Pacific Ocean-Wachuset Shoal reported.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 550 of 1899) that information has been published in the Shipping Gazette of August 29, 1899, that Mr. Lambert, master of the ship Wachuset, reports that his vessel passed over a shoal with a depth of 5 or 6 fathoms on it, in approximately lat. 32° S., long. 151° W.
