MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, April 15, 1899, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated April 10.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; A. Philip, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 18 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were submitted :—Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1898 to March 31 last; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Returns of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of March; and Health Officer's Report for the same month.

Resolved,—That the several statements be forwarded, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, to the Colonial Secretary, for publication in the *Government Gazette*; also the Health Officer's report.

3. A statement of tolls collected by the several collectors on behalf of the Municipal Council to the end of March was laid on the table.

The following correspondence was submitted and read :—

(a) Letter No. 15, dated March 20, from the Colonial Secretary, requesting the Chairman to confer with the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, respecting the proposal for removal of town rubbish by rail.

(b) Letter No. 17, dated March 30, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding estimate of cost of three skeleton hospitals, and asking for remittance of amount.

The Chairman stated that the estimated cost of three portable hospitals (Rs. 1,579.50) had been remitted to the Director of Public Works as requested.

Resolved,—That Government be asked to refund the 30 per cent. commission charged on the Factory estimate.

- (c) Letter No. 18, dated April 5, from the Colonial Secretary, acknowledging receipt of Minutes of Proceedings.
- (d) Letter No. 19, dated April 5, from the Colonial Secretary, returning papers relating to removal of town rubbish by railway.
- (e) Letter No. 20, dated April 10, from the Colonial Secretary, on the subject of a loan for improving the drainage of the town of Kandy.
- (f) Letter No. 21, dated April 10, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that Government does not see its way to comply with the Council's request with regard to the removal of the building adjoining the Post Office.

Resolved, on motion by Mr. Philip, that Government be asked for reasons for not complying with the Council's request.

- (g) Letter No. 22, dated April 11, from the Colonial Secretary, conveying sanction of Government to the proceeds of the toll at Ampitiya being made over to the Council.
- (h) Letter No. 23, dated April 11, from the Colonial Secretary, inquiring whether the accumulation of silt is being removed from the Kandy lake.

The Chairman stated that he had instructed the Superintendent of Works to submit an estimate of cost of removing any recent accumulation of silt, and proposed that the letter be referred to the Standing Committee.

This was agreed to.

- (j) Letter No. 24, dated April 13, from the Colonial Secretary, referring to letter of April 14, 1898 and subsequent correspondence, and requesting to be informed as to what sum will be actually required on loan for the improvement of the sanitation of the town of Kandy.

Resolved,—That the letter be referred to the Standing Committee to be dealt by them.

- (k) Letter No. 30, dated March 15, from the Government Agent, intimating that the Secretary of State considers that the Colonial Military land at Mahaiyawa should be leased to the Municipal Council on certain conditions and not sold, and that the lease will be granted for a period of twenty years at Rs. 5 an acre per annum.

Resolved,—That the terms be accepted.

- (l) Letter dated February 6, from Mr. John Guthrie, Auditor, respecting the closing of the year's accounts, in reply to the Secretary's letter No. 164, conveying copy of the resolution adopted on January 21.

Resolved,—That the recommendations made be adopted, and that a copy of the letter be appended to the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting (see Appendix A).

5. Considered application by residents at Wellate and Getambe for extension of mains along Peradeniya road beyond the water-rate limits up to the police station at Getambe.

Read report by the Superintendent of Works.

Resolved,—That the petitioners be informed that their request cannot be granted, as owing to an insufficiency of water the water-rate limits cannot at present be extended.

6. Read letter No. 3,814, dated April 14, 1899, from the Superintendent of Police, in reply to the Secretary's letter No. 383, forwarding copy of letter dated March 21 from Mr. A. Philips.

7. In accordance with notice, Mr. Vanderwall moved and Mr. Sproule seconded, "that Mr. Weerasinghe's petition, asking to be allowed to continue in office until the end of the present year, be granted."

The petition was read, and the motion was put to the Meeting. The following votes were recorded:—

The Chairman declared the motion lost.

