The remains of comrade KAS who passed away at the <u>Kandy</u> Hospital on 27-11-1989 was brought to Jaffna and was placed at the Party Headquarters in Jaffna city for the tribute of Party comrades before being taken to <u>Sathiamanai</u> in <u>Chulipuram</u>, Sri Lanka for the funeral service on 30-11-1989.

Comrade <u>S.K.Senthivel</u> presided over the funeral on behalf of the Party's final tribute committee. Twenty-one comrades and friends addressed the gathering. Family, Party comrades and friends paid the final floral tribute. There were no observances of religious practices, caste rituals, old customs etc. at the event. The event was held with the Party's revolutionary respect fit for a complete communist militant.

### Preface by <u>South Vision Books</u> for Comrade K.A. Subramaniam's Commemoration Volume

Professor George Derwent Thompson (1903 - 1987) of England pioneered the method of reading Greek classical literature in Marxist approaches. His book "Aeschylus and Athens" in 1941 and "Marxism and Poetry" in 1945 received international attention.

He was a member of the Communist Party of England and left the party after the Chinese Revolution due to differences of opinion. However, he continued to write various books enriching Marxism. He was close to the people until the very end. The rise of China today is the basis of his predictions.

Professor K. Kailasapathy is a student of George Thompson. While studying for his Ph.D., Thomson was the master of ceremonies. Following his style, K. Kailasapathy submitted a study on the heroic poetry of the Tamils under the title 'Tamil Heroic Poetry'. Oxford University published it in 1968.

When Kailasapathy came to India on behalf of University of Jaffna, he was approached by Ira Pandian, a postgraduate student from University of Madras in Tamil literature. Pandian obtained permission from Kailasapathy to publish his works. Ira Pandian has published books on literary criticism, poetry, and comparative literature. In turn, Pandian went to Jaffna, Sri Lanka. He had contact with the family of Kailasapathy.

When Comrade K.A. Subramanian came up with the idea of publishing a book written by N. Ravcendran in Tamil under the title "Bharathiyin Meignanam" (Bharathi's Wisdom), he was looking for a publishing house to publish Kailasapathy's books. K. Kailasapathy died at that time and his wife Sarva Mangala was interrogated. He has issued a letter of recommendation. Comrades S. Thevaraja and A. Chandrahasan came to Tamil Nadu with that letter.

Meanwhile, Ira. Pandian handed over his publication to M. Balaji. In 1985, when M. Balaji was running the publishing house under the name 'Chennai Books', Comrades S. Thevaraja and A. Chandrahasan from Sri Lanka came to the office and wanted to meet Ira Pandian.

Balaji took them to the nearby Pandian's house. They handed the letter to Pandian. After reading the letter, Pandian said, "I do not publish books now. Balaji just publishes. Talk to him."

The book was co-authored with the <u>National Arts and Literary Association</u>. Published by Balaji's 'Chennai Books'. This is the first time in Balaji's publishing venture that an organization has co-authored a book. It emerged as a new venture.

The present relationship between South Vision Books with the "<u>Puthiya Poomi</u>", "<u>Puthiya Neethi</u>" Publishing Houses of Sri Lanka and the <u>National Arts and Literary Association</u> and its authors began with the publication of Professor Kailasapathy's books. It was further developed by the efforts of Comrade <u>K.A. Subramaniam</u> to publish the books of <u>N. Raveendran</u>.

Currently, the books are growing in the <u>Kindle</u> format so that Tamils all over the world can read them on their smartphones. We feel it is an emotional moment that we are currently releasing the Commemoration Volume of Comrade K.A. <u>Subramanian</u> on this development path.

Comrade KAS can be said to be like George Thompson of Sri Lanka. They both deal with their confidence as they choose to embark on their play activities. Some within the party have struggled to

advance the debate on it. Today their struggle is proving to be the right one. Those who stood in front of them have all but disappeared.

Comrade KAS was an enthusiastic nurturer of the method of studying traditional literature from a Marxist perspective. The fact that they came in search of contact with the publisher who published K. Kailasapathy's books reveals the same thing, and the fact that he sent Comrades S. Theyaraja and A. Chandrahasan in person to turn Bharathi's wisdom into a book shows his determination.

Our publication, South Vision Books, currently incorporates all the latest technologies, converts all books into e-books, and publishes them on websites, including the <u>Kindle</u>. These books are paving the way for the world Tamil community to grow.

Comrade Buby, his daughter (Sathiamalar), and some comrades asked Balaji if the Commemoration Volume, published in 1989 in memory of Comrade K.A. Subramaniam, could be put on the Kindle website as a book. We gladly started work that we would do right away. It is currently being released on Kindle as well.

#### Comrades and Friends

I am delivering this Commemoration Address on behalf of the Party's Central Committee. The Party's General Secretary, Comrade K. A. Subramaniam, who was loved and respected by all, departed from our midst on 27-11-1989

Comrade K.A. Subramaniam (1931-1989) devoted his whole life to working for the country and for the oppressed people of this land. He was a noble Communist fighter who conducted his struggles on the lines of Marxism - Leninism. He has set a valuable example to all the communists, the leftists and the progressives of this land by living in accordance with the maxim 'Simple life, hard struggle".

Comrade K.A. Subramaniam was born to an orthodox family of farmers in the village of Kollankaladdy in the Northern Region. After completing his primary and secondary education, he joined the K.K.S. Cement Factory as an Engineering Apprentice. He was 17 then.

During the early stages of his working life, he came into contact with a Communist worker in the factory and was inspired by Marxist Philosophy. Consequently, he began participating in Trade Union activities based on the tenets of communism. Enraged by this, the Factory Administration, which included white bosses, dismissed him. However, not worried one bit by the loss of his job, he began to study Marxism more deeply and resolved to serve the people based on communism.

in 1951 he joined the Communist Youth Movement and thereafter became a member of the Ceylon Communist Party. As a young Communist, aged 22, the first struggle Comrade KAS participated in was the island - wide Hartal of 1953. The Hartal which was jointly led by the Communist Party and other left parties, was a great success in the North too and paved the way for the emergence of a class consciousness and a sense of unity embracing the whole island. Comrade KAS who was inspired by the revolutionary fervour roused by the Hartal, and who was in close touch with the then leaders who guided the Communist Movement in the North leaders like M. Karthigesan, Dr. S.V Seenivasagam, Pon . Kandaih, A. Vaithilingam and M. C. Subramaniam became a full - time party worker.

At the beginning, he was appointed to be in - charge of party work in the K. K. S. Electorate and was based in Chunnakam. During this period, the Trade Union in the K. K. S. Cement Factory was built amidst great difficulties and challenges. Although trade Union struggles began to make headway, Comrade KAS worked hard to build up the party outside the factory and to establish youth organisations affiliated with the party. KAS's weighty labours bore fruit: during this period, several intellectuals, teachers, students, and government servants were drawn toward communism.



In 1956, as a result of S. W. R. D. Bandaranayake's coming to power, some progressive measures were taken: one such measure was the takeover of schools. However, the Catholic hierarchy and

Tamil reactionaries joined hands to launch counter-measures. At this juncture, the Communist Party had to establish a solid campaign to support the takeover. The people supported this campaign. Comrade K.A. Subramaniam mobilised youths to support this campaign and was at the forefront of the movement.

