

GENERAL ELECTION OF 1936.

The first State Council under the Donoughmore Constitution, which came into being on July 7, 1931, was due to be dissolved on June 23, 1935. But its life was extended till December 7 of the same year, following the promulgation of an Order-in-Council, dated May 4, 1935, from Buckingham Palace and issued as a "Gazette Extraordinary" on June 18.

The legislation empowering the extension of the Council revoked Article 19 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order-in-Council, 1931, and gave the Governor power to dissolve the Council either upon or after the expiration of four years after the completion of the last General Election "as shall seem to him to be most convenient to enable the polling of votes at the ensuing General Election to take place in or about the month of January."

The new provision was the outcome of a communication to the Governor by the Board of Ministers, dated December 17, 1934. They recommended that the dissolution should take place on November 30, 1935, and the General Election in January, 1936.

The reasons for thus prolonging the life of the Council, as stated in their memorandum to the Governor, were (1) that the Council would have a period of 8 months within which to formulate its first Budget and pass the Appropriation Bill for 1936-37, and (2) that there would be sufficient time for the preparation of the new electoral registers before the General Election.

The Governor's reply to the Board of Ministers' request, dated December 21, 1934, stated that he was

in complete agreement with the proposals and was prepared to recommend to the Sceretary of State the prolonging of the life of the Council as desired by the Board of Ministers. He suggested that a draft-Order-in-Council for the purpose be prepared by the Attorney-General for submission to Whitehall.

The actual dissolution of the State Council was, however, prolonged somewhat beyond the date contemplated by the Board of Ministers in December, 1934. Instead of terminating on November 30, 1935, it was not dissolved till December 7, and the elections instead of commencing in January, 1936, were postponed till the latter part of February.

ENLARGED ELECTORATE

In the preparation of the electoral registers a new method was adopted which greatly enlarged the number of voters. In the 1931 election those desirous of having their names on the electoral register were required to send in their application within a prescribed period. But under the new procedure the names of persons entitled to vote were automatically a registered. Householders' lists were circulated and enumerators employed as in the case of the census. The result of the change was seen in the enlarged electorate of 2.451.323 voters as compared with 1.598,610 on the electoral register in 1931. printing of registers began on September 16, 1935. and in order to complete them in time 25 of the 50 registers were printed in Madras and the rest distributed between the Government Printing Press private presses in Colombo.

BALLOT PAPER

In the closing stages of the last State Council an unsuccessful attempt was made to alter the ballot paper. It was proposed to have ballot papers of different colours assigned to the candidates. The

neasure, which was turned down on August 13, 1935, in favour of the existing system, was brought forward in order to prevent (it was said) trafficking in ballot papers. It was disclosed that in the 1931 election there was evidence to prove that certain candidates' agents had bought ballot papers and used them fraudulently.

NEW ELECTION OFFENCE

Trafficking in ballot papers was, however, made an election offence; and a new law published in a Gazette Extraordinary of December 19, 1935, imposed a penalty for the offence of a term of imprisonment not exceeding two years without the option of a fine. A person so convicted was further penalised by deprivation of his right to vote or stand as a candidate for a period of seven years.

43 CONTESTS

The 1931 State Council was formally dissolved on December 7, 1935, after being in existence for 4 years and 5 months. Nominations for the General Election were received on Wednesday, January 15, 1936. Of the 50 territorial constituencies, seven—Kelaniya, Minuwangoda, Chilaw, Kurunegala, Veyangoda, Amradhapura and Kayts—returned uncontested candidates.

POLLING DATES

In the 43 constituencies that went to the polls, there were in all 117 candidates, the largest number contesting a single seat being six—at Gampaha.

Bolling commenced on Saturday, February 22, and was continued over a fortnight, till Saturday, March 7. No polling took place on the intervening Sunday (March 1), Wednesday (March 4) and Friday (March 6).

On the first day voting took place in twelve constituencies including the three Colombo seats.

The number of contests on each of the remaining days was as follows:—

February 24—one; February 25—four; February 26—one; February 27—four; February 28—two; February 29—six; March 2—two; March 3—three; March 5—four; and March 7—four.

