholarship for studies in accounting in the U.K. He was the CEO and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Singer Company's operations in Ceylon, was transferred to the U.S head office and subsequently appointed Vice President of Finance and Accounting of the International Group of the corporation. Mr. J.M. Rajaratnam has been included in Marquis 'Who's Who in America.' After his retirement, he worked as a consultant to the World Bank, as Member of the Roster of Experts on matters related to transnational corporations of the United Nations and as a Member of the U.S Executive Volunteer Services Corps.

Mr. Rajaratnam who had been educating government and international bodies for the Eelam Tami cause, published 'Tamils of Sri Lanka – The quest for human dignity' issued by the U.K.'s Tamil Information Center. He had been a long-time member of Sangam, was a past president and had spoken at various conventions in the USA, Canada, UK and India on the Tamil Eelam cause.

Professor Dr. Muttaiya Sundaralingam

(awarded November 2004)



Professor Dr. M. Sundaralingam received his B.Sc. (Honors) from the University of Ceylon in 1956 and Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh in 1961. After a post-doctoral stint in the Department of Anatomy, School of Medicine, University of Washington (1962-1963), he was appointed Research Instructor, Department of Biological Structure of the same school (1963-1965).

His research areas included Research Associate in Molecular Biology, Children's Cancer Research Foundation, Harvard University Medical School, Boston, MA; Chairman, Biophysics Ph.D. program, University of Wisconsin, Madison; Professor of Biomolecular Structure, University of Wisconsin; Professor, Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry and Director, Biological Macromolecular Structure Center of the Ohio State University, Columbus Ohio (1990-2002).

Among his honors are a John Simon Guggenheim Foundation Fellowship at Oxford (1975-1976) University of Pittsburgh Alumni Distinguished Award, 1986; Ohio Regent's Eminent Scholar Award by the Ohio's Governor. He was among the top 300 of the 1000 most cited scientists for work published from 1965-1978

Professor Dr. V. Arunasalam

Professor Dr. V. Arunasalam, a prominent Research Physicist at the Plasma Physics Laboratory, Princeton University, was a graduate of the University of Ceylon. He completed his Master's degree at the University of Massachusetts and his Ph.D. at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1964. He had taught at William Paterson University and Ryder University in New Jersey. Dr. Arunasalam had been included in the Marquis 'Who's Who in America'.

Dr. Arunasalam's achievements included research in Plasma Physics and controlled Thermonuclear Fusion, Quantum Theory, Quantum Electrodynamics, Cosmology, Foundations of Physics, Particle Physics, Condensed Matter, Theory and Quantum Statistical Mechanics. Dr. Arunasalam had been actively involved in promoting peace in Sri Lanka through the American Government.





ILANKAI TAMIL SANGAM'S ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION ON TAMIL HISTORY, ARTS AND CULTURE



The Drawing and Essay Competition of Ilankai Tamil Sangam was founded in 2013 as an endeavor to encourage Tamil children to proactively learn about their culture and history. In its first two years, the competition was limited to just New Jersey with less than 20 students. In 2015, it was expanded to include Staten Island and Queens and around 90 kids participated in this competition. Boston and Ohio also participated in 2016 with 135 kids and this year Pennsylvania was the newest addition.

The topics presented to the participants have varied through the years but have primarily been focused on Sri Lankan culture. These prompts facilitate participants to not only write about each topic, but also thoroughly research and understand it. They are required to creatively think about how to present their topics thereby allowing them to think independently about what they learned from their research and how to best communicate it.

Some of the topics from this year included Tamil festivals, the biographical history of Tamil poets, Tamil literature, a history of the formation of the Tamil population and the effects of the civil war in Sri Lanka. The goal of these prompts is to help children discover pieces of their cultural identity and think critically about what that means today. Furthermore, we hope that this will motivate them to seek out other topics and have conver sations with parents, friends and family members.

Today, our children rarely learn about our culture or history in school. Therefore, the responsibility of communicating that information falls to our community. Through this competition, we hope to spark interest in children to learn more about where they are from and how that ties to their own identities. Every year, we will strive to expand this contest to include as many areas of the country as possible, thereby bringing together our community throughout the nation. We are proud to host this competition in support of Sri Lanka and hope to continue to help them in the future.

The Sangam's website was launched on December 18, 1996 by our founder- editor, Dr. RajanSriskandarajah, a long-time Sangam member and contributor. Dr.Sriskandarajah is a physician and had no real background in technology and this was long before the website templates that are available today. Everything had to be done from scratch in HTML. After learning how to code on his own and in his free time from his busy medical practice, Dr. Sriskandarajah set up the website and began posting.

