PASSED ORDINANCES.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 20.—1892.

An Ordinance for exempting from Customs Duty certain articles imported or purchased for the use of Her Majesty's Naval and Military Forces.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for exempting from Customs duty certain articles imported or purchased for the use of Her Majesty's Naval and Military Forces and for paying a rebate of such duty: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Articles exempted from customs duty.

1 From and after the First day of January, 1892, the following articles shall be exempted from payment of customs duty:—

- (a) Articles of every description imported or supplied by sea or inland carriage or navigation for the public use of Her Majesty's regular military and naval forces, and all articles sold for the public use of Her Majesty's regular military and naval forces, though not directly imported for that purpose;
- (b) All wines, spirits, and stores which are imported or purchased or procured locally for the use of the Naval Commander-in-Chief when residing in the Colony, or which are supplied from Her Majesty's dockyard at Trincomalee for the use of his servants and of the sailors on duty at his place of residence;
- (c) Articles, clothing, and material for clothing, imported for the use in athletic sports and games of Her Majesty's regular military or naval forces in Ceylon;
- (d) Articles imported, purchased, or procured for the use of any canteen of Her Majesty's regular military or naval forces in Ceylon.

Certificate from naval or military officer required for exemption or payment of rebate.

2 (1) Upon the production of a certificate from such naval or military officer as the Governor may from time to time authorise by notification in the *Government Gazette* to issue the same, the Collector of Customs shall pass free from duty the articles hereinbefore exempted, or, in the event of the duty having been paid, he shall allow a rebate of such duty.

Proviso.

Provided that if such articles shall not be required for the use for which they were imported or purchased as aforesaid, and shall be sold, the same shall be liable to and be charged with such and the same duties of customs as may by law be payable or charged on the like articles; and the officer in whose charge such articles may be shall furnish the Collector of Customs with the particulars of the sale thereof, and out of the proceeds of the same pay to the said Collector the duties which may be due thereon.

Rebate.

(2) The rebate shall be paid out of the duties received by the Collector of Customs, anything in section 16 of the Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 to the contrary notwithstanding.

Form of certificate.

(3) The certificate required by this section shall be in such form as the Principal Collector of Customs shall from time to time prescribe.

Repeal.

3 The Ordinance No. 5 of 1884, intituled "The Customs Duties Amendment Ordinance of 1884," is hereby repealed

No. 21.—1892.

An Ordinance for making final provision for the Supplementary Contingent Charges for the year 1891.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance No. 21 of 1891 it was enacted that a sum of Rs. 1,619,878·70 should be charged upon the revenue of this Island for the Supplementary Contingent Service of the year One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-one, in addition to the sum of Rs. 11,102,543 provided by the Ordinance No. 29 of 1890, And whereas an expenditure of Rs. 22,588·58 was incurred and brought to account for the Contingent Services of the year 1891, for which provision is not made by the aforesaid Ordinances : It is enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Rs. 22,588·58 charged upon the revenue of this Island of the year 1891 for the final Supplementary Contingent Services of that year.

1 That a sum not exceeding Twenty-two thousand Five hundred and Eighty-eight rupees and Fifty-eight cents shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue of this Island of the said year 1891, for the services hereinafter mentioned ; the said expenditure being in conformity with the Schedule hereunto annexed, whereof the following is an abstract :—

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 22.—1892.

An Ordinance to apply a portion of the Surplus Revenues of past years to Works and Services of acknowledged Public Utility.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to apply a portion of the funds which have accrued from the surplus revenues of past years to the execution of works and services of acknowledged public utility :

Rs. 1,967,867 to be charged upon the surplus revenues of this Island.

1 It is therefore hereby enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that a sum not exceeding One million Nine hundred and sixty-seven thousand Eight hundred and sixty-

seven rupees out of the said surplus revenues shall be issued and applied to the execution of the several public works and services hereinafter mentioned, in conformity with the details of the estimates to be submitted :—

Treasurer to pay the above at such time as the Governor by warrant shall order.

2 The Treasurer of the said Island shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, in such proportions as the Governor for the time being by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him shall from time to time order and direct; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the said surplus revenues of the said Island.

And to receive credit in his accounts for the payments made in pursuance thereof.

3 The said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid ; and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall and may receive credit for the same accordingly.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 23.—1892.

