
About the Guru...

Smt Kalaivani Indrakumar is a very popular respected violinist who is well known among the Carnatic musicians and listening public in the UK. She is not only a high calibre musician but also one of the best violin teachers with a large number of disciples.

Smt Kalaivani Indrakumar graduated from the college of Carnatic Music, Madras and obtained the title of Sangeetha Vidwan in 1973. She benefited under the tutelage of her gurus Sangeetha Kalanithy T.N. Krishnan, Anantharaman and Alundar S. Nataranjan.

She has been at the forefront of developing Carnatic Music in London for the past twenty years and has established the Natha Vidyalaya School of Fine Arts in 1988. Through this she has promoted Indian music, through violin, miruthangam, bharathanatiyam and vocal. The Natha Vidyalaya has presented famous artists in concerts such as Sutha Ragunathan and the Priya sisters.





Mathanke has been learning violin under my tutelage for two and a half years. She has been one of the quietest students I have taught however, she is nonetheless an extremely dedicated and ambitious individual who is confident in her own ability.

Srinivas, M. Vasudeva Rao and Padmashri Umayalpuram K. Sivaraman methodically and meticulously. Bhavani Shankar has accompanied many leading musicians and dancers across the world. To name but a few: Musicans Taufiq Quereshi, Sivamani, Ranjit Barrat, Talvin Singh, Nittin Sawhney, Chandru, Steve Williamson, T.V. Gopalakrishnan, Rajakumar Bharathi, Unni Krishnan, Priya Siters as well as many others.



Shri Kandiah Sithambaranathan is a disciple of Naathamani Sri Muthu Sivarajah and has also had training under Sri T.V. Gopalakrisnan and Sri Karaikudi Mani. Shri Sithambaranathan is a talented and versatile artist and is often seen at concerts playing a wider range of percussion instruments for a vast genre of music. In the Carnatic field however, Shri Sithambaranatham is regarded as a morsing specialist and is always willing to pass on his vast experience and knowledge to all disciples of music.



Gadam: Shri. N. Rajaraman

Shri N. Rajaraman is a well known gadam artist from Chennai. He had training under the guidance of his uncle, the world famous, Padmasri Shri. Vikku Vinayakram. He has accompanied many leading artists like T.N. Krishnan, Shri M.S. Gopalakrishnan, Shri. Ganesh and Shri. Kumaresh as well as other eminent artists. He is also an accomplished instrumentalist in ancient percussion instrument Gethu Vadyam and plays in the popular group Sapthaakshara founded by Padmasri Vikku Vinayakram.

He has travelled widely to South Africa, Kenya, Mauritius, Seyshell, Ghana, Singapore, Europe and Indonesia. He is a recipient at Shri T.R. Hari Sharmas's performer award from Shri. Krishna Gana Sabha Chennai in 2000 and awardee at UNESCO.



Master Sharavanan Indrakumar began his mridangam career at the age of ten and completed his arangetram in 2002 under the tutelage of Shri Muthu Sivarajah. Since this time he has undergone advanced training from Shri N. Ramakrishnan and Shri N. Rajaraman, disciples of Vikku Vinayaharan. Sharavanan is a recent graduate with a B.A. Honours Degree in Accounting and Finance. He has also recently completed contracts with Investment Bank Morgan Stanley and continues his career within the Banking industry.
