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### VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

#### REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1892.

##### I.—POPULATION.

The estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 3,053,592, as against 3,057,693 on December 31 last.

Table I. in the appendix gives the area and population of each Province and district of the Island in the quarter.

2. *Arrivals and Departures of Indian Coolies.*—There was an unusual increase in the number of Indian coolie arrivals during the quarter. The total number of coolies who arrived in the Island was 19,526, which is an increase of 72 per cent. on the number in the corresponding quarter of last year (11,356), and more than double the average number for the period in the decade 1881-90 (8,708). The departures (20,287), on the other hand, though 21 per cent. above the number in the first quarter of last year (16,795) and 26 per cent. above the mean annual number of the first quarter in 1881-90 (16,093), were not large, compared with the arrivals recorded in the quarter. Usually the number of departing coolies in the first quarter of the year is nearly double that of the arrivals, but this year the departures (20,287) and the arrivals (19,526) were almost equal.

##### II.—MARRIAGES.

3. The number of general marriages, *i.e.* marriages other than Kandyan or Mohammedan, registered in the quarter was 2,684, and of Kandyan marriages 680.

Table III. shows the marriages solemnised among the general community in every Province and district of the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnisation, the number of bridegrooms and brides who were unable to sign their names in the registers, &c.

Table IV. gives similar information in respect of the Kandyans.

4. *First Marriages: Re-marriages.*—Of the 2,684 general marriages, 2,321 (equal to 86 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 58 between bachelors and widows, 270 between widowers and spinsters, 32 between widowers and widows, and 3 between divorced men and spinsters.

Of the 680 Kandyan marriages, 545 (equal to 80 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 27 between bachelors and widows, 62 between widowers and spinsters, 13 between widowers and widows, 16 between divorced men and spinsters, 10 between divorced women and bachelors, 4 between divorced women and widowers, and 3 between divorced men and divorced women.

5. *Age at Marriage.*—The mean age at marriage for the general community was 27.6 for males and 19.1 for females; for the Kandyans, 28 for males and 20 for females.

6. *Minors.*—In the general community 7.2 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 73.7 per cent. of the brides were under 21; and among the Kandyans 15.4 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 73.1 per cent. of the brides were under 21.

7. *Mixed Marriages.*—In this quarter there were two marriages between Europeans and Burghers, 10 between Burghers and Sihaliese, and 11 between Sihaliese and Tamils.

8. *Signatures in the Marriage Registers.*—Of the 5,368 persons who were married among the general community in the quarter, 609 men and 2,039 women signed the register with marks, that is to say, 77 per cent. of the men and 24 per cent. of the women, were able to write their names. Of the 1,362 persons married among the Kandyans, 209 men and 658 women signed the register with marks, or, in other words, 69 per cent. of the men and 3.2 per cent. of the women were able to write their names.

##### III.—BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

9. *Births.*—The births registered in the quarter numbered 22,305, and were in the proportion of 29.8 per 1,000 persons living, as against 35.3, the rate in the first quarter of last year, and 29.7, the mean rate for the period in the decade 1881-90.

10. *Deaths.*—The deaths registered in this quarter amounted to 26,643, including 27 Europeans, 71 Burghers, 17,862 Sihaliese, 6,712 Tamils, 1,865 Moors, 73 Malays, and 33 others, and corresponded to an annual rate of 35.6 per 1,000, being 30 per cent. above the mean rate of the corresponding period in the ten years 1881-90 (27.4).

11. *The Births and Deaths and their Rates* in the quarter are compared in the following statement with the results obtained in the previous quarter, the first quarter of the past year, and the average of the corresponding quarters in the ten years 1881-90:—

12. *Sex.*—Of the total number of births (22,305) registered in the quarter, 11,748 were of males and 10,557 of females, *i.e.* 111 males to 100 females. Of the total number of deaths (26,643), 13,905 were males and 12,738 were females. Out of equal numbers living of each sex there died 968 males to 1,000 females.

