RULES TO BE OBSERVED ON APPLICATION FOR LOANS.

1.—Any person desirous of obtaining a loan from the Colombo Savings' Bank must make an application by letter addressed to "The Chairman of the Superintending Committee" in which he is to state the sum required, the nature of the security he intends to offer,—whether of immoveable or moveable property,—and the names of his personal sureties; and in case of immoveable property, the Title-deeds are to be forwarded at the same time. On the superscription to be written "Immediate" when it will forthwith be attended to.

2.—The Chairman of the Committee, on receiving an application for a Loan, will forward the same together with the Title-deeds to the Trustees, who, if satisfied as to their legality, will cause the property to be appraised, and examine the sureties as to their sufficiency.

3.—On the Trustees acquainting the Committee that they are satisfied with the security tendered, the applicant will be entitled to receive as a loan one-half, and in case he gives two or more securities, two-thirds of the sum at which his property may have been appraised.

4.—The applicant must deposit with the Accountant of the Bank the amount of the appraisers' fees on the sum applied for, at the time of making his application; but should a Loan of less amount than that applied for be sanctioned, the surplus fees will be returned.

5.—Where moveable property is offered to be pledged, the applicant will be informed when and where it is to be produced for the purpose of being appraised.

6.—The fixed allowance of the appraisers to be employed by the Bank is one half per cent, on the amount lent,—and where the property to be appraised is situated without the Pettah and Fort of Colombo, then each appraiser is allowed in addition, one shilling per mile travelling expences.

7.—In all cases where the borrower is not subject to, or the property to be mortgaged is situate without the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court, or of the District Courts of Colombo No. 1. North and No. 1. South—such borrower will be required to execute, in addition to his Bond, a Warrant of Attorney to confess judgment.

During the past two years there has been an increase of *thirty nine* labourers; *twenty nine* stated congregations; *one thousand five hundred and forty two* additional hearers; *thirty six* schools; and *nine hundred and six* children.

At NELLORE and BADDAGAMA there are *Seminaries*, and at COTTA a *Christian Institution*, where a number of Youths, of good promise both for piety and capacity, selected from the other schools, are boarded and educated, with a view to their becoming useful Schoolmasters, Catechists, and Assistant Missionaries. The Cotta Christian Institution contains *Twenty-five* Youths. The course of study pursued by them comprizes SINGHALESE, ENGLISH, (including Grammar, Composition, History and Geography) LATIN, GREEK, ARITHMETIC, ALGEBRA, GEOMETRY and THEOLOGY: in all of which branches some of the Youths have made considerable progress, and shew as good a capacity for acquiring knowledge, and as great a thirst for it as Youths of the same standing in England. *Seventy six* of the Seminarists (including *eleven* Girls at Kandy) and Institution Youths are boarded and educated at the expense of the Society.

The whole of the Holy Scriptures, and the Book of Common Prayer, have been translated into the familiar Singhaliese, and printed at the Cotta Press; besides many elementary School Books, and a large number of Religious Tracts which have been circulated, and readily received by the Natives.

The British and Foreign Bible Society have authorized a new Edition of 2000 Copies of the Cotta Version of the Scriptures to be printed at the Cotta Press, and this work is now in progress. A new Edition of the Book of Common Prayer is now greatly needed.

The prospects of the Mission are encouraging in all its branches of labour. The Congregations, though in some places small, are very attentive. The School Children and Seminarians are making creditable progress in the acquirement of both religious and general knowledge; and many new Schools, in addition to those established during the two past years, might be established, at the request of the Natives, if the Mission had the means of supporting and superintending them: fresh Stations might be occupied, and additional labourers would be welcomed by the Natives.

The fixed annual allowance made to this Mission by the Parent Society in England is £4000. The School and Educational expenses alone of the year ending June last amount to £1405-9-9: shewing an increase of Expenditure in this Department during the past two years of £325-8-10½.

WESLEYAN MISSION.

South Ceylon District.

THIS MISSION WAS ESTABLISHED IN 1814. In this division of the island it has 71 Schools, 74 Masters, 10 Mistresses, 2872 boys, 562 girls, total 3434. The school expenditure, in 1839, was £896 18s 9½d. There are 741 members of the society, nearly all of whom are communicants.

The Rev. E. TOYNE and the Rev. J. KILNER having left the Island in May last, the stations were re-arranged, that all the congregations might have as large a share as possible of European attention upon the Sabbath. There are therefore two Europeans now at Colombo, one of whom visits the Negombo station, whilst his colleague remains in town; and on his return, in the alternate week, the other Missionary visits the Caltura station. By this means they are enabled to visit all the villages in turn upon the Sabbath. The Rev. A. KESSON, A. B. has been appointed to Ceylon, and was to be ordained after the Wesleyan conference in August last.

The revised edition of the scriptures has been printed to the end of the Acts of the Apostles. The Friend, in English, and the Lanka Nidhane, or Treasure of Ceylon, in Singhalese, are printed monthly for the Colombo Tract Society, price three half-pence each. The Nidhane was commenced in July last, and has subscribers for upwards of 500 copies.

BAPTIST MISSION.

Established in 1812.

