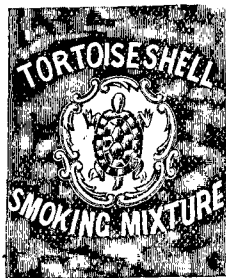

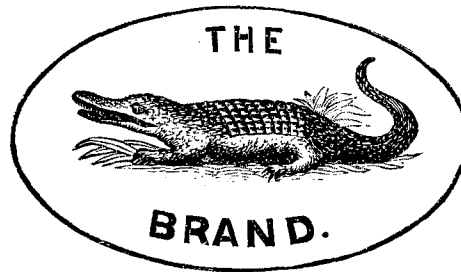

### CEYLON.

Notice is hereby given that on and after the 15th instant the following signals will be shown at night from the pilots' look-out tower near the flagstaff in answer to signals for a pilot made by vessels approaching the harbour, instead of those shown hitherto:—

A powerful electric light showing red and white lights alternately in quick succession for about one minute signifies that the pilot on night duty is disengaged and will proceed at once to the vessel making the signal.

A red light shown for about one minute signifies that the pilot is engaged with another vessel and will go off as soon as possible.

A flashing bright light of about two minutes' duration that a pilot will not go out, the weather being too bad for safely boarding a vessel at night, an event, however, which seldom happens. Under such circumstances a vessel should either anchor well out, or keep under weigh until daylight.

### BENGAL.—No. 194.

*Bay of Bengal—Burma Coast—Gulf of Martaban—  
Temporary discontinuance of China Buckeer Light.*

The Port Officer, Rangoon, has given notice, dated September 29, 1899, that from August 1, 1900, owing to the necessity for the renewal of the piles of the China Buckeer lighthouse, the light will be discontinued temporarily preparatory to its removal to the new structure close to its present site; and that from that date a light-vessel will be placed in position and will exhibit a revolving light showing a red and white flash alternately every 45 seconds (the duration of each flash being 5 seconds), and visible 12 miles approximately.

It is expected that the original light will be ready for re-exhibition from the new structure from November, 1900.

### BENGAL—No. 195.

*Australia South—Investigator Strait—Marion Reef and  
Troubridge Lighthouse.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 8, dated January last, issued by this office, the President, Marine Board, Port Adelaide, has given notice (No. 9 of 1899) that on September 15 a black can buoy, surmounted with staff and cylinder, in lieu of the black tripod beacon mentioned in the original notice, will be placed on the south edge of the Marion reef, two and a half miles south of the Troubridge Lighthouse.

A red light, visible five miles, will, on the 15th idem, be exhibited from the lighthouse platform showing over the Marion reef between the bearings N. 45° E. and N. 45° W.

This refers to Admiralty Chart No. 2,389A and 2,152.

*Africa, North-East Coast—Tajura Gulf.  
Jibuti Bay—Lights established on Pier and Buoy.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 549 of 1899) that on and after August 1, 1899, a green fixed light, visible from a distance of 2 miles, would be established at the extremity of the Residency jetty, Jibuti.

Also that a white fixed light would be exhibited 10 ft. above the sea, and visible from a distance of one mile from black buoy No. 1 on the eastern side of the harbour.

Approximate position: lat. 11° 36' 5" N., long. 43° 8' 20" E.