Dr.Sriskandarajah posted many original sources about the Tamil struggle that had been not widely available until that time, including historical, cultural and political documents and pictures, often arranging them in easy to understand formats. Dr.Sriskandarajah was honored for his effort of initiating and maintaining the website and his many other contributions at the 2003 Annual General Meeting.

Because he was such an early adopter, ITSwas able to obtain the coveted Sangam.org URL. At that time, our website was one of the few that existed on Tamil issues and thus played a very important role in providing news and information. As the number of websites has proliferated, our website is less important for breaking news, but remains an important repository of historical and reference information, and attempts to post material that will be of interest over the long term.

When Dr.Sriskandarajah stepped down as editor in 2000, other editors and web designers stepped in. During this period the website remained the most public face of the Sangam and of Tamil Americans. We have kept up with the enormous changes on the internet by going through three complete revamps of the site, by assuring that the site is viewable on mobile devices and by having new posts noted by Twitter. Posts from all three versions of the website are both viewable and searchable.

Maintaining a credible site in the face of the political challenges of the past few years has been quite a feat. The Tamil community has survived major trauma and steering a course through that trauma and its aftermath has not been easy. Our website posts news for Tamil Americans and other Tamils, but also provides information for academics and researchers (which we know from the inquiries we receive) and is the public face of our organization to the American authorities.

We encourage new people and young folks to become involved and to contribute to this important project to help take our website to the next level of the Tamil experience in the US. We are looking for new contributors and also new members of our Advisory Board.



Ilankai Tamil Sangam History Project



History - a chronological record of significant events (as affecting a nation or institution) often including an explanation of their causes

History of Tamils have not been formally documented in recent years. Successive occupying forces of Tamil Homeland, Portuguese, Dutch, British and Sinhalese, have destroyed many valuable historical land marks and rare historical documents. Pre-independence period of Sri Lanka (then known as Ceylon) has history of occupation by Portuguese, Dutch and British. These rulers were involved in either actively destroying historical evidence or removing and sending back to their countries as needed for their benefits. These kind of destruction continued even after Sri Lanka obtained independence from Britain in 1947. Successful Sri Lankan governments, majority Sinhalese, systematically destroyed ancient historical documents to deny any evidence for the Tamils to claim their homeland, North and East of the country. One of the recent events, burning of the Jaffna Public Library in 1981, showed the intention of the Sinhala governments to deny and annihilate Tamil people from Sri Lanka by erasing the rich history of Tamils in Sri Lanka. Many rare historical documents and many rare books were at the Jaffna Public Library, and the entire library was burned down by the Sinhala Police force with the blessing from a prominent Cabinet minister at that time. This is a deliberate destruction of historical documents of Tamils to erase evidence of Tamil people's rich history in North and East of Sri Lanka. This is part of a structural genocide against Tamil people.

History is not something obscure or unimportant. We learn from our past in order to achieve greater influence over our future. History is to preserve our race, language, culture and our nation. Without History Tamil people will have no identity or a place to call our homeland.

So why we need to invest in preserving, documenting and learning our history?

Because history matters! If we don't do it, who will?

Ilankai Tamil Sangam established the History Project to support the documentation, preservation and education of History of Tamils. Sangam has collaborated with historian/Professor, Dr. Murugar Gunasingam to document and preserve many rare documents of History of Tamils from all over the world. Dr. Gunasingam has written many books, notably, two books which have documented the history of Tamils from 300 B.C. to 2009.

First book, Tamils in Sri Lanka – A Comprehensive History (C.300 BC to C.2000 A.D.), was written with extensive research from documents found around the world. Dr. Gunasingam traveled to many countries to find rare historical documents for his research. This book is one of the well-researched and well written History of Tamils.

Second book, Tamil Eelam Liberation Struggle - State Terrorism and ethnic cleansing (1948 - 2009), was written to document the discrimination of Tamil people after independence. Dr. Gunasingam wrote this book to document why Tamil people demanded equal rights, and how successive Sinhala governments denied even some basic rights to Tamils.

This book also documents the non-violent form of struggle and

why Tamil youth took the path of armed-resistance against the Sri Lankan government to establish an independent state of Tamil Eelam. This book documents the rise of militancy and the brutal end of the armed conflict in May 2009.

Dr. Gunasingam has digitized all of the rare documents and copied into a hard drive to give it to various libraries around the world. Sangam has obtained a copy of the



hard drive with these documents. Sangam has given financial support to this digitization project as well. Sangam will be establishing a method for anyone to access these documents for educational and research purposes only. Please contact any Sangam executive committee member if you are interested in pursuing studies in Tamil History.

