

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## HISTORY OF SRI LANKA SCOUTING

SRI LANKA SCOUT ASSOCIATION

Scouting was started in Sri Lanka 109 years ago in 1912, initiated by a British colonial civil engineer Mr. F. G Stephen then residing in the Matale Administrative District in the Central Province. Within a few years the movement spread to other parts of the island more



particularly to the administrative districts of Kandy, Colombo, Galle and Jaffna

At the time of Mr. Stephen's departure from the Island in 1945, branch associations had been opened in several other districts making a total of 20 Branch Associations. The Ceylon Scout Council was enacted by Act No. 13 of 1957 and known as Ceylon Scout Association which is presently known as Sri Lanka Scout Association. The National Headquarters was at No. 121, Baladaksha Mawatha, Colombo 2 and in 1980 was shifted to the present location at No. 65/9, Sir Chittampalam A. Gardiner Mawatha, Colombo 2 as the land was acquired by the state.

The first Jamboree was held in Sri Lanka in Colombo in the Year 1959. This was followed by eight other National Jamborees held in Colombo, Anuradhapura, Balapitiya (Galle), Nuwara Eliya, Kurunegala, Kandy, Hambantota, and Jaffna. In addition to these National Jamborees, held as far as possible in intervals of four Years, the Association also staged the 1st SAARC Jamboree in 1990 with the participation of several National Scout Organisations in the Indian subcontinent, and also hosted one SAF Friendship Camp. The Sri Lanka Centenary Scout Jamboree and the 29th APR Jamboree was held in 2012 in Dambulla with the participation of over 900 overseas Scouts, Leaders and Officials, in which Jamboree a special 3 day package was introduced to Leaders and Officials for the first time from overseas which is now continued in all APR and most other Jamborees. In addition the SLSA has been organizing National Cubborees and Rover Moots regularly.

On 2nd September 2009 the Foundation Stone was laid for a 6 storied building with a basement car park and on 22nd December 2015 the said building "B P House" was ceremonially declared opened. Opening the movement out for Girls was a new step for the organization and this was cautiously implemented in

stages with the first Girl recruits being enrolled as Cubs on a proposal made by the then Chief Commissioner.


In 2009 the stage was set for enrolling Girl Scouts in the age group of 12 to 17. By the time of planning the APR Jamboree in 2012, Girls in Scouting had a membership of 5500 including leaders and had by then enjoyed camping experience having attended two national Jamborees and also taken part in 3 overseas friendship camps in Bhutan, Bangladesh and India. The Two training centers, Lee Dassanaike Training Center in Mirigama and Pedro Camp Site in Nuwara Eliya are regularly maintained and used by both Scouts and Leaders.

SLSA has organized and hosted several APR Workshops and apart from hosting the 29th APR Jamboree, organized and hosted the 8th APR Top Leader's Summit in Negombo in 2014 where all Top Leaders from the APR Region, the World Scout Committee and World Scout Bureau attended. In addition the WOSM Governance Task Force Meeting was also held in Marawila in 2014.

The first Sri Lankan, Janaprith Fernando was elected to the Asia Pacific Regional Scout Committee in 2012 and, in 2017, was elected to the World Scout Committee at the World Scout Conference in Baku, Azerbaijan. The SLSA continued its activities even during pandemic which started in March 2020 and organized many online programmes for scouts and leaders. The 1st ever Global Cultural Jamboree organized fully virtually in July 2021, had a participation of almost 24,000 scouts from over 100 countries. SL Scouts 110 Year Celebrations were held on 23rd December

2022 simultaneously in all districts conducting processions, model camps and campfires where over 35,000 scouts participated.

The SLSA is a leading National Scout Organisation out of the 173 member nations of the World Organisation of the Scout Movement and a part of the Asia Pacific Region.

We owe this accomplishment to the chairman and the executive committee of the council for fostering an environment that made it possible to carry out tasks and make decisions without any interruption.

Due to the council's chairman, chief commissioner, and the other commissioners, we were able to achieve the outcomes we had predicted for the year successfully.

Also, we have observed a sharp increase in the number of girls participating in scouting, Rover Scouts, Cub Scouts, and Sigithi Scouts, which has increased their visibility and awareness among the general public, including decision-makers, educators, and parents.

With the participation of the SLSA office holders and scouts representing all levels completed, H.E. Ranil Wickramasinghe, President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, was installed as Chief Scout during this time. He pledged his full support and asked for an increase in membership to 200,000 by the year 2024.

During this period syllabuses were also updated, new Proficiency Badges, including the Prime Minister's Badge, were implemented, and the training department's capacities were expanded in terms of both quantity and quality.

The SLSA event commissioners have been instructed to maintain all financial matters accountable and transparent by being reasonable and cautious with their spending.

During the reporting period, council was alerted about external and internal treats and man-made disputes and natural disasters and we were able to mitigate threats reasonably with the support of in-house experts.

Further, a number of special expert committees were appointed to look into the problems and weakness of certain sections, amoung them 'scout shop committee' took a lead role and have been very much actively involved in solving issues.

