## PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by the 3rd section of "The Local Board of Health and Improvement Ordinance, 1876," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*, to bring any of the towns mentioned in the schedule to the said Ordinance annexed under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such town or towns respectively for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and such Proclamation to amend, alter, or revoke as and whenever the Governor shall, with like advice, determine:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the Thirteenth day of August, 1884, the town of Trincomalee, a town mentioned in the schedule aforesaid, was brought under the operation of the said Ordinance, and the limits of the said town were, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, defined in such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Proclamation of the Thirteenth day of August, 1884, aforesaid, as respects the limits of the said town of Trincomalee, and to re-define the limits of the said town of Trincomalee for the purposes aforesaid :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation amend the Proclamation of the said Thirteenth day of August, 1884, aforesaid, by altering the limits of the said town of Trincomalee as defined in the said Proclamation ; and We do hereby define that the limits of the said town of Trincomalee shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, be those set out in the schedule hereto, as from and after the First day of January, 1893.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Seventeenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-two.

SCHEDULE.

*East and North-East.*—Dutch Bay, Fort Frederick, and Back Bay up to the northern boundary of the land now being acquired for the new cemetery.

*North and North-West.*—Line taken from the northern boundary of the said new cemetery along the Nilaveli road till it meets the junction with Love lane, thence along the Love lane as far as Tattakkaikulam, and thence to the northern edge of the tank and along it, and thence in a straight line to the Anurádhapura road, and thence along the Anurádhapura road to the Kandy road, and along the Kandy road to the junction with Orr's Hill road.

*West and South-West.*—Yard cove and Inner harbour.

SIR,—It was with great regret that I received your telegram of the 1st instant, reporting the sad news of the death of Sir Samuel Grenier, Attorney-General of Ceylon.

Sir Samuel Grenier, whose services had but lately been recognised by the honour of Knighthood, was at once a distinguished Colonist and a trusted adviser of the Ceylon Government, who were fortunate in securing for some years past the services of one so highly qualified by character and professional capacity as the late Attorney-General.

I wish to place on record my sense of the loss which has been caused to Her Majesty's Service in general by his death, and would ask you to give publicity to this despatch, as being a sincere expression of esteem and regret on the part of Her Majesty's Government.

**PASSED ORDINANCES.**

**MINUTE.**

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

**An Ordinance to amend the Ordinance No. 6 of 1885.**

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to amend the Ordinance No. 6 of 1885, intituled "An Ordinance to enable the Bishop, Clergy, and Laity of the Church of England in Ceylon to provide for the regulation of the affairs of the said Church," and hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Definitions.

1 In this Ordinance—

"Church" shall be construed to mean any Episcopal church not governed by the provisions of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1846, which has not been brought under the operation of the provisions of the Ordinance No. 5 of 1864, and any church not vested in any person or body corporate or originally vested in any trustee or trustees where the deed or instrument creating the trust contains no adequate provisions for the appointment of a new trustee or trustees, and the trustee or one or more of the trustees originally appointed may have died, or may have left the Colony and be residing elsewhere, or may be desirous of being relieved from the duties thereof.

"Members of the congregation" shall mean all persons entitled to vote at the election of lay representatives of the church under the rules and regulations for the time being of the synod, assembly, or convention held under the authority of the principal Ordinance.

Power synod to make regulations enabling congregations to pass a resolution to vest the church in the incorporated trustees.

2 It shall be lawful for the synod, assembly, or convention held under the authority of the principal Ordinance, by any statute, ordinance, or resolution to be passed for such purpose, to make regulations for enabling the majority of the members of the congregation of any church, present and voting at a meeting to be held and convened in manner by the said regulations provided, to declare by resolution their desire that such church and all immovable property belonging or appertaining to such church shall absolutely vest in "The Incorporated Trustees of the Church of England."

Church to vest in incorporated trustees on such resolution being passed.

3 On the passing of such resolution by the congregation under section 1 of this Ordinance, the church and all the immovable property belonging or appertaining to such church shall forthwith absolutely vest in the incorporated trustees of the Church of England in trust, and to and for the use of the Church of England in Ceylon, in the same and in the like manner as the same has heretofore been held, exercised, and enjoyed; subject, nevertheless, in all respects to the provisions and conditions contained in the 9th section of the principal Ordinance, whereby the constitutions of the said incorporated trustees and the beneficial enjoyment of all property which shall vest in them are to be regulated or controlled by the said synod, assembly, or convention.