Proceeds from our Ruby Jubilee AGM will be allocated to run this project for multiple years. Project to implement solar powered lights for thousand Tamil homes in Eastern Sri Lanka







In 2016, Ilankai Tamil Sangam USA in close co-operation with the U.S Rotary clubs in Northern New Jersey started executing a project to extend our hands to set-up 1000 poor Tamil families with Solar Panels that would provide electricity in their shacks. Each Solar Panel costs \$50. The Solar Panels are the size of a lap-top (12x15 inches).

This project is executed with the technical expertise at the Eastern Technical institute (ETI) in Batticaloa. The ETI was set-up by Fr. Lloyd Lorio an American missionary who came to Ceylon 60 years ago. The ETI technical staff will set the equipment. In addition, they will Repair and Maintain the Solar Panels and the associated battery for the families. The ETI technicians can support the panels for over 5 years. This project also provides temporary employment for the local youth.

With Solar Panel and electricity; the children can study & read at night. The parents can cook and do house work at night. The parents do not have to buy kerosene any more. They can use the money for buying necessary food/medicines. The parents do not have to live with the fear that a child will knock a kerosene lamp and the hut may catch fire. Children will not get burnt with fire anymore. If a child/adult is sick at night with the flip of an electric switch there is light to take care of the emergency at hand. Most of all, the quality of life of these poor is tremendously improved overnight.

At the time of the Sangam Ruby Anniversary, first phase of the project completed with implementation of the solar powered lamps 100 families with the Sangam funds. Rotary Club Has started the 2nd phase with the objective of providing solar powered lamps for additional 400 Tamil families.





Many facets of Thai Pongal Pongal as Tamils' Passover

Tamils have celebrated Thai Pongal in one form or the other over millennia. Celebrating Thai Pongal nowadays in its traditional, purposeful piety and outdoor gala continues to evolve as vast number of diaspora Tamil communities exit in far corners away from their homelands. They also live far from ancestral agrarian and village habitats that used to indulge in the age-old Thai Pongal festivities within the homelands as well. In this setting, let the Thai Pongal festivities continue to take centre stage and be celebrated as the key festival of Tamils in emboldening Tamil identity and in fostering kinship now and over our future generations:

(1) Bountiful prosperity ushers in the time of Tamil Thanksgiving

Tamil month of 'Thai', falling on January 14th or 15th is Pongal day; it is the Tamil Thanksgiving Day celebrating sun, rain, farm cattle and ushering in pureness and prosperity. Thai harvest celebration and thanksgiving are marked by the spillover of the traditional sweet rice cookout and everything good in abundance to follow in the year it joyously indicates.

Celebrated Philosopher-Poet Thiruvalluvar says in the first Kural ~ couplet, under Part I ~ Virtue (1.1.1 The Praise of God),

"As the letter A is the first of all letters, so the eternal God is first in the world". (Translated by Rev. G.U. Pope)

"AgaraMuthalaelluththellam Athi pakavanmuthatreulagu"

On Thai Pongal Day, the Sun is the celebrated "Athi pakavan", the eternally divine.



(2) Thai Pongal is marked with cultural festivities to uphold heritage

Among other things, Thai Pongal has long become a festival marking or taking gauge of prosperous sentiments in the lands of our roots, as one aspiring to be a farmer declined over a generation or two ago, the time of the year Thai Pongal falls and the traditions associated with its celebration make it an ideal time to take stock of sentiments.

One key aspect of it is that how important "Pongal Santhai" (Pongal market) became when markets in the Jaffna peninsula used to convene on alternate days etc., until a generation or two ago. When the market convened for the final time before Jan 14th, the crowds and spending habits would be the gauges on how well other sectors and the general spirit of the people would be too. The farmers' markets around towns and villages bustle with activity during days preceding Thai Pongal. The bountiful harvests parade the markets, and the final day the market convenes prior to Pongal known as Pongal Santhai (Pongal market) especially lavishes with prosperous sentiments.

They all depended on a bountiful harvest. However tiny, this aspect of our root still exists and it will be a reason to still celebrate Thai Pongal!

(3) Celebrating own heritage amid many cultures

Festivals such as Hanukkah and Kwanzaa gained added significance in their respective diaspora communities to fulfill the calendar of holiday time with one's own heritage. Celebrating the charming Tamil Thanksgiving Festival in January, just after the holiday season of December adds more glitter to Pongal fanfare.

(4) Celebrating Thai Pongal, the charming festival of Thanksgiving

Thai Pongal season has been generationally well documented as an extremely popular time with children in our homelands.

