Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, June 8, 1894.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated June 2, 1894.

Present :- Mr. C. E. D. Pennycuick, Mayor and Chairman; Hon. Sir John J. Grinlinton; Hon. W. R. Kynsey, c.m.c.; Captain F. Bailey; Mr. C. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. C. M. Fernando; and Mr. A. Alwis.

The Minutes of May 25, 1894, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of May 25, 1894, be confirmed.

A statement of receipts and disbursements from January 1 to May 31, 1894, was laid on the table.

A letter No. 272 of June 7, 1894, from the Superintendent of Works, was read, explaining that owing to the early date of the present Meeting the progress report of work done could not be got ready.

2. The following recommendation from the Standing Committee of May 29, 1894, was laid before the Council :

"(2) To determine rents to be recommended for new vegetable stalls in Edinburgh market.

Resolved,—That the following rates be recommended, viz., Rs. 10 per mensem for each of the end stalls, and Rs. 7.50 per mensem for the others."

Resolved,—That the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

3. A letter No. 81 of May 16, 1894, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with connected papers, with reference to the proposed investment of Municipal funds, was laid before the Council after previous circulation.

5. A letter No. 48 of April 5, 1894, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, and connected papers, relating to

the sewerage of Colombo, were laid before the Council after previous circulation. •

Resolved,-That the Government be informed that, irrespective of any changes required by operations in connection with the harbour, the Council have already undertaken the improvement of the sewerage of Colombo, and will from time to time continue to make such further improvements as may be considered by them to be necessary.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, June 16, 1894, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

Present:—Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; H. J. Deslandes, Esq.; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; Barnes de Alwis, Esq., Dr. J. T. Morgan.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 19 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table :--General Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund; also separate statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1893 to May 31, 1894; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during

the month of May; also Health Officer's report for same month.

Resolved,—That the several statements as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, and with the Health Officer's report.

3. Read petition dated May 7, from traders in the market complaining that they had been called on to take out licenses for the sale of kerosine oil in the Market.

Resolved,-That the sale of kerosine oil be not permitted in the Market after the end of the month.

4. Read letters No. 21, dated June 7, and No. 22, dated June 8, from the Colonial Secretary, on subject of the formation of the islet in the Lake, and urging the pushing on of the working of the dredger.

The Chairman stated that as the vote for dredging the lake was exhausted, he had provided in the Supplemental Budget, adopted by the Standing Committee, and to be submitted at the next Meeting, a sum to allow of the dredger being worked during the remainder of the year.

It was resolved,—That the working of the dredger be continued in anticipation of the vote being sanctioned.

5. Read letter No. 23, dated June 11, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that it has been decided to bring into operation from July 1 the Ordinance No. 1 of 1894, entitled "An Ordinance to vest in the Municipal Council the control of General Cemeteries situated within Municipal Limits," and the Ordinance No. 2 of 1894, "An Ordinance to insure supervision of Burial and Cremation Grounds situated within Municipal Limits."

The Chairman stated that the Proclamation had appeared in an Extraordinary Gazette No. 5,292 of June 11.

Resolved,—(1) That the attention of the Colonial Secretary be invited to the Chairman's letter No. 53 of October 17, 1893: (2) That a Special Committee of the Council be appointed to make regulations, &c., as to the fees to be paid as provided for under section 1 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1894; that the members of the Committee be the Chairman, Messrs. J. B. Siebel, J. H. Sproule, and E. Beven.

Water Supply—This is good. The new standpipe opposite the police barracks, in lieu of the one opposite the corner of the Mercantile Bank, is an improvement.

Market; Slaughter-houses.-These have been kept in a good sanitary condition.

Latrines, &c.—The Inspector of the Ward in which the piece of ground at the side of the temple opposite the United Service Library should see that it is kept in a clean condition. Until quite recently there was an accumulation of filth there, which was very offensive.
