## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

$I^{\mathrm{N}}$N accordance with the requirements of section 3 of the Opium and Bhang Ordinance, No. 9 of 1889 , I hereby give notice that the licenses for the sale by retail of opium and bhang within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo, for the year commencing January 1, 1895, will, by resolution of the Municipal Council, be four in number. The said licenses will be put up to sale by public auction at this office at noon on Saturday, October 13, 1894, and they will be issued in accordance with the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance, and under the following conditions, viz. :-
(1) That the place licensed shall be subject to inspection, and that no riotous or disorderly conduct be allowed to occur therein.
(2) That the place licensed shall not be kept open for the sale of opium or bhang at any time before the hour of 6 in the morning or after 9 in the evening.
(3) That the licensee shall cause to be painted or affixed in some conspicuous part of his shop bis name, the mber of the shop, and the words "Licensed to sell Opium by Retail."
(4) That no person other than the licensee shall sell or expose for sale any opium or bhang under his license, either as agent or servant of such licensee, unless the name of such agent or servant be registered in the Office of the Municipal Council with the sanction of the Chairman.
(5) Wholesale licenses will be issued only to retail dealers.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the - Town Hall on Friday, August 10, 1894.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated August 4, 1894.
Present:-Mr.C.E.D. Pennycuick, Mayor and Chairman; Hon. Sir John J. Grinlinton ; Hon. W. R. Kynsey, c.M.g. ; Captain F. Bayléy ; Mr. T. Smith ; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna ; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa ; Mr. C. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias ; and Mr. C. M. Fernando.

The Minutes of July 13, 1894, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,--That the Minutes of July 13, 1894, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. M. Fernando asked "what was the last step taken with reference to the widening of Malay street."

The Chairman stated that the last step taken was to pay the Government Agent the commission of Rs. $124 \cdot 70$ due for appraising (at half per cent. on Rs. $24,941.75$ ) the lands it was proposed to acquire on the west side of Malay street, and to convey to him the resolution of the Council of February 19, 1892 :-
"That the Hon. the Government Agent be informed that the Council regret that they are not in a position to agree to the acquisition being proceeded with."
2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. M. Fernando moved "for a return showing the number of cattle seized by cattleseizers licensed by the Council from January 1, 1894, to June 30, 1894."

- Mr. C. Perera seconded.
- The return called for was laid on the table.

3. A Supplemental Budget No. 2, approved by the Standing Committee on July 27, 1894, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that the Supplemental Budget be sanctioned.'
Hon. Sir John J. Grinlinton seconded.-Carried.
4. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to July 31, 1894, was laid on the table.

A memoranclum No. 408 of August 8,1894 , from the Superintendent of Works, was read, explaining that owing to the early date of the present Meeting his Progress Report could not be got ready.

The Chairman was of opinion that with a little pressure the report might easily have been got ready, and hoped this would not occur again. The Superintendent was so informed.
5. The following recommendations from the Standing Committee of July 27, 1894, were laid before the Council:-
(4) To provide, under section 114 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 , supplementary vote for acquisition of land for improvement of Silversmith street.
Resolved that the sum of Rs. 5,237.39 be transferred from vote No. 182 of Rs. 10,000 (road to Base Line from Maradana Junction) in the Budget for 1894, and applied as follows :-

Acquisition of land for new road through Silversmith street Rs. c. quarry (supplementany to No. 171 in Budget for 1894) ... 3,69325 Lowering water main, Kotahena street ... ... 24414 Construction of a lethal chamber for destruction of dogs. .... 300 o Repair of dredger No. 1