In this sense all are invited to practice utmost efforts and professionalism to safe guard and maximise usage of the limited resources of the movement.

I take this opportunity extend my courtesy to Chief Commissioner and all committees set-up to organize 10th National Jamboree planned to be held in Trincomalee district in 2024.

A mini museum was established to archive the valuable items belongs to the movement, also, explored the possibility in uplifting level of training up to graduation.

I take this opportunity to thank all organizing committees for their dedicated voluntary services, Officials of the branch Association, scout masters, District Commissioners and their teams, national and head-quarters level commissioners, parents, commercial establishments, auditors who rendered their valuable services to make skill full youths.

That shows and encourages me to see that, most members in the council as well as majority of senior commissioners have accepted my way, I worked in this position previously. Hence, I seek every one of you to extend your co-operation to me in maintaining transparency, good controls, honesty and improve this great movement further this year too.

#### **CHIEF COMMISSIONER'S REPORT**



# Mr Janaprith Fernando CHIEF COMMISSIONER

The year began on a positive note with the pandemic getting under control and institutions which were closed, opening gradually. A calendar packed with events and activities was prepared for all sections of the Sri Lanka Scout Association to be in active service and participation.

We identified the main areas we have to focus on during the year as:-

- a) Membership Growth
- b) Financial Discipline
- c) Quality of Scouting
- d) Transparency & Visibility
- e) Strengthening District Branches

#### Membership Growth

As per the Strategic Plan of SLSA and WOSM, we have to reach a membership target of 108,000 by year 2023 and we have been working towards achieving this. Our membership in 2021 was 52,266 and we have been able to reach a membership of 93,639 for 2022, The growth has been seen in all 4 sections of the movement. However, we have not seen a significant growth in the Senior Scout section.

Conferences for ADCs of Districts in charge of each subject was held separately organized by the Commissioners of NHQ and Department Heads during the year with emphasis on the required growth targets and that, we believe, is the success and the co-operation received from DCs and ADCs.

#### Financial Discipline

Having gone through few years of expenses over income (deficit) on a high note, we decided to introduce strict financial controls. A part time Internal Auditor's services were engaged and a Finance Committee comprising Accounting Professionals was formed. We introduced Travel Re-imbursement

policy for all projects and events, continued the conference daily expenses per person formula, collected the Management fee from the Developer without much delay and followed the procedure of obtaining a minimum of 3 quotations for all purchases. We had to be even more cautious during the year on the management of our finances as our income from the Service and Relationship Week was reduced by half to only 10% and also as we conducted 4 large National Events which involved both the Scouts and Scout Leaders from the entire country. We practice a method of finalizing all event accounts within 2 weeks of the conclusion of the project. The Annual Accounts which is part of this Report will show the results we have achieved.

The Scout Shop which recorded losses in the past few years had to be made into an profit making entity whilst rendering a service to the scouts. Several stringent methods had to be introduced on the purchases, credit been given to customers and the maintaining of the stock. We appointed a senior staff member to manage and run the shop under the supervision of a HQC & Internal Auditor and all these changes have proved to be successful and the Scout Shop has recorded a profit of almost 3 million during the year.

#### Quality of Scouting

We noticed that the quality and standard of majority of Scouts had dropped as a result of not having physical Scouting, camps and district rallies. The National Training Department under the 2 NTS's took steps to introduce new methods of training and improve the quality of leader's training. The National Programme Department under the NPC took steps to expeditiously introduce and implement the New Scout Programme. Through both these measures we have seen a marked improvement in the standard but, more work needs to be done in several districts.

The President's Award interview process was streamlined and conducted by the ACC in charge at provincial level, Advanced Courses were held in both camp-sites at Pedro and Mirigama. The Gold Star interviews for Cubs are conducted at District level by the ADC Cubs of the districts.

We introduced an Induction & Orientation Ceremony for all members of the Committee of the Council and all members took an Oath of Office as required by GSAT of WOSM. For the first time in our history an Open Call was made to recruit Assistant HQCs below the age of 30 years and we appointed 4 young adults as AHQCs during the year.

The Safe from Harm Policy (SfH) is fully implemented and complaints received by the SfH team are proceeded with. In addition, all genuine complaints received are also investigated and inquired into by Boards of Inquiry which are appointed.

The SLSA undertook to be subjected to a Global Support Assessment Tool (GSAT) audit in order to ascertain the position of our NSO. Preparation work for the audit began under 10 team heads co-ordinated by the DCC. We continued the Annual Appraisal system for all NHQ Commissioners, DCs and NHQ staff.

#### Transparency & Visibility

Another important area the SLSA focused our attention is Transparency. Monthly meetings of the Senior Management Team (SMT), Headquarters Commissioners (HQC Meeting) and Committee of the Council meetings were held monthly. Most meetings were physical whilst on some occasions we conducted them on Hybrid basis. Important matters are discussed, well debated sometimes, then decided and implemented. All decisions taken at meetings are recorded in the form of minutes and secured for future reference. Almost all request for documents held by

the NHQ have been issued to anyone requesting. All circulars are sent with reference number on most occasions in all 3 languages.

