be obserred in a pround swell in the sea and S. W. breeze more steady thin the sea breeze of last month. The temperature howerir continues to rise and all who can afford it oltailu deave or excole are among the mountains, some time ago.

## MAY.

By the middle of this month genial showers usually begin to fall. The wind is steadily in the 8. W. and itowards the close of the month there are usually thunder and lightning every afternoun in the S. W. with heavy showers, each preceled by a squall.

## JUNE.

It now rains heavily with squalls from the $S$. W. The sky is often clouded for a furtnight; but it seldom rains 24 hours wilhout interanission.

## JULY.

The rains are now over and a sleady $\mathbf{S}$. W. wind blows day and night, perfectly balmy and innocent, the difference leetween the wet and dry thermometer seldom exceeding $6^{\circ}$.

## AUGUST.

Weather the same as July but sumewhat warmer in consequence of the smailer amount of evaporation.

## SEPTEMBER.

Weather the same as July and August but still warmer in consequence of the still smaller amount of evaporation. These mouths are usually cool however compared with March April and May and towards the end of this month heavy showers usually fall, which are thankfully accepted.

The Year 5608 of the Jewish Era commences on Scptcmber 11, 1847.

Ramadin (Month of Abstinence observed by the Turks) commences on August 13, 1847.
The Year 1264 of the Mohammedan Era commences on Decemher 9, 18.47.

## ECLIPSES.

On the lst of April, a partial Eelipe of the Moon visible in Ceylon, commencing at $2 \geqslant \mathrm{~m}$. past 1 in the morning and ending 29 m . past 3 A. M. ; about one-fourth of the Mon's northern limberlipsed.

On the 15 th of April, a partial E. lipare of the Sun visille over the south-castern extremity of ('c!lan (invisible at Gialle or Ballicalua; ) it will commence at Ifamblaifolle at ; past 11 and end at moon, and will require very good instruments to distinguish it, as it is little more than a mere contact of the limbs.

On the 24th of Scptember, a partial Eclipse of the Moon visible in Ceylon; it will comm:ence a little after the Moon rises at $\frac{1}{4}$ to 7 p . M and will cad at 9 P . M. abuot $\%-5$ of the Moon's southern limb eclipsed.

On the 9th of October, an Eclipse of the Sus visible in Ceylon, commericing at 89 m . past 11 A . st and cuding at 9 m . p:ast $4 \mathrm{P} . \mathrm{m}$.; about 8 digits will be Eclipsed. This Eeclipe will be central and annular across the cente of ludia alout latitude $1 \mathrm{~s}^{\circ}$.

The Society for the Proparation of tha Guspel in Forcign Parts was incorpurated by Royal Charter, in the raign of King Wibliam III., A. D. 1701, for receiving. manazing and dispusing of such funds as might bo contributed tor the religroun instructun of His Majesty's Christian subjects beyond the seas, for maintaining Clersumen in the British Colonies, Piantations and Factories, and for the general propagation of the Gospel. It has been encared in its appuin'ed spliere of duty for upwards of 141 years; and during a whole century, it was the only Alisionary Socicty in connesion with the 'hurch of England, In regard to its constitution, it is under the immediate controul of the Bishops of the Linited Church and is unitormly conducted on Church principles.
The Society has at present in its employment, Mis ionaries in the four grand divisions of the British Empire, viz., North Amarica, West Indies, East India and Australia, and the whole tumber on its I.st amounts to 302 , besides 230 Catechists and Schoolmasters ; indepen-
dently of all which its funds are made available for supporting Collegres and building Churcties and Schoola. It was in 1818 that the Society exterded its operations to Hie East. Here it lias mure than 82 Alisionaries in its service. It has moreover entablistied a Collerge at C'alcutia. called Itrishop's ('olmas noreover fortablistied a an ind:grousus Clergy, und the diflusiun of sound atid useral knowled;e ; and Grammar Schools at Aladias for the iustruction of the middle and lower clasees.

At Corta there is an Institution called the Christian Institution, where a number of Youths, of good promise selecled from the other schoo.s, are boarded and ecucated, with a view to their becoming useful Schoolmasters, Carech:sts, and Assistant Missionaries. This Institution contains I'uenty-fzro Youths. The cuurse of study pursuld by them comprises singhalese. Enelish, (including Grammer, Composition, History, aid Geography) Lafin, Greis, Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, graphy latin, Grebe, Arithmetic, algebra, Geometry,
and Taeology. There is also a Prejaratory ciass, connected with this Institution, containing Six bi,ys.
At Chumdicully there is a Seminary containing Twenty-five Youths, and another at Baddagasa, containine Fifieen Youths. From these Siminaries, Yuuths are selcited for the Corra Christiion li:s!atutu,n.
The Youths in the Christian Institution and Preparatory class at Corta, and in the Seminuips at Chendiculiy and baddagana, minounting to sixty-cight are boaded and educated at the expense of the Society, with the excepticin of a few who pay a monthly sum towards defraying the expease of their board.
At Kandy and at Nellorb there are Female Buarding Schools, the former containing Thirleen, and the tatter Thirity three Giris. The expense of these two Schools is borne, partly by the Society, and jarily by Subsiriptions and Donations.
The Holy Scriptares, and the Book of Common Prayer, have been trauslated into the familar \$:nghalese, and primited at the

