THE following Rules, which have been passed by the Directors of the Ceylon Savings Bank and approved by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

RULES.

- Quarterly meetings of Directors. 1. A meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held in the first week of every quarter. Four days' notice of such meeting, showing the nature of the business to be transacted, shall be given to each Director.
- Statement of affairs. 2. At every quarterly meeting the Secretary shall submit a general statement of the affairs of the bank, made up to the last day of the preceding month, which statement, if satisfactory to the Directors, shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting.
- Annual meeting of depositors and rate of interest. 3. The Board of Directors shall prepare an annual statement of the affairs of the bank, made up to December 31, to be laid before the general meeting of depositors at their annual general meeting. They shall, on or before February 1 in each year, by public notification in the *Gazette*, declare the rate of interest to be allowed from January 1 to December 31 of the current year.
4. The Bank shall be open daily between the hours of 10 and 3 (Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays excepted). Deposits and withdrawals may be made between the hours of 11 A.M. and 2 P.M.
- The Secretary shall verify the Deposit Account by comparing the Deposit Book kept by the Clerks in charge of Ledgers with that of the Accountant's, and certify the same by attaching his signature thereto.
- Declaration of Depositor's book. 5. Any person desirous of becoming a depositor shall, on making his first deposit, and at other times if required to do so, declare his residence and occupation, and affix his signature or mark to such declaration in a book to be kept for the purpose; and every depositor shall be furnished with a deposit book, in which all sums lodged must be entered and signed by the Accountant and initialled by the Shroff at the time of transaction.
6. Persons who are already depositors may send additional sums with their deposit books.
- Moneys for deposit. Depositors unable to attend. 7. Persons residing at out-stations may remit moneys for deposit through the Government Agents, or by post office order, or bank draft or cheque on Colombo. Withdrawals will be paid by draft on the various Kachcheries or otherwise by special arrangement.
- Notice of withdrawals. 8. Depositors may withdraw the whole or part of their deposits on any day to be appointed by the Accountant, after due notice has been given for that purpose, as follows, viz.:—
- For sums above Rs. 50 and under Rs. 500, not exceeding one week from date of receipt of notice.
- For sums above Rs. 500 and under Rs. 1,000, not exceeding two weeks from date of receipt of notice.
- For sums above Rs. 1,000, not exceeding four weeks from date of receipt of notice.
- Deposits can only be repaid to the depositor himself or to his duly constituted attorney, or to the bearer of an order from such depositor or attorney together with the depositor's book duly signed and witnessed by a Justice of the Peace, a Public Notary, a Manager of a Bank, Clergyman or Minister of the Christian religion, or a qualified Medical Officer. The depositor's book should also be countersigned by the person receiving the money and initialled by the Accountant and Shroff.
- Interest. 9. Interest will be calculated on sums of five rupees, ten rupees, fifteen rupees, and so on (but not on fractional part of five rupees) from the first day of the month subsequent to that in which the deposit shall have been made to the last day of the month previous to withdrawal. The interest will be entered as cash deposits on December 31 in each year, and depositors' books must be sent to the Accountant as early as possible before April 1 in each year, that the interest may be entered therein.
- Depositors deceased or removing from Ceylon. Interest on deposits shall be paid for one year only after the death of any depositor, or after his ceasing to reside in Ceylon, except in case of death of a parent or natural guardian who may have made deposits on behalf of a minor, in which case interest may be paid till the minor attains majority, regardless of place of residence of the minor.
- Calendar year. 10. The year for all Savings Bank purposes shall be considered the calendar year, January 1 to December 31.
- Loss of deposit books. 11. Loss of deposit books must be attested by affidavit, and the sum of one rupee shall be paid for each new book issued to replace such lost book, and one rupee shall likewise be paid for each book destroyed, defaced, or mutilated.
12. The officers of the Savings Bank will endeavour to prevent fraud and to identify every depositor transacting business with the Savings Bank, but if any person shall obtain possession of a depositor's book and then fraudulently represent himself to be the depositor, and by giving the proper notice of withdrawal and by presentation of the depositor's book, and compliance with the rules of the Savings Bank, shall obtain any sum of money belonging to that depositor, the Savings Bank will not be responsible for the loss thereof.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA.—No. 11.

Australia—North Coast—Approaches to Port Darwin, Northern Territory.

Masters of ships and others are hereby informed that on and after February 1, 1893, a light of the following description will be exhibited from Charles Point:—Position (approx.), lat. 12° 23' 20" S.; long. 130° 37' E. The tower is built of iron, and painted red and white in horizontal bands. The focal plane of the light is 121 ft. above high water, and the light will be visible from a vessel's deck, in ordinary weather, 18 miles. The light will be of the first order, revolving every thirty seconds, and will show over an arc of 257°, viz., a green sector of 60° over the Great Fish Reef and adjacent dangers, from N. 22° E. to N. 82° E.; bright 155°, from N. 82° E. to S. 57° W.; and a red sector of 42° showing over the shoals to the west of Port Darwin entrance, from S. 57° W. to N. 81° W., the remaining arc of 103° to be obscured.

