#### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on January 21, 1899, at 1.30 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman; Dr. W. G. Keith; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.; C. P. Hayley, Esq.; N. Dias Abeyesinha, Esq.; D. G. Goonewardene, Esq.; and D. C. F. Obeyesekere, Esq.

- 1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.
- 2. Submitted letter from Government dated December 28, 1898, No. 39, sanctioning the establishment of a general cemetery at Ettiligoda.
- 3. Read letter No. A 019871 of January 2, 1899, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, forwarding for the information of the Council copy of a letter from the Health Officer of the Port of Bombay regarding the precautions adopted at Bombay against the shipping of lascars in vessels leaving that port.

Moved by Dr. P. D. Anthonisz "that the enclosure to the Colonial Secretary's letter from the Health Officer of the Port of Bombay is not quite satisfactory. It is stated in the 2nd paragraph of the letter that 'the Port Health Officer suggested to the P. & O. Company the advisability of shipping their native crews as many days as possible before the time fixed for sailing. This the Company do to the best of their ability. The ship's surgeon examines the crew at the time they sign the ship's articles,' &c. Apparently this reads satisfactory, but the Venice Conference has decided that ten clear days are sufficient on an average as a period of incubation for the germs of plgaue, although in rare cases the period may be extended to thirteen or more days. A proof of this is afforded in the last case imported into England in the British India Steam Company's ship 'Golconda' from Calcutta. The disease appeared when the vessel was near Marseilles, after a longer period than that allowed by the Venice Conference. Under these circumstances the proper course would be to ship the native crew ten clear days before sailing, or to isolate them for ten days on shore; and when that course has not been pursued, any cases of plague on board the ships of the P. & O. Company should not be permitted to be landed in the Island, and as a passage to Bombay is about two days, the vessel should be sent back to the infected port, whence she sailed."

#### The Sanitary Officer's Report for the Quarter ended December 31, 1898.

The General Health was good. In December few cases of chickenpox occurred in Ward No. 5. The Ward Inspector got information of the existence of these cases very late, after some finished their baths. There was no notification by householders, who pleaded ignorance of the requirements of the Ordinance. The ignorant public who have no opportunity of reading the Government Gazette, &c., should be kept informed of their duty in cases of infectious disease by placards, beat of tom-tom, and handbills.

Neglect of notification and failure of oarly detection of these cases were described in the control of the control of the cases.

Neglect of notification and failure of early detection of these cases must result in an epidemic. There was one

case of typhoid fever in the Fort.

The proposed opening up of cross roads and lanes in the Fort will facilitate the extension of the dry-earth system to all the houses and scavenging of house refuse. It will mitigate the nuisance caused by crowding of houses and improve ventilation and drainage.

Outside the Fort cesspits are of very bad construction. They are not cemented, and allow free percolation into the surrounding soil and pollute the neighbouring wells. Surface pollution by human excrement exists to an alarming extent.

The swamps at Minuwangoda and other places of low elevation should be drained and levelled.

Overcrowding invariably exists in mud and cadjan huts occupied by the poorest and labouring classes.

All houses with walls and roof of cadjan or inflammable material should be put into a wholesome condition or demolished. Wattle-and-daub houses should be properly plastered so as to be whitewashed.

Laundries.—The by-laws for the supervision and regulation of laundries should be enforced. Washing at

wells and unproclaimed places should be prohibited.

Milk-vendors are responsible for a large number of isolated cases of typhoid fever occurring within the Municipality, and the by-laws for the supervision and regulation of dairies should be enforced.

Bakeries are kept clean and in a sanitary state; but the quality of bread in most places is bad, due, I

believe, to adulteration of the flour used.

Hopper Boutiques and eating-houses, which are kept in an insanitary state, should be registered and kept under

strict sanitary supervision and control.

Cattle Sheds (galas) should be registered. They are as a rule kept in a very insanitary state. They should be properly paved, roofed, and drained. The dung should be removed daily or twice a week at least.

#### LOCAL BOARD NOTICES.

WHEREAS by notification in the Government Gazette dated the 13th February, 1899, it was duly notified that rule 15 of the regulations made by the Board of Health for the North-Western Province, under section 5 of the Ordinance No. 15 of 1862, has been repealed, and that the following regulation, made by the Board of Health and confirmed by the Governor and the Executive Council, has been substituted therefor:

"Public markets may be established at any place within the Province by the Government Agent by publication in the Government Gazette, and it shall not be lawful for any person to sell or expose for sale, meat, fish, fruit, or vegetables at any other place within a radius of one mile from any such market, except with permission in writing from the Government Agent of the Province or the Assistant Government Agent of the district."
