ABSTRACT OF SEASON REPORTS FOR NOVEMBER, 1892.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—In all the kóralés of the Province the harvesting of the autumn crops is finished, with a generally good outturn. Standing crops are doing well.

CENTRAL PROVINCE.

KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Udunuwara: maha fields being transplanted; prospects fair. Yatinuwara: late fields being transplanted; prospects poor. Tumpane: maha sowing over; yala crop reaped. Harispattu: maha being transplanted; prospects fair Páta Dumbara: yala fair, crop reaped; maha being transplanted, prospects fair. Uda Dumbara: maha cultivation in progress; prospects good. Páta Hewáheta: maha being sown; prospects good. Udapaláta: prospects fair. Uda Bulatgama: maha being transplanted.

Dry Grain.—Harispattu: kurakkan good; crop resped. Páta Dumbura: kurakkan, yala reaped, fair crop; maha being sown, prospects fair. Uda Dumbara: kurakkan sowing nearly over; prospects good. Páta Héwáheta: kurakkan sown. Uda Bulatgama: kurakkan already reaped.

MATALÉ DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Maha fields in plants; prospects good. Rain fairly satisfactory everywhere, except in Wagapanaha Pallesiyapattu, where maha cultivation is poor.

Dry Grain.—Chenas in plants; tanks full in Kandapalle koralé.

NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Kotmalé: young plants. Uda Héwáheta: paddy in ear. Walapané: a fair crop being reaped.

Dry Grain.—Kotmalé: kurakkan being reaped; crop good. Uda Héwáheta and Walapané: kurakkan chenas sown.

NORTHERN PROVINCE.

JAFFNA DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Between the 9th and 20th there were some heavy showers of rain throughout the district, except in the Punakari division, where the earlier sowings are in ears; in the other divisions paddy is in plants. Weeding and transplanting were carried on to some extent, though delayed to a great extent for want of rain. Paddy plants reported to be badly in want of rain. The wind in general from north-east from the 4th November.

MANNÁR DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain sown in September and October are all young plants, and likely to fail for want of rain.

MULLAITTIVU DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Munmari lands much benefited by recent rain; tanks generally full; cultivation in progress.

Dry Grain.—Varaku in plants, and doing well; kurakkan being sown. Sufficient rain during the month.

VAVUNIYA DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Tanks have not filled except in one (Melpattu) division; kalapokam cultivation thereby delayed; prospects not good; rain is wanted.

Dry Grain.—The little dry grain cultivation undertaken is doing well.

SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

GALLE DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Sowing for maha completed in Gravets, Wellaboda, and Talpé pattus; prospects good in two former; much damage from excessive rain in last named. Resowing necessary in some divisions; very small area sown owing to heavy rain in Hinidum and Gangaboda pattus; sowing has commenced in Bentota-Walallawiti koralé. Weather favourable.

MATARA DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Gravets: crops partly damaged by salt water and rain. Gangaboda: crop on the whole good Wellaboda: sowing for maha over; good harvest anticipated. Kandaboda: some damage done to crop by "godawellus." Morowak kóralé: young crop looks well; rich harvest expected. Weligam kóralé: crop flourishing.

HAMBANTOTA DISTRICT.

Paddy.-Magam pattu: being sown in parts; some springing up. Giruwa pattu east and west: prospects fair.

Dry Grain.—Magam pattu: thrown back owing to lateness of rain. Giruwa pattu east and west: checked by drought, but reviving since rainfall.

EASTERN PROVINCE.

BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Cultivation of early munmari in Butticaloa north is over; crops in excellent condition; rain has been proportioned to the young crop; preparation to trample lands for later munmari is going on in Batticaloa south.

Dry Grain.—Sowing is about to commence. Indian corn not yet ripe.

Price of paddy and Indian corn, Re. 1.50 a bushel; fine grain, Re. 1 a bushel.

TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Munmari cultivation continues. Water supply is sufficient, and prospects are good

NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE

KURUNĖGALA DISTRICT.

Paddy. - Sowing for the maha now over; a considerable extent of land has been cultivated, except in the Vanni Hatpattn and in some kóralés of the Dewamedi hatpattu, where the rainfall was insufficient for field cultivation.

Dry Grain.—Crops thriving; prospects generally fair.

CHILAW DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Fields sown for maha in all divisions progressing well. There is failure of water in tanks in Northern division; in Southern division there is sufficient water for the present barvest. A rich crop of tobacco in Southern

PUTTALAM DISTRICT.

Paddy.—In most village: cultivation not commenced for want of sufficient rain; in others young crop. Dry Grain. - Sowing over. Young crop.

NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

ANURÁDHAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy .- North-east monsoon deficient in rainfall and badly distributed; some village tanks full, some almost empty; maha cultivation is therefore delayed.

*Dry Grain.—Chena crop restricted to recultivation of last year's chenas, and prospects good.

Muriain in several kóralés; fever rather severe; food supply plentiful.

PROVINCE OF UVA.

BADULLA DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Cultivation for ensuing season reported good from all divisions; in Bintenna crop recently reaped and threshed, slightly damaged by flies.

Dry Grain.—Prospects of a good crop everywhere owing to seasonable rains.

PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—State and propects of crops on mud lands, chenas, and owitas good throughout the district.

KÉGALLA DISTRICT.

Paddy. -- Maha cultivation not yet over in Galboda and Kinigoda kóralés Paranakuru kóralé, and Beligal kóralé. In Three koralés and Lower Bulatgama some of the fields sown for maha were damaged by floods, and they had to be sown again; prospects middling to fair.

Dry Grain.—Kurakkan: sown for yala has been harvested in Galboda and Kinigoda kóralés, Paranakuru kóralé, and Beligal kóralé; out-turn not satisfactory. In Three kóralés and Lower Bulatgama and Beligal kóralé kurakkan sown for maha is growing well. Hill paddy: prospects good in Galboda and Kinigoda kóralés, Paranakuru kóralé, and Beligal kóralé; Three kóralés and Lower Bulatgama middling. Mun sown with kurakkan in Beligal kóralé is growing well. Iringu: prospects in Beligal kóralé and Paranakuru kóralé good; Galboda and Kinigoda kóralés middling. Amu: in Galboda and Kinigoda kóralés, Paranakuru kóralé, and Three kóralés and Lower Bulatgama, prospects middling; Beligal kóralé good. Meneri sown in parts of Beligal kóralé growing well.

Nagasaki Buoy.

Notice is hereby given that a buoy has been moored to mark the position of the sunken rock which lies at about 1 cable to the east of Tachigami-bana, near Mitsu Bishi dock in Nagasaki harbour.

The cross-bearings taken from the buoy are as follows :--

The buoy is made of iron, conical in shape, painted black, and is surmounted by a cylindrical top-mark, the top of which stands 10 ft. above the sea. It is moored directly to the eastward of the rock in 4 fathoms of water at low water spring tides.