8. Read report by the Superintendent of Works on the outlet drains adjoining premises No. 79, Peradeniya road (see Minute 5 of Meeting of February 18).

9. Read report by the Special Committee appointed to define the duties of the Health Officer.

Resolved,—That instructions be issued to the Health Officer in terms of the suggested by-laws of the Special Committee, but that the reports of the Health Officer be made monthly, as at present; also that he should be instructed to keep a diary and submit it monthly to the Council, with his report.

10. Read the following recommendation of the Standing Committee:—"That the granting of a pension to D. C. de Saram, Cemetery-keeper, be recommended."

Resolved,—That the recommendation be adopted, and that application be made to the Governor to sanction the pension.

APPENDIX A.

MR. JOHN GUTHRIE, Auditor, to the SECRETARY, Municipal Council, Kandy.

Colombo, March 28, 1899.

SIR,—I DULY received your letter of the 6th ultimo, asking me to report fully (in terms of the resolution passed that day) in what way any alleged difficulty might be overcome, in order that the annual accounts be closed earlier than they have hitherto been.

The difficulty in closing the accounts within a reasonable time after December 31 arises from a desire to have all transactions for the year brought to account in cash within the year's accounts before closing the books, such as payments to labour force, traders, and others.

Toll Rents.—The balances are always paid by Government some time in January, and as this is a large item, the exclusion of which would affect the account very much.

The system does not in any way interfere with the current work, as new accounts are opened for the following year's transactions.

It is however possible to close the year's accounts within a reasonable time after the end of your financial year, but this would probably necessitate your bringing forward numerous unclosed accounts, which would have to be kept distinct, or it would necessitate placing all recoveries into an "arrears account," which would become a large one, and perhaps lead to many a question why it is so large, and why should it be so, or left outstanding.

I would suggest that the present system be continued, it being absolutely necessary to have each year closed as near as possible, that each year be as clear as can be; that at your January Meeting your Accountant furnish you with a statement to December 31, including all transactions to that date, and another statement including all transactions between December 31 and the day on which you close the books be submitted at a subsequent Meeting.

(a) 30 lineal feet of pavement renewed in Colombo street; clearing silt from barrel drains 665 yards; 20 man-hole covers repaired and renewed; 80 lineal feet of pavement renewed in Trincomalee street; clearing silt from barrel drains, Trincomalee street, 1,000 yards; 35 manhole covers in Trincomalee street repaired and renewed.

(b) 18 cubes metal transported; 4 cubes metal spread, Victoria Drive; 3½ miles side drains cleared; half mile of vegetation cleared; 3½ miles sides reduced; 16 cubes of gravel transported.

(c) 2½ miles side drain cleared; vegetation cut back; sides reduced; purchase of cadjans for repairs of lines.

(d) Purchase of cadjans; repair of lines; supplying new manhole cover; proportion of cost of store and line watcher.

(e) Half mile side drain cleared; vegetation cut back; purchase of cadjans for repair of lines.

(f) 33 squares colourwashing, Town Hall; 26 squares whitewashing slaughter-house, cattle exposing shed; 15 squares whitewashing public latrine.

(g) Hire of bullocks for water carts.

(h) 38 cubes of metal spread; 33 squares of whitewashing main building and latrine; painting iron work; cleaning and weeding grounds; repairs to stalls.

(j) Cutting branches; weeding round plants.

(k) Purchase of mamoties, &c.

(l) Concreting landing stage, Gonawatta ferry.

(m) Purchase of plank for sluice door.

(n) Repairs to Gonawatta ferry boat.

(o) Hire of bullocks for mowing grass recreation ground; weeding grounds.

(p) Repairs to wire fence, esplanade; building retaining wall near store; repairs to wooden railing.

(q) Rail fare; Customs duty; cart hire on four latrines imported.

(r) Concreting stand.