Referring to Notice to Mariners No. 5 of 1891, mariners are hereby informed that the erection of the lighthouse on Point Emery is postponed for the present.

Japan—Honchu—East Coast—Rikuzen District—Position of Oginohama Beacon Light.

Referring to Notice to Mariners No. 535 of 1892, on erection of Oginohama beacon light, the following information has been received from Commander N. Uyemura, Commanding H.I.J.M.S. Atago, that this beacon light is placed on a point (name Saki-yama) which lies little less than 3 cables E.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. from Daijogasaki, and its approximate position is as follows :—

Latitude 38° 22' 39" N.; longitude 141° 26' 46" E.

Honshu—North-West Coast—Noto District—Nanao Bay.

Buoys marking Asaguri Reef, Suzuki Reef,
Morita Reef, and Shichiko Reef.

(1) Asaguri reef buoy is a black pyramidal wooden buoy, surmounted by two triangles placed apex to apex, 15 ft. high above the water, and is moored over the reef in 2½ fathoms water at low water springs.

(2) Suzuki reef buoy is a red pyramidal wooden buoy with squarehead, 15 ft. high above the water, and is moored over the reef in 2½ fathoms water at low water springs.

(3) Morita reef buoy is a black pyramidal wooden buoy, surmounted by isosceles triangle, 15 ft. high above the water, and is moored over the reef in 1 fathom water at low water springs.

(4) Shichiko reef buoy is a red pyramidal wooden buoy with spherical head, 15 ft. high above the water, and is moored over the reef in 2½ fathoms water at low water springs.

Japan—Honshu—East Coast—Kinkuwasan Approach—Unsuccessful search of a Sandbank.

The following information has been received, that a sandbank, reported by the French ships Bourayne and Triomphante, was unsuccessfully searched for by Commander N. Kashiwabara commanding H.I.J.M. surveying ship Banjo. The area over and around the reported positions was sounded, but on indications of a bank could be found.

Hokushu—West Coast—Rishiri Island—Oshidomari Bay—Light Exhibited.

On December 15, 1892, a light was exhibited at the north-west extreme (Bejinhana) of Oshidomari bay, Rishiri island, Hokushu west coast.

The light is a revolving white light of sixth order. It shows a flash every 15 seconds between S. 32° 0' E. and N. 26° 42' E. over an arc of 238° 42', and covers this bay between N. 59° 19' W. and N. 26° 42' E. over an arc of 86° 1'.

The light is shown at an elevation of 238½ ft. above the sea, and in clear weather should be visible from a distance of 14 miles.

The lighthouse is a circular stone tower, 15 ft. high, and painted white

PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by the 25th section of "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889," it is enacted that all rules framed under the provisions of section 13 or 16 shall be transmitted by the Government Agent to the Governor for the approval or disallowance thereof by the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council; and in case such rules shall be approved, notice of such approval shall be given by Proclamation; and the said rules shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and in the district in such a manner as to the Government Agent shall seem expedient, and shall thereupon become binding upon all proprietors within the said district, and shall be as legal, valid, and effectual as if the same had been inserted in the said Ordinance: Provided that nothing contained in such rules shall be repugnant to, or inconsistent with, the true intent and meaning of the said Ordinance:

And whereas the rules set forth in the several schedules hereto have been framed under the provisions of section 13 of the said Ordinance for the encouragement and extension of paddy cultivation in the several subdivisions respectively of the Trincomalee District, in the Eastern Province, and for the enforcement of the ancient customs of such subdivisions of the said district in regard to the irrigation and cultivation of paddy lands and the maintenance of the water rights of the proprietors within the said subdivisions, and have been transmitted by the Government Agent of the said Province to the Governor for the approval or disallowance thereof by the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and such rules have been duly approved by the Governor with the advice aforesaid:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation give notice of such our approval of the rules set forth in the several schedules hereto aforesaid, and the said rules are hereby published for general information.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon this Fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-three.

SCHEDULE A.

RULES for the Irrigation and Cultivation of Paddy Lands in *Koddiyar Pattu* of the Trincomalee District of the Eastern Province, drawn up in accordance with the ancient customs and in conformity with resolutions passed at a meeting held at Koddiyar on 23rd October, 1891, under "The Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889," section 26.

1. The Vaddai Vidanais, who shall be elected in the manner provided in the 19th section of the Ordinance shall have the entire supervision of all the works of irrigation, distribution of water, and paddy cultivation within their respective divisions. They shall enforce the following rules, and bring all breaches of the same before the Village Council for adjudication. The Vaddai Vidanais shall be assisted, when necessary, by Adikaries or Veli-arachchies elected as prescribed by the Ordinance, and these officers shall be liable for all neglect of duty proved to the satisfaction of the Village Council as for a breach of rules.