(12) Proposal to transfer Rs. 3,000 from vote No. 160 to vote No. 159. Sanctioned. Superintendent of Works to furnish details of work done to date this year on the St. Sebastian canal.
(19) Portable standpipes for fire engines, Kotahena and St. Sebastian. Estimate of Rs. 150 sanctioned. Money to be transferred under clause 114 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 from the unexpended balance under No. 179 in Budget for 1894 (Rs. 2,000, pay of firemen, \&e.).
The details required in paragraph 12 with reference to St. Sebastian canal were laid on the table with Superintendent's memorandum No. 401 of August 3, 1894.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that the foregoing recommendations be adopted."
Hon. A de A. Seneviratna seconded.--Carried.
6. A letter No. 118 of August 2, 1894, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, was read, intimating that the Governor has ordered that the question of the proposed deviation of Mutwal road opposite Uplands do rest for the present.
7. Resolved that the number of opium licenses to be issued for 1895 , under section 3 of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1889 , te four.
8. The Sanitary Officer's report for the second quarter of 1894 was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
9. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for March, 1894, received with letter No. 70 of July 17, 1894, were laid on the table.
10. A further remark by the Auditor-General with reference to the gratuity to a peon in the accounts for January, 1894, stating that "the surcharge is made final," was laid on the table.

Resolved,-That the Auditor-General be informed that his final remark has been laid before the Council.
11. The City Analyst's report dated July 24, 1894, on the town water for July, 1894, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
12. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages, and kerosine, poison, and gunpowder shops for August, 1894, were laid on the table.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

I$N$ terms of section 4 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1893, and section 5 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1889, notice is hereby given that licenses as enumerated below for the retail sale of opium and bhang for the year commencing January 1 , 1895, will be put up for sale by public auction at the Municipal Office, Galle, on Monday, October 15 next, at 10 oclock p.M., and they will be issued in accordance with the provisions of the said Ordinances:-


Conditions of Sale.

1. That the place licensed shall not be open to the public before 6 A.M. or after 9 P.M.
2. That the place licensed shall be subject to inspection, and that no disorderly conduct be permitted therein.
3. That the place licensed be always kept clean.
4. That the place licensed have no internal communication with other rooms or passages, and that the interior thereof be open to public view.
5. That no opium be sold to any woman, or any child under the age of 15 , or to any intoxicated person.
6. That no opium be consumed on the premises, whether by swallowing, chewing, smoking, or in any other manner whatsoever.
7. That the licensee shall affix in some conspicuous part of his shop a board with his name, the number of the shop, and the words "License to sell Opium by Retail" painted on it.
8. That no person other than the Jicensee shall sell or expose for sale any opium or bhang under his license, either as agent or servant of the licensee, unless the name of such agent or servant be first registered in the Municipal Office.

Wholesale licenses will be issued only to retail dealers.

1. Read Minutes of last Meeting.

Dr. Dias moved "That as the Minutes of the Meeting just read are meagre and misleading they be not confirmed."
The motion was not seconded.
The Minutes were confirmed.
Dr. Dias handed in a written protest (see Appendix).
Dr. Dias admitted that the protest was prepared and written before the Minutes were read.
The protest read. The Chairman replied.
2. Submitted letter from the Hon. the Colonial,Secretary intimating that Mr. H. F. Jansz has been nominated Auditor of the Galle Municipality for the current year.
3. Submitted letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that the Ordinances Nos. 1 and 2 of 1894 will be brought into operation from July 1, 1894.

Resolved,-That no action be taken until a general cemetery is established in Galle.
4. Submitted a memorandum from the Chairman recommending the erection of latrines out at sea in a few feet of water.

Resolved,-That temporary structures of the kind be erected at Kaluwella and the bazaar.

Motions.
5. Moved by the Hon. P. D. Anthonisz, c.m.g., "That until sanitary improvements so urgently called for, and which are of vital importance, have received the required attention-as the supply of pure water to the Fort, the improvement of the Fort drainage, the substitution of dry-earth closets for the cesspits now in use-no expenditure be incurred in widening Middle street, as this is not a work of urgent necessity."

Seconded by Mr. W. Abeyesundera.
Mr. C. P. Hayley moved as an amendment, "That the work be not deferred, but taken in hand at once."
Seconded by Mr. R. L. Symes.
The Chairman put the amendment to the vote, with the following result:-Ayes, 2 ; Noes, 5 ; Chairman not voting. The Chairman declared the motion carried.
6. Moved by R L. Symes, Esq., "That the cesspits in the Fort be closed at the earliest possible date, the dry-earth system being substituted, and that a Sub-Committee be appointed to devise means for best carrying this into effect."