An Ordinance to remove doubts as to past appropriation of Rates by the Municipal Council of Colombo.

A. E. HAVELÖCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS doubts have been entertained as to whether the Municipal Council of Colombo has lawfully applied the rate or rates heretofore made, assessed, and levied by it under the provisions of the Ordinances for the time being applicable to the Municipal Council of Colombo, and it is expedient to remove such doubts: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Past appropriation of rates declared legal.

1 The application in whole or in part by the Municipal Council of Colombo heretofore made of any rate or rates made, assessed, and levied under the Ordinances No. 17 of 1865, No. 16 of 1881, No. 7 of 1886, or No. 7 of 1887, to any purpose or purposes other than those provided by the said Ordinances or any of them, is hereby declared to have been in all respects and for all purposes legal and valid.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 24.—1892.

An Ordinance to amend the Ordinance No. 6 of 1885.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Ordinance No. 6 of 1885, intituled "An Ordinance to enable the Bishop, Clergy, and Laity of the Church of England in Ceylon to provide for the regulation of the affairs of the said Church," and hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Definitions.

1 In this Ordinance—

"Church" shall be construed to mean any Episcopal church not governed by the provisions of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1846, which has not been brought under the operation of the provisions of the Ordinance No. 5 of 1864, and any church not vested in any person or body corporate or originally vested in any trustee or trustees where the deed or instrument creating the trust contains no adequate provisions for the appointment of a new trustee or trustees, and the trustee or one or more of the trustees originally appointed may have died, or may have left the Colony and be residing elsewhere, or may be desirous of being relieved from the duties thereof.

"Members of the congregation" shall mean all persons entitled to vote at the election of lay representatives of the church under the rules and regulations for the time being of the synod, assembly, or convention held under the authority of the principal Ordinance.

Power to Synod to make regulations enabling congregations to pass a resolution to vest the church in the incorporated trustees.

2 It shall be lawful for the synod, assembly, or convention held under the authority of the principal Ordinance, by any statute, ordinance, or resolution to be passed for such purpose, to make regulations for enabling the majority of the members of the congregation of any church, present and voting at a meeting to be held and convened in manner by the said regulations provided, to declare by resolution their desire that such church and all immovable property belonging or appertaining to such church shall absolutely vest in "The Incorporated Trustees of the Church of England in Ceylon."

Church to vest in incorporated trustees on such resolution being passed.

3 On the passing of such resolution by the congregation under section 2 of this Ordinance, the church and all the immovable property belonging or appertaining to such church shall forthwith absolutely vest in the incorporated trustees of the Church of England in Ceylon in trust, and to and for the use of the Church of England in Ceylon, in the same and in the like manner as the same has heretofore been held, exercised, and enjoyed; subject, nevertheless, in all respects to the provisions and conditions contained in the 9th section of the principal Ordinance, whereby the constitution of the said incorporated trustees and the beneficial enjoyment of all property which shall vest in them are to be regulated or controlled by the said synod, assembly, or convention.

Resolution to be published in the Government Gazette. Short title.

4 Every resolution passed by a congregation under section 2 of this Ordinance shall be published in the *Government Gazette* within one month of the passing thereof.

5 This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Episcopal Church Amendment Ordinance, 1892."

Preamble.

Rs.1,099,582*05 to be charged upon the revenue of this Island for the Supplementary Contingent Charges for the year 1892.

1 That a sum not exceeding One million and Ninety-nine thousand Five hundred and eighty-two rupees and five cents shall be, and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue of this Island for the services hereinafter mentioned; and the said expenditure shall be in conformity with the details of the estimates specified in the Schedule A hereunto annexed, whereof the following is an abstract:—

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 27.—1892.

An Ordinance to empower Police Magistrates to try certain Offences in a more expeditious manner than is provided in "The Criminal Procedure Code, 1883."

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for the trial of certain petty offences in a more expeditious manner than is provided in "The Criminal Procedure Code, 1883": Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Power to try in a summary way certain cases.