In the latter half of the 1950s, he was chosen as a member of the Party's Northern Regional Committee and became the Regional Secretary of the Northern Region Communist Youth Movements.

He used all his skills and talents to build up the Youth Movement as a politically and organisationally vital force. In 1963, the oppressed caste living in Neervely, were brutally assaulted, and caste fanatics set fire to their houses. The Youth Movement staged a protest march in Jaffna Town and collected funds for the affected people. Dr. S.V Seenivasagam led the protest march and chaired the Public Meeting held to condemn this brutality. Comrade KAS was at the forefront of this protest campaign. This was a forerunner of the later struggles against caste oppression.

From 1963 - 1964, the Ceylon Communist Party split due to the ideological struggle waged nationally and internationally. At that time, Comrade KAS lined up with the revolutionary forces guided by Marxism-Leninism - Mao Zedong Thought. Through this ideological struggle, he resolved to take forward the revolutionary work based on a revolutionary party.

After 1964, while being one of the leading members of the Revolutionary Communist Party, he led the struggle against wrong ideas and practices both within and outside the party. He joined with other sincere Communists in the party to oppose those who spouted revolutionary textbook slogans while they possessed a bourgeois parliamentary outlook. In these struggles, he adopted a balanced ideological stand. At the same time, he stressed that as the party of the oppressed classes, it should launch mass struggles centered on their most pressing problems. He took the lead in getting resolutions to this effect passed in the party. These resulted in the mass upsurge on 21st October 1966 at Chunnakam. Comrade KAS led the upsurge and was one of those principally responsible for guiding and taking forward the struggles.

Following this upsurge, Comrade KAS rendered invaluable service to the party and the people by providing a correct and balanced leadership to mass struggles that combined both battles within and outside the confines of the law. As a result, the broad united front was built to fight untouchability, and with the principles, practices, and strategy, he helped to formulate a historic, unforgettable mass organisation. The historic victories of the people at Chankanai - Nitchamam, Maviddapuram, Madduvil - Manthuvil, Karaveddy - Kanpolai were mainly due to Comrade KAS's guidance which combined practical realism and a balanced ideological outlook. Comrade KAS was confident that the Communist Party should fight not only caste oppression but also spearhead struggles in other spheres, and he acted accordingly.

From 1964 to 1971, Comrade KAS was at the forefront of the Trade Union and farmers' struggles, the youth movement, and the anti-imperialist struggle: all these activities were centered around the party and the youth movement. The climax of these activities was reached in 1969 when the UNP Government banned the May Day Rally and Meeting. KAS organised a mass procession to protest the ban. He was brutally assaulted by the police and acquired bleeding injuries. Nevertheless, through this struggle, he shone forth as an exemplary Communist, manifesting the revolutionary fervor, courage, dedication, and self-sacrifice characteristic of Communist militants.

In the history of the left movement in Sri Lanka, on several occasions, Communist leaders have slipped up due to political and economic circumstances, deviated from their ideals, and became inactive. As a result, the enemies of the left and Communist Movement used these lapses as a trump card against the left movement. But Comrade KAS, till he breathed his last, lived as a Communist both in word and deed. This is the legacy he has bequeathed to today's younger generation and the future generation.

In the 1970s, Comrade KAS played a decisive role in the struggle against Wrong ideologies and practices within the party. At a time when in defining the stages of the revolution in Sri Lanka and the formation of a united front in the new democratic revolutionary step, dogmatism and sectarianism held sway within the Party, Comrade K.A. Subramaniam waged a disciplined, ideological struggle, within the party, against these trends. But at no stage did he form clandestine

groups within the party to violate the organization's rules. On the contrary, he abided by the majority's decision even when they waged ideological struggles based on principles.

After 1964, several hundreds of members and carders who had joined the party because it was a Revolutionary Party became dissatisfied with the Party leadership and began to quit the party in 1972 and became isolated individuals. Yet, KAS joined the comrades who decided to stay in the party and were confident they could build up the party anew, on the correct lines.

Comrade K.A. Subramaniam and the other comrades who continued to stay in the Party which had Comrade N. Shanmugathasan as its General Secretary, were forced to change their position in 1978 at a special Party Conference summoned in the middle of 1978. However, a full report incorporating correct ideological, political, and organisational standpoints was presented for debate under the leadership of Comrade KAS. Unfortunately, the report was not accepted, and arbitrary decisions were made. In this background, Party members who had assembled from various parts of the island decided to form a separate party. Comrade KAS accepted the proposal wholeheartedly and came forward to implement it resolutely.

On 3rd July, 1978, Party members held a Conference at Jaffna. At that Conference, it was decided that the new party should be named Sri Lanka Communist Party (left) until a Party Congress was held. The Conference chose an interim Organizing Committee, and Comrade KAS was elected Secretary of the Committee. Comrade KAS deployed all his skills to build up the party as a strong organisation and to make it take root among the working people. From 1978 till the early part of 1984, past faults were weeded out through retrospection and introspection, and the path was laid for the party's ideological, political, and organisational consolidation.

From the bottom upward, they have adhered to the principle of democratic centralism. Dogmatism, sectarianism, extremism, and all the principles and practices rooted in a non-dialectical outlook were criticised and rejected, and laid down guidelines for the assessment of united fronts. As for the <u>National Question</u>, sterile positions were denied and formulated a clear standpoint. Reviewed the national and international situations and adopted correct principles corresponding to contemporary reality. On this basis, the first National Congress of the <u>Sri Lanka Communist Party (left)</u> was held on the 2nd and 3rd September 1984. The Central Committee elected at this Congress chose Comrade KAS as the General Secretary. As a leader, he served the party and people with honor and dignity until the end of his life.

Comrade KAS played the central role in formulating the party's standpoint on the <u>National Question</u>. The sterile views adopted by the old party concerning Tamils as a nation and the right to self-determination were rejected. Instead, a principled, balanced approach incorporating a long-term perspective was adopted. Comrade KAS emphasised that the <u>National Question</u> could not be solved on a hurried petit-bourgeois basis and that the demand for separation was impracticable. At the same time, he did not fail to stress that a relentless struggle against majority chauvinism was inseparable from the national liberation struggle. Through the Party's Central Committee, he repeatedly stressed that military activities would not provide an interim solution to the ethnic problem and urged the need for an equitable political solution based on tripartite talks (the Tamil militants, the Sri Lankan State, and India).




Photo 8: Comrade KAS seen with Chinese vice premier Comrade Chen Yi during his trip to the People's Republic of China in 1963.

After 1983, when Sri Lanka's ethnic problem became complicated in various ways, India went from being a non-partisan, friendly neighbor to establishing its regional hegemony using the ethnic problem as a tool. As a result, comrade KAS very strongly opposed India.

He emphasized the need for all patriotic, democratic forces to unite and resolutely oppose India's hegemonism and safeguard our country's independence and sovereignty. Comrade KAS was responsible for imbuing into the minds of his party members a conviction that they should be ready to sacrifice anything for the nation's sake, the welfare of the people, and the liberation of the workers. He firmly believed it was meaningless to speak empty slogans or prize hollow honors.

