PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 17 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever the Government Agent shall forward an application of the nature described in sections 15 and 16 of the said Ordinance to Government, together with his report as to the necessity for locating a police force in any district and as to the number of men to compose such force and the amount in money required for its upkeep, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to establish a police force in such district from such time as shall be therein named, and to introduce therein such of the clauses of the said Ordinance as the Governor and Council shall consider expedient :

And whereas the Government Agent of the Central Province did forward to Government an application of the nature described in sections 15 and 16 of the said Ordinance, together with his report as to the necessity for locating a police force in the District of Wattegama in the Central Province, and as to the number of men to compose such force and the amount in money required for its upkeep, as required by the said section 17 of the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby establish a police force in the said District of Wattegama in the Central Province, as from and after the 15th day of October, 1900, and We do hereby introduce the following clauses of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," in the said district, namely, all the clauses of Ordinance No. 16 of 1865, except 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 49, 80, and the following up to 97 inclusive :

And the said district shall, for the purposes of the said Police Ordinance, 1865, consist of and comprise all lands and high roads included within the external boundaries of the estates specified in the schedule hereto :

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this 8th day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred.

Décrète :

Art. 1er.-Les taxes inscrites au tarif minimum sont applicables, à titre provisoire et jusqu'au 31 Décembre, 1900, aux denrées visées à l'article 1er des lois des 24 Février et 17 Juillet, 1900, originaires : **Du Portugal**:

Des colonies, possessions et protectorats allemands, Britanniques, danois, espagnols, Néerlandaiset Portugais;

Des Etats-Unis de l'Amérique du Nord ;

Des cinq républiques de l'Amerique centrale ;

De Haïti, de Cuba et de Porto-Rico;

De l'Equateur, du Pérou et du Chili

De Libéria et de l'Etat indépendant du Congo ;

D'Ethiopie ;

De la Corée, de la Chine et du Siam ; **Des Philippines.**

Art. 2.—Lesdites denrées originaires des pays non compris dans l'énumération ci-dessus restent admissibles aux droits du tarif minimum jusqu'au 20 Septembre, 1900.

Art. 3.-Le ministre du commerce, de l'industrie, des postes et des télégraphes, le ministre des affaires étrangères, le ministre des colonies et le ministre des finances sont charges, chacun en ce qui le concerne, de l'exécution du présent décret, qui sera publié au "Journal Officiel" et inséré au "Bulletin des lois."

HE following rules made under section 13 of the Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, No. 23 of 1889, for the Hambantota District of the Southern Province, and approved by His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, are hereby published for general information.

Rules referred to.

1. Every proprietor of paddy land shall contribute annually either in money or in labour in the following proportion towards any work of construction, restoration, improvement, repair, or upkeep of the tank or amuna or channel or water-course or other source of supply on which the paddy land depends outside the fields, which the Assistant Government Agent after due inquiry shall consider necessary, and order to be carried out, viz. :-

Two days' labour for every quarter amunam or part thereof owned by him under the tank, amuna, channel, or water-course or other source of supply on which the paddy land depends.

(a) Provided that if in any year it shall not be found necessary to require from each proprietor the full amount of labour thus provided for, the Assistant Government Agent shall decide what proportion of labour shall be performed by each proprietor.
(b) Provided also that each proprietor may commute such labour by a money payment of 50 cents for each day's labour due by him, which commutation must be paid on or before the 21st Max

before the 31st May.

In addition to the ordinary labour of the year as above provided for, whenever the Assistant Government Agent, or person acting under his orders, shall find it necessary to call out the labour of a village to perform an urgent work of repair, or of prevention of inevitable damage, nncommuted labour either in person or by substitute shall at once be furnished by every shareholder, and continued daily until the completion of the work. 3. When Government provides a sluice or a spill or any other work of permanent improvement costing Rs. 1,000 or over, the above labour contribution shall be doubled.

4. The above labour shall be called out at such times and in such proportion as the Assistant Government Agent or any person deputed by him on that behalf may determine, and notice published by beat of tom-tom shall be held to be sufficient notice to all persons liable for the labour.

5. Before the commencement of any sowing season, the majority of the proprietors of each tract of field intending to cultivate for the season shall decide on the kind or kinds of paddy that shall be sown for that season, and the times of beginning and finishing mudding and sowing, and such decision shall be adhered to by all proprietors. Any proprietor sowing sny other kind of paddy than that decided on, or mudding and sowing outside the times fixed, shall, besides being liable to the penalty provided for the breach of the rules, do so at his own risk, and shall perform the duties of watching, fencing, &c., with the other proprietors until all their paddy is reaped. If the proprietors neglect to decide as above, the irrigation headman shall do so for them.

