By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 41 of "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that in any case in which a road or portion of a road has been constructed or partially constructed, or shall after the coming into operation of the said Ordinance be constructed, by the proprietors of any estates, it shall be lawful for the proprietors for the time being of such estates to apply to the Governor that such road may be treated as a branch road constructed under the said Ordinance, and that on receipt of such application the Governor may, if he thinks fit, with the advice of the Executive Council, issue a Proclamation declaring that such road shall be treated as a road made under the said Ordinance; and that on the publication of such Proclamation in the Government Gazette the provisions of the said Ordinance relating to improvement, upkeep, and repair of roads shall apply to such road as if it had been originally constructed under the provisions of the said Ordinance:

And whereas a road from Kadugannawa to Alagalla, in the Central Province, has been constructed by the proprietors of the following estates, viz., Allagalla and Kirimetiya:

And whereas such proprietors have applied to the Governor that such road may be treated as a branch road constructed under the said Ordinance:

And whereas the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, thinks it fit to declare that such road shall be treated as a road made under "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1896":

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do declare that the said road from Kadugannawa to Alagalla, in the Central Province, constructed by the proprietors of the following estates, viz., Allagalla and Kirimetiya, shall, as from and after the First day of April, 1900, be treated as a road made under "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1896."

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Seventeenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred.

THEREAS by the 19th section of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by the 6th section of Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred, viz. :-

- (a) The period fixed under section 7 of the said "Forest Ordinance, 1885," for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and
- (b) If such claims have been made, the period fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims has elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and
- (c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 of the last mentioned Ordinance have become vested in the Crown-

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereunder mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all times hereinbefore recited have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know all men that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest as from and after the First day of April 1900.

And We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule.

WHEREAS by section 21 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that should it be found necessary at any time after the original assessment to alter the limits of any district defined as provided in the 16th section of the said Ordinance and to increase the force therein, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, to do so:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the Fourteenth day of December, 1886, a Police Force was established in the rural district of Watawala, in the Central Province, and by the said Proclamation the limits of the said district were defined:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the limits of the said rural district of Watawala and to increase the Police Force therein:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and direct that for the purposes of the said Ordinance the limits of the said district of Watawala shall be taken to comprise and to be defined by all lands and high roads included within the external boundaries of the estates mentioned in the schedule hereto annexed, and that an increased Police Force be established in the district so defined.

And We do further proclaim that all the clauses of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," except 33 to 40 and 80 to 97 inclusive, shall be in force in the district so defined.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, intituled "An Ordinance to declare certain By-laws to be in force within the Municipality of Kandy," it is enacted that the by-laws set forth in the schedule thereto shall be in force within the Municipality of Kandy; provided, however, that nothing contained in the said Ordinance shall be held or construed to prevent

the making, approval, and publication in respect of the Municipality of Kandy of further by-laws or by-laws in amendment of or in addition to such by-laws, in the same and the like manner as is empowered to be done by "The Municipal Councils' Ordinances, 1887, 1890, and 1896," or any other Ordinance:

And whereas by section 124 of "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," it is enacted that "no by-law or alteration, amendment, or cancelment of or substitution for any by-law shall have effect until the same is confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council," and that notice of such confirmation shall be given by Proclamation to be made in that behalf, and that such by-laws when so confirmed and published in the Government Gazette shall be as valid and effectual as if they had been in the said Ordinance enacted:

And whereas the amendment of by-law 20, chapter XII., of Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, set forth in the schedule hereto, has been made by the Municipal Council of Kandy under the provisions of section 122 of the said "Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," as amended by "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1896," and the same have, under section 124 of the said "Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," been confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim that the amended by-law set forth in the schedule hereto has been confirmed by Us in Executive Council, and shall have effect as from and after the First day of April, 1900.

SCHEDULE.

Amendment of By-law 20, Chapter XII., of Ordinance No. 19 of 1896.

20. Should the Council have reason to believe that in any house or premises water from the Municipal Waterworks is used by others than the members of the household, or for other than domestic purposes, or is wasted or unduly consumed, it shall be lawful for the Council to fix a meter on the pipe supplying such house or premises, and the owner or occupier shall be liable to pay at such rates as may from time to time be determined by the Council for all water shown by the meter to have been consumed in excess of two thousand gallons for every rupee of water-rate assessed in respect of such house or premises. It shall be lawful for the Council to agree with any person to supply water for other than domestic purposes on such terms and subject to such conditions as to the Council shall seem fit.