Today, the people of this country, including the Tamils, are experiencing untold misery. Through the party, KAS stressed the need for an alternative government that could provide a minimum solution. On this basis, he supported the candidature of Mrs. Srima Bandaranaike the candidate of the popular, democratic forces at the last Presidential Election. He played a significant role in her Jaffna campaign. Through this, the way Communist paved for the unity of and mutual understanding between the progressive, democratic, and patriotic forces.

Comrade K.A. Subramaniam had very high regard for proletarian internationalism. He worked eagerly to foster the ties and links between Communist fraternal parties. Comrade KAS always stressed the necessity for our party to have direct relations with the Chinese Communist Party and Socialist China. With a clear vision, he strove to establish ties with other fraternal parties and socialist countries. In 1963, 1967, 1975, and 1979, he visited the People's Republic of China, and in 1967 he visited Albania as a member of the party, youth movement, and trade union delegations, which undertook goodwill missions to these countries.

Comrade K.A. Subramaniam helped to bring out Party newspapers like the "Sempathahai", 'Red Banner' and 'Puthiya Boomi' and advised, which helped to win these papers the esteem of the people, and contributed to their growth. Moreover, his guidance and advice greatly benefited the functioning of the Thesiya Kalai Illakiya Peravai' (National Arts and Literary Association) and its organ "Thayakam", which rendered excellent service to the cause of art and literature.

Comrade KAS was a committed Communist militant and a worthy leader. At the same time, outside the party, he had several friends among the progressive, democratic, and patriotic forces he respected. He considered advice on how best to use the talents and skills of learned men, educationists, artists, writers, and intellectuals for the people's liberation and social change.

Comrade K.A. Subramaniam dedicated his life to work for the welfare of the country and the liberation of the oppressed people. The Central Committee of the Sri Lanka Communist Party (Left) declares, with a sense of inner satisfaction, that Comrade KAS was a worthy Communist Leader who self-effacingly poured all his talents into service for the people. The Party dips its red flag to pay a revolutionary tribute to a selfless Comrade who has passed away.

# 4. Comrade K. A. Subramaniam (By S. D. Bandaranaike)




Photo 12: Comrade S. D. Bandaranaike delivers his speech at the meeting held in Chunnakam in 1966.




Photo 13: S. D. Bandaranaike inspecting a house burnt by upper caste in 1969 with Comrade KAS

<u>SD Bandaranayake</u> who was elected to parliament in 1956 remained a consistent democratic progressive, a supporter of the left, and a courageous activist inside and outside parliament. When members of the <u>UNP</u> led by <u>JR Jayewardene</u> went on a march to <u>Kandy</u> in 1957 to oppose the <u>Bandaranayake-Chelvanayakam Pact</u>, claiming that the agreement designed to grant Tamils their rights was a secessionist move, <u>SD Bandaranayake</u> took the initiative to mobilize people to obstruct the march at Imbulgoda on the Colombo-Kandy road in the Gampaha electorate and force the <u>UNP</u> to retreat to Colombo. <u>SD Bandaranayake</u> himself lay across the road as an act of protest.

During the struggles in the North in the 1960s against caste oppression and untouchability, 50 Bandaranayake spoke in support of the struggles in parliament as well as visited the North to personally express solidarity with the struggling masses. At the time, during a parliamentary debate he dared to quote Lenin that "the parliament was a den of thieves" and declare that the Parliament of Ceylon too was a den of thieves. As a result he was forcefully removed from the House of Representatives and suspended from parliament for two weeks. He always supported the people and their just struggles. As a result he was arrested in 1971 and detained for more than two years. He spoke firmly in support of granting the Tamil people their just rights and campaigned for the rights of workers, peasants and plantation workers.

As a result of his above political stand, he was a long standing friend of the <u>Party</u> who continued to maintain his bond with the Party. In a context in which racism and religious fanaticism are wreaking havoc in the south of the Country, his departure is a loss that very much saddens the Party and the people of the country. The <u>Party</u> expresses its deepest condolences and heartfelt sorrow to his wife, children and other members of the family and to the people of Gampaha."

# 7. Rare Politician (By Prof S. Sivasegaram )

It requires extraordinary courage to take political stances which are not acceptable to people in power and to people who speak only the language of guns. It takes far more than strength of will to defy the majority Chauvinism in defence of the minority without falling victim to narrow rationalist sentiments and following the emotional tide. K. A. Subramaniam, the General Secretary of the Sri Lanka communist party (left), who died on 27-November-1989 after some months of serious illness was a rare politician in the context of Sri Lankan politics amidst ethnic conflict.

He started his political life as a young communist and remained loyal to the Marxist Leninist line from his early days in the party, through the major split in 1964 between the pacifist parliamentarist section and the proletarian revolutionary section of the <u>Ceylon Communist Party</u> (CCP), up to the very end of his life. The splits which weakened the CCP and the subsequent splintering of the Marxist - Leninist section because of the opportunism of the leadership did neither dent his confidence in the communist cause nor weaken his resolve in taking the struggle forward.

He had remarkable organisational skills and leadership qualities, but he never sought a position within the party and preferred to work for the cause with dignity and determination. It was with much reluctance that he accepted the position of General Secretary of the <a href="CPSL">CPSL (left)</a> a few years ago when the young and enthusiastic members of the party wanted a person with experience and maturity to lead the party during a period of national political crisis.

He displayed a sense of balance and objectivity in dealing with problems small and large. He was in the front line in the struggles against exploitation and oppression and when senior party leaders ran for cover during police attack on a May day demonstration in the late 1960's, K.A. Subramaniam refused to desert and was brutally attacked with batons.

He was among the few leaders of the movement against caste oppression in the north who acted to ensure that the struggle was directed against the handful of oppressors and not allowed to develop into a caste war. This clarity of vision was again evident in the line taken by the <a href="CPSL (left">CPSL (left)</a> backed the struggle for liberation while firmly rejecting separatism as the only solution.



His death has robbed the Tamil community and the progressive forces of Sri Lanka of a sincere, humble and honest revolutionary political leader.



K.A. Subramaniam was, however, an inspiring leader and we hardly lost a single case. The last case appeared for him was a Caste case at <u>Chavakachcheri connected with the Temple Entry</u>. The High Class Tamils were out to poison the wells and the police were helping them to prevent the depressed classes from going into the Temple yard.

The depressed classes organised themselves and restrained the police from doing this foul act. They even assaulted the police. It was a sensational case and the high class interests were demonstrating

outside the Court. We won the case. Subramaniam as a true leader had prepared the case so well inspite of all the disadvantages in the Caste ridden area.

K.A. Subramaniam was well read in politics and had his own political philosophies which he often shared with me. We had a few political differences but that did not prevent us from meeting and having useful discussions.

Subramaniam was a very affectionate friend and never failed to meet me when he came to Colombo, had the opportunity to meet his son. He was a family friend, a sound politician and a great gentleman. I share the grief over his death with the members of his family and his friends.

K.A. Subramaniam was patriot, a humanist and a lover of people. He was the Champion of the oppressed and throughout his life he carried on a relentless Crusade against the oppressors.

He has fought his battles valiantly and his life has been a Victory over death.