The legendary KullanthaiKavignarAzha. Valliappa, (1922-1989) a pioneer known for dedicated work of children's literature in Tamil, wrote the following poem about Pongal in his collection of poetry for children, MalarumUllam (Blossoming mind)

The poem brings out the charm in preparing for and celebrating Pongal festivities, and roughly translates as follows:

"Walls newly painted

Floors neatly polished
Day break we shower
Lamp within us flicker
Garner decorated crock
Dazzle around turmeric
Crock atop stove
Milk therein pour
Foaming milk spillovers
Greetings galore
'Pongal 'o Pongal
Offer almighty rice
Coconut sugarcane feast
Together we eat
Singing dancing joyously"





Greeting on Pongal day saying 'Pongal 'o Pongal' signifies the abundance of milk froth spillover, from the clay pot and other vessels that are used to make the sweet-rice – Pongal, as sign of prosperity and happiness. It is said that "Pongal" is perhaps the only festival in the world to known in the name of a food dish.

(5) Thai Pongal in Home away from Home and in light of leading non-agrarian life styles "Thai paves the way for good things to follow", is a Tamil proverb.

Thai Pongal marks the first day of the Tamil month January; it is also the celebrated Tamil month for weddings, lasting intro to eternal friendships and love.

In terms of Thai Pongal's "irrelevance" – that may also become a new reason to "celebrate" it. This one festival of Tamils can be said that is causing it to be not celebrated in the same way as our ancestors did, particularly its outdoor events and then also it falls in the colder months to where the most Tamil "exodus" have taken place. Observance of Thai Pongal becomes a commemoration of this historic aspect as well.

In that sense it can become Tamils' own "Passover"!

Ilankai Tamil Sangam to its pride has been coordinating Thai Pongal events in expanded ways here in the United States for the past few years. Kudos to Ilankai Tamil Sangam in these efforts and Best Wishes for further development on the Pongal front going forward! And 'Pongal 'o Pongal', to all!!!

எங்களில் பலருக்கு தமிழ்மொழியின் எதிர்காலம் பற்றிய கவலை, அச்சம் இருக்கிறது. தமிழ்மொழி வரலாற்றை எடுத்துப் பார்த்தால் அது எதிர்நீச்சல் போட்டே வந்திருக்கிறது. எதிர்நீச்சல் போட முடியாது போனபோது தமிழ்மொழி சிதைந்து வேறு மொழிகளுக்கு வித்திட்டுள்ளது. மலையாள மொழி இதற்கு நல்ல எடுத்துக்காட்டு ஆகும்.

ஐம்பெரும் காப்பியங்களில் ஒன்றான சிலப்பதிகாரம் இயற்றிய சேரன் தம்பி இளங்கோ, ஆதி உலா எழுதிய நாயனார் சேரமான் பெருமாள், திருமொழி பாடிய குலசேகர ஆழ்வார் வாழ்ந்த சேர நாடும், பேசிய செந்தமிழும் இன்று மலையாளம் பேசும் கேரள நாடாக மாறிவிட்டது. பதினேழாம் நூற்றாண்டு வரை கேரளத்தில் தமிழே பேசப்பட்டது. 17 ஆம் நூற்றாண்டில்தான் குஞ்சத்து எழுத்தச்சன் என்பவர் தமிழோடு வட மொழியைக் கலந்து மலையாள மொழியை உருவாக்கினார். இன்று அவர் நவீன மலையாள மொழியின் தந்தை எனப் போற்றப்படுகிறார்.

மலையாள கரையோரம் உள்ள அம்பலக்காட்டில் முதலில் தமிழில் எழுதி வெளியிடப்பட்ட நூல் கிபி 1577 இல் வெளிவந்தது. அந்த நூல் மலவார் அல்லது தமிழில் எழுதப்பட்டது என்று மொழி அறிஞர் கால்டுவெல் குறிப்பிடுகிறார். மலையாளத்தில் இலக்கண நூல் இயற்றப்பட்ட ஆண்டு கிபி 1860 ஆகும். எனவே மொழி அழியக் கூடியது. சங்க கால வடவேங்கடம் தென்குமரி யாயிடைத் தமிழ்கூறு நல்லுலகத்தின் பல பகுதிகளை இன்று நாம் இழந்து விட்டோம்.வட எல்லை இன்று சுருங்கிவிட்டது.

சித்தூர் மாவட்டத்தில் 19,000 சதுர கிலோ மீட்டர் நிலப்பரப்பில் பெரும் பகுதியும் 13,000 சதுர கிலோ மீட்டர் நிலப்பரப்பு உள்ள நெல்லூர் மாவட்ட த்தின் கணிசமான பகுதியும் ஆந்திராவுடன் இணைக்கப்பட்டு விட்டது. இதனால் வடபெண்ணாறு, ஆரணியாறு, பொன் வாணியாறு முதலிய வற்றின் வளமான மண் தமிழகத்திற்கு இல்லை என்றாகி விட்டது. ஆரணி ஆற்றின் பாசனப் பகுதி தமிழ்நாட்டில் இருந்தாலும், அணைக்கட்டுப் பகுதி ஆந்திராவுக்குப் போய்விட்டது.