Two European Missionaries superintend the whole—1 residing at Colombo, the other at Hangwelle—4 ordained Native Missionaries discharge spiritual duties at Byanville, Kottigawatta, Hangwelle and Matelle, 4 others are now in a state of preparation, for ordination being regularly and publicly engaged in preaching the Gospel, and instructing the people according to the usual custom of the Society and the directions given in Holy Writ—Other persons also at present not intended for public preachers act as Catechists and occasionally address small assemblies of the Natives. The work of the Mission is carried on in the English, Portuguese and Singhalese Languages and in the Western and Central Provinces. The number of children taught in Elementary Schools is somewhere about 1,200; the places of Worship are in proportion to other parts of the Establishment—An increase of labour is monthly expected, advice having been given of the intended embarkation of a young man with the materials for the department connected with a Printing Office.

The school at Batticotta is taught by Miss S. F. Brown, assisted by B. Kellogy, J. Newton, and Samuel, Native teachers. In the others, instruction is given by Native Masters who have been educated in the Seminary. These are all under the Superintendence of the Missionaries at the stations with which they are connected.

The expense of this class of schools in 1839, including £60 for board and tuition of boys in the preparatory class connected with the Seminary, was £125. 14. 0.

Tamul Free Schools.

The expense of this class of schools in 1839, (of which there were 81) was £373. 15. 1. There are now 74 schools in 12 parishes—containing 2,390 boys and 422 girls; in all, 2,812.—All instruction is given in the native language which the children are taught to read and write. A small mental Arithmetic has been lately *introduced*. Christian Catechisms or portions of Scripture are studied daily in all the schools.

The prominent and avowed object, in all the educational arrangements, is to introduce into the country, to the greatest practicable extent, a knowledge of the christian religion.

The whole amount expended for educational purposes in 1839 was £1,316 13 4. This does not include any part of the salary of Missionaries.

The allowance for the year from the parent Society was £4,100 for all the expenses of the Mission.

Native Assistants.

Of this class, *not* including the teachers in the Seminary and Boarding Schools, there are now forty four employed by the Mission as Catechists; Readers, Superintendants of Schools, Writers &c.

The number of communicants in the seven Mission churches is 346.

Printing and Binding Establishment.

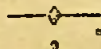

Extract from the Rules for the Management of the Post Office Department, passed by the Governor General of India in Council on the 30th August 1837.

Receipts of Letters, &c. for dispatch by Land or Sea. Letters, Papers and Parcels shall be received wherever a Post Master or Post Office Writer is stationed, for dispatch by *Land* to every part of India or to Ceylon, and by *Sea* to every part of the World with which there is a Post Office communication; the letter unless superscribed for some particular Ship, will be sent by the first Vessel that sails direct to the country to which the letter is addressed, and if there be no Vessels so proceeding direct to the place addressed, the letter shall be forwarded by such circuitous route as shall appear to the Post Master General or Post Master to afford the means of most speedy and secure transmission.

Letters to Ceylon to be paid in advance. On Letters, Papers or Parcels, intended for delivery in Ceylon, Postage must be paid in advance to Point Calimere, except in case of letters received for Ceylon from Ship, which may be forwarded Bearing Postage. If letters for Ceylon are received from Ship under cover to residents in India, such letters, superscribed, "Ship Letters" and Bearing Postage as such, will be received for transmission to their destination in like manner as if received direct from the Ship.

Letters from Ceylon to be charged Postage. Letters from Ceylon will be charged inland Postage from Point Calimere, or the place where the same are landed in India.

THE RIGHT HONBLE THE GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the following Rules for establishing a Parcel Tappal be published for general information.

It having been found expedient to establish for the public convenience a Parcel Tappal between Colombo and the principal Outstations. Notice is hereby given that from the 1st of January next, such a Tappal shall be established under the following Rules and Conditions, with a proviso, however, that the conveyance of parcels through the Post Office will be given up as soon as any establishment of the same nature shall be set up by private persons—and with the exception of the road between Kandy and Colombo, on which a conveyance of that nature already exists.

The following Rules will be strictly abided by:

1. The Tappal will be despatched twice a week, namely, each Tue-day and Friday, from Colombo, and arrangements will be made with the Post Offices at Outstations for parcels being brought to Colombo also twice a week, on days to be fixed by the several Government Agents.

2. All private parcels, not exceeding 6 lbs. in weight, and being made up in a form which can be conveniently carried, which may be brought to the Post Office before 5 on the days above-mentioned, will be duly forwarded.

3. In order that the Parcel Tappal may not interfere with the regular post, the Post Master General, or Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent at Outstations, will be authorized to call on any person sending or receiving a parcel in which he may suspect letters to be enclosed, to open it at the Post Office in his presence.

4. No parcel can be franked; all below one pound shall be charged as if they were of that weight, and the following rates will be levied:—

Double letter postage for every parcel of a pound weight, or less than a pound, and two pence for every extra pound for each distance of 72 miles, and an additional charge of ten shillings for every single letter found in any parcel.

5. The Post Office will be answerable for no parcels contain money or jewels, but for additional security any person sending such parcels should give notice at the time to the Post Office Clerk, and take a receipt in writing, specifying the weight of the parcel.

NOTICE is hereby given that in cases where private individuals may be desirous of sending EXPRESSSES, from Colombo to outstations, or vice versâ, on sufficient notice being given at this Office, or at the Post Offices at the chief Outstations, arrangements will be made for despatching such expresses, unless something should at the time occur to render it inexpedient for the Public Service that they should be sent, in which case information will as speedily as possible be given to the applicants.