13. *Health of the Districts.*—The general health of the population in the quarter has been worse than in any previous quarter in the last eleven years, with the exception of the first quarter of 1885 and of 1889, when the death-rates recorded were somewhat excessive, 36·4 and 37·6 respectively, as against 35·6 this quarter. The highest death-rate in the quarter is in the Mannár District, which, though invariably the unhealthiest in the Island, never before (since 1881) experienced such an unusual rate (37·3), being more than double the rate in the corresponding quarter of last year (38·8), and 53 per cent. in excess of the mean rate for the period in 1881–90 (57·2). This exceptional increase in the rate is due to the heavy mortality from cholera (149 deaths) which occurred, I presume, chiefly among the Indian immigrants, and to a still greater mortality from fever, which accounted for 229 deaths out of a total of 528 deaths registered in that district. Next to Mannár comes Anurádhapura as the unhealthiest district of the Island, with a death-rate (76·9) higher than in any past quarter since 1881, save the first quarter of 1885 (99·7), and showing an increase of 90 per cent. on the rate of the corresponding quarter of 1891 (40·5) and 45 per cent. on the mean rate of the quarters in 1881–90 (52·9). The next highest death-rate was recorded in the Hambantota District (52·2). This district suffered terribly in the first quarter of last year, when the death-rate attained a rate of 96·3, nearly treble the usual rate (33·0), but improved in the succeeding quarters, falling to 52·2 in the second quarter, 33·5 in the third quarter, and 35·9 in the fourth quarter, from which the rate rose again this quarter to 52·2, showing an increase of no less than 58 per cent. on the mean rate for the period. In Ratnapura and Mullaittivu (including Vavuniya) the death-rate in the quarter was equal to 51 per 1,000, which though excessive for the former district, being an increase of 50 per cent. on its mean rate (34·1), was an increase of only 11 per cent. on the mean death-rate of the latter district (46·5). Next comes Batticaloa with a death-rate of 49·6, showing an increase of 53 per cent. on the mean death-rate of the corresponding quarter in 1881–90 (32·4), and then Badulla with a death-rate of 48·0, showing an increase of 61 per cent. (the greatest increase shown by any district on its death-rate), and Trincomalee with a death-rate of 45·7, an increase of 16 per cent. on its mean rate (39·3). The lowest death-rate in the quarter (20·8) was as usual maintained by the Colombo District, which shows an increase of 23 per cent. on its mean rate (16·9). Mátalé District, which has a death-rate more than double that of Colombo, showed the same rate of increase this quarter as Colombo (23 per cent., *i.e.* from 38·1, the mean rate in the first quarter in 1881–90, to 46·8 this quarter). The next lowest death-rate was in Negombo, where the death-rate rose to 26·6 from 18·7, showing an increase of 42 per cent. In Kégalla, though the death-rate (26·9) almost equalled Negombo, the rise on its mean death-rate in the quarter in 1881–90 (22·4) was not so great as in Negombo, being only 20 per cent. Next to Negombo and Kégalla the lowest death-rate in the quarter was recorded in Nuwara Eliya, where the death-rate (27·0) increased 57 per cent. on the mean rate of the corresponding quarter in 1881–90 (17·1), and then comes Kalutara with an increase of 54 per cent., from 19·3 to 29·8; Jaffna, with an increase of 9 per cent., from 27·7 to 30·3; Galle, with an increase of 52 per cent., from 21·3 to 32·5; Mátara, with an increase of 42 per cent., from 22·6 to 32·1; and the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts, with an increase of 18 per cent., from 32·0 to 37·8 per 1,000. Kurunégala is the only district in the Island which shows a death-rate lower than usual.

The percentage of increase or decrease in the death-rate of each district in the quarter as compared with the death-rate in the first quarter of last year and with the mean rate of the first quarter in 1881–90 is shown in the following statement:—

14. *Age at Death.*—Table IX. shows the number of deaths registered in the quarter at different periods of life for either sex in each district of the Island. Of the 26,643 deaths registered in the Island this quarter, 4,396, equal to 19·7 per cent. of the total deaths, occurred under one year; 9,206, or 41·2 per cent., under five years; 62 persons are reported to have been centenarians, and 1,529 persons to have died at various ages between 75 and 100.

15. *Registered Causes of Death.*—Table VII. in the appendix gives the causes of deaths registered in each district of the Island and of each nationality.

16. *Fever and Diarrhoeal Diseases.*—Of the 26,643 deaths registered in this quarter, 6,752 or 25 per cent. were reported due to fever and 4,686 to diarrhoeal diseases. The deaths ascribed to these two causes amount to 11,438, or 42 per cent. of the deaths from all causes.

Under this head 1,100 deaths are attributed to cholera, of which 189 were in Batticaloa, 152 in Ratnapura, 149 in Mannár, 102 in Kurunégala, and 99 in Trincomalee.

17. Smallpox accounts for 23 deaths, of which 13 were in Kandy, 4 in Colombo, 3 in Mátalé, and the remaining 3 in Jaffna, Puttalam, and Kégalla.