2. The Vaddai Vidanais shall be entitled to receive, as Vaddai Vidanai's share, from the cultivators one marakal of paddy for each amunam sown, and where an Adikari or Veli-arachchi has been appointed one marakal in addition shall be set apart for his share; if more than one Adikari have been appointed, the Adikari's share shall be divided equally between them. This paddy shall be delivered to the Vaddai Vidanais and Adikaries at the threshing-floor before any is removed.

3. The Vaddai Vidanai and Adikari of each division shall reside within the limits of such division, and they shall not absent themselves during the cultivation season or at other times when their services are required, without reasonable cause and without providing substitutes.

4. Each proprietor shall contribute, whenever required, either in money or labour, in the following proportion towards any work of construction, repair, restoration, improvement, or upkeep of the tank or channel or water-courses connected with it outside the fields which the Government Agent, after due inquiry, shall consider necessary, and shall order to be carried out, viz. :—

One day's labour or its equivalent in money paid in advance at the rate of 30 cents for each bushel of land owned by him in the field, provided that such labour shall not exceed thirty days in the case of a proprietor owning less than seventy-five bushels, and not less than six days in any case; and in the case of a proprietor owning seventy-

five bushels or more, such labour shall not exceed fifty days. Provided that if in any year it shall not be found necessary to require from every proprietor the full amount of labour, the Government Agent shall decide what proportion of labour shall be contributed by each proprietor; also, provided that the payment annually shall not exceed 30 cents per bushel.

5. In addition to the ordinary labour of the year as above provided for, whenever the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, or person acting under their orders, shall find it necessary to call out the labour of a village to perform an urgent work of repair or of prevention of inevitable damage, uncommuted labour, either in person or by substitute, shall at once be furnished by every proprietor, and continued daily until the completion of the work. Provided double the ordinary labour provided in rule 4 shall not be exceeded in any one year.

6. Notice shall be given by the Vaddai Vidanai by beat of tom-tom in the village not less than twenty days beforehand of the intention to call out the labour of a village provided for in the 4th rule, and of the proportion of labour required.

7. The Vaddai Vidanais shall prepare each year a revised roll of the proprietors in their respective divisions, and the proprietors shall furnish, ten days after publication by tom-tom under rule 6, a list to the Vaddai Vidanai of the cultivators to be employed in each share. Any change of cultivators during the cultivation shall be notified forthwith to the Vaddai Vidanai in writing by the proprietor.

8. By the tenth day after notice by beat of tom-tom, proprietors intending to commute shall make their intention known, and shall pay in, before the day fixed for the commencement of the work, the full sum of commutation due by them. Each proprietor or cultivator electing to work shall attend at the appointed place for work at 6 A.M., continue to work to 11 A.M., and again from 1 to 5 P. M., and shall carefully carry out the work assigned to him by the Vaddai Vidanai or other officer in charge of the work.

9. The construction or improvement of water-courses and channels inside the fields shall be considered to belong to the description of work provided for by rule 4. The mere upkeep, however, of water-courses and channels inside the fields shall be maintained by the proprietors of the shares through which they lead, whether such shares be cultivated or not.

10. The distribution of water to the various vaddais shall be regulated by the Vaddai Vidanais, subject to revision by the Wanniah and Village Council.

11. Where no channel exists for the drainage of any field, the field on the higher level is entitled to allow the surplus water to flow on to the lower field; but the proprietor of the latter can apply to the Village Council to order a new channel to be opened under rule 9.

12. No gaps (vettuvan) in any permanent dam shall be allowed to be cut, but wooden pipes (kottu) shall be inserted in all necessary places by the Vaddai Vidanais; the cost of insertion and upkeep of such pipes shall be borne by the owners of all lands dependent on the outlet jointly at a rate proportioned to the extent of their land, and in the event of refusal the person so refusing shall not only become liable for a breach of rules, but the Vaddai Vidanai shall sue him for the share of expense due by him.

13. No person shall obstruct, encroach on, or lessen the width of any water-courses or vaikals

14. No new dam to divert water from any customary dam shall be constructed, nor shall any upper dam be broken down to make up for a deficiency of water below without the consent of the Village Council; but should fresh dams be necessary for the supply of water to any new lands, the Government Agent shall call a Village Council to decide thereon.

15. If, owing to drought or any unexpected accident to a dam, the quantity of water available be found insufficient for the season, a Village Council shall make a division to the various subdivisions, by allowing the full volume of water to each subdivision for a given time; and such division shall be final, subject to appeal to the Government Agent.

16. If any person shall wilfully prevent water flowing to the field below his own, the Vaddai Vidanai shall proceed to the spot with witnesses and have the gaps (vakkaddavai) open in his presence.

17. No person shall in any way alter or injure any ridge (varampu) or boundary between fields in the same vaddai, and on information to that effect the Vaddai Vidanai shall proceed to the spot with witnesses and restore every such alteration to its original state if the parties consent, but if objection is made he shall report to the Village Council for decision and carry out such orders as he shall receive.