1 Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Criminal Procedure Code, 1883," and "The Criminal Procedure Code Amendment Ordinance, 1890," any police magistrate specially empowered in this behalf may try in manner hereinafter provided all or any of the following offences:—

- (a) Offences against the Ceylon Penal Code, sections 157, 257, 258, 259, 270, 271, 272, 278, 279, 282, 283, 285, 286, 287, 289, 314, 325, 327, 332, 343, 409, 433, 434, 484, and 488.
- (b) Theft under sections 367, 369, and 370 of the same Code, where the value of the property stolen does not exceed fifty rupees.
- (c) Receiving or retaining stolen property under section 394 of the same Code, where the value of such property does not exceed fifty rupees.
- (d) Assisting in the concealment or disposal of stolen property under section 396 of the same Code, where the value does not exceed fifty rupees.
- (e) Offences against any other Ordinance and against the by-laws, rules, or regulations made under or in pursuance thereof punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 50, or with imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or with both.
- (f) Abetment of any of the foregoing offences.
- (g) An attempt to commit any of the foregoing offences when such attempt is an offence.

Procedure.

2 In trials under this Ordinance the procedure prescribed by sections 216, 217, 218, and sub-section 1 of section 219 and sections 220, 221, 222, 223, 224, 228, 229, 230, 236 of the chapter substituted by "The Criminal Procedure Code Amendment Ordinance, 1890," for chapter XIX. of "The Criminal Procedure Code, 1883," so far as they are applicable, shall be followed, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained.

Particulars to be recorded.

3 The police magistrate, in cases tried under this Ordinance, need not record at length the evidence of the witnesses or the statement of the accused, or frame a formal charge, but he shall enter in such form, as the Governor in Executive Council may direct, the following particulars—

- (a) the serial number;
- (b) the name and residence of the complainant (if any);
- (c) the name and residence of the accused;
- (d) the offence complained of, and the offence (if any) proved, and in cases coming under sub-section (b), sub-section (c), or sub-section (d) of section 1, the value of the property in respect of which the offence has been committed;
- (e) the plea of the accused and his examination (if any);
- (f) a concise memorandum of the substance of what each witness deposes (which shall be recorded as the examination of each witness proceeds);
- (g) the finding, and, in the case of a conviction, a brief statement of the reasons therefor;
- (h) the substance of the statement (if any) made by the accused; and

Record in cases under this Ordinance.

(i) the sentence or other final order.

4 The particulars mentioned in the preceding section shall be the only record in cases coming under this Ordinance.

Finding not limited by complaint.

5 A police magistrate may in any proceedings under this Ordinance convict the accused of any offence triable under this Ordinance which from the facts admitted or proved he appears to have committed, whatever may be the nature of the complaint or information. Provided that the particulars of the offence shall have been stated to the accused, and he has had an opportunity of making his defence; but in no case shall it be necessary to frame a formal charge.

Limit of imprisonment.

6 No sentence of imprisonment exceeding one month, or fine exceeding twenty-five rupees, shall be passed in the case of any convicton under this Ordinance.

Governor may empower magistrates to act under this Ordinance.

7 The Governor in Executive Council, after consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, may, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, confer on any police magistrate power to try under the provisions of this Ordinance all or any of the offences mentioned in section 1.

An Ordinance to amend "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1874."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1874," in the particulars hereinafter mentioned: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

To be read with Ordinance No. 6 of 1874.

1 This Ordinance shall be construed and read as one with "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1874," hereinafter called the principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 5 of principal Ordinance.

2 In section 5 of the principal Ordinance for the words "three or more" shall be substituted the words "two or more."

Amendment of section 11 of principal Ordinance.

3 Section 11 of the principal Ordinance shall be amended as follows:—

(1) For the words "five members" shall be substituted the words "not less than three or more than five members."

(2) For the words "not less than ten proprietors or resident managers within the district" shall be substituted the words "such number of proprietors or resident managers as shall represent not less than two-thirds of the acreage within the district."

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed, at such rates as the Governor from time to time shall by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates thereafter specified :

And whereas by section 1 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885, intituled "An Ordinance authorising the Legislative Council by resolution to establish tolls, and the Governor in Executive Council by resolution to abolish tolls, and to alter the places where tolls shall be collected," it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session thereof, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, anything contained in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding ; and by section 2 of the same Ordinance it is further enacted that when tolls shall be so by any such resolution established, the provisions of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," and of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1871 shall, in so far as they are not repugnant to the said Ordinance, apply thereto :

And whereas the Legislative Council at a public session thereof held on the 14th day of December, 1892, by a resolution established tolls at a place between the 47th and 48th mileposts, and at a place between the 57th and 58th mileposts on the road from Colombo to Galle, as from and after the 1st day of January, 1893 :

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the rates at which the tolls so established in respect of the said road shall be levied :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf on Us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the tolls so established in respect of the said road from Colombo to Galle between the 47th and 48th mileposts and between the 57th and 58th mileposts on the said road shall be in accordance with those set out in the schedule hereto.

