## By-laws referred to.

## Chapter III.

14. After any market is opened for public use, it shall be lawful for the Local Board to prohibit, by a notice to be published in the Government Gazette and by notice of tom-tom, the sale by any person within a certain area to be defiued in such notice of fresh meat, fresh fish, und fresh vegetubles; and any person who shall after such notice sell or expose for sale auy such article within the said area, except at the markets thereof provided by the Local Board, shali for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten rupees.
15. After any market has been opened for public use, it shall be lawful for the Local Board to prohibit, by notice published as aforesaid, the sale of fruits other than dried fruits at auy place withiu the limits of the Local Board by any person, except at his own dwelling-house or shop; and any person who shall so sell or expose for sale any fruits uther than dried fruits, except at the markets thereof provided by the Local Board, or as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence, and be liable to a peualty notexceeding ten rupees.

## DRAFT ORDINANCES.

## MINUTE.

## The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:-

An Ordinance to amend "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1887."

Preamble.

Amendment of sub-sections ( $\theta$ ) and ( $f$ ) of section 11 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 , as to qualification of voters in the Galle manioipality.

Section 47, as to appointment of chairman.

## $\because \cdot$

Amendment of section 55, as to jurisdiction of municipal magistrate.

Section 164, as to sales and leases of lands or buildings.

Ordinance No. 7 of 1840 not to affect sales or leases to or by the municipal council.
Municipal magistrate may order the remoral of obstruction, \&c.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend in the particulars hereinafter mentioned the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :-

1 After the passing of this Ordinance sub-sections (e) and ( $f$ ) of section 11 of the principal Ordinance shall not apply to the municipality of Galle, but the following sub-sections shall apply to the municipality of Galle in lieu thereof:-
" (e 2) have been for the six months immediately preceding the occupier of a house in the division for which he desires to vote, at a monthly rental of not less than ten rupees; or
" ( $f$ 2) be possessed, either in his own right or in right of his wife, of a house situated within sach division of the annual value of not.less than one handred and twenty rupees."
2 In the proviso to section 47 of the principal Ordinance the words "shall be an officer in the Civil Service of the Ceylon Government who " shall be omitted.

3 In section 55 of the principal Ordinance, for the words "and 14 of 1878 " shall be substituted the words " 14 of 1878 , 17 of 1889 , and 12 of 1891 , and any offence committed within the municipality in breach of section 257,258 , or 259 of the Ceylon Penal Code."

4 For section 164 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be substituted, namely :-
"(1) The municipal council, with the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council, may sell or lease any lands or buildings vested in them or acquired by them, either in block or in parcels as they may find most convenient and advantageous; and the proceeds of such sale and the rents arising from such lease shall be paid to the credit of the municipal funds.
"(2). None of the provisions in the Ordinance No. 7 of 1840 shall be taken as applying to sales, leases, or other conveyances of land or other immovable property from or to the municipal council."

5 After section 183 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be inserted, and numbered $183 a$, namely :-
"It shall be lawful for the municipal magistrate in any proceedings under sections 175 and 183 of the principal Ordinance, to make an order requiring the person who has caused any obstruction, encroachment, or projection to remove, within a time to be fixed by the order, such obstruction, encroachment, or projection; and if the person against whom such order is made shall neglect to perform the act directed thereby within the period specified in the order, he shall be liable to a penalty of twenty rupees for each day after the date fixed by the order for the performing of the act thereby directed until the same is carried out. Such magistrate shall from time to time issue a warrant directing the amount due in respect of any such penalty to be levied in the manner by law provided for levying fines imposed by a magistrate in the police court."

Municipal
magistrate may order alteration or demolition of houses built without notice or contrary to Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 .

Chairman, with consent of standing committee, may provide houses of isolation.

Short title.

6 After section 201 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be inserted, and numbered $201 a$, namely :-
"Whenever a municipal magistrate considers, on receiving a. report from the chairman, and on taking such evidence (if any) as he thinks fit, that any building begun or made without sending such notice and plan as is required by section 198 of the principal Ordinance, or at any levels different from those fixed by the chairman under section 199 of the principal Ordinance, or in any other respect contrary to the provisions of that Ordinance, such magistrate may make an order requiring the owner to alter or demolish such building within a time to be fixed in the order; and if the person against whom such order is made shall neglect to perform the act directed thereby within the period specified in the order, he shall be liable to a penalty of twenty rupees for each day after the day fixed by the order for the performing of the act thereby directed until the same is carried out. Such magistrate shall from time to time issue a warrant directing.the amount due in respect of any such penalty to be levied in the manner by law provided for levying fines imposed by a magistrate in the police court."

7 After section 250 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be inserted, and numbered $250 \alpha$; namely:-
" It shall be lawful to the chairman, with the consent of the standing committee, to provide houses of isolation for the reception of persons suffering from any dangerous infectious disease, and to charge and levy fees for the use and. occupation of such houses, and to make by-laws for the regulation of such houses, and for imposing, collecting, and recovering such fees."

