Notice is hereby given that the stone rubble of the N. W. Breakwater now extends to a distance of about

400 yards from the green light on the N. E. head of the Breakwater, along a line S. 39° W. from the green light; and that there is a patch on the rubble bank having a depth of water over it of 25' 10".

A boat showing a red light will be moored (on the end of the rubble bank) on or about July 15 next, and vessels will have to pass between it and the red light on the end of S. W. Breakwater; but in the meantime vessels are cautioned not to come in shore of a line with the red light on end of S. W. Breakwater bearing south, until the pilot gets on board.

Eastern Archipelago—Borneo, North-west Coast—Marks for the Abana Shoal.