Comrade KAS, in his entire life fought for the freedom and emancipation of workers and agricultural labourers. Struggled and succeeded in many struggles for the relief of the oppressed people and for which he travelled far and wide in Sri Lanka. Above all, he stuck to his principles and convictions without any compromise yet he respected and maintain friendly relationship with people who had differed from his views.

This is the proof of how KAS had successfully led workers protests and movements in spite of government's repression and factionalism within Left movements.

#### An incident

Don't remember the year.\* The government had denied permission for May Day procession. Trade union with K.A. Subramaniam as regional General Secretary had announced that May Day procession would be held. Police had plan to trap KAS. KAS went underground.

Police made great efforts to find the details regarding origin and culmination of procession. At that time it was R.Sundaralingam was the northern region police officer, who had friendly and respectful relation with media and public. He was friendly to me. He believed the media would be of great help in controlling the crime in northern region. I maintain similar opinion. I helped in this through my journalism.

The police officer was quite aware of my close friendship with Comrade KAS. That particular May Day from morning to evening around 4.30, the police officer R.Sundaralingam had frequently

telephoned me to enquire about the procession details. I had informed in the morning itself that I had not met KAS for two days and I don't have any information about the procession. He was not ready to believe me. He kept calling me repeatedly.

At the same time, around noon Comrade KAS had called me from somewhere. When I asked from where he was calling, he replied 'nearby' only. When I asked when the procession will be held, he replied 'in the evening'. When I asked about where from it will start? He disconnected on saying 'will tell you later'. KAS who called me 4'o clock again, asked if the SP had enquired. I replied yes. Saying 'will contact later' he disconnected.

KAS was ready to trust me in this issue. Not only me, but he was not ready to trust anyone when it came to the matters related to protests. At 5 in the evening, KAS briefly called to say 'come to Windsor theatre and also send people there' and disconnected.

People who were watching movie in Rajah Theatre, came out in large numbers like a swarm and began to raise slogans and follow KAS who was marching ahead with the red flag in the prominent streets of Jaffna. Police were dumbfounded and that was unique trick of KAS with his burning desire for achieving his goal.

It was looking like a battle field in <u>Gurushethram</u> and it seemed like the massive gathering would go reckless on either side in that crisis.

<u>Eelanadu</u> the only daily from Jaffna which very carefully maintained neutral position while releasing news. However, both sides (public and the government side) were condemned us. One night, a hand bomb was thrown on the <u>Eelanadu</u> office. It was less noisy and there was no causality reported.

Few days after, I met KAS. We were discussing about the protest in <u>Maavittapuram</u>. I asked him that if his people thrown hand bomb on the <u>Eelanadu</u> office. He said 'I swear' Gopu, we did not do that. We don't do those things to you. Humanity in KAS responded like that.

# Another incident, didn't remember date and month of the happening

The police were looking for KAS fervently. We received the news that KAS was absconding. Two days after I received a letter, which says "if you come to this place, you can meet me". It was KAS's letter. Did not disclose to anyone. I went to that particular place. KAS was alone in deep thoughts walking, tying his hand back.

Both of us were discussing nearly for half an hour. He did not have good food for some days. For two or three days, went and delivered food for him from my house.

After many years in 1987, when the office of "<u>EEZHA MURASU</u>" daily where I was working as an editor and its printing machines were bombed by the Indian Peace Keeping Forces, the daily "<u>EEZHA MURASU</u>" was produced and released from places like <u>Tholpuram</u> and <u>Chankanai</u>.

When 'EEZHA MURASU' was being produced from Tholpuram, KAS had sent word through a friend E.R. Thiruselvam to come and meet him at his place. After reaching there, he requested me to stay in his house. 'I am an editor in the journal which supports the LTTE and you are a supporter of China backed Communist Party' if both of us together caught by Indian peace Keeping Forces, what would be our fate?. Hearing these, KAS had graceful laugh.

'At that time you helped him serving food at his place, now we should take care of you without fail at any cost by arranging food for you. He was determined in helping back were the words by KAS's wife. These were traits of gratefulness by KAS.

I wrote my critical views on the stand point of Sri Lanka's Communist party with regard to liberation of Tamil Eelam in <u>EEZHA MURASU</u>, he also responded to that on their party magazine.

When I met him in <u>Tholpuram</u>, the discussion got attention on these essays too. In his reaction "I have to reply in the same journalistic Tamil (same tone probably) which I had learnt from Gopu. But despite difference of opinions, nothing come between our friendship and nothing which hamper our friendship will not come in between us" KAS said determinedly.

KAS's defined the friendship in this way. KAS penetrated into villages for the liberation of oppressed and suppressed people. In the struggle for workers and farmers wellbeing, he was also attacked by police and got beaten up by them.

He was known as rebellion and protested against all evils. However, I saw him as humanitarian, some body with human qualities and his humanism only I could observe of him.

KAS – we could remember him as Beijing KAS in our memory. He never compromised his goals and achieved his objectives and goals. Long live his name and fame.

Among the western dress clad crowd, I noticed a tall majestic person wearing <u>Veshty (dhoti)</u> and enquired with an acquaintance who he was. 'Don't you know him. I am very surprised. I thought you must have been known him. He is the secretary of <u>Sri Lanka Communist Party (Left)</u>.

I have heard him as man of his own mind rather than as one who blindly follows orders from the top. When this friend introduced me to him, 'oh. Is it the same <u>Ganesh</u> who translated the works of Hungarian poet <u>Petofi</u>?' (<u>Sándor Petőfi</u>). When knodded, he immediately with a hug he said 'I read that were published in <u>Thinakaran</u> and <u>Thamarai</u>. In those days when I read some of the translations of <u>Petofi</u>, I had suggested a few Tamil poets in Sri Lanka. For some reasons they did not show interest. I was pleased when I read yours '.

As I found his work comparable to that of Mahakavi Subramania Bharathi in arousing emotions in people to raise against the colonial oppression, I had translated his works. I was pleased when a seasoned senior politician like KAS appreciating my work when I was doubting the reach of my works to the right audience. More this, however I was happier for being introduced to a leader who had interest in literature and brought fresh ideas unlike other politicians who are interested merely in delivering long speeches.

He mentioned happily the role played by 'Desiya Kalai Ilakkiya Peravai' (National arts and literature association) in promoting literary works and the impressive manner in which Bharathi centenary memorial celebration publication 'Bharathi panmuha paarvai' received. He also mentioned about the efforts being taken to improve the publication of the monthly magazine 'Thayagam'.

His thinking was that struggles of upcountry people should merge with main stream movements to establish an united Sri Lanka. He also suggested that 'Kalai Illakkiya Peravai' could play a role in bringing the translation of Petofi's works in Tamil. As per the discussions the hand written translated copies of Petofi's work

Although the manuscripts could not be published due to then prevailing political situation in Sri-Lanka, subsequently he got it published with the help of Chennai Books' in an impressive manner. I had an opportunity to interact with him closely, when he was admitted in an hospital in Peradenya. He often highlighted the vital role played by the literature in shaping the politics of any country.

He mentioned with the concern China's Foreign Language Press not publishing any Tamil books since 1976. He had shown interest in making them resuming publishing in Tamil. Just two days before his demise, he had visited an Exhibition of Chinese Books in Colombo and seems like he had impressed upon the visitors from China resuming the publication of Chinese books in Tamil.

