## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### KANDY MUNICIPALITY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, October 21, 1899, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated October 16, 1899.

Present: Hon. Mr. H. Hay Cameron, Chairman; Edwin Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on September 16 last were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1898 to September 30, 1899; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Returns of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of September; and Health Officer's Report and Diary for the same month.
- (a) Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.
  - (b) That the Health Officer be desired-
    - (1) To specify each month in his report the description of cattle slaughtered (bullocks, buffaloes, sheep,
    - and goats); and
      (2) The nature of the condition of localities said to continue "same as in last report."
  - 3. The following papers were laid on the table:-
    - (a) Return of tolls collected by the several collectors on behalf of the Municipal Council to end of September.
    - (b) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries visited during September.
  - 4. The following correspondence was submitted :-

- Sanitary Condition of the Pavilion.

  (a) Letter No. 53 dated September 27, from the Colonial Secretary, asking what has been done in the matter of closing cesspits on premises adjoining the Pavilion premises; and Chairman's reply.
- (b) Letter No. 54 dated September 27, from the Colonial Secretary, requesting postponement of sale of opium licenses.

The proposal by the Chairman, that the sales take place during the first week of December, was approved.

- Plague Precautions—Hospitals.

  (c) Letter No. 55 from the Colonial Secretary, dated September 29, asking that voucher for amount claimed for purchase of hospitals be sent to Chairman, Plague Committee.
- Sanitary Engineer. (d) Letter No. 56 dated September 29, from the Colonial Secretary, relating to Sanitary Engineer, a copy
- of which, with connected papers, had been sent to each Member. Opium Licenses-Retail.
- (e) Letter No. 58 dated October 12, from the Colonial Secretary, inquiring how many retail opium shops are proposed.
  - The Chairman stated that, in accordance with the written opinion of Members on Circular dated October 14, he had informed the Government that the number of shops for retail of opium in Kandy was limited to four.
  - The reply sent was approved.
- Drainage—Loan for Improvement of.

  (f) Letters No. 57 dated October 12 and No. 59 dated, October 19, from the Colonial Secretary, respecting the loan of Rs. 16,300 applied for to cover a sum already expended in carrying out urgent works in connection with drainage improvement of Kandy were read. In the latter it was intimated that the Lieutenant-Governor has authorized the advance of the sum named, and requesting that a fresh
  - bond be sent. Resolved that a fresh bond be sent as requested, and that the Colonial Secretary be requested to convey to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor the thanks of the Municipal Council for authorizing the advance of the sum of Rs. 16,300.—Carried nem. con.

Resolved,—That Messrs. P. Lamb and T. Leighton, Plumbers, be authorized to enter any building or premises in order to examine the condition of pipes, works and fittings therein, &c., subject to the provisions of section 28, chapter XII., of the by-laws.

#### Health Officer's Report for the Month of September, 1899.

SIR,-I HAVE the honour to forward my report for the month of September.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town during the period under review has been satisfactorily carried out. Water Supply.—The water supply has been good and sufficient.

Food Supply.—Good and ample.

Drainage.—The large drains are in an unsatisfactory condition owing to defective construction, hence insanitary, Drainage. and a source of danger to the public health. The surface drains were kept clean and in good order.

Alleys.—In the same unsatisfactory condition as when last reported upon.

Public Market.—Same as when last reported upon.

Exposing Shed and Slaughter House .- Clean and well kept.

Dry-Fish Boutiques. Well kept and provided with ample supplies of good and wholesome dry fish. Laundries.—In the same condition as when last reported upon.

Cooly Lines.—The cooly lines that still require attention are the Municipal ones situated on the railway approach road.

Bakeries.—In good condition.

Dairies.—Clean and well kept.

Latrines.—Well kept.

Health.—The general health of the town has been exceptionally good. Rinderpest among cattle was not reported during the month.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

DUBLIC warning is hereby given of the existence of rabies within the Municipal limits of Colombo.

- 2. The following extracts from the regulations hereby brought into operation are published for general information. The penalty for contravention is One hundred Rupees:—
  - (a) Every owner of a dog shall, after publication has been made by the local authority that an outbreak of rabies is apprehended at any place within his jurisdiction, cause such dog to be muzzled or led by a chain, when in any public road or place within such limits, and for such period as shall be notified in such publication. The muzzle shall be so constructed as to render it impossible for the dog, while wearing the same, to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent the dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

(b) A dog shall not be considered effectually controlled unless muzzled as above, or led by some competent person by means of a collar and chain, both of which shall be securely fastened to the dog's neck. Provided that the above regulations shall not apply to packs of hounds while being exercised or used for sporting purposes, or to other sporting dogs while being used for sporting purposes and being in charge of competent persons.

(c) Any dog found in any public road or place unprovided with a muzzle, or not under control by means of a collar and chain, may be seized by any police officer or any person duly appointed for the purpose by the local authority.

- The following rules framed by the Principal Civil Medical Officer are published for general information:
  - (1) The suspected dog should not be killed, but secured in a cage and kept under the observation of the Veterinary Surgeon.

(2) Note for the guidance of persons bitten by mad dogs:—The wound should be cleansed as quickly as possible and strong nitric acid applied to every part of it.