In order to be transparent and visible, SLSA has focused much on the social media platforms. We made an Open Call to recruit young members to the media which had a very large number applying and after an interview process a team of around 40 was formed. Our Web-Site has been updated regularly and all current affairs of SLSA and scouting are uploaded. The SLSA is active on Facebook, Instagram and other social media platforms. A Quarterly E-Newsletter is been published and circulated widely.

SLSA events and activities both at National level and district level receive wide publicity in both print and electric media. However, we are focusing more in the areas of social media platforms.

#### Strengthening District Branches

Out of the 37 districts there were 5 districts which were inactive at the beginning of the year. We were able to activate all 37 districts and our officials and I have visited all districts in the country. Moving forward from the District Office Bearers Conference held in 2021, we were able to hold Annual General Meetings of most districts during the year

One main problem of the districts was that the Assistant District Commissioners, District Scout Leaders and majority of Scout Leaders not having their Warrants of Appointment. Both ACC District Coordination and Administration have been able to resolve this matter and we have been able to renew over 90% of the warrants received for 2022. However, we have received some complaints of the Branch Association Committees and few ADCs in districts not cooperating with the DC and obstructing the progress of the districts. There have also been complaints from

ADCs and senior district leaders against DCs who do not obtain their services due to personal grievances. We have requested the Act & Rules Sub-Committee to look into this matter and introduce Rules in order to prevent the above taking place in districts.

#### National Events held during the Year

#### International Mother Language Day

The International Mother Language Day was celebrated on 21st February. The event was organized jointly with the Bangladesh High Commission in Sri Lanka at the Independence Square. The Chief Guest was the Hon. Prime Minister. The Annual Blood Donation Campaign also jointly organized was held for the 6th Consecutive year at the Sir John Kothalawala University Hospital in Werahara and the Chief Guest was the High Commissioner for Bangladesh in Sri Lanka H.E. Tareq M Ariful Islam and Madam Islam. This project was sponsored by the Bangladesh High Commission.

#### President's Scouts Parchment Award Ceremony

The Awarding of Parchments to President's Scouts which had not taken place for 4 years was held on 23rd February. The main ceremony was held under the auspices of the Chief Scout H.E. Gotabaya Rajapaksa at the Presidential Secretariat. For the first time in the history of any NSO, nine ceremonies were held simultaneously in the provinces under the Governors and the main ceremony was connected on zoom to the 9 provinces and the provincial ceremonies were connected to the main ceremony. Over 749 were awarded their certificates.

#### DC Conference

The Annual District and Headquarters' Commissioners Conference was held on 26th and 27th March 2022 at the Blue Water Hotel, Wadduwa. Education Ministry Secretary Prof. Kapila Perera was the Chief Guest. The 2 day programme included sessions by all sectional heads, training by an external Resource Person, Awarding of Presidents Award parchments and a Farewell for immediate past Chief Commissioner Major General Milinda Peiris.

#### SL Scouts Care - Distribution of Infant Milk Powder

The SL Scouts Care Project continued under another Phase. Funding of over USD 3,900 was received from Malaysia Ceylon Provident Fund Society through an Assistant Chief Commissioner of Malaysia Scouts to purchase and distribute Infant Milk Powder to needy families. This project was conducted in 10 districts spending the entire sum on Milk Powder without spending any money for transport or administration

specially during the period there was no Milk Powder of any kind available in the Country.

#### SL Scouts Care - Community Kitchen Project

With the shortage of fuel, LP Gas and several food items, the SLSA was determined to contribute towards the welfare of the needy families in the districts. With this intention we introduced the concept of 'Community Kitchen Project'. Under this project over 110 projects were conducted in 14 districts where a nutritious meal, soup and bread and other cooked food was distributed to the needy by the Districts. The Bangladesh High Commission made a significant contribution towards this project.

#### SAANSO Leader Trainer's Conference

The South Asia National Scout Organization's Leader Trainers Conference was held from 15th to 17th July at Goldi Sands Hotel, Negombo. Several VIP's including the Regional Director of APR Mr. J R C Pangilinan, SAANSO Secretary General Mr. Abdullah Rasheed, Additional National Chief Commissioner BSG (India) Mr. Mohamed Ali Khalid, International Commissioner Dr. Mukhyyuddin Bin Sarwani and Senior Commissioners of SAANSO NSOs were present. This Conference was held as a Hybrid event and was organized by the NTC.

#### National Scout Awards Ceremony

After a lapse of almost 5 years the National Awards Ceremony was held on 17th July at Goldi Sands Hotel, Negombo to recognize Adults who have contributed towards the development of Scouting in Sri Lanka. Due to the large number of recipients the ceremony was held under 3 sessions where the Chief Guests were the High Commissioner for Bangladesh in Sri Lanka, The High Commissioner for Malaysia in Sri Lanka and the Ambassador for the Royal Kingdom of Thailand in Sri Lanka. Over 700 awardees received their medals and certificates. The selection of awardees was done by a committee comprising of 5 Past Silver Lion recipients chaired by the DCC. The following were awarded the Silver Lion the Highest Award in Sri Lanka.