Seconded by Mr. C, P. Hayley.
After a brief discussion Mr. Symes, by leave of Council, amended the motion thus : "That the cesspits in the Fort be closed at the earliest possible date, and that a Sub-Committee be appointed to consider what other system of sanitation it would be best to adopt, and to devise means for carrying it into effect."

Seconded by Mr. C. P. Hayley.-Carried.
Resolved,-That the Sub-Committee consist of the Hon. Dr. Anthonisz, the Colonial Surgeon, the Provincial Engineer, and Messrs. R. L. Symes, C. P. Hayley, and C. L. M. Abdul Carim.-Three to form a quorum
7. Moved by Mr. W. Abeyesundera" That the erection of a side wall to the Kepu-ela opposite the railway station is urgently needed, and to ask why the improvements to the same proposed some time ago have not get been carried out."

Seconded by Mr. N. Dais Abeyasinha.-Carried.
The Chairman in reply stated the reason why the work could not have been carried out.
Resolved,-That the side wall be built in sections as funds are available.
8. Mr. Abeyesundera, by leave of Council, withdrew the next motion, notice of which he had given.

## APPENDIX.

I beg to protest the adoption of the report of the proceedings of this Council held at its Meeting on the 23rd ultimo as just read, as most meagre and misleading. I beg to point out two facts not brought out in the report read: in the discussion on the second subject in the Order of the Day the Chairman read a letter from Councillor (sic) Mr. Hayley, charging me with incompetence. The grounds on which he founds this charge is undisclosed. I presume he does not aspire to inspiration. (He has also hitherto not disclosed his qualifications to be a judge of the competence or otherwise of Sanitary Officers.) But light was thrown on the matter by a question put by the Chairman to Dr. Anthonisz, "Have you not seen the papers circulated, inoluding my reply to the Colonial Secretary." These papers were not sent to me-perhaps purposely withheld so as to take me by surprise in the discussion. Again, the admission of the Chairman that a certain document (the Sanitary Officer's Quartarly Report for Second Quarter of 1893) has been tampered (sic) with and then printed by the Municipality as the original, with his name affixed as if he had signed it.

## By-Laws of the Local Board of Health and Improvement of Matara.

Conducer of Bustness.

1. The Local Board of Mátara shall meet at the Mátara Kachchéri at 1 o'clock P.M. on the first Saturday in every month, unless the sittings shall have been specially adjourned at the next previous meeting to some other day or hour.
2. For all purposes connected with the Board, the precedence and seniority of members shall be regulated as follows:-After the Chairman shall rank the members appointed by Government in the order in which they may have been gazetted, and after them the elected members, in the order of the priority of their elections; and in the case of former members re-elected of the seniority of the continuous membership of the Board.
3. The office of the Board shall be in the place where the meetings of the Local Board are ordinarily held, and shall be open for the transaction of business daily (except on Sundays or holidays) from 11 A.M. to 4 P.M.
4. The Chairman shall preserve order, and shall decide on all disputed points of order.
5. The business of the Board at its meetings shall be taken in the following order :-
(a) The Chairman shall call on the Secretary to read the minutes of the previous meeting, which shall thereupon be read and, if need be, corrected and confirmed.
(b) Memorials, petitions, and communications addressed to the Chairman shall be laid before the meeting, and orders made thereon.
(c) Consideration of business, generally including questions and motions by members, of which previous notice must have been given.

## Petitions, \&c.

1. Any member of the Board presenting a petition or other communication will be held responsible for its contents being throughout respectful, and no petition will be accepted which has not the signature of the drawer and his place of abode.
2. When a petition or other communication is presented, the purport thereof shall be concisely stated.

On the motion of any member duly seconded, the question shall be put whether the document shall be read.

## Questions and Motions.

1. Any member desirous of asking a question or making a motion shall (unless in the course of a discussion, or, in case of an emergency, by leave of the Board) give notice of such question or motion, either at some previous sitting of the Board or by a note in writing, to the Secretary, at least two days before the day on which he intends to ask such question or make such motion.
2. Every member in giving such notice shall deliver to the Secretary a copy of the proposed question or motion.