To chickenpox 2 deaths are attributed, and to measles 60, of which 22 occurred in Ratnapura, 15 in Kalutara, 9 in Colombo, 5 in Anurádhapura, 3 in Kandy, 3 in Galle, 2 in Jaffna, and 1 in Negombo; to whooping cough 18; to mumps 2; and to diphtheria 1.

18. The other chief causes of death were infantile convulsions 1,863, rickets 1,726, convulsions 931, influenza 916, collapse 847, anæmia 839, phthisis 682, debility 593, worms 555, old age 427, general dropsy 402, puerperal convulsions 370, pneumonia 251, inflammation 236, childbirth 218, thrush 215, rheumatism 149, ulcer 147, pleurisy 128, tetanus 122, bronchitis 117, premature birth 90 (of which 61 were in Badulla), parangi 82 (of which 41 in Kurunégala), starvation and want of breast milk 71 (of which 29 were in Badulla, 9 in Nuwara Eliya, 8 in Vavuniya, 7 in Kandy, 6 in Mátalé, 5 in Kégalla, 2 in Mullaitivu, 2 in Kalutara, and 1 in Hambantota).

19. *Accidental Deaths and Suicides.*—Out of the 435 deaths attributed to these causes, 93 are attributed to drowning, 91 to fall from trees, 33 to snake-bites, 26 to burns and scalds, 9 to fall of heavy substances, 7 to fall from heights other than trees, 4 to fall in pits, 4 to crocodiles, 2 to buffaloes, 1 to a bear, 1 to a bull, 3 to sunstroke, 1 to lightning. Three persons were run over by carts and 2 by trains. 25 deaths were due to suicide (18 by hanging, 2 by drowning, 1 by poison).

20. *Murders and Executions.*—Sixteen deaths registered in this quarter are attributed to murder and other forms of homicide, 7 in Kurunégala, 3 in Galle, 2 in Badulla, and the remaining 4 in Colombo, Jaffna, Hambantota, and Chilaw. Two men were judicially executed in the quarter, one in Kandy and the other in Badulla.

IV.—HEALTH OF THE TOWN OF COLOMBO.

21. The town of Colombo has been unhealthier in the quarter than in any previous quarter since 1887 (when the Vital Statistics of the town were first collected), excepting the first quarter of the last year, when there was a virulent epidemic of smallpox in the town which raised the death-rate to 27·0. The death-rate in the quarter is equal to 24·5 per 1,000 as against 22·0, the mean rate of the first quarters in 1881–90. The causes of deaths may be summarised as follows :—

23. *European Births and Deaths.*—The European deaths in the quarter were 16 in number (of which 2 resulted from influenza, 4 from phthisis, 2 from liver disease), and corresponded to a rate of 28·7, which is curiously enough also their birth-rate.

24. *Births and Deaths of other Races.*—The death-rates of the different nationalities living in the town are not strictly comparable with each other. The European population of the town is small and fluctuating, and the rate calculated on such a population is not likely to be trustworthy for purposes of comparison. Similarly the Tamil death-rate is not a standard of their healthiness in relation to other nationalities. The circumstances which account for the low rate of mortality generally prevailing in this community are the migratory character of the Tamils living in the town and the peculiarity in the age composition of their population, there being among the Tamils of Colombo a very small proportion of people at early or advanced periods of life and an unduly large proportion at the middle period, as compared with the other races.

The death-rate in the quarter has exceeded the mean rate in the corresponding quarter of the preceding five years among all the races living in the town except among the Malays and the races classed together as others. The increase in the death-rate among the Burghers (from 9·1 to 9·6) and the Moors (from 40·7 to 41·5) was very small, while the Tamils show a marked increase in their death-rate (from 17·0 to 23·0), and have even exceeded the rate recorded in the quarter among the Sinhalese (20·7), who show an increase of 14 per cent. on their mean rate (18·2). The town birth-rate and death-rate of the Sinhalese in the quarter are compared below with their own rate in the other revenue divisions of the Colombo District :—

The death-rate of the town, as the above figures show, is better than the rates recorded in two of the divisions (Salpiti Kóralé 23·2, Héwágam Kóralé 27·7), but is worse compared with the rates in the other two divisions (Alutkuru Kóralé 17·5, Siyané Kóralé 13·8) of the Colombo District ; while the birth-rate is lower in the town (not an unusual occurrence in towns) and higher in all the other divisions, than the death-rate.