கடந்த ஆண்டு நான் கேரள நாட்டுக்குப் போயிருந்த போது மொழிச் சிக்கல் இருக்கவில்லை. அவர்கள் பறைவது எமக்குப் புரிகிறது. நாங்கள் பறைவது அவர்களுக்கு விளங்குகிறது. மலையாள மொழியில் காணப்படும் வடமொழிச் சொற்களை நீக்கிவிட்டால் எஞ்சியிருப்பது தமிழ் மொழிதான்.

ஏழரைக் கோடி மக்கள் வாமும் தமிழ்நாடு பற்றி நாம் அதிகம் கவலைப்படத் தேவையில்லை. வட்டார வழக்கில் எவ்வளவுதான் வேறுபாடு இருந்-தாலும் பாட நூல்கள் தமிழ் இலக்கணத்துக்கு அமைய எழுதப்படுகிறது. திரைப்படங்களில் கூட கதாநாயகன், கதாநாயகி பேசும் மொழி இலக்கணச் சுத்தியோடு இருக்கிறது. பெரும்பாலான திரைப்பாடல்களும் அவ்வாறே. ஆனந்த விகடன், யூனியர் விகடன் மற்றும் "அவாள்" நடத்தும் கிழமை ஏடுகளே தமிங்கிலத்தில் எழுதப்படுகின்றன. அப்படியான கலப்பு நடைக்கு தமிழர்களிடம் இருந்து எதிர்ப்பில்லாததால் அந்த ஏடுகள் தொடர்ந்து தமிமுக்கு கேடு விளைவிக்கின்றன.

தமிழ்நாட்டு மாணவர்கள் தமிழை ஆங்கிலத்தோடு கலந்து பேசுகிறார்கள். மேட்டுக்குடி மாணவர்களுக்கு ஆங்கிலம் நுனி நாக்கில் விளையாடு கிறது. வீட்டில் பெற்றோர்களோடு ஆங்கிலத்தில்தான் உரையாடுகிறார்கள். வீட்டு வேலைக்காரியோடு மட்டும் தட்டுத் தடுமாறி தமிழில் பேசு கிறார்கள். திரைப்படக் கதாநாயகர்கள், கதாநாயகிகள், இயக்குநர்கள் தொலைக்காட்சியில் தோன்றி உரையாடும் போது ஆங்கிலத்தோடு தமிழைக் கலந்து பேசுகிறார்கள். ஒரு காரணம் அவர்களில் பலர் பிறமொழியைத் தாய்மொழியாகக் கொண்டவர்கள்.

என்போன்றோரது கவலையெல்லாம் என்றுமுள்ள செந்தமிழ் தமிழ்மக்கள் புலம்பெயர்ந்த நாடுகளில் வாமுமா அல்லது மாமுமா என்பதுதான். இங்கு நடைபெறும் கலை விழாக்களைப் பார்க்கும் போது தமிழ்க் கலைகள் வாமும் என்ற நம்பிக்கை பிறக்கிறது. ஆனால் தமிழ்மொழி வாமுமா என்பது கேள்விக்குறியே!

கடந்தவாரம் (15-09-2017) கனடா தமிழ்க் கல்லூரியில் படித்த மாணவர்களுக்கு திரு நாராயணசாமி நினைவு பல்கலைக் கழகத்தின் (ளுசுஆ ருணைநசளவைல்) தமிழ்ப் பேராயம் அயகைத் தமிழ் ஆசிரியர் பட்டப் படிப்புப் படித்து முடித்தவர்களுக்கு சான்றிதழ் வழங்கி மதிப்பளிக்கும் விழா ஸ்காபரோ நகரில் நடந்தது. இந்த வகுப்பில் படித்த 51 மாணவர்களில் 34 மாணவர்கள் (33 பெண்கள் ஒரு ஆண்) தேர்வு எழுதி சித்தி பெற்றிருந்-தார்கள். அவுஸ்திரேலியா, சுவிஸ்த்தலாந்து போன்ற அயல்நாடுகளிலும் தமிழ் ஆசிரியர் பட்டப்படிப்பு கற்றுக் கொடுக்கப்படுகிறது.

இப்படியான முயற்சிகள் தமிழ் ஆசிரியர்கள் தமிழ்மாணவர்களுக்கு தமிழைப் படிப்பித்துக் கொடுக்க உதவும். இப்போது தமிழில் பயற்சி பெறாத ஆசிரியர்களே தமிழைச் சொல்லிக் கொடுக்கிறார்கள்.

