Bay of Bengal—Andaman Islands—Port Blair— Alteration in position and power of Ross Island Light.

The following Notice to Mariners (No. 30 of 1899) issued by the Bombay Government is re-published :-

Information has been received from the Officer in Charge, Marine Survey of India, dated February 23, 1899, that the light on Ross island, Port Blair, is now exhibited from a wooden structure on the north-east corner of the barracks, a large dark stone building with battlements situated on the north end of the island.

The light is a fixed white light of a greater power than formerly shown from the flagstaff, is elevated 163 ft. above high water, and is visible 12 miles in clear weather.

The height of the building from base to vane is 56 ft.

The light is obscured by the high land of Ross island between the bearings of N. 46° E. and N. 21° E.

From the new position of the light the bearing of-S. 26° W. S. 70° W. Government House is Observation spot N. 26° W Conspicuous tree on North point ... Barracks on command point N. 653 W. (Bearings are true.)
