(a) All existing burial grounds and cremation grounds situated within the limits of the Local Board, Puttalam, and not proclaimed under the Ordinance No. 12 of 1862, shall be registered in the office of the Local Board.

(b) The proprietor or trustee or any other person entitled to the possession or control of an existing burial or cremation ground shall apply in writing to the Local Board to have it registered, and shall state in his application the name and extent of the ground and name of the keeper.

(c) The keeper in charge of a burial or cremation ground, or if no keeper, the person or persons upon whose application registration is made, shall keep a book wherein he shall enter particulars of each burial or cremation, and send an extract of the said entries to the Local Board Office.

(d) It shall be lawful for the Chairman, Local Board, or any person authorized by the Board, and for the Inspector of the Board to visit and inspect at any time any burial or cremation ground.

(e) It shall be the duty of every keeper or trustee of a burial ground to keep the same clean and in good order to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Local Board, and enclose the same by a wall or sound fence.

(f) No grave shall be less than four feet in depth.
