WEST RIDGEWAY.

W HEREAS by section 22 of "The Butchers' Ordinance, 1893," it is enacted that whenever a building shall have been erected for the purposes of a public slaughter-house, and such building shall have been certified to the Governor by the proper authority as sufficient for the purposes of a public slaughter-house, the Governor may, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare and proclaim such building to be a public slaughter-house:

And whereas it has been certified by the Government Agent, Central Province, being such proper authority as aforea id, that the building on Franklands estate, Lower Dumbara, is sufficient for the purposes of a public slaughter-house : Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare and proclaim that the said building shall be a public slaughter-house for the district of Wattegama. comprising the villages Wattegama, Yatawara, Narandanda, Pallegama, Meegammana, Udagama, and Pitiagedara, and the estates called Franklands, Maria, Goonambil, Walarambe, Zululand, and Eriagastenna, as from date hereof.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twelfth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred.

**THE** following rules made by the Government Agent, Central Province, under the provisions of <u>Ordinance</u> No. 9 of 1893, in respect of the public slaughter-house, Wattegama, have been confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, and are hereby published for general information.

#### RULES.

1. No person licensed to carry on the trade of a butcher in the planting district of Wattegama, as defined in the Proclamation dated 12th May, 1900, shall slaughter cattle at any place other than the public slaughter-house on Franklands estate, referred to in the said Proclamation.

2. The building situated 125 yards to the south-east of the said slaughter-house is The building situated 125 yards to the south-east of the said slaughter-house is hereby appointed as the spot in which the licensed butchers of the planting district of Wattegama shall, as required by section 12, sub-section (1), of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1893, expose to public view all cattle intended for slaughter for a period of not less than twenty-four hours immediately preceding the time of slaughter.
 No cattle shall be slaughtered at the said slaughter-house except on such days and between such hours as may be determined by the Government Agent, notice of which shall be posted at the slaughter-house, nor until after they have been inspected and approved by the Apothecary at Wattegama as fit to be slaughtered for human food.
 Cattle rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.

5. The said Apothecary may prohibit the slaughter of any animal notwithstanding that it has been approved as aforesaid, if it should before slaughter be found to be diseased or otherwise unfit to be slaughtered for human food.

6. If on any animal which has been approved as aforesaid being slaughtered the carcase shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the said Apothecary shall cause the meat to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used for human food.

7. The person in charge of the slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any cattle which have not been approved as aforesaid as fit to be slaughtered for human food, or the slaughter of which the said Apothecary has prohibited as provided by rule 5.

8. No person shall remove from the slaughter house, except under the directions of the said Apothecary any meat which the latter has declared to be unfit for human food.

9. The fee for slaughtering shall be 75 cents for each head of cattle.