#### 13th National Cubboree

The 13th National Cubboree organized by the ACC Cubs and her team was held from 16th to 18th September. This event was held on a different format where the main event was held at S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia under the auspices of the Ambassador for the Republic of Korea, 241 camps at district and group level were held simultaneously with the programme been handled from the main camp. Over 12,000 cubs attended this event which had several sponsors from the corporate sector and the 16th Colombo Scout Group.

# 'Piyawara' – A Step towards nature. (Plastic Recycling Project)

The said project initiated under the Messengers of Peace (MOP) Coordinator was launched 1st October at the Mount Lavinia Beach by conducting a beach cleanup and collecting plastic bottles. The plastic bottles collected by Scouts will be paid for so that the Scouts could earn some pocket money and the plastic bottles recycled for the manufacture of yarn for the producing of Scout scarves. This project is supported by the Bangladesh High Commission, Aqua Fresh – Access Natural Water (Pvt) Ltd and ECO Spindle (Pvt) Ltd.

#### Investiture Ceremony of the Chief Scout

The Investiture Ceremony of the Chief Scout His Excellency Ranil Wickramasinghe President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka was held on 21.11.2022 at the Presidential Secretariat. The Chief Scout was invested by placing the Sri Lanka Scout Scarf after the renewal of the Scout Promise by all those present. The Chief Commissioner presented a brief report of the activities carried out and the plan for the year 2023. H.E. the President in reply sated that he is fully supportive of Scouting as he is aware that it is one of the most important youth movements in the world and requested SLSA not to stop at reaching 108,000 members by 2023 but to have a target of 200,000 by 2024 and that the President and the government specially the Ministries of Education and Youth Affairs would be directed to give the fullest support to SLSA. The Senior Commissioners and key officials of the Council attended this event. Wide media coverage was received for this ceremony.

#### First National Kiddoree

The First National Kiddorree was held at the Vihara Maha Devi Park, Colombo 7 organized by the ACC Singithi and her team on 26th November. The Chief Guest was the High Commissioner for Bangladesh in

Sri Lanka. Over 6,000 Singithi Scouts and Leaders attended the half day programme. Several corporates sponsored this event and each participant received items valued at almost Rs.4,000/-. Participants from all the provinces attended the Kiddorree which was jointly supported by the Homagama and Colombo District Branches.

#### Scouting in New Communities (SNC) Project

On an application submitted by SLSA, the WOSM MOP approved the said project to re-introduce Scouting in 10 districts where either scouting had come to a halt or inactive. The following districts were selected. Ampara, Point Pedro, Mannar, Monaragala, Puttalam, Wennappuwa, Polonnaruwa, Chilaw, Anuradhapura, Nuwaraeliya.

The Project is Managed by a HQC and the APR has pledged a sum of USD 23,000/- of which 40% was received and used for stage 1 of the project. The Project consist of conducting a Conference for Zonal Education Department Authorities and School Principals in the 10 districts. The participation of children in activities organized under the SL Scouts 110th Anniversary Celebrations, Conducting of Phase 1 Leader Training Courses for Singithi and Scout Section and commencing of new Scout Groups.

#### SL Scouts 110

The Sri Lanka Scout Association celebrated its 110th Anniversary in a grand scale throughout all Scout districts of Sri Lanka on 23rd December. All districts organized a walk/parade with posters carrying messages under the 'Better World Framework', Poster Competitions, Rallies, Model Camps and Grand Camp-Fire in the main cities. Over 35,000 Scouts participated in activities throughout the nation, Every event was attended by a Commissioner from the National Headquarters. All Scouts who actively participated in the event were entitled to wear the SL 110 badge on their uniform.

#### Cub Scouting for Everyone

This project under the leadership of ACC Cubs to increase the number of Cub Scouts by 33% funded by the WOSM APR MOP was an overwhelming success where the target expected was 29,630 but topped 35,814 cubs.

#### Service and Relationship Month 2022

The Service and Relationship Month 2022 was held during the period of 1st to 31st of August. As in the previous year on the request of the DCs the Scouts were issued Job Cards on an individual basis, through their districts to the Scout Groups. As decided the NHQ allocation was only 10% of the income, 30%

to the districts and 60% to the Scout/Scout Group. This project is well received by both the Scouting community and the general public of Sri Lanka, specially in districts where it is properly planned and implemented. The total collection from the country exceeded Rs. 33 million and the highest collection of over Rs. 5 million was from Homagama District Branch of SLSA.

#### **Chitral Amaratunga Memorial Committee Room**

We received a donation of office furniture, computers and other equipment valued at over Rs. 4 million from Mrs. Pushpa Amaratunga AAL the wife of late Mr. Chitral Amaratunga AAL and former President of SL Scout Council, in memory of Mr. Amaratunga. All items of furniture and equipment have been inventoried and been used at the NHQ Office. We decided to name the Scout Council room in Memory of Mr Chitral Amaratunga and it has been named after him. We are very thankful to Mrs. Amaratinga for this donation.