He was also supportive of the 'Desiya Kalai Illakkiya Peravai' publishing the works of Prof. S. Sivasegaram, R. Murugaiyan, N. Raveendran and K. Thanikasalam. The unfortunate demise of a leader with passionate love for the literature, extraordinary organizing capacity and political honesty, is great loss for not only Tamil Nadu but for the entire nation.

By loving and marrying a woman from a different caste amid many oppositions he revolted on a personal level against the caste system. The union of Subramaniam and Valliammai went beyond their names. They lived like Valluvar and Vasuki and actualized those qualities; their son Sathiarajan was martyred in the Eelam liberation struggle.

On the 11th day of the month of December in 1984, the Sri Lankan army suddenly arrested Sathiarajan (Meeran Master). At this time, it was rumoured that he leaked his Party's internal information to the Sri Lankan army. Already hurting over his son's sudden arrest, this rumour further pierced KAS's wounded heart. It is possible that the compromise of his party's security hurt more than the arrest of his son.

To enquire about this tragic event, I paid KAS a visit at Sathiamanai. At this time, I refuted this view by pointing out that it was difficult to see Sathiarajan not walking the same path as his revolutionary father. To console him, I reminded him of the scars left by the battles he fought to defend his socialist principles. Like him, I told him, Sathiarajan too would have defended the Party; his son could not have betrayed the Party. My reminders rested on his sobs. Though, my words came true—Sathiarajan was released without having disclosed any Party information—these tragic events haunted Comrade KAS, shadowing him even in his last days.

He derived unlimited happiness from his daughter, Sathiamalar (Buby), who he cherished as his wealth; and a son in law, N. Raveendran, who shared his socialist principles and values. Thereafter, a grandchild Subhrah.

KAS's second son Satheakeerthy was highly studious. He became an engineer. He took care of his father when he was unwell in <u>Kandy</u> and Colombo. As an intelligent student, Satheakeerthy got many special grants and scholarships at the <u>University</u> level bringing even more fame to his family and his country. With three gifted children, KAS led a large life.

His life's fundamental principle was that he wanted every living being to be happy. He won everybody's heart and love and lived a great, honest life. I pray for the well-being of my brother KAS's family and friends.



In <u>October 1966</u>, he became one of the <u>passionate pioneer leaders in the tea shop equality march from Chunnakam to the Jaffna town</u>, <u>his first struggle for the abolition of untouchability</u>, and was bombed by the police. He was placed on Police custody.

Even during his illness, he continued to work hard to establish the truth. He was firmly involved in learning, writing and Party activities, caring for the welfare of the people even when he had to retire.





### 41. Final days with an esteemed father. (By K. Akilan)



Dad, who usually wakes up early in the morning to read and write, did not wake up on that day (26-11-1989). I approached him and said, "What are you tired of? Are you sick?" When asked, "I have nothing. I'm fine." He got up and flipped through a nearby book.

He does not always take grief into account. He will only allow us to go to the hospital at our insistence. Even so, owning one is still beyond the reach of the average person. There have been instances where he has lost consciousness before the said dates. So this time we took him to the hospital with the help of the next room mates against his will. Still, he was as excited as ever during the trip and maintained that his chest would not give way to any fatigue.

After coming to the hospital, he gradually became more and more tired. Satheakeerthy also came there at this time. I left Daddy for the night reluctantly because there was an exam the next day. Although I returned home unscathed with the hope that my father would succeed this time around, despite his worse health over the past few months.

When I came to the hospital eagerly after the examination, father's health deteriorated further, and he was completely unconscious with no movement. He suddenly raised his left hand and said goodbye at about 5 o'clock, as the mucus was filling his throat obstructing his breathing. The eye woke up, that's all!

"Aw!" We should not cry about that. Because we have to learn many lessons from Dad's every move. I could not digest the fact that today there is no more the great man who has not succumbed to any threat or deadly disease.

He has been able to walk deftly since late 1987 despite having no emotion under his knees. He travelled. Furthermore, he has even bicycled successfully.

He did not tell anyone that his legs were numb. His mental strength, however, was such that he could not move his feet or toes in an incredible way and walked slowly.

Despite the stern warning of the medical expert, he was reading the newspapers till the end and was reading <a href="EMS Namboodiripad">EMS Namboodiripad</a>'s book 'Reminiscences of an Indian Communist'.

Who would not be amazed to see that Dad was standing and talking excitedly for over an hour and a half with his old Comrades and friends at the Chinese Book Fair at the Colombo Library on November 1, 1989!

The last letter Dad wrote (20-11-1989) was belongs to Mr. R. Siva Rajendran. In it he wrote very firmly that he would attend the meeting to be held in Colombo on December 10.




Photo 60: With Comrades Kanti Abeyasekere, S. K. Senthivel and Ratnayake during their trip to the People's Republic of China in 1975



It was time for the police to search the party leaders by throwing nets in order to prevent the procession from taking place that day. Police in Jaffna (Yazhpanam) are eager to know where and when the procession will depart. They sniffed around each corner of the city.

At that time, I had the opportunity to stay with Comrade <u>K.A. Subramaniam</u> in a house in the city of Jaffna. Even on that occasion when he was in the same place, he did not tell me until the last moment where and how the procession was going to depart. His tendency to be restrained made him a unique leader above all. The majesty with which Comrade <u>K.A. Subramaniam</u> went in front of them during the procession that day and the riot and beatings that took place when he met the police face to face can still be seen before our eyes.

The April 1971 uprising was a time when the police were searching for Communist Party of Ceylon (pro-Chinese) leaders all over the country, including Comrade K.A. Subramaniam. Even then Comrade K.A. Subramaniam came to me and said, "Selvanayagathar, We should go find out about the situation of Comrade Karthikeyan."



"The pinnacle of wisdom, The linguistics of love, My Dad!!!". He is a legend, a historical hero, a genius who lived by the grammar of this word. Every moment I think about that my Heart spurn, wilder. Senthil uncle's telegram, got the news.

Dad! The life you have lived is immense, very, very enormous. I have read and heard about many historical figures, great leaders, great martyrs, patriotic warriors, and brave fighters. I wondered about their precious human values. But it was only when I saw those values in you, I began to understand myself. It was the awe of you that made me a human being.

Dad! Even when I engaged in political activities, which is entirely contrary to your magnificent policy, I was able to find and work with the greatest principle, "unity in diversity". It is solely due to the political knowledge you have taught me. Even if I sometimes make "ignorant" mistakes, I can realize the mistakes and correct them, that is the way you taught me.

Otherwise I will bow my head in shame and be in pain," You raised us by telling that.




Photo 65: Drawn image of Comrade KAS with his signature.

When you spoke to me one day in late November 1984, you said, "A closer look at the political situation reveals the potential for India's hands of expansion to fall on Sri Lanka. If such an alien occupation takes place in my country, I will march as a fighter on the just battlefield against it. I will fight against any form of aggression. I want to say something to you (me) as my son. You

must not knowingly or unknowingly commit such an act of betrayal, that is, of betraying or mortgaging the homeland. That is what I expect from you. "you said that.