ஏற்கனவே மனோன்மணியம் சுந்தரனார் பல்கலைக் கழகம், அண்ணாமலைப் பல்கலைக் கழகம் ரொறன்ரோவில் இளங்கலை, முதுகலைப் பட்டப் படிப்புக்கு மாணவர்களை தயார் செய்து பட்டம் வழங்கி வருகின்றன. தமிழில் பேசவும் எழுதவும் ஒரு சிறு விழுக்காட்டினரே தேர்ச்சி பெற்றிருக்கிறார்கள். ரொறன்ரோவில் உள்ள 40,000 மாணவர்களில் கால்வாசியே தமிழை ஒரு பாடமாகப் படிக்கின்றார்கள். எஞ்சியவர்கள் தமிழைப் படிப்பதில்லை. கனடாவில் மட்டுமல்ல தமிழர்கள் புலம்-பயர்ந்து வாழும் நாடு களில் தமிழ் படிப்போர் எண்ணிக்கை அருகி வருகிறதாகச் சொல்கிறார்கள்.

இருநூறு ஆண்டுகளுக்கு முன்னர் புலம்பெயர்ந்த தமிழ்நாட்டுத் தமிழர்கள் தமிழை மறந்ததற்குப் பல காரணங்கள் உண்டு. சமூக ஏணியின் அடிமட்டத்தில் உள்ள ஏழைகளே பிழைக்க வழிதேடி கூலிகளாகக் கப்பல்களில் புலம்பெயர்ந்தார்கள். பெரும்பாலும் இவர்கள் படிப்பறிவில்லாதவர்கள். ஊருக்கு ஒரு கடிதம் எழுதினால் அது போய்ச் சேர ஆறுமாதம் எடுத்தது. இவர்கள் இன்று தமிழை மறந்துவிட்டார்கள். இன அடையா ளத்தையும் தொலைத்து விட்டார்கள். அண்மைக்காலத்தில் தென்னாபிரிக்கா, மொறேசியஸ் போன்ற நாடுகளில் பிள்ளைகளுக்கு தமிழ் படிப்பித்துக் கொடுக்கும் முயற்சி முன்னெடுக்கப்பட்டு வருகிறது.

மலேசியாவில் இருபது இலட்சம் (7விமுக்காடு) தமிழ்மக்கள் வாழ்கிறார்கள். சென்ற நூற்றாண்டின் மத்தியில் (1950 இல்) 888 தமிழ்ப்பள்ளிகள் இருந்தன. 2011 ஆம் ஆண்டில் 523 தமிழ்ப்பள்ளிகள் தான் இருந்தன. இடைப்பட்ட 54 ஆண்டு காலத்தில் மலேசியாவில் இருந்த 365 தமிழ்ப்பள்ளிகள் மூடப்பட்டன. அதற்கு முக்கிய காரணம் தமிழ் மொழிக்கு அங்கு தகைமை இல்லை.

பியூஜியில் குடியேறிய தமிழர்கள் தமிழை மறந்து இந்தி படித்துத் தங்களது இன அடையாளத்தை தொலைத்து வருகிறார்கள். இந்தி படிப்பதை இந்திய மத்திய அரசு ஊக்குவிக்கிறது. இந்தி மொழி சொல்லிக் கொடுக்க இந்தி மொழி ஆசிரியர்களையும் பாட நூல்களையும் அனுப்பிவைக்கிறது.

அன்றைய கால கட்டத்தில் தொலைதொடர்பு கருவிகள் இருக்கவில்லை. வானொலி, தொலைக் காட்சி, திரைப்படம், கணினி, தொலைபேசி போன்றவை இருக்கவில்லை. இன்று அப்படியல்ல, தமிழ்மொழியை கணினி மூலம் படிக்கலாம். படித்துத் தேர்வு கூட எழுதிப் பட்டம் பெறலாம். பல்கலைக் கழகங்கள் இந்த வாய்ப்புகளை ஏற்படுத்திக் கொடுத்துள்ளன.

உண்மையைச் சொன்னால் தமிழ்ர்களுக்கு தாய்மொழிப் பற்று மிகக் குறைவு. முதலில் அவர்களது வழிபாட்டில் தமிழ் இல்லை. திருமணச் சடங்கில் தமிழ் இல்லை. இசையில் தமிழ் இல்லை. தமிழ்நாடு நீதிமன்றங்களில் தமிழ் இல்லை. தமிழ்நாடு பள்ளிக்கூடங்களில் தமிழ்மொழி கட்டாய பாடம் இல்லை. ஒரு மாணவன் தமிழ்மொழியைப் படிக்காமல் பல்கலைக் கழகம் வரை சென்று பட்டம் பெற்று வெளியேறலாம் என்ற அவல நிலை தமிழ்நாட்டில் இருக்கிறது.

