MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, June 15, 1895, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

Present:—Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; Dr. Frederick Keyt; R. D. Ormsby, Esq.; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; J. N. d'Esterre, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; B. de Alwis, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 25, 1895, were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table:—Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from close of 1894 to May 31 last; also separate statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of May.

Resolved,—That the several statements, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, be forwarded, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, to the Colonial Secretary.

3. Read the following recommendation of the Standing Committee on the application dated December 12, 1894, from the Members of the Clerical Staff for compensation owing to the fall in exchange:—

"The Standing Committee recommend to the Council the adoption of the same terms as were determined on by the Municipal Council of Colombo at their Meeting on February 8."

Proposed by Mr. E. Beven, seconded by Dr. F. Keyt, "that the term of service to entitle an officer to the increase be reduced from fifteen years, as adopted by the Colombo Council, to ten years, and that the recommendation be adopted with this amendment."

5. On the motion of Mr. J. B. Siebel, seconded by Dr. J. T. Morgan, it was unanimously resolved that the congratulations of the Council be tendered to the Chairman, the Hon. Allanson Bailey, on his being confirmed as Government Agent of the Central Province, and that a copy of the resolution be forwarded to him.
