WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things provided that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the purposes of the administration of justice, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Northern Circuit twice at least at Jaffna and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Jaffna in the month of February and in the month of July in every year:

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And whereas it appears to Us expedient that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court should be holden at Batticaloa, one of the places included in the Northern Circuit, on the date hereinafter mentioned:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Batticaloa on or about Friday, the Second day of March, 1900.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the Tenth day of November, 1899, and published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 5,657 of Tenth November, 1899, a police force has been located in the district of Ukkuwela, in the Central Province, as required by section 17 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865;" and whereas by section 21 of the said Ordinance it is amongst other things enacted that should it be found necessary at any time, after the original assessment, to alter the limits of any districts, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, to do so; and the Government Agent shall give the same notice of such alteration, and of the new rates payable in consequence, as he is required to give of the original proceedings:

And whereas the Government Agent of the Central Province did give the necessary notice of such alteration after the original assessment as provided for by sections 18 and 19 of the said Ordinance and of the new rates payable in consequence, as required by section 21 of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the limits of the said district by Benveula estate of 126 acres of cocoa in extent being included in the said district of Ukkuwela, in the Central Province, as from and after the Fifteenth day of January, 1900, and We do hereby introduce the following clauses of "The Police Ordinance, 1865" in the said district so altered, namely:—All the clauses of Ordinance No. 16 of 1865 except 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 80, and the following up to 97 inclusive.

And the said district shall, for the purposes of the said "Police Ordinance, 1865," after the above alteration, consist of and comprise all lands and high roads included within the external boundaries of the estates specified in the schedule hereto.

NDER instructions from the Secretary of State, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that the following clause be substituted for clause 6 of the Minute of 11th December, 1892:—

- 6. In case of abolition of office the pensions or gratuities grantable to a public servant whose office has been declared to be pensionable will be at the rate of one-sixtieth of his salary for each year of his actual service plus the following addition of years for abolition:—
 - (i.) Where the actual service of an officer amounts to twenty years and upwards, a period of ten years may be added to his actual service in computing his retiring allowance.
 - (ii.) Where the actual service amounts to less than twenty years and not less than fifteen years, a period of seven years may be added.
 - (iii.) Where the actual service amounts to less than fifteen years and not less than tenyears, a period of five years may be added.
 - (iv.) Where the period of service amounts to less than ten years and not less than five years, a gratuity shall be awarded, calculated at the rate of one month's salary for each year's service, with the addition of three months' salary.
 - (v.) Where the period of service amounts to less than five years, a gratuity shall be awarded, calculated at the rate of one month's salary for each year's service, plus half a month's salary for the fraction of a year over six months, with the addition of one month's salary.

Provided always that the officer who is thus retired shall be liable to be recalled to the Public Service for re-employment, and that in no case shall the number of years to be added to actual service exceed that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would bring that age up to sixty years.

THE Junior Department of the Ceylon Medical College is for the training of Apothecaries whose course of study shall extend over a period of two years, and who, after examination, shall be qualified to act as Apothecaries in the hospitals, dispensaries, and asylums of the Colony.