புலம்பெயர் தமிழர்களிடையே தமிழ்க் கலையில் உள்ள ஆர்வம் தமிழ் மொழியில் இருப்பதில்லை. கனடாவில் தமிழ்மொழியைச் சொல்லிக் கொடுக்க விரல் விட்டு எண்ணக் கூடிய பள்ளிக் கூடங்களே இருக்கின்றன. ஆனால் நடனப் பள்ளிகள் 60 க்கு மேல் இருக்கின்றன. நடன ஆசி ரியர்கள், ஆசிரியைகள் நூற்றுக் கணக்கில் இருக்கிறார்கள். சோகம் என்னவென்றால் மாணவர்களுக்கு ஆங்கில மூலம் நடனக் கலை படிப்பித்துக் கொடுக்கப்படுகிறது. அரங்கேறும் ஆடலழகிகள் தமிழ் பேசவராததால் நன்றியுரையை அழகான ஆங்கிலத்தில் வழங்குகிறார்கள்!

இன்று தமிழ்நாட்டுத் தெருக்களில் தமிழ் இல்லை. நூற்றுக்கு 90 விழுக்காடு பெயர்ப்பலகைகள் ஆங்கிலத்தில் காணப்படுகின்றன. எஞ்சிய 10 விழுக்காடு ஆங்கிலத்திலும் தமிழிலும் இருக்கின்றன. கேரளத்தில் நேர் எதிர்மாறு. தொண்ணூறு விழுக்காடு பெயர்ப்பலகைகள் மலையாளத்தில் மட்டும் எழுதி வைத்திருக்கிறார்கள்.

ஆள்வோருக்குத் தமிழ்ப் பற்று இருந்தால்தான் குடிமக்களுக்கும் தமிழில் பற்று வரும். ஆளுவோருக்கு அக்கறையில்லாவிட்டால் தமிழ்மெ-ாழி வளராது! பேணப்படாத பண்டம் குப்பைக்குப் போய்விடும்.

GREETINGS FROM SACHI

Sangam website's 'honorary columnist' Sachi Sri Kantha

Currently, the digital face of Ilankai Tamil Sangam is the Sangam website. My association with the Sangam website began in 2001. For this honor bestowed on me by the founder website editor, Dr. Rajan Sriskandarajah, his successor (the current website editor) as well as to the past and present office bearers of the Ilankai Tamil Sangam, I'm most thankful. From Japan, I convey my heartfelt40th birthday greetings to Sangam and have big hopes that it will prosper with a long life in the years to come as well.

During the past 16 years, I have contributed items of varied topic range on issues of interest to Eelam Tamils, Tamil Nadu Tamils and Tamils living in the diaspora. For the first two years, I routinely took print copies of all the posted items of my columns and filed them. Subsequently, for various reasons, I have given up this exercise. As such, currently I don't have a complete record of the items which appeared with my byline. Numbers provided in the current version include 136 items. Older articles, before the current version came into existence, include 268 items. There are no numbers for the original version. This exercise of writing something of interest to Sangam readers kept me in touch with my relatives and friends, whom I couldn't see face to face. It also brought to me new friends, whom I couldn't meet face to face.

I can do no better than offer a wonderful poem by King poet Kannadasan (1927-1981) with the title, 'Thamizhan' for the Sangam's ruby jubilee. He penned this poem for Sirkazhi Govindarajan (1933-1988), renowned musician and movie playback singer bestowed with a temple bell-like voice, to perform in invited concerts held among diaspora Tamils. This poem is composed in six quatrains. In the final quatrain, Kannadasan included Govindarajan's name and his own signature as well. I provide a scanned version of the original and my English translation.

Our Tamils did cross the sea – and there
[We] see the God in camphor light
Searching wealth for the body and God for the mind
To live with self respect and service the Tamil

On that side, a temple for Murugan Near to that, a temple for Krishnan On any side, a temple for Sivan Wherever one sees a temple for Tamil

To spread the philosophy of tranquility
In the lands of America,
To promote their religion as dear as an
eyelid in the London city



I did see Raman in the great old island I saw Seetha in the beauteous Thailand Later saw Brahman in Cambodia – and also saw the fault-forgiving Hindu God

Madurai Meenachi crossed the sea – Thiru Malai Nayagan did cross the sea Gracious Ganapathi did cross the sea – Our Chanting Velan also crossed the sea.

In the voice of Govindarajan – that
Kannan of Gokulam could be heard
In the song of poet Kannadasan – the Tamil
of learning Goddess does bloom.