## Orders and Records of Proceedings.

1. The Secretary shall keep an order book, in which shall be entered and numbered in succession the subjects to be brought under discussion at each meeting, and he shall serve on each member, or leave at his residence, two days at least before each sitting, a notice containing the orders of the day, arranged in succession as in the order book.
2. He shall keep a book, to be called the Minute Book, in which shall be minuted during each sitting, in the order in which they occur, the proceedings of the Board; and he shall keep another book, to be called the Journal, in which he shall cause all minutes of proceedings, acts, and orders of the Board, when confirmed, to be fairly transcribed; and such journal shall form the book required to be kept and to be signed by the Chairman and one member then present, under the 20th section of the Local Board Ordinance.
3. He shall also keep and submit to the Board at every meeting a complaint book, and he shall provide that this book be accessible to the public at his office between the hours of 11 and 3 on every week day, excepting Saturdays and holidays, and excepting also on such days as the Board may sit. Every inhabitant within the limits of the Local Board may have access to this book on his furnishing the Secretary with his correct name and address.

## Execution of Works.

1. It shall be lawful for any person thereunto authorized by the ex-officio Chairman, at all reasonable times and with all necessary and proper labourers, carriages, and animals, and other means, to enter upon any land near to any existing or intended thoroughtare, and there severally to do all things necessary for the purposes of making, repairing, or improving any bridge, fence, drain, dam, or ditch in any way connected with such thoroughfare, or for performing, constructing, or executing any and every act, building, work, matter, or thing under the provisions of the Local Böards Ordinance.
2. In the tracing, making, repairing, or improving any existing or intended thoroughfare, or building any bridge, fence, drain, dam, or ditch thereupon, or in any way connected therewith, it shall be lawful for the officer authorized by the ex-officio Chairman to throw upon any lands near thereto such earth, rubbish, or materials as it may be necessary to remove from the place of any such work. Provided that the Board shall be bound within a reasonable time thereafter to cause such earth, rubbish, or materials to be removed, and restore the ground to its former state.
3. It shall be lawful for any person thereto authorized in writing by the ex-officio Chairman to make any temporary road through any premises near to any existing or intended thoroughfare, during the execution of any work in any way connected with such thoroughfare, provided that such road shall not run over any ground whereon any building stands, nor over an enclosed garden or yard.
4. It shall be lawful for any person thereunto authorized in writing by the ex-offcio Chairman to cut and remove, and place upon any ground near thereto, all trees, bushes, and shrubs, and all leaves and branches or roots of trees that shall grow in or overhang any thoroughfare, or cause any obstruction or harm thereto, and for that purpose to enter upon any land or premises with such persons, animals, and instruments as may be necessary for the removing of such trees, bushes, shrubs, leaves, branches, or roots, provided that no ornamental or useful tree or shrub be cut without the special order of the ex-officio Chairman or, in his absence, of any member of the Board.
5. If shall be lawful for any person thereto authorized by the ex-officio Chairman to put up or make fences, hedges, ditches, drains, or banks by the side of any thoroughfare, whenever to him it shall appear necessary, and the owners or occupiers of land adjoining such fences, hedges, ditches, drains, or banks shall, and they are hereby required, to keep the same in good repair and order.
6. Any person thereunto authorized in writing by the Chairman shall have power to make and cleanse all drains or water-courses as he shall deem necessary for the preservation, improvement, repair, or construction of any road in and through any lands or grounds lying near to such road or intended road.
7. The officer authorized as before-mentioned by the ex-officio chairman shall have the power to lay over any matter or thing whatsoever upon any road, and to allow the same to remain there during the time such road is under repair, and for such time before the repairs are commenced and after the repairs are completed as may be necessary for facilitating the making of such repairs, or for preventing danger or injury to persons passing along such road.
8. Nothing in the hereinbefore-mentioned by-law shall be taken or construed as affecting the upkeep of the street through the ${ }^{\text {otown }}$ of Mátara leading from Galle to Tangalla and the new entrance to the town of Mátara.