18. The date at which cultivations in each vaddai shall be commenced, and the description of grain to be sown, shall be fixed by the Village Council, subject to revision by the Government Agent, and all proprietors shall make up their ridge (varampu) at the same time and leave proper gaps (vakkaddavai) for the conveyance of water to the fields on a lower level.

19. Should any proprietor neglect or refuse to cultivate his share, the Village Council, subject to revision by the Government Agent, may allow such share to be cultivated by any other proprietor or cultivator, free of rent for the season, all the duties of the owner being performed by the person cultivating for that season. Such duties shall not include services required by the proprietors by the 4th and 5th rules.

20. No person shall be exempted from contributing his quota of labour for any work to which he is liable under these rules, on the ground that he has not cultivated for the season, unless his field may have been cultivated by some other person under rule 18, and then only if such quota of labour be due for that season only.

21. A proprietor unable to attend personally may provide for the cultivation of his share by substitute (varakudi) in the performance of the duties required.

22. The fence round the whole vaddai shall be measured by the Vaddai Vidanai, and by him apportioned to each proprietor in proportion to the extent of his share, but without regard to whether the fence adjoins his share or not. Each proprietor shall erect a watch-hut (purai) in the centre of his portion of fence, and shall keep both fence and purai in repair, keep a regular watch, and accompany the superintendents in their rounds at nights with chulu lights till the Vaddai Vidanai announces that the whole vaddai has been reaped and stored.

23. Should a portion of any vaddai ripen before the rest by the cultivation of sineddi paddy or from any other cause, the cultivator of that portion shall, with the consent of the Vaddai Vidanai, be allowed to reap and store the same; but he shall continue to watch the field and preserve the fence until the remainder of the vaddai has been reaped and stored.

24. The threshing-floors (kalaveddis) shall be cleared and fenced with stakes by the joint labour of all the cultivators stacking paddy there, who shall also take their turn to watch the same.

25. After cultivation has once commenced as fixed by rule 18 no cattle shall be admitted to the vaddai except for the purpose of cultivation.

26. During the cultivation season no cattle shall be allowed to graze within one mile of any cultivated place, unless they be tethered or in charge of a herdsman.

27. The owners and cultivators of all new lands which have been or may hereafter be purchased from the Crown in this division shall become liable for their joint share of labour under rules 4 and 5, when called upon by the Vaddai Vidanai.

28. The owners or cultivators of these new lands shall be entitled to enjoy all the rights and privileges that belong to the owners of the old lands at present under cultivation.

30. * After the reaping is over the Vaddai Vidanai shall order the removal of the fence, and shall cause the fence sticks to be heaped by the cultivators in such places as he may appoint; and no one shall remove the fence sticks without the consent of the Vaddai Vidanai.

31. Jungle or trees growing within a vaddai and likely to occasion damage by giving cover to wild animals or otherwise shall be removed by the proprietors and cultivators of the land whereon they may be growing, when ordered by the Village Council.

32. The rules for Koddiyar pattu, dated 26th September, 1863, are hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE B.

RULES for the Irrigation and Cultivation of Paddy Lands in *Kaddukkulam Pattu* of the Trincomalee District of the Eastern Province, drawn up in accordance with the ancient customs and in conformity with resolutions passed at a meeting held at Nilavelli, in the said Kaddukkulam Pattu, on 17th September, 1891, under "The Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889," section 26.

1. The Vaddai Vidanais, who shall be elected in the manner provided in the 19th section of the Ordinance, shall have the entire supervision of all works of irrigation and paddy cultivation within their respective divisions. They shall enforce the following rules, and bring all breaches of the same before the Village Council for adjudication. The Vaddai Vidanais shall be assisted, when necessary, by Adikaries or Veli-arachchies, elected as prescribed by the Ordinance, and these officers shall be liable for all neglect of duty proved to the satisfaction of the Village Council as for a breach of rules.

2. The Vaddai Vidanais shall be entitled to receive, as Vaddai Vidanai's share, from the cultivators one marakkal of paddy for each amunam sown, and where an Adikari or Veli-arachchi has been appointed one marakkal in addition shall be set apart from his share; if more than one Adikari have been appointed, the Adikari's share shall be divided equally between them. This paddy shall be delivered to the Vaddai Vidanais and Adikaries at the threshing-floor before any is removed.

3. The Vaddai Vidanai and Adikari of each division shall reside within the limits of such division, and they shall not absent themselves during the cultivation season or at other times when their services are required, without reasonable cause and without providing substitutes.