CANDIDATES' COLOURS

In the choice of colours, red proved to be the most popular, 41 candidates adopting that colour. Green came a close second with 40, while white was favoured by 14 candidates, yellow by 11, ash-grey by 6, brown by 4 and purple by one. In some places, objection was raised against the adoption of yellow on the ground that it had a special religious association. In these cases another colour was substituted.

The majority of the constituencies (25) had two contestants each. Nine electorates had three contestants each; six, four each; and two, five each.

Out of a total electorate for the 43 constituercies of 2,096,657, roughly 55 per cent. went to the polls. This compares with 57 per cent. cast at the 1931 General Election. It should, however, be remembered that this time the electoral registers were greatly enlarged. The voters who went to the polls this year should be compared with the total strength of the electoral register of 1931, which stood at 1,598,610.

MAJORITIES

Of the 43 contested seats, eight returned members with majorities of 10,000 and over. In 20 constituencies the winning candidate's majority was less than 10,000 but more than 5,000; in 13 constituencies the majority was less than 5,000 but more than 1,000; in two others it was less than 1,000.

The largest majority by which a member was returned was at Galle (Mr. H. W. Amarasuriya: Majority, 23,852): and the smallest was at Gampola (Mr. R. S. S. Gunawardana: Majority, 184.)

ABSENCE OF PARTIES

A feature of the election campaign was the absence of any party cries except in the case of three candidates who called themselves members of the Sama Samaja (Socialist) Party. Even the existing ill-defined party lines were obliterated. Instances were not wanting when so-called party chiefs threw in their weight against members of their own party.

Much interest in the elections, however, was shown by the man-in-the street who appeared to be keen on exercising his vote. Owing mainly to the fact that the elections were extended over a fortnight some regrettable incidents occurred. In the Matale election, an attempt was made on the life of the winning candidate, Mr. B. H. Aluwihare, and although be escaped with minor injuries several deaths resuited. Apart from this and another electioneering fatality in Colombo, election crowds on the whole behaved in an orderly manner.

OLD MEMBERS RETURNED

Of those who had been members of the 1931 State Council, twenty-six were returned, namely, Sir D. B. Jayatilaka, Mr. D. S. Senanayake, Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike, Mr. H. R. Freeman, Mr. G. C. S. Corea, Mr. J. L. Kotalawala and W. Duraiswamy (all seven uncontested); Gate-Mudaliyar A. E. Rajapakse, Mr. D. S. de Fonseka, Mrs. Naysum Saravanamuttu, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, Mr. G. G. Ponnambalam, Mr. A. Mahadeva, Mr. H. W. Amarasuriya, Mr. A. Ratnayake, Mr. C. W. W.

NOMINATED MEMBERS

On Friday, March 13, under Article 12 of the Order-in-Council eight members were nominated by the Governor to the newly elected Council. Four of these were Europeans, one Burgher, one Indian Tamil, one Moor and one Malay.

*FORFEITED DEPOSITS

Twenty-two candidates for State Council seats forfeited their deposits of Rs. 1,000 each having failed to poll one-eighth of the total number of votes polled.



ELECTIONS IN COUNCIL.

• When the State Council met for the first time on Tuesday, March 17, Mr. W. Duraiswamy, the Member for Kayts, was elected Speaker by a majority of two votes, after three ballots were taken.

The candidates for the office of Speaker were:—Messrs. Francis de Zoysa, C. Batuwantudawe and W. Duraiswamy.

The first ballot resulted as follows:-

Mr. W. Duraiswamy ... 27 votes.

Mr. Francis de Zoysa ... 17 ,,

Mr. C. Batuwantudawe ... 14

As Mr. Duraiswamy had not secured more votes than those polled by his opponents in the aggregate, a second ballot was then held, Mr. Batuwantudawe's name being eliminated. This resulted in a tie, the voting being as follows:

Mr. W. Duraiswamy ... 29 votes. Mr. Francis de Zovsa ... 29 ...