When I was released from the torture camp of the Sri Lankan government, my country was enslaved to foreigners. Many who do not understand it said that the country has entered a wonderful era. I even stumbled. Dad, you are my perfect guide, you showed me the path of righteousness. Dad, you are my light of life.

Another incident: Dad, you were the first person to condemn the invasion of foreign planes on June 4, 1987, before the occupation, in the name of "refugee assistance". You stood firm and tall in your policy, when many politically blind people who could not understand it then attacked you with "word of mouth". Dad, your adherence to your policies is much taller than the Himalayas. Time has passed. After Four months and four days, those who entered our country under the name of "Refugee Aid" swam in the blood of innocents and massacred our people.

Only then did many realize their mistake and accept your opinion. No one gets any benefit from the wisdom that comes after the passage of time. Many do not understand your political decisions. Understood but did not admit their mistakes. The world is aware of the attempts made by the state terrorists of Sri Lanka to harm your life and body. Similarly, people know that strangers have indirectly tried to harm you. Politically blind people without all such understanding also exist.

I have heard others say that you worked tirelessly for the victory of the <u>Nationwide Left in the early 1950s</u> and about your heroic contribution to the nationwide national ownership operations of the late 1950s.

I am pleased to hear that many have lauded you as the heroic commander of the glorious mass struggle waged by the Communist Party on behalf of the <u>subpressed masses against the tight caste oppression in the country, Jaffna (Yazhpanam), 1966.</u>

History has not forgotten your full contribution on May 1, 1969, International Workers' Rights Day, even though your body was badly beaten by state police dogs, thwarting attempts by state terrorists to prevent it.

I remember you being saved in the many murderous actions taken by the Sri Lankan government. Especially during the uprisings launched by the <u>Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna</u> (JVP) in 1971. I also remember the brutal life we faced at that time.

When the country's bourgeoisie "sowing the seeds of racism in the north and south of the country in order to strengthen its power and strength, and when the small seed of those racists has become a great dissent." You boldly said it is not in the best interests of the country.

I recall that when the Tamil leadership of the brokerage bourgeoisie, which claimed to represent the Tamil people, advanced the secessionist slogan based on its parliamentary politics, the party firmly pointed out its consequences and you clearly explained its mistake, despite the large wave of pro-secessionism.

I recall the actions you took when the party launched a determined boycott against the pseudodemocratic system of parliament in 1977 and as a result you were on the lookout for state terrorism and assassination attempts.

At every stage your determination does not falter, except to be fructified. You worked harder for your policy, which made your taller and stronger than the Himalayas. Is that why the Death feared to get close to you?

Even when the economic crisis of the 1980s affected you in many ways, you did not betray your policy. Even when there is a threat to your life, you do not deviate from your policy, you never

deviate. The joy I felt being born as your son is immeasurable. I feel so proud to be your son. Just as your political career, your personal life was equally surprising and magnificent. You made my mother your life partner for the principle you have. As far as I know you are the first of a few who have lived life as a whole couple in both joy and sorrow!

You have done a great job of politics by getting comrades like you who are courageous, principled and determined fighters. I was one of those who was amazed at the new approach when you and your comrades came to each other through exchanges, concessions, criticism and self-criticism to make the right political decisions in a timely manner. It is the social discipline you have taught your children as a father that has helped us to live upright. The priority you gave to Mom's decisions set a precedent for many. Your characteristic of not trying to impose your decisions on others, the way you express your opinion in a nascent way, was surprising to many.

Though you had no faith in religion or other superstitions, the respect you showed towards the faith of others, has multiplied your esteem.

During the time we were reading, you would often say, "Study for knowledge, not for wealth." In the late 1970s your close friend A.C.D, was the Director of Soyza Air Lanka, I had all the qualifications for the job vacancies requested by that company. I would have gotten a job there if you had used your own influence. But you did not do that. I was heartbroken at that age when I could not understand it. But I feel very proud about you when I think about it today. I scorn.

In 1989 a close friend of yours offered me a decent job. I told you about that. In response, you wrote, "I would have been happy if Sathiarajan had got the job. But I think Subramaniam's son was the one to get the job. That's why I don't like this. The status I have belongs to my party. I do not want to use it for my home. I hope my children will not misuse it either." Not only me but many others were amazed at your firm decision. Irrespective to the suffering you went through politically, physically and economically, you took that firm decision.

Many have gratefully remembered that you encouraged and nurtured them to become self-reliant citizens in their community by understanding many talents that they did not even know existed.

It is very difficult for my brother to continue his education in Sri Lanka. Therefore, when asked to apply for a scholarship to a socialist country, you made no change to your firm decision of not using your political influence even for education.

Even during my sister's wedding, you had an ideal marriage according to your principle. You have not failed to acknowledge any of our reasonable decisions. Also, you never fail to support it despite the pseudo-controls of society when it seems fair to you.

Dad! You are so unique. You have proven this in many ways. History has shown many times in your political life that many of the things you prophesied have happened. You were one among the first fighters to carry out the armed struggle for the liberation of our homeland. History has shown that many who wanted to negotiate a political deal with you at gunpoint have had to turn their backs on their own politics. You're a fanatic in politics!

In May 1970, The May Day procession that shook the city have started at the Jaffna, Chankanai, the land of bravery, arrived at City Hall. Addressing a public meeting there, you recounted the 1969 state atrocities, saying, "Even if I am shot and thrown into the flesh, thousands of people will emerge from every drop of blood that flows from my body." They will carry out the people's liberation struggle," you said amidst thunderous applause. The incident is still in front of my eyes.

Dad! Often when you advise us you say, "Do not think that you have to live with the address of, "the children of Subramaniam". Instead, if you live to the point where people say that the father of this child is Subramaniam, I will consider myself a success in my family life." We think of it as scripture and have been going on and on until today.

'A nation, a party, an individual must stand on his own feet.'. Dad, you have developed our self-confidence and responsibility by saying that very often. On the other hand, I have never met someone who values the collective decision, advice, and opinions of his fellow men.

Dad! Your memories will continue to guide us. We will never betray you or your policy. We will always be on the side of the nation and the people, and their liberation. We will participate as much as we can in the political activities taken forward by your great comrades. We will do our part for greater human liberation.

Let us walk in the path of the ideas of the outstanding Marxism-Leninism-Mao Zedong. Long live the Communist Party of Sri Lanka (Left) leader!

It is not possible to find in the future, an untiring comrade like him who has worked and worked tirelessly throughout his life. In short, the era is over. Who like him is going to spearhead this movement? He has left the question mark.

I have been conversant with him since 1954. I also remember those days when he married you in the early 60s. In the early days we were both so accustomed to being colleagues. Later he rose to prominence due to his hard work, talents and noble habits. The movements under his leadership never went sour. His fearless heart and tireless work will be remembered forever. I tried to meet him before leaving for <a href="Beijing">Beijing</a>, but I failed to meet him.

Nevertheless, the last memorabilia I have are the book, the magazine and the letters he sent me a month ago. I will always cherish them as souvenirs. The anxiety of not having to see him before leaving exists within me. What to do, it's my fate!

