Darra wela-Annfield Branch Road.

half its area, or if this cannot be done, on the whole area of 308 acres.

(e) That for sections 5 and 6 the Ottery Tea Company of Ceylon shall pay for construction and upkeep on its Stamford Hill division only, that is 138 acres.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, May 12, 1899, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated May 6, 1899.

Present: -Mr. F. H. Price, Chairman; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Major L. F. Knollys, C.M.G.; the Hon Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. Chas. P. Dias; Mr. Arthur Alvis and Mr. James Peiris

The Minutes of April 28, 1899, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of April 28, 1899, be confirmed.

- 1. The report of the Special Committee appointed to consider the advisability of acquiring the land on the western side of the Maradana road, between Symond's road and Dean's road, for the purpose of widening the Maradana road at that place, and for utilizing a portion of it for the extension of Dean's road market, was not ready.
- A letter No. 32/05757 of April 24, 1899, from the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the amendment of section 259 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, by including plumbago in the list of trades requiring licenses, was laid

Mr. James Peiris moved "that the receipt of the letter be acknowledged with thanks."

The Hon. Mr. A de A. Seneviratna seconded. - Carried unanimously.

3. A letter No. 34/06124 of April 25, 1899, from the Colonial Secretary. in respect of the question of

exemption of school buildings from rates was laid before the Council, with connected papers.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that this Council will be glad to be empowered to exempt school buildings from rates, and further that the Council desires to see the draft Ordinance proposing to deal with the subject.'

The Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna seconded.—Carried unanimously.

4. A letter No. 37/6825 of May 3, 1899, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding fresh by-laws drafted under Ordinance No. 2 of 1894, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that the matter be laid over fer consideration at the next Meeting of Council, and that in the meantime the papers be circulated.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried unanimously.

- 5. Report of the Sanitary Officer for the first quarter of 1899 was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.
 - 6. The Auditor-General's report for 1898 was laid on the table.
- 7. A statement of receipts and disbursements from January 1 to April 30, 1899, and a progress report of work done for April, 1899, were laid on the table.
 - 8. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for December, 1898, were laid on the table.
- 9. The City Analyst's report on the town water for April, 1899, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
- 10. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages, and on shops used for the sale of kerosine, poison, and gunpowder for April, 1899, were laid on the table.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, May 20, in accordance with Notice dated May 15, 1899.

Present: -J. H. Sproule, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; A. Philip, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib.

- 1. Resolved, That Mr. Sproule take the Chair in absence of the Chairman, who is unable to attend owing to indisposition.
 - 2. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 15 were read and confirmed.
- 3. The following documents were submitted :-Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during April; Health Officer's report for the same month.

The statement of receipts and disbursements and progress report of works had been circulated and were with the Chairman, who was unavoidably and unexpectedly absent.

- 4. Read statement of tolls collected by the several collectors on behalf of the Municipal Council from January 1 to April 30.
 - Resolved, -That the return be circulated with a comparative statement of amounts previously paid.
- Reports by the Inspectors on laundries were submitted. The Secretary was instructed to cause the annual return to be forwarded to the Government.
 - 6. The following correspondence was submitted:
 - (a) Letter No. 25, dated April 28, from the Colonial Secretary. repecting the charge of a commission of 30 per cent. on an estimate of cost of work done at the Government Factory. Letter taken
 - (b) Letter No. 26, dated April 28, from the Colonial Secretary, acknowledging the receipt of Minutes of
 - Proceedings of the Meeting of March 18, and connected papers.

 (c) Letter No. 27, dated May 3. from the Colonial Secretary, stating that Government is not prepared to comply with the request for removal of the building adjoining the Post Office for reasons that . appear to Government to be sufficient

Proposed by Mr. A. Philip, seconded by Mr. C. Vanderwall, that the whole correspondence be published. On being put to the Meeting, the following votes were recorded:-

> Aues. Noes. Mr. Vanderwall. Dr. Craib. Mr. Jonklaas. Mr. Creasy. Mr. Philip. Mr. Beven. Mr. Gibbon. The Chairman.

The Chairman declared the motion carried.

(d) Read letter No. 28, dated May 3, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of fresh by-laws under Ordinance No. 2 of 1894, respecting the burial of corpses in any other place than a general cemetery

Resolved, -That the letter and the proposed by-laws be forwarded to the Special Committee appointed on March 18.

(e) Read letter No. 574, dated April 13, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, stating, in reply to the Secretary's letter, that the jungle has been cut down, but the roots cannot be eradicated without exposing the steep embankment to washaways and probable accidents.

Resolved, - That the General Manager be asked in reply to have the roots removed and the ground laid in turf.

7. Read petition dated April 14 from Binduwa Dentayalagedera Kira, praying that he may be granted a reward for recovering the body of the late Miss Kenny from the Meda-ela when it was in flood.

Resolved,-That the application be refused.

8. Read proposed additional by-laws prepared by the Special Committee appointed to deal with matters connected with the water supply respecting the Municipal water service.

Read petition from residents respecting the charge for use of meters. Resolved, -That the paper just read, with the petition, be circulated.

9. In accordance with notice, Mr. Beven asked what number of buffaloes was slaughtered at the Municipal slaughter-house in November and what number in April last?

Reply.-In November nil, during April 123.