A third ballot thus became necessary and resulted in the election of Mr. Duraiswamy, the final voting being:—

Mr. W. Duraiswamy ... 36 votes.
Mr. Francis de Zoysa ... 28

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEES

On the following day, March 18, the Council divided itself into the seven Executive Committees. In four Committees—Home Affairs, Agriculture and Lands, Local Administration and Health—some Members who were chosen into them declined to

serve, expressing their desire for membership in in other Committees. But in the remaining three, the ballot selection appeared to have agreed with the wishes of those who found themselves on these Committees. The names of seven Members did not find a place at all in the Committees elected by ballot; and these:—Messrs. A. Mahadeva, A. R. A. Razik, E. R. Tambimuttu, Natesa Iyer, S. O. Canagaretnam, G. C. Rambukpota, and Mrs. N. Saravanamuttu—had to be allotted places by the Speaker to fill in the vacancies created by those who jumped from one Committee to another.

ELECTION OF MINISTERS

The Executive Committees met on Thursday, March 19, and elected their Chairmen who constitute the Board of Ministers.

Mr. D. S. Senanayake was again elected unopposed as Minister of Agriculture and Lands. Sir D. B. Jayatilaka as Minister of Home Affairs and Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike as Minister of Local Administration were also elected uncontested.

An asterisk denotes that the candidate was a Member of the last State Council and a dagger denotes a candidate who represented a different constituency in the last State Council.

The strength of the total electorate in each constituency and the separate number of men and women are indicated by the set of figures under the name of each constituency. E—Total electorate; M—Men; W—Women.

In the 1931 General Election four of the five Northern Province constituencies did not take part as the result of a boycott. The 1936 election is, therefore, the first time since the inauguration of the Donoughmore Constitution that the whole country went to the polls.

CHIEF SECRETARY

SIR FRANCIS GRAEME TYRRELL has been Chief Secretary of Ceylon since 1932, when he succeeded Sir B. H. Bourdillon. Sir Graeme was educated at King's College School, London, and graduated from



Pembroke College, Oxford. He entered the Ceylon Civil Service as a cadet in 1900. During the world war he served in Gallipolli, France and North Russia and was mentioned in the despatches. He was Chairman of the Port Commission and Principal Collector of Customs in 1926 and Controller of Revenue

in 1927. He was Deputy Chief Secretary (1931-1932). He was the Officer Administering the Government in the latter part of 1933 and again from June to November 1935.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY

Mr. H. J. Huxham has been Financial Secretary of Ceylon since 1934, when he succeeded Sir Wilfred

Woods, Mr. Huxham was educated at Christ's Hospital. He was on the Board of Inland Revenue (England) from 1907 to 1929. From 1929 to 1931 he was Income Tax Adviser to the Government of Ceylon, and when the Income Tax Department was set up he was appointed Commissioner of Income Tax, Estate Duty



and Stamps. He continued in this post from 1932 to 1934 and in the latter year was appointed Chief Secretary. Mr. Huxham's recreations are yatching, golf and fishing.

LEGAL SECRETARY

MR. J. C. Howard, K.C., was appointed early in February this year. At the time of the beginning of the present Council he had not taken up his duties, Mr. J. W. R. Illangakoon acting for him in the meantime. Mr. Howard was educated at Uppingham and graduated from Clare College, Cambridge, where he was an Exhibitioner. A Barrister-at-Law of the Middle Temple (1913), Mr. Howard was President of the District Court, Cyprus (1920-24), Attorney-General of Cyprus (1924-26), Solicitor-General of Nigeria (1926-33) and Attorney General of Gold Coast from 1933 till his appointment to Ceylon. In the World War he served as an officer in France and Flanders.

MR. J. W. R. Illangakoon has been acting as Attorney-General since the departure on leave at the end of last year of Sir E. St. J. Jackson who has since retired from service. Mr. Illangakoon was appointed Deputy Solicitor-General in June, 1932, after acting in that capacity at different periods. He counts over 11 years of service in the Department, his first appointment being in 1924, as Crown Counsel. He has acted in various judicial capacities and has now been appointed permanently to the post of Solicitor-General.