4. Each proprietor shall contribute, whenever required, either in money or labour, in the following proportion towards any work of construction, repair, restoration, improvement, or upkeep of the tank or channel or water-courses connected with it outside the fields which the Government Agent, after due inquiry, shall consider necessary, and shall order to be carried out, viz. —

One day's labour or its equivalent in money paid in advance at the rate of 30 cents for each bushel of land owned by him in the field, provided that such labour shall not exceed thirty days in the case of a proprietor owning less than seventy-five bushels, and not less than six days in any case; and in the case of a proprietor owning seventy-five bushels or more, such labour shall not exceed fifty days. Provided that if in any year it shall not be found necessary to require from every proprietor the full amount of labour, the Government Agent shall decide what proportion of labour shall be contributed by each proprietor. Provided also that the payment annually shall not exceed 30 cents per bushel.

5. In addition to the ordinary labour of the year as above provided for, whenever the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, or person acting under their orders shall find it necessary to call out the labour of a village to perform an urgent work of repair or of prevention of inevitable damage, uncommuted labour, either in person or by substitute, shall at once be furnished by every proprietor, and continued daily until the completion of the work, provided double the ordinary labour prescribed in rule 4 shall not be exceeded in any one year.

6. Notice shall be given by the Vaddai Vidanai by beat of tom-tom in the village not less than twenty days beforehand of the intention to call out the labour of a village provided for in the 4th rule, and of the proportion of labour required.

7. The Vaddai Vidanais shall prepare each year a revised roll of the proprietors in their respective divisions, and the proprietors shall furnish, ten days after publication by tom-tom under rule 6, a list to the Vaddai Vidanai of the cultivators to be employed in each share. Any change of cultivators during the cultivation shall be notified forthwith to the Vaddai Vidanai in writing by the proprietor.

8. By the tenth day after notice by beat of tom-tom, proprietors intending to commute shall make their intention known, and shall pay in, before the day fixed for the commencement of the work, the full sum of commutation due by them. Each proprietor or cultivator electing to work shall attend at the appointed place for work at 6 A.M., continue to work to 11 A.M., and again from 1 to 5 P.M., and shall carefully carry out the work assigned to him by the Vaddai Vidanai or other officer in charge of the work.

9. The construction or improvement of water-courses and channels inside the fields shall be considered to belong to the description of work provided for by rule 4. The mere upkeep, however, of water-courses and channels inside the fields shall be maintained by the proprietors of the shares through which they lead, whether such shares be cultivated or not.

10. The distribution of water to the various vaddais shall be regulated by the Vaddi Vidanais, subject to revision by the Vanniya and Village Council.

11. In case of lands watered by the tanks, it may sometimes occur that there is not sufficient water in the tank to cultivate more than a portion of the whole tract dependent on the tank, and on such occasions the Vanniya and Village Council shall decide how much land shall be cultivated, subject to revision by the Government Agent. The proprietors generally shall cultivate such portion without reference to ownership in the same proportion to the extent cultivated as the whole share of each bears to the whole tract dependent on the tank.

12. No gaps (vettuvan) in any permanent dam shall be allowed to be cut, but wooden pipes (kottu) shall be inserted in all necessary places by the Vaddai Vidanais. The cost of insertion and upkeep of such pipes shall be borne by the owners of all lands dependent on the outlet jointly at a rate proportioned to the extent of their land, and in the event of refusal the person so refusing shall not only become liable for a breach of rules, but the Vaddai Vidanai shall sue him for the share of expense due by him.

13. No person shall obstruct, encroach on, or lessen the width of any water-courses or vaikals.

14. No new dam to divert water from any customary dam shall be constructed, nor shall any upper dam be broken down to make up for a deficiency of water below, without the consent of the Village Council; but should fresh dams be necessary for the supply of water to any new land, the Government Agent shall call a Village Council to decide thereon.

15. If owing to drought or any unexpected accident to a dam the quantity of water available be found insufficient for the season, a Village Council shall make a division to the various subdivisions, by allowing the full volume of water to each subdivision for a given time; and such division shall be final, subject to appeal to the Government Agent.

16. If any person shall wilfully prevent water flowing to the field below his own, the Vaddai Vidanai shall proceed to the spot with witnesses and have the gaps (vakkaddavai) opened in his presence.

17. No person shall in any way alter or injure any ridge (varampu) or boundary between fields in the same vaddai, and on information to that effect the Vaddai Vidanai shall proceed to the spot with witnesses and restore every such alteration to its original state if the parties consent, but if objection is made, he shall report it to the Village Council for decision and carry out such orders as he shall receive.

18. The date at which cultivations in each vaddai shall be commenced, and the description of grain to be sown shall be fixed by the Village Council, subject to revision by the Government Agent, and all proprietors shall make up their ridges (varampus) at the same time and leave proper gaps (vakkaddavai) for the conveyance of water to the fields on a lower level.

19. Should any proprietor neglect or refuse to cultivate his share, the Village Council, subject to revision by the Government Agent, may allow such share to be cultivated by any other proprietor or cultivator, free of rent for the season, all the duties of the owner being performed by the person cultivating for that season. Such duties shall not include services required by the proprietors by the 4th and 5th rules.