10. Mr. Beven, in accordance with notice, asked what has been the cost of typewriting the Minutes of the Council for the last three months, and if the newspapers have published the Minutes furnished them by the Council.

Reply.—Only one set of Minutes was typewritten at a cost of Rs. 28-41. The Chairman considered the cost so great that he directed that the Minutes should thereafter be copied in the office by means of the cyclo-style and sent to the papers. Neither the typewritten Minutes nor any others since sent have been published in extenso. The newspapers are no doubt satisfied with the record of the proceedings sent them by their reporters.

11. Mr. Alexander Philip invited attention to the alleged distribution of the police and moved "that a Special Committee be appointed to revise the beats with power to investigate the matter generally in conference with the Superintendent of Police. That the following Members be appointed Members of the Committee:—The Chairman, Messrs. Gibbon, Sproule. Vanderwall, and Philip. Three to form a quorum."

This was seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, and on being put to the Meeting, carried.

12. In pursuance of notice, Mr. Philip inquired why the noisome vegetation along the right bank of the stream at the 1st mile from Kandy below the railway line has not yet been cleared, and moved, on sanitary grounds, "that the Ceylon Government Railway and other owners be again asked to co-operate in having the roots of wild sunflower, lantana, &c., systematically dug up."

The motion was seconded by Mr. W. D. Gibbon.

Reply.—The Chief Inspector reports that all land has been cleared, but is again growing up, except one piece,

which is said to belong to the railway.

Letter No. 574, from the General Manager, on the subject of digging out roots has been submitted at this day's Meeting.

The motion on being put to the Meeting was carried.

13. Mr. Philip, in accordance with notice, inquired why the banks of the stream or water-course from the 1st milepost on the Katugastota road to the railway viaduct have not yet been planted up with bamboos, grevilleus, and other shade trees as desired and determined by the Municipal Council about two years ago, and moved "that the work be properly proceeded with during the coming rainy season by contract with a planter or other reliable party.'

The motion was seconded by Mr. Jonklaas.

Reply.—The Superintendent of Works reports that the banks on both sides of the stream from the bridge beyond the 1st milestone to the dharma lines were planted with bamboos, but they have frequently been eaten down by cattle; some only of those planted are growing. The portion of land from the 1st milepost to the bridge and to the north of the stream has not been planted, as it is private land belonging to the Railway Department. Some years back inga trees were planted along both sides of the road. Any more required will be planted during the approaching wet season

The motion was put to the Meeting, and the following votes recorded :---.

Dr. Craib. Mr. Creasy. Mr. Vanderwall. Mr. Beven. Mr. Gibbon.

The Chairman.

The Chairman declared the motion lost.

Mr. Philip, in accordance with notice, asked that a return be read showing what special Sub-Committees of the Municipal Council are now sitting; (2) the date of their appointment; (3) how often they have met; (4) what reports have still to be furnished, and moved for papers.

This was seconded by Mr. Beven.

which loan will be granted for purchase.

February 18.—To make further representations to Government respecting reduction of Police Force.

Meeting called for April 8, but not held owing to protracted sitting of another meeting.

March 18.—To consider question of additional roads within the Municipality. No meeting held.

March 18.—To consider rules suggested to prevent burial of corpses except in cometries. Messrs. Sproule, Vanderwall. Beven. Since appointment amended rules sent, and submitted to Council to-day.

March 18.-To consider Administration Report, 1898. No meeting held.

November 19 .- To confer with Committee of subscribers to the Volunteer and Public Band.

Resolved, -- That the following motion, of which Mr. Vanderwall had given notice, do stand over for consideration at the next Meeting:

"That Mr. Weer singhe who has served the Council as Storekeeper for the last thirty-three years be allowed three months' leave on full pay preparatory to his compulsory retirement."

Confirmed this 17th day of June, 1899.

Health Officer's Report for April, 1899.

SIR, -I HAVE the honour to forward my report for the month of April.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town has been satisfactory.

Water Supply.—The water supply has been ample in quantity and good in quality as proved by results

obtained from analysis.

Drainage.—I am glad to be able to report that the surface drains of the town were clean and cleared by those in charge of them and by the heavy rains which fell during the month; these showers also produced a beneficial effect on the deeper barrel drains by the thorough flushing they produced.

Alleys.—These continue in the same unsatisfactory condition as when last reported upon.

Dairies.—Clean and well kept. Bakeries.—Clean and well kept.

Cooly Lines.—Cooly lines are much in the same insanitary condition as they have ever been, chiefly due to want of proper ventilation and the filthy habits of the class of natives who occupy them.

Public Market.—The market is being painted and cleaned. There is no improvement in the condition of the vegetable stalls since I reported upon them in February last.

Exposing Shed and Slaughter House.—Both these buildings are in good order and well kept.

Laundries.—Those at Ampitiya are in a satisfactory condition. The others situate at Katukele, Trincomalee Laundries.—Those at Ampitiya are in a satisfactory condition. The others situate at Katukel street, and at Malabar street are in an objectionable condition, owing to want of space and ventilation:

Fish Boutiques.—The dry fish exposed for sale in most of the boutiques was good and fit for human consump-

There were three prosecutions during the month for exposing fish unfit for food.

Notices.—During the month 109 notices were served on occupiers and owners of houses to improve the sanitary condition of their houses and properties, with fairly successful results.

Health. - The general health of the town was satisfactory.