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the parcel of land called Bogahawatta, situated in the village Medemulla in Dasiya pattuwa of Alutkuru korale north, in the District of Negombo, Western Province, described as lot B 742 in the acquisition plan No. 503 dated 14th March, 1898; and bounded on the north by Jambugodellawatta claimed by R. K. Charles Alphonso, east by Bogahawatta claimed by J. M. Don Lewis Appuhami, south by land described in acquisition plan No. 504 and Bogahawatta claimed by J. M. Don Lewis Appuhami, and west by Gurugodellewatta claimed by W. Samuel Fernando and

M. K. Silvestri Perera; containing in extent 1 acre 1 rood 32·25 perches, shall be and the same is hereby established a general cemetery to be used by the residents of the villages specified in the schedule hereto, for the burial and cremation of their dead, as from and after the Second day of April, One thousand Nine hundred.

It is hereby notified that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by virtue of the powers conferred upon him by section 6 (2) of the said Ordinance, ordered that all burials and cremations in the burial ground known as the "Teak Garden," situated in the village Minuangoda, and specified and defined in the schedule hereto, shall be wholly discontinued from and after the Second day of April, One thousand Nine hundred.

THE following communication from the Secretary of Lloyds Patriotic Fund, intimating that in the distribution of funds the Trustees of Lloyds Patriotic Fund are prepared to consider the cases of officers and men of the Colonial Forces who may be permanently disabled in the present war in South Africa equally with those of the Home Forces, is published for general information.

SIR,—I AM desired by my Trustees to inform you that, in the distribution of the funds at their disposal, they are prepared to consider the cases of officers and men of the Colonial Forces who may be "permanently disabled" in the present war in South Africa equally with those of the Home

I shall be much obliged therefore if you will kindly notify to me all cases of "permanently disabled" officers and men needing assistance in the Contingent sent by the Colony of Ceylon in order that I may lay them before my Trustees.

I have mide the following arrangements, with the sanction of my Trustees, for granting

assistance to the "permanently disabled soldiers, sailors, and marines" of the Home Forces

Up to the present time we have not been called upon to make any distribution; this will, how-

ever, commence shortly, as a considerable number of invalids have already reached England.

The subscriptions received up to date will scarcely enable my Trustees to make any "permanent" allowances, but they hope to be able to assist every "partially disabled" man to start some light occupation, by which he may be able to supplement his pension and thus support himself; and they will pay every "totally disabled" man a small weekly allowance as long as the funds at their disposal will permit.

At present, however, it is quite impossible to decide what amount we shall eventually be able to give to each "permanently disabled" man, as no estimate can be formed of the probable number

of such cases to which the funds will have to be applied.

I have arranged with the authorities of the Naval and Military Hospitals to give each "permanently disabled" man one of our Application Forms to fill up and send into this office, and to inform him that he will receive assistance from this fund when he has reached his intended place of residence.

My Trustees have decided to withhold their assistance for a little time after a man's discharge from hospital, because he will on discharge be in possession of funds from accumulation of pay, and because the Imperial War Fund will give each disabled man on discharge from hospital a small grant sufficient for his immediate wants. This arrangement will also give a man time to consider and indicate to my Trustees how their grant can be best applied for his permanent benefit.

The grants will be paid through the members of Local Committees of the Naval and Military Funds, the Officers Commanding Depôts, or other responsible persons, who will see that the best use

is made of the money granted.

In the cases of "permanently disabled" men, who, after their discharge from hospital, are in need of a short sojourn in a Convalescent Home, before returning to their own homes to make a new start in civil life, my Trustees will undertake the payment of their expenses whilst in such Homes.

The procedure indicated above would probably not be applicable to the cases of "disabled" men of the Colonial Forces, and my Trustees will feel very much obliged if you will kindly indicate to them what procedure—on somewhat similar lines—would be adopted by your Government in

dealing with such cases as may occur in your Contingent.

My Trustees desire me to say that they would hand over their grants for "permanently disabled" men of your Contingent in a lump sum to your Government to be distributed at their

discretion.