THE following by-laws framed under the Ordinance No. 19 of 1891, relating to Markets in the Northern Province, are published for general information.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

Public Markets.

1. Public markets shall be open daily from 5 A.M. to 9 P.M.
2. Every stall-keeper, boutique-keeper, or occupier of any hut or building paying rent for the ground, or occupation of a stall in a building in a public market, shall clean or sweep the same daily, and shall keep it in a clean and wholesome state.
3. No fish or meat of any description shall be brought into, exposed for sale, or sold in any places except those set apart for the sale of fish or of meat in each public market in which such sale is allowed, and such places shall be used exclusively for the keeping, exposing, or selling of such fish or meat respectively.
4. Persons erecting huts in the spaces set apart for such huts shall erect them only in such lines as may be determined on by the Chairman for the public convenience and for proper passage and ventilation.
5. No shed in the spaces other than those set apart under section 4 of the Ordinance shall have a larger floor measurement than 6 feet by 4 feet, nor be less than 6 feet in height at the corner posts.
6. The Committee may mark off in each market such spaces for stalls as may seem to it necessary.
7. The Committee may through the Chairman enter into leases, which may extend to twelve months, on lease bonds containing such terms as the Committee thinks just, and as may be agreed to by the lessees.
8. Rents or fees shall be paid to the persons appointed by the Committee to recover them.
9. Commission may be paid to such persons at rates fixed by the Committee.
10. The Chairman or any person authorised by him may put up to public auction the right to occupy for twelve months the several stalls in the buildings or lots in the spaces other than the spaces set apart under section 4 of the Ordinance. The Chairman may, at his discretion, accept the offers of the highest bidders, or accept lower offers, or reject all offers made, provided that the offers made and accepted shall not be less than at the rate of one cent per square foot of floor area per month, and that the bidders whose offers are accepted shall thereupon enter into the required bonds referred to in by-law.
11. The Chairman may let any vacant stall or lot of ground in the spaces not set apart under section 4 of the Ordinance for any less period than twelve months on payment of a rent or fee at the rate of one cent per square foot of floor area per month.
12. A statement of all such sales and lettings as are referred to in by-laws Nos. 7, 10, and 11 shall be laid before the Committee at their next meeting.
13. Any occupier of the space set apart in section 4 of the Ordinance neglecting or refusing to remove his building, hut, or shed within the time fixed in the Ordinance shall be liable to the penalty provided by section 8 of the Ordinance.

Private Markets.

14. The fee for a license to hold a private market shall be one rupee a year.

General.

15. No person shall take any cattle, sheep, goats, swine, or other animals into any part of the market except into such places as may be set apart therefor; and no person shall allow his cart, carriage, or other conveyance to stand in any part of the market ground except when being loaded or unloaded.

16. No person affected with, or suffering from, any cutaneous disease shall occupy any stall, or expose for sale any provisions whatsoever.

17. No person shall throw offal, dirt, filth, or rubbish, or commit nuisance by easing himself on any market ground, or in any building, hut, or shed in such ground, or on the high roads bordering the same.

18. No person shall kill any animal, or flay or disembowel any carcass within the limits of any market, or on the high roads bordering the same.

Market-keepers, &c.

19. It shall be lawful for the Committee to appoint, to remunerate, to dismiss, and to make rules for the duties of market-keepers, inspectors, and others necessary for the conservancy of the markets.

20. Any person obstructing the market-keeper or other person employed by the Committee in the lawful execution of his duty shall be liable to the penalty provided by section 8 of the Ordinance.

BY-LAWS FOR MARKET-KEEPERS, &C.

1. The market-keeper shall reside within half a mile of the market.

2. He shall see that the buildings, huts, or sheds referred to in clause 4 of the Ordinance are removed within the time fixed.

3. He shall see that the market is kept clean, and that the by-laws and the provisions of the Ordinance are observed by persons frequenting the market, and report any infringement thereof to the Chairman.

4. The inspectors shall visit the markets, public and private, as frequently as they can, but at least once a week, and report to the Chairman on the state of the markets.
