## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the

Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 27 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to abolish any village tribunal or add to the jurisdiction of any village tribunal any other village or villages or group of villages in the same or any other division :

And whereas a village tribunal was duly established in Giruwa Pattu West in the District of Hambantota, Southern Province, and it is expedient to abolish the said village tribunal :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the village tribunal established as aforesaid in Giruwa Pattu West in the District of Hambantota, Southern Province, as from and after the First day of February, 1899.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eighteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-nine.

## GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE following by-laws made by the Local Board, Matara, and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, are published for general information.

By His Excellency's command,

BY-LAWS framed by the Local Board of Matara in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Cemeteries Ordinance, No. 5 of 1898, under Section 12 of the same Ordinance.

1. All applications for graves are to be made to the keeper of the cemetery not less than six hours of the time fixed for the burial of the person for whom the grave is wanted.

2. The keeper or in his absence the sexton of the cemetery must intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one come at the same time the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.

3. Should it be necessary, for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by the other and not otherwise, the keeper of the cemetery may require that one burial service should be concluded before another can be commenced.

4. The keeper of the cemetery shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his lawful commands are to be obeyed.

5. No grave is to be less than 5 ft. in depth or at a less distance than 4 ft. from another. No grave shall be reopened within three years, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein.

6. The keeper of the cemetery shall send to the Chairman of the Local Board monthly a statement of all moneys recovered by him, together with such recoveries.

Provided that paupers dying in the Government Civil Hospital shall be buried free of charge by the hospital contractor or servants under the direction of the cemetery-keeper.

Provided also that on the production of a certificate signed by the Vidane Arachchi of the Local Board or the Secretary of the Local Board that the relations of any deceased person are not able to pay the fees herein authorized for the digging of a grave, the keeper of the cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried therein free of charge.

#### By-laws under Ordinance No. 5 of 1898, Section 12, Chapter II.

1. No burials or cremation of any person dying withing the Local Board limits of Matara shall take place except in a cemetery duly proclaimed under Ordinance No. 12 of 1862, or on premises specially registered as a burial ground or cremation ground in the office of the Local Board.

2. The proprietor or trustee or any other person entitled to the possession or control of an existing buriar ground shall apply in writing to the Local Board to have it registered, and shall state in his application the name, extent, and boundaries of the ground. and the name of the keeper.

3. All burials in the general cemetery shall be entered in a register to be kept in the form prescribed by the Local Board.

4. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, Local Board, or any person authorized by the Board, and the Inspector, Local Board, to visit and inspect at any time any burial or cremation ground.

5. It shall be the duty of the proprietor or trustee or any other person entitled to the possession or control of any existing burial or cremation ground to enclose the same by a wall or sound fence, and to keep the same clean and in good order and repair to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

IT is hereby notified that the Board of Health, Central Province, has, with the sanction of His Excellency the Governor and Executive Council, in terms of section 7 of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," made and assessed a rate of 4 per cent. per annum for the year 1899 on the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and all lands and tenements whatsoever within the towns of Hatton-Dikoya, Talawakele, Nanu-oya, Kadugannawa, and Ragala within the said Province, save such as are by the said section exempted from the payment of such rate.

Persons whose tenders are accepted by Government will be required to bear the expenses of having -security bonds prepared for the due performance of their contracts, which bonds will be subject to the approval of the Hon. the Attorney-General, but may be drawn by the tenderer's own lawyer, in which case the name or stamp of the lawyer should be affixed to the document.

11. Any alterations made in the tender form should bear the initials of the tenderers, and all tenders containing alterations not bearing the tenderers' initials will be treated as informal and rejected.