I have seen very few life partners like you who have worked day and night to support His cause. As we do not have that privilege, we are not able to work in harmony as he did. Mr. N. Shanmugathasan's memoirs were recently published in English. On reading it, the ghostly image of an individualist, N. Shanmugathasan, was many times larger than the image of a leading fighter who led the Marxist-Leninist movement of the Communist Party of Sri Lanka and screened the party and the movement. This did not surprise me when I recall my first meeting with Mr. N. Shanmugathasan.

By the time I went on to complete my higher studies in the UK I had a deep acquaintance with leftwing thinking. When he returned to Sri Lanka in 1970, he was part of the Marxist-Leninist faction of the Communist Party of Ceylon (' Peking ) I had great faith and sympathy for the so-called 'section'). At the small office of the Ceylon Trade Union Federation in Kandy, I got in touch with Mr. Malliya Goda and got acquainted with some party sympathizers in the upcountry. Unexpectedly one day I met Mr. N. Shanmugathasan and got to talk for a while. Shanmugathasan was convinced when he found out that he was staying at a luxury guest house Hotel Suisse in Kandy. The explanation for that was revealed to be his health and the need to travel frequently. While this does not give me complete satisfaction it does not seem right to dismiss the leadership of a party for this reason alone. However, Mr. Mallya Goda said that the party's opponents were using the same weapon to attack the party. (Later, at a public meeting, JVP's keynote speaker Rohana Wijeweera joked, "Comrade Shan needs a pillow if he wants to make a revolution.") N. Shanmugathasan and his daughter stayed at my house on their next visit to Kandy. N. Shanmugathasan's vast knowledge and intelligence are sure to attract the attention of anyone who speaks to him. The two days he stayed with us were spent happily. During that time, and during a conversation with him in Colombo shortly before the April 1971 uprising, one thing went deep into my mind. I could always see N. Shanmugathasan trying to make himself more important. With this in mind, it is not uncommon for him to repeatedly appeal with great self-pity that the government has put itself in detention after the 1971 riots. This is why in his memoirs ( *Political Memoirs of an Unrepentant Communist* ) he mentions at length with gratitude the virtue of a high official who allowed him to take food from home when he was in custody. I think he missed the names of many of the comrades who stood in the front line fighting for control of the party despite their differences with him until 1977 and got beaten up by the police.

Even when he now thinks of someone he wants to forget, he still remembers the good times that the Communist Party missed. I did not know my friend K.A. Subramaniam before 1977. I know K.A. Subramaniam was one of those who rejected the decision to expel N. Shanmugathasan during the 1972 riots, saying it was wrong. It was only later that I came to know about the mistakes of N. Shanmugathasan's political position that he had honestly exposed within the party in a very restrained manner. I was, however, dissatisfied with those matters as I was aware of the lack of consultation and explanation at the lower levels of the party about it rather than the manner in which the decision on expulsion was taken. As a result of N. Shanmugathasan's return to the 1977 elections and his misguided stance, his loyal comrades who were close to him ran away from him. It is in this context that I first met Mr. K.A. Subramaniam (KAS) at a friend's (HLK Karavita) house. The next meeting, which took place in early 1982, took place in the same house on a few subsequent occasions. Didn't get a chance to talk to him much longer. All I know is that he approached with the desire to unite the divided good forces and establish a strong establishment. HLK Karavita was unable to explain clearly to friend KAS that it was due to the weaknesses within the Maoist-affiliated Party that day.

HLK Karavita, however, asked me to co-operate with the left communist forces in the north. That rapprochement, which began with Karavita's recommendation, was fostered by left - wing communist sympathetic press contacts. Following the death of my friend <a href="Kailasapathy">Kailasapathy</a>, my contribution to the press was a little more in demand. In early 1984, before leaving for a foreign country, I went to Jaffna to attend the <a href="Kailasapathy">Kailasapathy</a> Memorial Conference organized by the <a href="National Arts and Literary">National Arts and Literary</a> <a href="Association">Association</a> and stayed at my friend KAS's house.

When friend KAS was standing at home, even though it was my first meeting with his family, I very easily got used to them being like one at home. There I was able to notice a situation where everyone was saying their opinions with an open mind without restraint. The difference between what friend KAS had told me about the party and himself and what N. Shanmugathasan had said had a profound effect on my mind.

Friend KAS, who writes and speaks very clearly and honestly about the past mistakes and contributions of the party, the work done by the party comrades and future plans and the strengths and weaknesses of the party, also said a little about himself. He never spoke or wrote a word about his past mistakes, his achievements, the atrocities he experienced, the sacrifices he made. Even the party comrades did not tell me about these. I came to know about the excellent contribution of the friend KAS through old time comrades in Colombo. When talking about the faults of the party he does not fail to mention his responsibility in it. I do not remember him blaming any individual for any wrongdoing.

His influence on the party and the revolutionary movement was greater than his own interests and his own pride. He could never give me everything. For example, I did not embark on the task of translating the poems of the Hungarian poet Santor Petafi into Tamil without fulfilling his request and having the opportunity to do so. Then the poet K. Ganesh fulfilled his wish. I could easily fulfill smaller requests than this. Yet under no circumstances did he ask me for any help for himself. All of his best qualities like this made him realize how he possessed the qualities of a good leader and a good servant at the same time. Yet the most useful lesson I learned from my association with him was about 'unity and struggle'. As he speaks to me he once spoke of the unification of the forces with which we can unite. But he noted that the enemy is united with the forces that must unite with us. I saw this as a warning to all liberation struggles and progressive forces not only in Sri Lanka but around the world. His words are a testament to his long political experience and observation ... I saw

One can only imagine how many rare opportunities we have missed when comparing the strength of Sri Lanka's progressive, left, patriotic and national liberation movements with the strength of the enemy. Many other movements, such as individualism, right-wing opportunism and left-wing extremism, have disrupted the unity of the masses and weakened the struggle against the reactionary prefectural force. Despite the possibility of unity, the forces that work together have split and weakened themselves in the recent history, especially in the post-1977 elections.

There are many times when unity is emphasized. However unity with anyone, on any basis In the post-1956 elections we saw the surrender of the class to the exploiting class in the name of unity for office and parliamentary seats, in view of the vague short-term benefits of unity. We know left-wing leaders who behave in a way that is convenient to the enemy with the intention of 'teaching a lesson' to others through bitterness and frustration. The Left, which had joined hands with those who had raised racist cries to teach a lesson to the betrayed <a href="ITAK">ITAK</a> in 1966, the leadership of <a href="Philip Gunawardena">Philip Gunawardena</a>, who joined the <a href="UNP">UNP</a> to avenge the betrayal of <a href="NM Perera">NM Perera</a>'s leadership, and the left - wing leaders who acted in such unethical way as to lead the <a href="UNP">UNP</a> to a landslide victory in 1977 to teach the <a href="SLFP">SLFP</a> a lesson, did not defiance the enemy but cut their noses. If it can be trusted that it belongs to friend KAS who played a major role in the emergence of such a prefectural leadership to <a href="SLFP">Sri Lanka Communist Party (Left)</a> that can be seen within the progressive voices with the determination not to give up its struggle on behalf of the oppressed people while emphasizing unity.