(s) 31 cubes of excavation to straighten channel near bridge, Hospital road; supporting bridge; rolling stone

Health Officer's Report for March, 1899.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to submit my report for the month of March.

Water Supply.—The water supply has been ample, and I am glad to say that the quality of the water is good, as will be seen from my report of an analysis I made, herewith appended.

Drainage.—The drainage is still in the same imperfect condition as when last reported upon.

Alleys.—The alleys remain much in the same unsatisfactory condition. I would again urge that a beginning may be made with regard to their reconstruction as early as possible.

Cooly Lines.—The observations made by me in my last report under this head still hold good. I am glad to notice that the set of lines at Bogambra has been removed, and that a new set of permanent lines is being built near the Grand Hotel for the use of the Public Works Department coolies. I hope that similar lines will replace the other temporary ones in time, and that when they are rebuilt it will be on more suitable sites.

Dairies.—The dairies within the Municipality are fairly clean and in good order.

Bakeries.—All the bakeries are now in a sanitary state.

Public Market.—The public market is in good order and well kept, with the exception of the vegetable stalls, which require rebuilding. The building itself, I am glad to see, is being painted. When this work is over I trust the vegetable stalls will receive the attention they need.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was well carried out during the month, and the town has been on the whole clean.

Cattle Shed and Slaughter-houses.—Cattle shed and slaughter-houses were kept in a sanitary state.

Fish Boutiques.—Fish boutiques were in good order, and with the exception of two instances the fish exposed for sale was fit for food. Cases have been instituted against the two vendors of dry fish in whose possession the rotten fish was detected.

Night Soil.—When I took charge of duties as Health Officer it struck me that the removal of the night soil was being worked in an expensive and rather extravagant system. By close and careful attention to this matter I, am glad to be able to inform the Council that I have succeeded in bringing about a saving to the Council of Rs. 431.70 a month, equal to Rs. 5,180.40 a year. How this saving has been effected will be explained by a letter from the Scavenging Inspector, herewith annexed.

I may add that, notwithstanding the discontinuance of a certain number of carts, coolies, kanganyies, &c., which I considered superfluous, the work in connection with the removal of the night soil has been satisfactorily done for the last fortnight or so:

Houses and Gardens.—A vast improvement is now apparent in the condition of the smaller houses and the gardens belonging to them throughout the different districts of the Municipality. This has been brought about by the prompt serving of notices to whitewash, clean, &c. During the month 173 notices were served by the Inspectors, and I am glad to say most of the householders carried out the instructions given to them.

General Health.—The health of the town has been on the whole satisfactory. Beyond a few isolated cases of chickenpox and measles, no disease worthy of note was reported to me.

Chemical and Physical Examination.

4. Free ammonia: no evident trace.
5. Chlorine: two grains per gallon. Equivalent of common salt: about three grains per gallon.
6. Nitrites: nil.
7. Nitrates: nil.
8. Hardness: under 4 degrees.
9. Lead: nil.
10. Zinc, iron, and copper: nil.
11. Oxygen absorbed in 15 minutes at 212° F.: about 0.5 grains per gallon.

From the examination of the source of the water herein referred to, and the results obtained by analysis, I am of opinion that it is well adapted for all domestic purposes.

Darrowela-Annfield Branch Road.

NOTICE is hereby given that a meeting of the Local Committee will be held at Invery Bungalow on Monday, July 10, 1899, at 1 P.M., and that the following proposals, as well as any other business which may be brought before it concerning the above branch road, will be considered at such meeting:—

Proposals referred to.

(a) That for purposes of upkeep, the first section be extended to the Darrowela-Hadley boundary, and that the second section begin at that point.

(b) That sections 10 and 11 be withdrawn and omitted from the Darrowela-Annfield road entirely for all purposes under the Branch Roads Ordinance.

(c) That Darrowela be admitted to share in the privileges of the road on agreeing to pay upkeep on first section, that is, to the Darrowela-Hadley boundary.