8 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Municipal Councils Amendment Ordinance, 1892," and this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance shall be read as one, and may be cited collectively as "The Municipal Councils Ordinances, 1887 and 1892."

> India-West-Bombay Coast-Lights on North Channel Beacon.

- The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 474 of 1892) that on Uctober 1, 1892, a fixed red light above a fixed green light, 2 ft . apart, would be shown from North Channel beacon, while the dock gates are open, to assist veisels in navigating the dock channels. These lights are visible in all directions except where obscured by Cross Island.

Tasmania-West Coast-Masquarie Harbour-Entrance Islet Lighthouse-Sector of Red Light.
With reference to notice to Mariners No. 116, dated July 4, 1892, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 475 of 1892) that on October 1, 1892, a sector of red light would be shown from Entrance Islet lighthouse, Macquarie harbour entrance, through an arc of $35^{\circ}$, or from the bearing of $\mathrm{S} .16^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$. to S. $51^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$.

Note, -A wire hawser to facilitate communication has been stretched from Bushy (Cap and Bonnet) islet to the mainland ; there is therefore no channel fur vessels southwest of it.

Australia-East Coast-Moreton Bay-Alterations in certain Leading Lights-Howe or North Channel.
The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 476 of 1892) that on September 13,1892, Tangaluma light would be moved 466 yards $N$. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. from its previous position, and would then be elevated 277 ft . above high water.
Approximate position, lat. $27^{\circ} 11^{\prime} 30^{\prime \prime}$ S., long. $153^{\circ} 23^{\prime}$ $20^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$.
The southern limit of the sector of white light shown from Yellow Patch lighthouse has been altered to bear E. by S ., instead of $\mathrm{E} . \frac{\mathrm{g}}{4} \mathrm{~S}$., as formerly.
Nots.-Vessels entering Howe or North channel should proceed as usual until Tangaluma and Cowan Cowan lights are in line bearing S. $17^{\circ} \mathrm{E}$., and should keep them so till the southern limit of the sector of white light shown from Yellow Patch lighthouse is reached, when the course should be altered to the eastward to bring Tangaluma light open eastward of Cowan Cowan light the difterence in their heights, and then proceed with them in that position. By following this course, a depth of not less than 21 ft . at low water spring tides will be carried.

Eastern Archipelago-Java, North Coast-Sunken Wreck North-west of Berebes Point.
The British Admirulty has given notice ( N n. 477 of 1892) that the Netherlands barque Salimnerachman lies sunk with Berebes point bearing S.S. E. 3 E., distant about 8 miles. The wreck, head about south, has top gallant masts struck and top masts showing abuve water at an angle of about $25^{\circ}$. The least depth found on the wreck was 3 fathoms.

## Bengax.-No. 215.

China Sea-Strait of Makassar-Non-existence of Komba Island and certain Islets.
The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 478 of 1892) that the Commander of the Netherlands steamvessel Sperwer repurts that the Komba (Noesa Komba) island, charted as lying in approximately lat. $5^{\circ} 15^{\prime} \mathrm{S}$., long. $117^{\circ} 3 \frac{1^{\prime}}{} \mathrm{E}$., does not exist.

Information has been received from the Government of Batavia that the three islets (Triangles) charted as lying in approximately lat. $3^{\circ} 1^{\prime}$ to $3^{\circ} 6^{\prime}$ S., long. $117^{\circ} 50^{\prime}$ E., and the three islets (P.D.) in lat. $2^{\circ} 41^{\prime} \mathrm{S}$, long. $117^{\circ} 66^{\prime}$ E., do not exist.

Komba island and the above-mentioned islets have therefore been removed from the Admiralty Charts.

Information has been received that Heathrocks, which dry at low water; extend about 100 yards no, th, 200 yards east, and 30 yards south, of the beacon erected f n them, in approximately $13^{\circ} 28^{\prime} 15^{\circ}$ S., long. $-143^{\circ} 39^{\prime} 50^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{H}$.
(2) Particulars of Khandalla Shoal.

Also, with reference to notice to mariner No. 601 of 1891 (No. 10 of 1892 issued by this office), that K handalla shoal, with 13 ft . on it at low water, is of amall extent, and cannot usually be seen even from the masthead.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, November 18, 1892.

The Council met this day at 3 f.m., pursuant to notice dated November 12, 1892.
Present:-Mr. C. E. D. Pennycuick, Acting Mayor and Chairman ; Hon. J. J. Grinlinton; Dr. W. R. Kynsey, C.m.a.; Captain F. Bayley ; Mr. E. Walker ; Major L. F. Knollys, C.m.G.; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne ; Mr. C. Perera ; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; and Mr. C. M. Fernando.