6. If a proprietor shall absent himself at the sowing season or neglect to cultivate his share, it may be cultivated by the other proprietors or by one of them, as the majority may decide, free of rent for that season. All the duties required of the owner being performed by the cultivator for that season, provided that such duties do not include the labour required of the proprietor under rules 1, 2, and 3, for which the owner is liable.

7. Should a case occur in which from any cause the source of supply to the tract of fields should prove insufficient, after sowing has been completed, to bring the whole extent sown to maturity, a majority of the proprietors of the fields sown shall decide what part of the tract shall be abandoned, and the remainder shall be divided among the proprietors who sowed in proportion to the extent sown by each.

8. Should a case occur in which before sowing has commenced it is found that the source of supply to the field is insufficient to irrigate the whole extent of the field, the majority of the proprietors intending to sow for that season shall decide on the extent and the portion of the field to be cultivated, and that portion shall be divided among such proprietors in proportion to their shares of the field.

9. Each proprietor shall join in putting up the fence of the field in proportion to his share of the field. The fence shall be made sufficiently strong to keep out cattle, and all cultivators shall put up the fences before commencing to cultivate, and each proprietor shall keep his portion of the fence in proper order throughout the cultivation season until the crop is reaped, whether he cultivates his share or not, unless his share is cultivated by another proprietor.

10. Each proprietor shall erect a proper watch hut in his share, and shall watch his share until all the paddy in the field is reaped, whether his own paddy has been reaped or not.

11. Each proprietor shall be allowed a share in one of the threshing-floors, in which to stack his puddy till it is threshed, and all the shareholders of each threshing-floor shall put up a strong stake fence round it, and each proprietor shall keep up his fence and watch the threshing-floor until his own paddy has been threshed and removed.

12. No fence shall be put up on any part of a tank bund.

13. All owners of buffaloes shall drive them to, and keep them at a safe distance from, the field during cultivation season, and shall have wooden bells attached to their necks, and all known fence-breakers and dangerous animals shall be yoked to others. All owners of black cattle, goats, and sheep shall herd them during the day, and tie or fold them during the night at a safe distance from the fields.

14. Each proprietor shall be allowed water from the source of supply for his paddy cultivation in proportion to his share in the field.

15. The distribution of water from the tank, amuna, or other source of supply shall be made under the control of the irrigation headman, and no person shall issue, distribute, out off. divert, or use in any manner the water, except under the direction of, or with the consent of, the irrigation headman.

16. In distributing water from any source of supply to the fields in a tract, the water shall first be taken to the fields on the higher level, and thence to those on lower levels, and no one shall in any way interfere to the prejudice of others with the distribution of water.

17. No proprietor shall take water for any other purpose than paddy cultivation without the consent of all the other proprietors.

18. Water-courses and channels within the fields shall be kept in proper order by the owners of the lands through which they flow.

19. The bunds of all tanks shall be divided equally among the proprietors of lands under them, and each proprietor shall keep the portion assigned to him always free from jungle, brushwood, and overgrowth of every description, and from white ants' nests, and also shall keep such portion properly turfed.

20. The tank bed may be cultivated when the majority of the proprietors under it so decide with the permission of the Assistant Government Agent. Unless the majority decide to cultivate the tank bed, and the permission of the Assistant Government Agent is obtained, no proprietor shall cultivate the tank bed or any portion thereof.

21. No person other than the proprietors or persons acting on their behalf shall fish in the paddy fields or in the tank belonging to them.

22. Cattle found upon a tank bund or bank of an irrigation channel shall be liable to be seized and handed over to be dealt with by the Gansabhawa, which shall have power to impose a fine on the owner, in addition to the sum awarded for the damage done and cost of maintenance.

23. No person shall commit any act in opposition to these rules, or whereby damage may accrue to any of the proprietors within the Hambantota District, or which causes damage to any irrigation work.

24. Every proprietor shall pay to the irrigation headman over his lands a huwandiram or commission at the rate of 10 kurunies of paddy for each amunam's extent sown by him for each harvest.

25. Any custom now existing relating to paddy cultivation, not expressly provided for in these rules and not opposed thereto, shall have the force of these rules and be considered part of them.

26. The above rules are not to apply to the irrigation systems of Walawe and Tissa, for which special rules have been framed.