All Department Heads have submitted Reports of the Activities, Projects and Progress made by their respective departments which will give an overview of the successful activities carried out by SLSA during the year under review.

The implementation of the Strategic Plan was been carried out by DCC. The monitoring is been done periodically. The Singithi section and Girls in Scouting sections headed by ACC Singithi and HQC are also experiencing a growth due to several projects and workshops been conducted. The Rover section has seen a large growth and we expect further growth. The new Youth Programme we are convinced will strengthen and grow the Scout section and the retention of Scouts.

I thank the two Chief Scouts Their Excellencies the Presidents of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and the officials at the Presidential Secretariat, The Secretary and officials of the Ministry of Education for the cooperation extended to us. I thank all the District Commissioners for their unity and unstinted support extended to me during this period and thank the DCC, all my brother and sister Senior & all NHQ Commissioners, the President of the Scout Council, The Chairman of the Committee of the Council, The Hony. Secretary, Hony. Treasurer & members of the Committee of the Council, the Chairmen & members of Sub-Committees, the Executive Secretary and the staff of SLSA for the co-operation extended to me in carrying out my duties during the period.

Ms Wathsala Wijewickrana completed her tenure as ACC after serving for a period of 6 years and her dedicated service is very well appreciated and remembered by all at NHQ. As one of the Senior Commissioners who served SLSA in many capacities for a long period, we wish her all success in all her future endeavours.

Mr Sampath Kariyawasam has completed 3 years with the committee of the Council as Hony Treasurer and have fulfilled all his responsibilities to the complete satisfaction of the Committee, Chief Commissioner and other Commissioners. #### Mr M F S Muheed DEPUTY CHIEF COMMISSIONER

I was appointed as Deputy Chief Commissioner with effective from 1st February 2022 and assumed duties officially on 5th March 2022. I am thankful to Chief Commissioner Attorney at Law Mr. Janaprith Fernando for having selected me as his Deputy and hope to carry out my duties to the best of my abilities.

#### **Strategic Plan 2021 – 2023**

The Strategic Plan prepared in 2021 for 3 years during the period of former Chief Commissioner Major General Milinda Peiris to reach the membership target of 108,500 by end of 2023 had to face obstacles in 2021 due to the Covid 19 Pandemic and periodical closure of schools of not being able to get correct census figures. In 2022 and we were able to reach a membership of 93,639 progressing from the figure of 64,807 in 2020. We are hopeful to reach another 14,861 by end of 2023 to reach the Strategic Plan target.

#### **WOSM - Assessment - GSAT Audit**

SLSA was requested to undertake the Audit under 10 dimensions and I was appointed as Coordinator by Chief Commissioner.

Ten teams were appointed and prepared for it from October 2022 onwards after meetings with facilitator and APR officials. All details were uploaded with evidence till December 2022 to face the physical audit in January 2023. Once the Audit is successful, we will get the certification which will enhance the credibility of our Association.

I wish to thank all Team Leaders and members of their teams for the hard work done. My special thanks to AVM Andrew Wijesuriya, Headquarters Commissioner and Mr Sashika Munasinghe, Assistant Headquarters Commissioner the uploading of evidence and the follow up.

#### 'Nutrivention' Project of UNICEF

This project initiated by UNICEF is a joint project with Sarvodaya and SLSA. The main objective being to improve the nutrition level of the communities through the scout groups. Initial training of the Scout Leaders is in progress via zoom who will train the scouts for the implementation. The project period is 6 months. Dr. Rajeev Pagoda, Headquarters Commissioner is coordinating the project.

#### **United Nations Volunteers (UNV)**

We are continuing to participate in activities organized by the UNV. Dr. Asanka Eriyawa, HQC and I attend meetings representing SLSA. We are also members of the Steering Committee for the V Net project connecting all volunteer organisations.

#### **Tamil Translations**

All circulars are translated and sent in Tamil Language translated by our Tamil translator at NHQ office. We give below the activities conducted by the National Training Division during the year 2022 for your information.

#### **Setting up of National Training Website**

National Training Division website is now well in operation we requested officials updating the National Site of the Scout Association to copy all information of this site to the National Website. The thinking behind this site was to activate the usage of Information Technology to blend with Scouting, so that it ideally suits conditions arising after the pandemic and into the future. We earnestly believe that this move contributed to the promotion of online activities in a big way.

# Strengthening the National Training Division Administration

Four Secretaries (one for each section), support the National Training Commissioner with Director of the National Training Division. We believe that this exercise too contributed to the efficiency of administration.

#### **National Training Adult Leader Programs**

National Training adult new programs are in practice island wide. English and Tamil translations are in progress and we hope to complete it with in a very short period of time

#### Pedro Camp, Nuwaraeliya

Pedro camp is now in operation and regular camping and Training Courses organized by National and District levels are being held on regular basis. Residential warden and an Assistant are full time based at the camp.

Previously, we had to transport camping items from Mirigama Training Center to Pedro specially when we organize Phase IV advance courses. This is a costly exercise for transportation.

Treasurer for releasing funds to buy new camping items for Pedro Training center and now the Pedro is fully equipped with its own camping gears. Updating of the camp inventory with new items are already been completed.