Resolution to be published in the Government Gazette. Short title.

4 Every resolution passed by a congregation under section 2 of this Ordinance shall be published in the *Government Gazette* within one month of the passing thereof.

5 This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Episcopal Church Amendment Ordinance, 1892."

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

## An Ordinance to amend "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1874."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1874," in the particulars herein-after mentioned : Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

To be read with Ordinance No. 6 of 1874.

1 This Ordinance shall be construed and read as one with "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1874," hereinafter called the principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 5 of principal Ordinance.

2 In section 5 of the principal Ordinance for the words "three or more" shall be substituted the words "two or more."

Amendment of section 11 of principal Ordinance.

3 Section 11 of the principal Ordinance shall be amended as follows :—

(1) For the words "five members" shall be substituted the words "not less than three or more than five members."

(2) For the words "not less than ten proprietors or resident managers within the district" shall be substituted the words "such number of proprietors or resident managers as shall represent not less than two-thirds of the acreage within the district."

NOTICES UNDER THE FOREST ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS by the 6th section of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1885 it is enacted that whenever it is proposed to constitute any land a reserved forest, notice thereof shall be published in the *Government Gazette*—

- (a) specifying, as nearly as possible, the situation and limits of such land;
- (b) declaring that it is proposed to constitute such land a reserved forest;
- (c) naming an officer (hereinafter called, "The Forest Settlement Officer"), who shall be appointed by the Governor, to inquire into and determine the existence, nature, and extent of any rights claimed by, or alleged to exist in favour of, any person in or over any land comprised within such limits, and any claims relating to the practice within such limits of cheva cultivation, and to deal with the same as provided in chapter II. of the said Ordinance :

#### Australia—South Coast—Alteration in Buoyage—Coles and South Channels.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 426 of 1892) that the following alterations will be made in the buoyage of Coles and South channels, Port Phillip entrance, during the last week of September and on October 6, 1892, respectively:—

1. *Coles Channel*.—The existing north, south, and wreck buoys will be withdrawn, and in lieu thereof three conical buoys, painted red, will be moored as follows:—

North buoy in 18 ft. of water, on north-west edge of West sand, with Pile lighthouse, West channel, bearing E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., distant  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile, and High lighthouse, Queens-cliff, S.S.W.

Middle buoy in 20 ft. water, on west edge of West sand, with Pile lighthouse, West channel, bearing N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E., and south red bluff beacon N. by W., distant  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile.

South buoy in 18 ft. water, on south-west edge of West sand, with Pile lighthouse, West channel, bearing N.E. by N., and north extreme of Duck island N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W., distant  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile.

2. *South Channel*.—The green light now shown from No. 15 black buoy, at east end of Middle ground, will be discontinued, and in lieu thereof an occulting white light, occulted eight times every minute, will be exhibited.

### BENGAL.—No. 201.

#### Africa—North-East Coast—Red Sea—Western Shore—Shoal reported North-West of Difein Island.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 448 of 1892) that information has been received from H. B. M. Consul at Jidda that Mr. Baldwin, commanding the British ss. Akbar, reports that, when approaching North Massawa channel from the northward on July 1, 1892, the ship, drawing nearly 20 ft. water, touched slightly at 8 P.M. on a shoal (probably composed of coral) lying with Difein island bearing about S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E., distant 12 miles. A sounding of 5 fathoms was obtained near the spot, and soon after the ship was anchored in 22 fathoms. The weather at the time was hazy, and there was a slight swell from the southward.

Position as given to be considered very doubtful: lat.  $16^{\circ} 47' N.$ , long.  $39^{\circ} 12' E.$

Caution.—There being many indications of shoal patches northward of Difein, and the area being but imperfectly examined, caution is necessary in approaching that island. A note to this effect has been placed on admiralty chart No. 184.

The deposit must be made at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and the deposit receipt must be produced to the officer issuing the form of tender as his authority for making the issue.

The security bond should be furnished before December 1, 1892. All alterations or erasures should bear the initials of the tenderers, otherwise the tenders will be treated as informal and rejected.