## Scavenging.

1. Every market, shop, stall, godown, or other place used for the sale of butcher's meat, poultry, fish, fruit, regetables, or other articles of consumption shall be daily swept, washed, or otherwise kept clean.
2. When public seavengiug carts, with warning bells, are established by the authority of the Local Board (presumptive evidence of which shall be their carrying warning bells, and having the words "Public Scavenging Carts" painted on them in Sighalese and Tamil), every occupier of any house or premises situated along the route which such carts shall take, or within one hundred yards of any part thereof, or in any lanes or places which the person attending such carts shall regularly visit, shall daily before 7 o'clock of each morning cause all dust, ashes, and refuse to be removed from out of his premises and placed in sufficient and convenient baskets or boxes on the street, road, or public way in front of or near to such premises, or if any such premises are within one hundred yards of any public receptacle, in such public receptacle.
3. No occupier of any premises or other person shall place any such basket or box more than two feet from the side drain or curb stone of any street or thoroughfare, or in such manner as to interrupt or endanger the traffic thereon, or shall suffer any such box or basket to remain on such street or thoroughfare for more than one hour after the same have been emptied by the public scavenger.
4. Every householder or occupier of any house shall daily before 8 A.M. sweep or otherwise cause to be cleansed the space between his houses or boutiques and the adjoining street or road or thoroughfare, including the road drains, and shall also cleanse the drains passing through his premises and provided for carrying off surface water, either by flushing them or by some other effectual meens.
5. Every owner, tenant, or occupier of lands other than those provided for in section 1, sub-section 1, of Ordinance 15 of 1862 , whenever situated within the limits of the Local Board, shall be required to keep the same clean and free from all rank and noisome vegetation, as well as from all refuse and rubbish.

## Weights and Measures.

It shall be lawful for any Inspector or officer authorized by the Board to take into his possession and test any weights or measures in use within the limits of the Local Board, and to seize any false weights and measures and detain them subject to the order of the Board.

## Waste or Public Lands.

1. From and after the passing of these by-laws no horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be tethered or grazed upon any public ground vested in the Board without a license signed by the Chairman. Such license shall be issued annually or quarterly at the option of the Chairman, upon pre-payment of a fee of 3 rupees per annum or 75 cents per quarter, as the case may be, and such licenses shall be in force during the period for which they are granted.
2. Any person thereto authorized by the Local Board may seize any ox, horse, sheep, goat, or other animal which he may find tethered, tied, straying, or improperly driven or tended upon any thoroughfare or public ground within the limits of the Local Board, unless any such animal belong to any cart to which it is tied or tethered whilst the same is being loaded or unloaded, and to impound the same subject to the orders of the Chairman. No animal so seized shall be released unless upon the payment of a fee of 1 rupee, and the charges leviable under rule No. 6 for pounding it in the cattle-pound if it has been so impounded.
3. Any animal seized and not claimed within ten days may be sold by public auction on the order of the Chairman.
4. The Board may farm or let out the public grazing gruunds or any part thereof for any period not exceeding one year at a time, on such conditions as to the Board may seem fit, provided that no terms or conditions on which the same may be let shall be repugnant to or inconsistent with these by-laws.
5. All cattle, sheep, and goats straying about the public roads and paths within the limits of the Local Board may be pounded in the pound established by the Board for that purpose.
6. The following charges for occupation by such cattle, sheep, and goats of such pound shall be paid to the Board before removal of the cattle so impounded :-

## Public Bathing Places.

1. From and after the passing of these by-laws it shall not be lawful for any person to bathe at any public places within the limits of the Local Board other than such as shall have been set apart for that purpose by resolution of the Board.
2. It shall not be lawful for any person to wash clothes or mats or other articles, or to hang them up to dry at any public places within the limits of the Local Board, other than such as shall have been set apart by resolution of the Board for that purpose.

## By－Laws for the Regulation of the Dog Tax．

1．From and after January 1，1894，all owners of dogs within the limits of the Local Board of Mátara shall register their dogs annually in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Board．

2．A stamped collar shall be issued by the Board to any owner on his application for the same．
3．Any owner desirous of providing a collar of his own for his dog may obtain a stamp and number from the Board．

4．All dogs found straying within the limits of the Local Board after January 1，1894，shall be liable to seizure by a person duly authorised thereto by the Chairman of the Board，and shall be destroyed within 48 hours of the time of seizure unless redeemed in the interval．
