MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, April 21, 1900, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated April 11, 1900.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklass, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib; C. M. Fernando, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 17 were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1899 to March 31, 1900, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of March.

Resolved,—That the statements, together with the Minutes of Proceeding of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's Report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Guzette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table :-
 - (a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during April, and register.
- Read reports dated April 17 by the Auditor (Mr. J. Guthrie) on audit of accounts to end of 1899, and for January and February of the present year.
 Resolved,—That Mr. Guthrie be informed that a report is required each month.

Resolved,—That the report on audit of accounts to December 31, 1899, be referred to the Standing Committee.

- 5. The following correspondence was submitted and read :-
 - Letter No. 11 dated March 31, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has sanctioned the payment of a contribution of Rs. 1,200 towards the cost of the Volunteer and Public band.

6. Report by the Special Committee appointed to consider the petition dated January 13, from certain residents re water meters, and which had been circulated and seen by all the Members, was submitted.

Proposed by Mr. Fernando, seconded by Mr. Jonklass, "that consideration of the report remain over till the next Meeting."

The motion, on being put to the Meeting, was carried.

It was also resolved that consideration of the lists of premises on which there has been a consumption of water in excess of allowance remain over till next Meeting.

7. Considered recommendation of the Health Officer that the cesspit common to premises Nos. 32-37, Hill street, and Nos. 299-300, Trincomalee street, the property of Sir H. Dias, be closed and a dry-earth closet substituted. Resolved,—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owner or occupant of premises Nos. 32-37, Hill street, and Nos. 299-300, Trincomalee street, to empty and close the cesspit on the said premises and to substitute a dry-earth closet therefor premises and to substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of March, 1900.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to submit my report for the month of March.

Scavenging.—The town during the month was clean and well scavenged.

Market.—Clean and well kept. The vegetable stalls have not yet been altered so as to be in keeping with the beef stalls. The grounds round about the market have been altered and improved by the removal of superfluous trees.

Food Supply.—Ample, and of good quality. 465 cattle, 94 buffaloes, and 402 sheep and goats were inspected and passed as fit for food.

Bakeries.—Clean and well,kept.

Boutiques were periodically inspected by me. I found the articles exposed for sale of good quality and fit for food, with one exception, in which the vendor was prosecuted and fined.

Dairies.—Two of the dairy-keepers were fined for keeping their premises in a filthy condition. The other dairies were in order.

Laundries.—In good order, with the exception of those at Peradeniya road, Trincomalee street, and Malabar street (Talwatta).

Night Soil Depôt.-In good order.

Latrines.-In good order.

Water Supply.—Ample, and of good quality.

Alleys.—Unsatisfactory and insanitary. The alley in Castle Hill street belonging to Mr. Alwis is being mproved, and the barrel drain which runs across it is undergoing repairs.

Cooly Lines.—Permanent ones in order. Temporary ones unsatisfactory, owing to want of space and ventilation.

Filthy Premises.—168 prosecutions for keeping premises filthy were entered during the month, and most of the offending parties were heavily fined.

Drainage.—Surface drains in good order. Deep barrel drains were kept in as good order as possible by

The health of the town was exceptionally good.
