WHEREAS Solomon Orner, of Union place, Slave Island, has, under the provisions of "The Naturalization Ordinance, 1890," applied to Us, the Right Honourable Sir West Ridgeway, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., K.C.S.I., &c., Governor of Ceylon, in Our Executive Council, that the privileges of naturalization may, in terms of the said Ordinance, be conferred on the said Solomon Orner, and We, in Executive Council, acting in pursuance of the powers in Us vested by section 3 of the said Ordinance, have made an order bearing date the 16th day of January, 1900, granting such application :

And whereas the said Solomon Orner has taken the oath of allegiance prescribed by section 4 of the said Ordinance, and has produced to Us a certificate of his having taken and subscribed such oath, and of the date of his taking and subscribing the same, and We are satisfied that the said

Solomon Orner has taken the prescribed oath within the period specified in the said section of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We do hereby grant to the said Solomon Orner all the rights and privileges of a British subject, and declare that the said Solomon Orner shall, within the limits of this Colony, be entitled to all political and other rights, powers, and privileges, and be subject to all obligations to which a natural-born British subject is entitled or subject.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, under the Public Seal thereof, this Twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred.

THE following by-laws made by the Board of Health, Central Province, under and in pursuance of section 5 of Ordinance No. 15 of 1862, and confirmed by the Governor and the Executive Council, are published for general information.

They will apply only to bakeries where wheat-flour is used for making bread.

1. Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof plastered with lime mortar and whitewashed, the floor cemented, and drainage sufficiently provided.

2. No bakery shall be within 30 feet of any cesspit, latrine, or sewer, nor in a position where bad odours wafted therefrom shall reach it.

3. No place used as a bakery shall be used as a dwelling-place or for any other purpose whatsoever.

All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a bakery shall be kept clean. 5. The flour, water, and other material used in the manufacture of bread shall be

good and wholesome.

6. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a bakery shall be removed without delay, and the drains well flushed. 7. No person suffering from any loathsome, contagious, or infectious disease, or who

has recently been in attendance on any such person, or who is unwashed or otherwise unclean shall be employed in a bakery.

8. Every bakery and the management and conduct of the business shall be always open and subject to examination by the Chairman of the Board of Health and all persons acting under the authority of the said Chairman.

Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 20.

(c) Mathematics, comprising (a) Arithmetic; (b) Alge-bra, as far as simple equation inclusive; (c) Geometry, the subject-matter of Euclid, Books I., II., and III., with, deductions.

(d) One of the following optional subjects :---

(a) Greek, (b) French, (c) German, (d) Italian, (e) Sinhalese or Tamil (classical)

Candidates for this examination must forward an entrance fee of Rs. 1050 with their application for admission, in which they must definitely state the optional subject selected not later than February 28, 1900.

**`HE** Junior Department of the Ceylon Medical College is for the training of Apothecaries whose course of study shall extend over a period of two years, and who, after examination, shall be qualified to act as Apothecaries in the hospitals, dispensaries, and asylums of the Colony.