The Wesleyan Institution at Jaffna has been strengthened by the addition of two European Missionaries recenily afpointed by the British Conference.
The course of study adop'ed in the Day and Boarding Schools includes, in aldition in the ordinary branches of a plain education Ancient and Modern History, Algebra, Gecmetry, Natural Philosophy, the Elements of Mental and Moral Science, and Latin.

## BAPTIST MISSION.

The Baptist Missionary Sceiety has in the Island 4 Eutopean, and 19 Natire Missionaiies who occupy two principal and 20 Sub-stations. Besides these agents there are 45 Schoolmasters and cther Native Assistants. In 44 Schoolsirstrection is given to about 995 children in their vernacular tongue. English is also taught in 3 of them. At Colombo there is a School in which 12 Singhalese girls are boarded, ctothed, and educated mratuitousiy and at Kandy there is a Day School for girls in which English only is faught. The Stations are supplied with Tracts and Sthool Books from the Mission Printing Office at Kandy, where boih Letter Press and Lithograpiic Painting are done. In all the Stations the Gospel is regulatly preached in the Singhalese Larguage, to which' in some, ate added Portoguese and Tamil; and, in the o Head Stations, Englith. The Coffee Estates arcund Kavdy and Matelie ere visited by camil preachers and Tiacts di-tributed amone the Coolies. The following scale of Red-Sea Postage, as approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Trearury in England. was establisthed to be in force from the 1st April 1844, in supercesion of the rates laid down in the Advertisciment of 8th December 1839 under instructions received from Her Majerty's Postmaster Gencral in Loudun.
On every Letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, one shil-
ling.
Un every Letter exceeding half an ounce and not excceding one ounce is weight, two shillings.
On every Letter exceeding one ounce and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four shillings.

On every Letter evcecding two ounces and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six shillugs.

And on every Letter esceeding three ounces and not exceeding four ounces in weifht, eight shillings.
And for every ounce in weight above the weight of four ounces. there shall he charged and taken two additional rate of Pontare of swo shillings, and every fraction of an ounce above the weight of four ounces shall be cliarged as one additional punce.

By His Excellency Lieutenant General Sir Colin Caupbril. Knight Commander of the Most Hunorable Military Order of the Bath. Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the British Settlements and Teritories in the Island of Ceylon with the Deperdencies thereof.

## C. Campbell.

Whereas by an Ordinance No. 10 of 1843 entitled "An Ordjnance for the Establishment of Cuurts of Inferior Civil Jurrdiction to be called Courts of Requests;" it was enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor for the time teing by any Proclanation or Proclamations to te by him for that purpose frim time to time issued to est:ablish Courts of Inferior Civil Jurisdict on which shall bo . called Couris of Requests and shall exercise Jurisdiction and be holden within such limits as the said Govertior in such Pıoc!amation or Proclanations shadl appoint, and to revoke aiter and amend any such Proclamation ur Proclamations as occasion may require.

And whereas hy a certain other Ordinance No. 11 of 1843 it was enacted that it shall he lawtul for theGovernor of the said Island with the advice of the Fxecutive Council hy any Proclumation or Proclamations to be by him for that purpose issued to establish from time to time Courts of liferior (Crimmal Jurindiction to te called Police Courts wheh stall he holden and shall exercise Jurisdiction within such limits as shall be sprecified and defned in such Proclamation or Proriz mations and from time to time to revoke alier and amend any such Proclamation or Proclamations as occasion may require. And the said Cuurt so established shall be c'ourts of Kecord.

And whereas bv a Proclamation bearing date the first day of October One Thousatid Eight Hundred and Forty-five we did among other things direct and appoint that the Courts of Requeits and Police Courts of Kands and of Kurnegalle should be established and should be holden and shou!d exercise juriediction as therein set forth and it has become expedient to amend the satd Proclamation in so far as the same relates to the said Courts of Kandy and Kurnegalle.

Now therefore with the advice of our Expcutive Council we do hereby proclaim and direct that Courts of Requests and Police Courts shail be estathistied under the nanes of if: 1 ourt of Kequests and Police Court of Avistanelie and of the Court of Requests and Police Court of Madawalatenne and hurnegalle.

And we do further direct and appoint that the said Courts of Kandy and Kurnegalle and of Avishawelle and Madawalatenne and Kuruegadle shaلd, jespectively be holden and exercise jurisdiction
within and over the Districts or Iimits set opposite to their names, any thing in the said Proclamution of the First day of Oc'0!, er Une Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-five to the contsary notu ithstanding.
