

#### COUNCIL NOTICES. MUNICIPAL

### Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, June 15, 1895, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

Present :--Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman ; Dr. Frederick Keyt ; R. D. Ormsby, Esq. ; J. B. Siebel, Esq. J. N. d'Esterre, Esq. ; E. Beven, Esq. ; B. de Alwis, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 25, 1895, were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table :-Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from close of 1894 to May 31 last : also separate statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate accounts ; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date ; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of May.

-That the several statements, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, be Resolved, forwarded, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting. to the Colonial Secretary.

3. Read the following recommendation of the Standing Committee on the application dated December 12, 1894, from the Members of the Clerical Staff for compensation owing to the fall in exchange :-

"The Standing Committee recommend to the Council the adoption of the same terms as were determined on by the Municipal Council of Colombo at their Meeting on February S.

Proposed by Mr. E. Beven, seconded by Dr. F. Keyt, " that the term of service to entitle an officer to the increase be reduced from fifteen years, as adopted by the Colombo Council, to ten years, and that the recommendation be adopted with this amendment."

This was opposed by the Chairman, who considered that the service should be fifteen years. The Council divided, with the following result :--

Proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Mr. d'Esterre, "that the officers who received an increase to their salaries from January 1, 1895, should be excluded from the operation of the motion just passed, as those increases were granted for the same reasons as have been urged for the general increase now allowed." On this being put to the vote, the following votes were recorded :-

#### The Chairman declared that the motion was lost.

4 Considered the following recommendation of the Standing Committee :--- "The Standing Committee recommend the adoption of the suggestion that the water-rate limits to the east be extended so as to include the eastern and of Malabar street up to the Municipal limits."

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On motion of the Chairman it was unanimously resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted, and that the Colonial Secretary be asked to obtain the sanction of His Excellency the Governor to the necessary amendment of the schedule to the Ordinance No. 29 of 1884.

5. On the motion of Mr. J. B. Siebel, seconded by Dr. J. T. Morgan, it was unanimously resolved that the congratulations of the Council be tendered to the Chairman, the Hon. Allanson Bailey, on his being confirmed as Government Agent of the Central Province, and that a copy of the resolution be forwarded to him.

Health.—The general health of the Municipality has been good. The return of deaths shows a large proportion of cases of bowel complaints.

Drainage.--Want of water has interfered with the proper flushing of drains. Some improvements are being carried out.

Water.—Owing to the continued dry weather the supply has not been constant. The quality is good. Market.—Well kept and clean.

Slaughter-House and Shed.—Satisfactory. Many of the cattle appear rather old, and I rejected some owing to want of condition.

Public Latrines.-Satisfactory.

#### Progress Report of Work done brought up to May 31, 1895.

(a) 20 manhole covers renewed; 25 lineal yards of bartel drain cleared of silt; clearing gratings: 555 lineal feet of pavement curbing re-built in Hill street; 6 oisterns re-built; repairing gratings.

(b) 420 lines of sides of roads and drains cleared ; 85 cubes of metal transported.

(c) 318 lines of sides of roads and drains cleared ; sweeping leaves from roads ; wages of watcher.

(d) Opening soupper drains; 7 lines of side drains deepened; proportion of cost of store and latrine cooly.

(e) Shifting tiles, whitewashing, cleaning and oiling woodwork of bandstand; cleaning doors and windows and painting at Town Hall; repairing windows and staging.

(f) Hire of bullocks for water carts.

(g) Repairing stalls.

(h) Weeding land at head of lake ; repairing wire fence ; repairing a timber carrying truck.

(j) Weeding round trees and plants; trimming hedges; repairing tree guards.

(k) Purchase of two buckets.

(1) Transport of clay and sand ; repairs of sluice-door.

(m) 165 lines of sides of roads and drains cleared.

(n) 15 cubes of silt removed from minor traps round Victoria drive; 170 cubes of silt removed from silt trap. No. 2 at head of lake; repairing hand cart.

(o) Labour employed working dredger; opening channel for barge; repairs to dredger.

(p) Mowing grass on recreation ground and esplanade; weeding, deepening, and clearing of silt; drain on eastern side.

(q) 48 cubes of earth excavated and removed; 10 lineal feet of barrel drain re-constructed **2** Cross street; 13 feet of barrel drain extended in Brownrigg street and trapped; 33 lineal feet of barrel drain reconstructed in Brownrigg street in extension of drain from barracks; 100 lineal feet of permanent curbing re-constructed in Colombo street; 605 lineal feet of surface side drain constructed in coment concrete in Colombo street.

(r) Mining and blasting rocks near landing place.

(s) 8 cubes of excavation for foundation; 3.60 cubes of foundation constructed; 7.20 cubes of rubble masonry steps constructed; 3.80 cubes of rubble masonry retaining wall constructed; 1.35 square of paving for culvert; mining and blasting stones; transport of stones.