20. If the share of an absentee remains cultivated, the proprietor himself shall perform all the duties required of a proprietor, whether he cultivates or not. Provided that in the case of proprietors unable to cultivate their shares for any year from ill-health or some unavoidable cause, the Government Agent may, if he thinks fit so to do, remit the commutation for service due for that year under the 4th rule.

21. A proprietor unable to attend personally may provide for the cultivation of his share by substitute (varakudi) in the performance of the duties required.

22. In the Tamil villages the fence round the whole vaddai shall be measured by the Vaddai Vidanai, and by him apportioned to each proprietor in proportion to the extent of his share, but without regard to whether the fence adjoins his share or not. Each proprietor shall erect a watch-hut (purai) in the centre of his portion of fence, and shall keep both fence and purai in repair, keep a regular watch, and accompany the superintendents in their rounds at nights with chulu lights till the Vaddai Vidanai announces that the whole vaddai has been reaped and stored.

23. In the Sinhalese villages the fencing shall be done as follows:—The allepattu holders are to fence the top and bottom of the tract and to watch according to ancient custom. The land in the centre is to be divided into the usual bogees, and fenced and watched in accordance with the ancient custom in each village.

24. Should a portion of any vaddai ripen before the rest by the cultivation of sunnedi paddy or from any other cause, the cultivator of that portion shall, with the consent of the Vaddai Vidanai, be allowed to reap and store the same, but he shall continue to watch the field and preserve the fence until the remainder of the vaddai has been reaped and stored.

25. The threshing-floors (kalaveddais) shall be cleared and fenced with stakes by the joint labour of all the cultivators stacking paddy there, who shall also take their turn to watch the same.

26. After cultivation has once commenced as fixed by rule 18, no cattle shall be admitted to the vaddai except for the purpose of cultivation.

27. During the cultivation season no cattle shall be allowed to graze within one mile of any cultivated place, unless they be tethered or in charge of a herdsman.

28. The owners and cultivators of all new lands which have been or may hereafter be purchased from the Crown in this division shall become liable for their joint share of labour under rules 4 and 5 when called upon by the Vaddai Vidanai.

29. The owners or cultivators of these new lands shall be entitled to enjoy all the rights and privileges that belong to the owners of the old lands at present under cultivation.

30. After the reaping is over the Vaddai Vidanai shall order the removal of the fence, and shall cause the fence sticks to be heaped by the cultivators in such places as he may appoint, and no one shall remove the fence sticks without the consent of the Vaddai Vidanai.

31. The rules for Kaddukulam pattu, dated 23rd April, 1868, are hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE C.

RULES for the Irrigation and Cultivation of Paddy Lands in *Tampalakam Pattu* of the Trincomalee District of the Eastern Province, drawn up in accordance with the ancient customs and in conformity with resolutions passed at a meeting held at Tampalakam on August 3, 1891, under "The Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889," section 26.

1. The Vaddai Vidanais, who shall be elected in the manner provided in the 19th section of the Ordinance, shall have the entire supervision of all works of irrigation, distribution of water, and paddy cultivation within their respective divisions. They shall enforce the following rules, and bring all breaches of the same before the Village Council for adjudication. The Vaddai Vidanais shall be assisted, when necessary, by Adikaries or Veli-arachchies, elected as prescribed by the Ordinance, and these officers shall be liable for all neglect of duty proved to the satisfaction of the Village Council as for breach of rules.

2. The Vaddai Vidanais shall be entitled to receive, as Vaddai Vidanai's share, from the cultivators one marakkal of paddy for each amunam sown, and where an Adikari or Veli-arachchi has been appointed one marakkal in addition shall be set apart from his share: if more than one Adikari have been appointed the Adikari's share shall be divided equally between them. This paddy shall be delivered to the Vaddai Vidanais and Adikaries at the threshing-floor before any is removed.

3. The Vaddai Vidanai and Adikari of each division shall reside within the limits of such division, and they shall not absent themselves during the cultivation season or at other times when their services are required, without reasonable cause and without providing substitutes.

4. Each proprietor shall contribute, whenever required, either in money or labour, in the following proportion towards any work of construction, repair, restoration, improvement, or upkeep of the tank or channel or water-courses connected with it outside the fields which the Government Agent, after due inquiry, shall consider necessary, and shall order to be carried out, viz.:—

One day's labour or its equivalent in money paid in advance at the rate of 30 cents for each bushel of land owned by him in the field, provided that such labour shall not exceed thirty days in the case of a proprietor owning less than seventy-five bushels and not less than six days in any case; and in the case of a proprietor owning seventy-five bushels or more such labour shall not exceed fifty days. Provided that in any year it shall not be found necessary to require from every proprietor the full amount of labour, the Government Agent shall decide what proportion of labour shall be contributed by each proprietor; and also provided that the payment annually shall not exceed 30 cents per bushel.

