#### WEST RIDGEWAY.

•W HEREAS by section 22 of "The Butchers' Ordinance, 1893," it is enacted that whenever a building shall have been erected for the purpose of a public slaughter-house, and such building shall have been certified to the Governor by the proper authority as sufficient for the purposes of a public slaughter-house, the Governor may, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare and proclaim such building to be a public slaughter-house and whereas it has been certified by the Government Agent, Central Province, being such proper authority as aforesaid, that the building on Brownlow estate is sufficient for the purposes of a public slaughter-house:

(a) Greek, (b) French, (c) German, (d) Italian,
(e) Sinhalese or Tamil (classical).

Candidates for this examination must forward an entrance fee of Rs. 1050 with their application for admission, in which they must definitely state the optional subject selected not later than February 28, 1900.