#### **Mirigama National Training Centre**

Residential warden and an Assistant are full time based at the camp.

The branches of trees which were overgrown were cut after a very long time to reduce the risk of branches falling and damaging buildings.

Camp items such as Mattress, Pillows, Linen and Iron beds were replaced with all new items. The previous items were in very bad and unusable condition.

Again, my sincere thanks to the Chief Commissioner, Deputy Chief Commissioner, Hon. Chairman and Hon. Treasurer for releasing funds to buy these camping items for Mirigama Training center. Updating of the camp inventory with new items are already been completed.

Need to do major repairs for roofs of all cabins at the training center and I already informed the Chief Commissioner and the Committee of the Council to allocate required funds for this repair. This is an urgent matter to take necessary actions.

#### **CUB SCOUT SECTION REPORT**

The year 2022 can be recognized as a historically significant one for the Cub Scout movement of the Sri Lanka Scout Association. A year which brought on a new set of challenges for Cub Scouts and Cub Leaders due to the continuing pandemic, political unrest and adverse economic conditions. However, 2022 saw the Cub Scout movement, come out on top, once again, with the successful rolling out of the Cub Scouting for Everyone (MoP); and the 13th National Cubboree taking centre stage in September 2022.

# **Cub Scouting for Everyone Programme (MoP Project): Stage 3**

The Cub Scouting for Everyone programme, a project under the patronage of the Asia pacific Region (MoP Project), picked up momentum in 2022. The aim of this project was to have a growth of 33% of Cub Scouts compared to the project's commencement in the year 2020. The line-up of activities towards meeting this target is as follows:

- 1. Updating the Cub Scout programme and Proficiency Badge Syllabus.
- 2. Distribution of four activity books (Membership, Bronze Star, Silver Star and Gold Star).
- 3. Conducting Phase 1 Introductory Training Courses (Fifty Phase 1 introductory courses to train new Cub Leaders were conducted.)
- 4. Provincial workshops for Cub Scout leaders in collaboration with the Ministry of Education:




5. Uniform distribution for Cub Scouts from low-income families: Uniforms were provided under this project to more than 1100 under-privileged students who joined the Cub Scout movement from rural areas of the country. In keeping with our diversity and inclusion programme, uniforms were also distributed to over 75 differently abled Cub Scouts in the Kurunegala District.

Despite the set-back experienced during the year 2021, owing to the COVID-19 pandemic and the economic rescission faced by the country, project activities leapfrogged in 2022, surpassing the project target of 29,630 Cub Scouts (33% increase of the population of Cub Scouts that existed in January 2021). We ended up by achieving a record-breaking population



of registered Cub Scout in the country (35,766 according to the SLSA census), by March 2023. In addition to the above, there are an over 8,000 new Cub Scouts from different parts of the country, who have commenced their journey of Cub Scouting but are yet to be registered. This brings the total number of Cub Scouts close to 44,000 in the island.

Accordingly, I am pleased to place on record that the Cub Scouting for Everyone Project was completed on a high note and was a resounding success.



#### 13th National Cubboree: 16th to 18th Sep 2022

The 13th National Cubboree was successfully held from the 16th to the 18th of September 2022 under the theme, "Change for Success". The national event was hosted by S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia and conducted simultaneously across the island; during one of the most challenging periods in Sri Lanka's Cub Scouting history. Participation at the 13th National Cubboree exceeded all expectations as 12,573 Cub Scouts and 707 Leaders participated in this event representing 266 schools from 26 Districts. Additionally, a delegation from the Maldives, including 25 Cub Scouts and 10 Cub Scout Leaders along with the International Commissioner of the Maldives, joined the Cubboree. The Chief Guest at the main venue was the Korean Ambassador, Santhush Woonjin Jeong.

All programmes at District level were extremely successful and were ably led by the District Commissioners. Following the training we provided, the Assistant District Commissioners (Cubs) and Cub Scout Leaders took a lead role in conducting the programme in their locations. The Cubboree gave our Cub Scout Leaders valuable leadership experiences, through having to organize and conduct the various Cubboree sessions. For the Cub Scouts who participated in this event, the benefits were immeasurable. This was the first physical camp this group of Cub Scouts had after the pandemic: and as such they were able to enjoy experiences they had never known before. Cub Scout Leaders unanimously reported that these Cub Scouts displayed growth in

independence through the activities planned; as well as through taking care of themselves, each other and their belonging during those three days. My sincere thanks go out to each and every one who played a part in making this event a successful one for our nation's Cub Scouts.

#### **District Activities**

I must appreciate the hard work of many Assistant District Commissioners (Cub Scouts), District Cub Leaders and the Cub Scout leaders who were instrumental in organizing many activities for the Cub Scouts and were instrumental in increasing the number of Cub Scouts through their dedicated service.