5. In addition to the ordinary labour of the year as above provided for, whenever the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, or person acting under their orders shall find it necessary to call out the labour of a village to perform an urgent work of repair or of prevention of inevitable damage, uncommuted labour, either in person or by substitute, shall at once be furnished by every proprietor, and continued daily until the completion of the work. Provided double the ordinary labour prescribed in rule 4 shall not be exceeded in any one year.

6. Notice shall be given by the Vaddai Vidanai by beat of tom-tom in the village not less than twenty days beforehand of the intention to call out the labour of a village provided for in the 4th rule, and of the proportion of labour required.

7. The Vaddai Vidanai shall prepare each year a revised roll of the proprietors in their respective divisions, and the proprietors shall furnish, ten days after publication by tom tom under rule 6, a list to the Vaddai Vidanai of the cultivators to be employed in each share. Any change of cultivators during the cultivation shall be notified forthwith to the Vaddai Vidanais in writing by the proprietor.

8. By the tenth day after notice by beat of tom-tom, proprietors intending to commute shall make their intention known, and shall pay in before the day fixed for the commencement of the work the full sum of commutation due by them. Each proprietor or cultivator electing to work shall attend at the appointed place for work at 6 A.M., continue to work to 11 A.M., and again from 1 to 5 P.M., and shall carefully carry out the work assigned to him by the Vaddai Vidanai or other officer in charge of the work.

9. The construction or improvement of water-courses and channels inside the fields shall be considered to belong to the description of work provided for by rule 4. The mere upkeep, however, of water-courses and channels inside the fields shall be maintained by the proprietors of the shares through which they lead, whether such shares be cultivated or not.

10. The distribution of water to the various vaddais shall be regulated by the Vaddai Vidanais, subject to revision by the Vanniah and Village Council.

11. No gaps (vettuvan) in any permanent dam shall be allowed to be cut, but wooden pipes (kottus) shall be inserted in all necessary places by the Vaddai Vidanais. The cost of insertion and upkeep of such pipes shall be borne by the owners of all lands dependent on the outlet jointly at a rate proportionate to the extent of their land, and in the event of refusal the person so refusing shall not only become liable for a breach of rules, but the Vaddai Vidanai shall sue him for the share of expense due by him.

12. No person shall obstruct, encroach on, or lessen the width of any water-courses or vaikals.

13. No new dam to divert water from any customary dam shall be constructed, nor shall any upper dam be broken down to make up for a deficiency of water below without the consent of the Village Council; but should fresh dams be necessary for the supply of water to any new lands, the Government Agent shall call a Village Council to decide thereon.

No person shall in any way alter or injure any ridge (varambu) or boundary between fields in the same vaddai, and on information to that effect the Vaddai Vidanai shall proceed to the spot with witnesses and restore every such alteration to its original state if parties consent, but if objection is made he shall report it to the Village Council for decision and carry out such orders as he shall receive.

17. The date at which cultivation in each vaddai shall be commenced, and the description of grain to be sown, shall be fixed by the Village Council subject to revision by the Government Agent, and all proprietors shall make up their ridges (varambus) at the same time and leave proper gaps (vakkadavai) for the conveyance of water to the fields on a lower level.

18. Should any proprietor neglect or refuse to cultivate his share, the Village Council, subject to revision by the Government Agent, may allow such share to be cultivated by any other proprietor or cultivator free of rent for the season, all the duties of the owner being performed by the person cultivating for that season. Such duties shall not include services required by the proprietors by the 4th and 5th rules.

19. If the share of an absentee remains uncultivated, the proprietor himself shall perform all the duties required of a proprietor whether he cultivates or not. Provided that in the case of proprietors unable to cultivate their shares for any year from ill-health or some unavoidable cause, the Government Agent may, if he thinks fit so to do, remit the commutation for services due for that year under the 4th rule.

20. A proprietor unable to attend personally may provide for the cultivation of his share by substitute (varakudi) in the performance of the duties required.

21. The fence round the whole vaddai shall be measured by the Vaddai Vidanai, and by him apportioned to each proprietor in proportion to the extent of his share, but without regard to whether the fence adjoins his share or not. Each proprietor shall erect a watch-hut (purai) in the centre of his portion of fence, and shall keep both fence and purai in repair, keep a regular watch, and accompany the superintendents in their rounds at nights with chulu lights till the Vaddai Vidanai announces that the whole vaddai has been reaped and stored.

22. Should a portion of any vaddai ripen before the rest by the cultivation of sinneddi paddy or from any other cause, the cultivator of that portion shall, with the consent of the Vaddai Vidanai, be allowed to reap and store the same, but he shall continue to watch the field and preserve the fence until the remainder of the vaddai has been reaped and stored.

23. The threshing-floors (kalaveddis) shall be cleared and fenced with stakes by the joint labour of all the cultivators stacking paddy there, who shall also take their turn to watch the same.

24. After cultivation has once commenced as fixed by rule 17, no cattle shall be admitted to the vaddai except for the purpose of cultivation.

25. During the cultivation season no cattle shall be allowed to graze within one mile of any cultivated place, unless they be tethered or in charge of a herdsman.