Though Kannadasan had not specifically identified Eelam by name (like that of Thailand and Cambodia) in this verse, his reference to it appears in the first line of that quatrain, as 'great old island'. I propose to let this verse be the motto of encouragement for expatriate Tamils living in the USA and elsewhere.



We have written this future direction and road map document for future leadership and members of Sangam to guide them in continuing the initiatives of Sangam over the last forty years. This document is written based on the valuable feedback we received for a decade from our members and previous leaders. Our founding members have laid down the sound principal objectives for our organization. Continuing with activities that align with those principal objectives is critical to the long-term survival and existence of our organization. We hope this document explains why Sangam is engaged in specific activities and how the Sangam operates as an organization.

Arts and Culture

On the arts and culture front as the oldest Ilankai Tamil organization, Sangam has the parental responsibility to bring the local Tamil communities in the United States together under the umbrella of Sangam. While this objective is not intended to interfere with the workings of the local community organizations, their active participation in Sangam-initiated national programs will create a strong Tamil community and an active social network for our current and future generations. In the past eight years Sangam has initiated efforts such as the Kalai Vila, Pongal Vila and Essay Writing competitions. While these initiatives are hugely successful in the New York tri-state area and to some extent on the East Coast, future leadership teams should continue to expand these initiatives with the goal of having national activities in each of these initiatives by our Golden Jubilee. Sangam should continue its efforts to start Ilankai Tamil Sangam Tamil schools in local communities and eventually this can a create Tamil Education network and a common curriculum.

Humanitarian Efforts

In the past Sangam has initiated and executed several initiatives to create opportunities for the Tamil people who live inllankai. With a lack of many vital tools necessary for the growth of the people, Sangam should develop and implement a ten-year plan on critical initiatives such as Energy projects including Solar panel, Windmill, Livelihood projects such as cattle farm, Fishing and Rainwater-harvesting projects and water conservation projects. These projects will help female-headed households and resettling families in north and eastern provinces. Sangam has focused on building an athletics program, a low-cost and high impact tool, in schools in Vanni and Batticaloa. Our goal is to help these children strive for a brighter future regardless of their financial situation. Athletics Programs teach children about leadership qualities, life skills, healthy habits and cultural diversity. Sangam should continue to expand this initiative with the help of local community sports organizations.

Human Rights Work

Prior to May 2009, Sangam as an Ilankai Tamil organization in the United States had the major responsibility of protecting the human rights of Tamil Community in Ilankai. Post May 2009, though other organizations have taken some responsibilities, Sangam should continue its work as defined in our constitution. Sangam can use its strong ties to the local communities to support human rights work such as engaging local government officials. Sangam should also continue expanding its initiatives to observe the 'Mullivaikkal Memorial' event nationwide in local communities. We should also continue our initiative of having memorial trees for the Tamil Victims planted in each Tamil American community.

Leadership

Our organization has thrived over forty years with the dedication and relentless efforts of our leadership teams and committees. In selecting ourleadership, Sangam has always followed a procedural path, especially with the critical roles such as President and Secretary. Those who take such leadership roles are individuals who have been associated with Sangam for a number of years and often volunteered as committee members for few years and then also took the responsibility in the second-tier leadership roles such as assistant secretary or vice president. This enables to them to be effective leaders when they take the responsibility of President or Secretary. We also followed our constitutional limitation of two-year term limit for each President and also the unwritten rule of not rotating the roles of President and Secretary with the previous leaders. While there is exception to these rules and norms, following these procedures will allow us to continue the path we followed for forty years.

Younger Generation

Sangam is keen in engaging the younger generation to get involved in Sangam activities. While their involvement is essential to continue our operation, it does not require us to alter our values and core principles to accommodate them. The Younger generation need to learn and understand the principles of Sangam and join Sangam to build and enhance those activities. It should also be noted that an influx of younger generation to Sangam also arrives from New immigrants coming to this country in addition to the second-generation Tamil Americans.

Sangam Center

We should take meaningful and implementable actions to have a center builtfor Sangam in ten years. For an organization, such as Sangam with forty years of rich history, a community center is an added value to the existence of our organization and such a center will also help us to march towards the hundredth anniversary.

Communication Methods

Tamil language will be our primary method of communication in our cultural programs. We use both English and Tamil languages in our AGM since the focus of the AGM is on our humanitarian and human rights efforts. AGM is attended by officials who are not Tamils and we use English language to effectively communicate with them about the needs and aspirations of our people in Eelam.

Although many of these directions and the roadmap outlined above might be overwhelming to the incoming leadership teams, we hope they will understand that these goals need not be done in a year, but over ten years with continuous efforts.