I take this opportunity to extend my deep gratitude to the National Executive Committee, the Chief Commissioner, Deputy Chief Commissioner, National Training Commissioner, National Programme Commissioner and all Senior Commissioners for the input, guidance and advice. My sincere thanks to all Headquarters Commissioners, District Commissioners and Assistant District Commissioners (Cub Scouts), District Cub Leaders, Cub Scout Leaders and to the office staff for the support extended, to make all Cub Scout activities successful during the challenging but ultimately rewarding year of 2022.

As I relinquish my duties as ACC (Cubs) by 31 December 2022, I wish to thank the former Chief Commissioner Prof. Nimal Silva who appointed me in 2016; former Chief Commissioners, Mr. Merille Goonatilake, and Major. 


without any spending from SLSA. The National Committee attended to few monitory requirements and most work was done free of charge.

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#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

#### TO THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS OF SRI LANKA SCOUT ASSOCIATION

#### Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

#### **Qualified Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of Sri Lanka Scout Association ("the Association"), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31st December, 2022, and the statement of income and expenditure, changes in funds, statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies set out in pages 4 to 25.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Association as at 31st December 2022, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standard for Small and Medium-sized Entities (SLFRS for SMEs).

#### **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

As disclosed in note 4 to the financial statements, the Association has recorded cost of property, plant and equipment of Rs. 159,470,276/- and related accumulated depreciation of Rs. 33,991,485/- as at 31st December 2022. We were unable to verify the completeness, accuracy, existence and valuation of these balances in the absence of proper fixed asset register with details including purchase dates, accumulated depreciation and asset categories. Accordingly, we were unable to determine what adjustments might be necessary to the statement of financial position, statement of income and expenditure, statement of changes in funds and statement of cash flows for the year ended 31st December 2022, and for the comparative year ended 31st December 2021.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards (SLAuSs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by CA Sri Lanka (Code of Ethics) and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion

#### Other Information

The Executive committee ("Committee") is responsible for the other information. These Financial statements do not comprise other information.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

#### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SLAuSs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SLAus, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

However, future events or conditions may cause the Association to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

#### 1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

#### 1.1 Reporting Entity

The Association incorporated and domiciled in Sri Lanka has been established under the Ceylon Scout Council (incorporation) Act No.13 of 1957. The registered office of the Association is located at 65/9 Sir Chittampalam A Gardiner Mawatha, Colombo 02.

#### 1.2 Principal Activities and Nature of Operations

During the year, the principal activities of the Association were initiating programmers aimed at promoting Scouting.

#### 2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

#### 2.1 Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the Institute which comprise of the statement of financial position, statement of income and expenditure and accumulated fund and statement of cash flows together with the accounting policies and notes to the financial statements of the institute as at 31st December 2021 and for the year then ended are prepared in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standard for Small and Medium - sized Entities ("SLFRS for SMEs) adopted by the institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka (ICASL).

#### 2.2 Responsibility for Financial statements

The committee members are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements.

#### 2.3 Approval of Financial Statements by Committee members

The Financial Statements for the year ended 31st December 2022, were authorized for issue by the Committee members on 26<sup>th</sup> May 2023.

The Committee members are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements.

#### 2.4 Basis of Measurement

The Financial Statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis and applied consistently with no adjustments being made for inflationary factors affecting the financial statements.

These Financial Statements have been prepared on the basis that the Association would continue as a going concern for the foreseeable future.

#### 2.5 Functional and presentation currency

The Financial statements are presented in Sri Lanka Rupees (LKR), which is the Association's functional and presentation currency.

#### 2. BASIS OF PREPARATION (CONTINUED)

#### 2.6 Use of Estimates and Judgments

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with SLFRS for SMEs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates are revised if the revision affect only that period or in the period or revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

#### 2.7 Materiality and Aggregation

Each material class of similar items are presented separately in the financial statements. Items of a dissimilar nature or function are presented separately unless they are immaterial.

#### 3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT POLICIES

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements unless otherwise indicated.

Certain comparative amounts in the financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation.

#### a) Foreign Currency Translation

All transactions in foreign currencies are translated to Sri Lanka Rupees at the foreign exchange rates prevailing at the time of such transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the reporting date are translated into Sri Lanka Rupees at the foreign exchange rates prevailing on that date. The foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognized in the Statement of income and expenditure and accumulated fund.

#### b) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances and call deposits with maturities of three months or less from the acquisition date that are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in their fair value and are used by the Association in the management of its short-term commitments. The statement of Cash Flow is reported based on the indirect method.

#### c) Property, plant and equipment

#### (i) Recognition and measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. The cost of self-constructed assets includes the Cost of materials and direct labour, any other costs directly attributable to bringing the assets to a working condition for their intended use and when the group of asset to obligation to remove the asset or restore the site, an estimate of the costs of dismantling and removing the items and restoring the site on which they are located, and capitalized borrowing costs.

#### 3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT POLICIES (Cont.)

#### (i) Recognition and measurement (Cont.)

When an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Any gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognized in profit or loss.

#### (ii) Subsequent Measurement

Subsequent expenditure is capitalized only when it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the expenditure will flow to the Association incurred.

#### (iii) Depreciation

Items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated on a straight- line basis in profit or loss over the estimated useful lives of each component.