26. The owners and cultivators of all new lands which have been or may hereafter be purchased from the Crown under the provisions of Sir Henry Ward's Minute in this division shall become liable for their joint share of labour under rules 4 and 5, when called upon by the Vaddai Vidanai.

27. The owners or cultivators of these new lands shall, however, not be entitled to enjoy all the rights and privileges that belong to the owners of the old lands at present under cultivation until the matter shall have been considered by the Irrigation Council and, if necessary, by the Government Agent in appeal, whose decision either way should be final.

28. After the reaping is over the Vaddai Vidanai shall order the removal of the fence, and shall cause the fence sticks to be heaped by the cultivators in such places as he may appoint, and no one shall remove the fence sticks without the consent of the Vaddai Vidanai.

29. The rules for Tampalakamem pattu, dated 18th March, 1863, are hereby repealed.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by the 19th section of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1885 it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred, viz. :—

- (a) the period fixed under section 7 for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer ; and
- (b) if such claims have been made, the period fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Appellate Officer or the Supreme Court ; and
- (c) all lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 have been vested in the Crown—

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation :

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereunder mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all times have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest :

Now know all Men that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto to be a reserved forest as from and after the Twenty-eighth day of February, 1893, reserving, nevertheless, to the public the right of way along the following roads and footpaths within the said forest :—

- (1) The twelve-foot road from Pelmadulla to Rakwana between the 76th and 84th mileposts, described in preliminary plans 7,342 and 7,808.
- (2) The twelve-foot road from Madampé to Hambantota, described in preliminary plan 7,342, from its junction with road No. 1 at the 76th milepost as far as Alpiya village.
- (3) The twelve-foot road from Rakwana bazaar to Bulutota, described in preliminary plan 7,808, from the bridge over the Rakwana-ganga to the south-eastern limit of the Madampé gabadagama.
- (4) The six-foot footpath connecting roads Nos. 1 and 2, and described in preliminary plan 7,342, commencing from its junction with road No. 2 between lots T 14 and O 14, and continuing thence in a westerly direction between lots T 14 and N 15, R 14 and M 15, through lots L 15, K 15, J 15, and I 15, between lots H 15 and G 16, H 15 and G 15, M 14 and L 14, P 13 and K 14, P 13 and O 13, land described in title plan 72,382 and N 13, N 12 and M 12, N 11 and M 12, M 11 and L 12, through lots L 11, J 10, I 10, H 10, J 11 and I 11, and between lots H 11 and H 12 to its junction with road No. 1.
- (5) The six-foot road from Madampé to Horamulla, described in preliminary plans 7,342 and 7,808, from its junction with road No. 1, between lots R 18 and R 19, through lots Q 18 and N 21, between lots J 21 and 3, H 21 and 3, 1 and 3, 2 and 3, 21 and 3, 26 and 3, 24 and 25, to the point where it crosses the Demuwata-ganga.
- (6) The six-foot road from Weralugahamula to Ratnapura, described in preliminary plan 7,808, from its junction with road No. 1 at Pettitt's bridge, thence paralld with the course of the Demuwata-ganga along its northern bank as far as the western limit of Madampé gabadagama.
- (7) The six-foot footpath from Weralugahamula to Horamula, described in preliminary plan 7,808, from its junction with road No. 1 at lot 200, thence through lot 195 across the Mahadola, between lots 175 and 176 through lot 160, between lots 128 and 159, 149 and 150, through lots 155, 154, 145, 144, and 140½, between lots 118 and 139, 117 and 141, 116 and 137, 115 and 137, through lots 112, 113, 100, 110, and 99, to the Widat-ella.
- (8) The six-foot footpath described in preliminary plan 7,808 through lot 137, from footpath No. 7 to the Ketabodahenadola.
- (9) The six-foot footpath from Rakwana to Gangoda, described in preliminary plan 7,808, from its junction with road No. 1 at Rakwana bazaar, between Orangefield tea estate and lots 331, 330, 329, and 328, through lots 281 and 327, across the Mahadola, thence through lands described in preliminary plans 4411 and 4414, and south of lots 324, 323, and 314, to the western limit of Madampé gabadagama.
- (10) The six-foot road from Rakwana to Everton gap, described in preliminary plan 7,808, from its junction with footpath No. 9, between lots 327 and 328, through lands described in preliminary plan 4,428 and in title plans 63,342 and 63,359, north of lot 366, between lots 365 and 370, 375 and 376, and through lot 378 to the southern limit of Madampé gabadagama.

(11) The six-foot footpath from Rakwána bazaar to Godakawela, described in preliminary plan 7,808, starting from Rakwána bazaar and thence between lots 340 and 341, through lots 347, 342, and 346, to the eastern limit of Mádampé gabadágama :

Reserving also to the villagers of Mádampé gabadágama the right to use the water of the following streams flowing through the Mádampé gabadágama, for irrigation purposes:—
