Bay of Bengal—Orissa Coast—New Elfin Channel—Fairway Buoy shifted.

The Port Officer, Chandbally, reports that the Elfin Fairway buoy has been shifted 200 ft. east of its former position in 10' 6" reduced. Bearing of flagstaff from buoy, N. 73° W. (magnetic). Vessels proceeding to the Balasore river should come in on a course of N. 42° W. (magnetic). Transit marks on. There is at present 2 ft. reduced on the bar.

Bay of Bengal—Chittagong Coast—Kutubdia—Exhibition of the New Light.

In continuation of Notice to Mariners No. 277, dated December 31, 1898, issued by this office, a telegraphic communication, dated the 28th instant, has been received from the Port Officer, Chittagong, stating that the

Kutubdia new light is now being exhibited. The new light is a group flashing white dioptric light of third order, showing two flashes in succession every thirty seconds.

BENGAL.—No. 25.

China—East Coast—Intended alteration in character of certain Lights.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 786 of 1898) that during 1899 it is probable that the following alterations will be made in the character of certain lights and fog signals on the east coast of China:—

1. Kiutoan lightvessel. The light shown from this vessel will be altered from white fixed to white flashing every half minute.

The fog signal will remain unaltered.

Approximate position: lat. 31° 17' 10" N., long. 121° 47' 30" E.

2. Tungsha lightvessel. The light shown by this vessel will be altered from revolving every half minute to group flashing, showing three white flashes in succession every forty-five seconds. The fog signal will be altered from a horn to a siren, giving two blasts, a high tone and a low tone, every forty-five seconds.

Approximate position: lat. $31^{\circ} 8' 20''$ N., long. $122^{\circ} 0' 20''$ E.

3. Shawsishan light will be altered from white fixed to white occulting every fifteen seconds.

Approximate position: lat. $31^{\circ} 25' 20''$ N., long. $122^{\circ} 14' 0''$ E.

4. Gutzlaff light will be altered from white fixed to white flashing every five seconds.

Approximate position: lat. $30^{\circ} 48' 35''$ N., long. $122^{\circ} 9' 45''$ E.

5. Turnabout light will be altered from white fixed to white occulting every fifteen seconds.

Approximate position: lat. $25^{\circ} 26' 15''$ N., long. $119^{\circ} 56' 0''$ E.

6. Lamocks light will be altered from white fixed to white occulting every twenty seconds.

Approximate position: lat. $23^{\circ} 15' 45''$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 17' 0''$ E.

As further information is promised when each of the above alterations are about to be made, the Charts will remain uncorrected until that information is received.
