HEREAS by section 8 of "The Opium Ordinance, 1899," it is amongst other things enacted that the number of licenses to be granted for the sale by retail of opium within the limits of any Province, part of a Province, or any town, shall be in the discretion of the "proper authority," but shall in no case exceed the number to be fixed by the Governor from time to time, by Proclama-tion in the *Gazette*, in respect of any Province, part of a Province, or any town :