Items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated from the date that they are installed and are ready for use, or in respect of internally constructed assets, from the date that the asset is completed and ready for use.

All assets are depreciated from the month of the asset is available for use up to the month of disposal and depreciation is charged commencing from the year in which the assets was purchased or constructed, and no depreciation is charged in the year of disposal.

#### (iv) Capital Work-in-Progress

Capital work-in-progress is transferred to the respective asset accounts at the time of the first utilization of the asset.

#### (d) Intangible Assets

#### (i) Cost

Intangible assets Intangible assets are stated at cost less accumulated amortization and impairment losses. Cost is usually determined as the amount paid by the Group. Amortization is recognized together with depreciation in profit or loss. Intangible assets with indefinite lives are not amortized but are subject to annual reviews of impairment.

#### 3.SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT POLICIES (Cont.)

#### (d) Intangible Assets (continued)

#### (ii) Amortization

The estimated useful lives of significant items of intangible assets are as follows.

#### (e) Inventory

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated selling expenses. The cost of inventories is based on the weighted average principle, and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the inventories and other costs incurred in bringing them to their existing location and condition.

#### (f) Funds

#### i) Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are those that are available for use by the organization at the discretion of the Committee, in furtherance of the general objectives of the organization and which are not designated for any specific purpose.

#### ii) Restricted funds

Where the grants are received for use in an identified project or activity, such funds are held in a restricted fund account and transferred to the statement of income and expenditure to match with expenses incurred in respect of identified project. Utilized funds are held in their respective fund accounts and included under accumulated fund in the statement of financial position until such time as they are required.

#### iii) Designated funds

Unrestricted funds designated by the Committee for a specific purpose are identified as designated funds. The activities for which these funds may be used are identified in the financial statements.

#### (g) Employee Benefit

#### (i) Defined contribution plan

Obligations to defined contribution plans are recognized as an expense in the income statement as incurred. The College contributes 12% and 3% of gross emoluments of employees as Provident Fund and Trust Fund contribution respectively.

#### (ii) Defined benefit plan

Provision has been made for retirement gratuities from the first year of service of all employees. However, according to the Gratuity Act No.12 of 1983, payment of the liability arises only on completion of five years of continued service. The liability is not externally funded, nor is actuarially valued. The Gratuity Liability is valued using a Gratuity Formula method.

#### 3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT POLICIES (Cont.)

#### (h) Liabilities and Provisions

Liabilities are recognized in the statement of financial position when there is a present obligation as a result of past events, the settlement of which is expected to result in an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits. Obligations payable on demand-or within one year of the reporting date are treated as current liabilities in the statement of financial position. Liabilities payable after one year from the reporting date are treated as non-current liabilities in the statement of financial position.

A provision is recognized if, as a result of a past event, the Association has a present legal or constructive obligation that can be estimated reliably, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation.

#### (i) Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Institute and the revenue can be reliably measured on an accrual basis. Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. The following specific criteria are used for the purpose of recognition of revenue.

#### (i) Membership Fee income

Membership fee income is accounted on time accrual basis.

#### (ii) Interest income

Interest income represents the interest on fixed deposits and is accounted on accrual basis.

#### (iii) Management fee income

The association has entered in/ to a management agreement with fairway Developments Limited (Manager) whereas the employer (Association) requires a manager to manage, improve, construct, upon by providing the necessary resources, develop and utilize and maintain the premises known as Sri Lanka Scout Association National Headquarters (B.P. House). The agreement has commenced on 151 December 2014 unless terminated earlier in accordance with its terms, end on 30th November 2039. The employer was granted the allotments of land marked lots 1 and 2 in p. plan no. 6593 and joint possession of the premises to enable the manager to achieve the objects of the agreement and cover the costs and expenses incurred with a reasonable return therefor. The Association is occupying the exclusively the upper ground floor excluding the common area and Fairway Developments limited is responsible and has the control over the balance area of the premises. Throughout the validity of the agreement, manager should pay the employer as a fixed guaranteed profit which is a sum of Rs. 1,337,057/- (Rs.45\* 26,950 Square Feet) payable on or before 15th of each calendar month subject to any deductions due from the employer. This payment will be enhanced by 5% at the end of each three-year period.

The management fee income represents the amount received from Fairway Developments limited and is accounted on accrual basis.

#### (i) Expenses

All expenditure incurred in the operations of the business and in maintaining the capital assets in a state of efficiency have been charged to income in arriving at the Association's profit/loss for the year.

#### (j) Income Tax Expenses

Income tax expense comprises current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognized in the income statement except to the extent that it relates to items recognized directly in equity, in which case it is recognized in equity.

#### (k) Current tax

Current tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted at the reporting date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

#### (I) Events occurring after the reporting date

All material post reporting events have been considered and where appropriate adjustments or disclosures have been made in respective notes to the financial statements.

#### (m) Capital commitments and contingencies

Contingencies are possible assets or obligations that arise from a past event and would be confirmed only on the occurrence or non-occurrence of uncertain future events, which are beyond the Association's control.

Commitments and contingent liabilities are disclosed in notes to the financial statements.