The Minutes of October 14, 1892, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved, -that the Minutes of October 14, 1892, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne moved "for a return of all lands vested in or belonging to the Municipal Council, whether road reservations or otherwise, the extent of each, and the yearly revenue, if any, derived therefrom."

Mr. C. M. Fernando seconded.-Carried.
The return called for was laid on the table.
2-3. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that the existing table of charges for licensed passenger hackeries and jinrickshaws be repealed, and that the following table of charges with a new classification be adopted in lieu thereof for the year 1893 and thereafter ":-

1st Class.-Wagonette or Basket Hackery drawn by a Bullock.


Rates chargeable between 7.30 P.M. and 6 A.m. to be one-third more than the aboverates-
and "that the above fare tables be printed in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil, and attached to wagonette or basket hackeries, hackeries, and jinrickshaws, as may be necessary in each case."

Mr. Dias seconded.
Resolved,-That the matter be referred to the Special Committee appointed by resolutions No. 5 of February 12 and No. 7 of August 12, 1892, and that the name of Major L. F. Knollys be added to the Committee.
.4. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that a road may be constructed from Darley road to Captain's Garden for cart as well as foot traffic."

This motion was, by leave of Council, withdrawn.
5. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved " that the letter addressed to the Municipal Council by Mr. Vincent E. Loos on June 6, 1891, be read and considered."

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne seconded.
The purport of the letter having been explained by the Chairman, it was resolved that the Superintendent of Works be requested to frame an estimate for the construction of the road referred to in the letter, viz., from the Maradana junction to the Base line road.
6. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that a steam road roller may be purchased for the use of the Public Works Department of the Council."

This motion was, by leave of Council, amended as follows :-"That the cost of a steam-roller be ascertained from the Director of Public Works, in order to enable the Council to determine whether one should be procured for the use of the Public Works Department of the Council."

The motion so amended was seconded by Mr. Dias and carried.
7. A statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January to October, 1892, and a Progress Report of Work done during October, 1892, were laid on the table.
8. A letter No. 139/013895, dated November 1, 1892, was read, intimating, with reference to the resolution of Council, declining to pay for a skilied workman to attend to the maintenance of water meters, that as the proceeds of the sale of water are paid to the Municipality as an act of grace, and outside the original financial agreement, under
which the Council contributes Rs. 130,000 , the Council may reasonally be asked to meet any additional expense incurred in making such sales.

The Chairman read letter No. 202 of November 5, 1892, addressed to the Hon, the Colonial Secretary with reference to the above.

Resolved,-That the Chairman's_answer be accepted by the Council.
9. A petition dated October 18, 1892, from Mr. M. Fernando and other residents of Modara, complaining of the want of built side drains, was read, together with a memorandum, dated November 18, on the subject from the Superintendent of Works.
-Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne moved "that the Chairman be authorised to incur the expenditure necessary to put the drains in order as soon as funds are available."

Captain Bayley seconded.-Carried.
10. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for July, 1892, received with letters Nos. 159 and 161 of November 2 and 10, 1892, were laid on the table.
11. The City Analyst's report, dated November 4, 1892, on the town water for September, 1892, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
12. A proposal from Mr. George D. Miller of Rajakadaluwa offering to pay for the cost of a drinking trough for animals to be erected opposite the Edinburgh markets or near Messrs. Walker, Sons \& Co.'s workshop, was laid on the table, with connected papers.

The Chairman moved "that the thanks of the Council be accorded to Mr. Miller for his gift."
Mr. C. Perera seconded.-Carried.
13. The report of the Sanitary Officer for the third quarter of 1892 was laid on the table.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on October 22, 1892, at 2 p.m.

3. Submitted applications for the post of Sanitary Officer from C. Thomas, of Kotmale; Charles de Silva, of Galle ; and J. E. Disanaike, of Mutwal.

Resolved,-That Dr. Charles de Silva be appointed Sanitary Officer from November 1, 1892, on a salary of Rs. 600 per annum.
4. Considered whether a new valuation of property for 1893 shall be made, or whether the valuation as contained in the assessment book for 1892 be adopted.

Resolved,--That a new valuation of property within Police limits, outside the Fort, be made for 1893, and that Rs. 200 be allowed as remuneration to the assessors.

Resolved, 一that Messrs. W. Jansz and D, A. de Silva Abeyawardena be appointed assessors.
5. The subject of the lease of the markets, generally in accordance with section 231 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, was brought up for consideration, when it was resolved that the Council is not prepared to lease out any of the markets.
6. Submitted the following recommendation of the Standing Committee held' this day :-The question whether application should not be made to Government to extend to the Galle Municipality the provisions of Ordinance No. 9 of 1889 came up for consideration, when it was resolved that a recommendation be made to the Council that such an application be made.