Friend KAS never allowed me to make any changes in the publication of the things I write without my permission. On a few occasions he asked me for permission to make some changes and has done them in the accompanying condition. If I explain that such a change is not necessary, he has accepted it and acted. I have admitted twice to a mistake pointed out by Cheran in one of my reviews. In this connection, I wrote less about a particular writer. That writer died while it was being published. Mr. KAS thought it would be better to avoid that reference in this situation. This also seemed very reasonable to me. On another occasion, the printers omitted the final lines of one of my poems, thinking that it might offend the Indian 'peacekeeping force'. Even though it was somewhat acceptable to me Friend KAS expressed his regret about it and republished the whole poem on the next occasion.

My poems are not easily set to music as I am more involved in revival poetry. Audio Cassette of the National Arts and Literary Association entitled 'We Will Create New History' reminding me of the importance of music When my friend KAS sent it to me, he pointed out the problems caused by the structure of my poems. After this, I composed some poems as musical songs. He was very satisfied about these. However he never asked me to write like this under any circumstances. I found in his comments on my writings that he had the maturity to recognize the strengths and weaknesses of each and to criticize without exaggeration and without the listener's mind. Here I felt his experiential maturity in unity and struggle.

An incident that took place at the end of the January 1984 Kailasapathy Memorial Meeting is also noteworthy here. On the first day of the meeting, a person closely associated with an anti - party newspaper was involved in an attempt to intimidate me with someone who had a difference of opinion with him. He objected to some of the comments he had made in connection with it and sought to intimidate them into continuing to do so. The weight was noticed while talking to friends far away Friend KAS slowly came to me and asked "What is the problem?" The young man who tried to intimidate me slipped away saying "Nothing, just some doubts ...". The way my friend dealt with the problem made me cringe. When the matter was settled as if nothing had happened without a demonstration, he sent some friends to support me until I boarded the bus to Colombo and returned home. I think that has allowed it and its mass institutions to continue to function effectively. The position taken by the Left Communist Party during the struggle for the right of national minorities to self-determination, the main opposition candidates who contested the presidential election against the anti-democratic measures of the post-1977 UNP government, and the referendum on the antidemocratic action of the government in the 1983 parliamentary dissolution issue was a good practical explanation for the policy of unity and struggle. The party by working together with all the forces that can unite in a crisis situation. It is still in a position to function today because of the strengthening of itself and the patriotic progressive forces. I think the leadership and exemplary work of friend KAS is very important in this.

Friend KAS who does not consider himself more important than any party comrades. He did not want to endanger himself in vain, not only by party members but also by any of its allies. An example of how the humanity of the Marxist revolution differs from the worldview of other insurgents. Revolution may require sacrifices, but his view that futile casualties must be avoided is very much in line with the views of the Marxist chiefs. It was this humanity that clearly formed the basis for recognizing the contradictions between the people and the people who disagreed with the friend and made him admire and value him.

Friend KAS 's leadership of the Left Communist Force came at a time when the Left Movement was in dire straits. It is our reasonable expectation that the contribution of friend KAS will be an important part of the unwritten history of tomorrow's society, leading to great success and a new harmonious society.

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## A5. Comrades KA Subramaniam as "KAS Comrade" and his accomplishments and memories ..... – By K. Subbaiah 2012

Today (27.11.2012) is the 23rd Remembrance Day of Comrade K.A. Subramaniam, one of the Northern Leaders of the Communist Party of Sri Lanka. At a young age he worked in the engineering department of the Kankesanthurai Cement Factory and was actively involved in trade union activities.

I had the opportunity to meet Comrade K.A. Subramaniam in mid 1961 at the party office on Stanley Road Jaffna. Due to his friendship I became involved in youth union activities and had the opportunity to become a member of the Communist Party and worked with him. Comrade KAS is the best party organizer. It was natural for him to know his acquaintances in some way and to be able to bring them to join the party, the youth association and the mass organizations.

On 10.03.1963, a major turning point in the history of the Communist Party. He worked hard for the success of the prestigious Youth Conference held at old Jaffna Town Hall. It is noteworthy that he set up branches of youth associations in the hamlets of the North and led hundreds of young people to attend the conference on behalf of the settlements, and provided guidance to many of the youth who attended the conference who later became responsible communists.

The conference was held on 10.03.1963 and was attended by various leaders including comrades Peter Keuneman, N. Shanmugathasan, Sarath Muttetuwegama, V. Ponnambalam, M. Karthikeyan and WA Dharmadasa who were prominent leaders of the Communist Party. At that conference, Comrade K.A. Subramaniam was unanimously elected as the Northern Secretary of the Youth Organization. The party split in two after the Youth Conference. KAS was actively involved in strengthening the revolutionary team led by N. Shanmugathasan.

After the split in the Communist Party, anti-imperialist struggles intensified as Marxist ideas became more deeply ingrained in the youth, and struggles to establish an egalitarian (Socialist) society in the North began to germinate little by little. During this period the struggles of the oppressed against untouchability and for equality in temples and tea shops erupted.

The Communist Party, which called for an end to caste oppression, united the oppressed masses and the progressive forces to build a Mass Movement for the Eradication of Untouchability. Not only the oppressed people but also the progressives of various castes and writers have joined this movement. Through this, meetings were held from village to village to create awareness among the people against the caste system. KAS, Daniel, Neervai Ponnaiyan and others, including Comrade VA Kandasamy, the party's Northern Regional Secretary, addressed the gathering and worked tirelessly to integrate the villagers with the mass movement.

In such a tumultuous situation, on October 21, 1966, a huge march took place from Chunnakam to Jaffna with the slogan "Let the caste system crumble and let equality prevail". Comrades VA Kandasamy and K.A. Subramaniam, who led the procession, were arrested and detained by the police but the procession remained in Jaffna. Reached the courtyard. It is noteworthy that Comrade K.A. Subramaniam was a key participant in making arrangements for this grand procession and mobilizing the people.

Following the October 1966 uprising, members of mass organizations involved in protests for equality in tea shops in Chavakachcheri, Chankanai, Achuveli and Nelliyadi were arrested on false charges and held in remand prisons. Many dignitaries affiliated with the Communist Party and other progressive movements visited Jaffna to inform the people of the South of their plight, as many were detained under strict legal provisions.

Chief among them is <u>Gampaha</u> constituency MP <u>SD</u> <u>Bandaranavake</u>. Comrade <u>K.A. Subramaniam</u> also pointed out that barricades had been erected around the temples, temple pits and wells that had been locked for fear that the oppressed people would enter the villages affected by the northern struggle. In addition, Jaffna. It is noteworthy that Comrade <u>K.A. Subramaniam</u> had made arrangements for the detainees to visit the prison and visit the prison.

In May 1969, the then government banned the celebration of May Day on May 1, as May Day and Poya Day came on the same day. In this context, the Communist Party "determined to celebrate May Day and determined to uphold the rights of the working class by fighting against any form of government repression. It also called for it. Following the party's call, the working class also held a May Day rally in Jaffna.

Comrade K.A. Subramaniam led the May Day procession on behalf of the Communist Party. As the procession passed through Jaffna KKS Road, a large number of policemen gathered and attacked Comrade KAS. His fingers were smashed in the attack.

Fractures occurred in the shoulder bone and the bones of the legs. During this time, his comrades Veeru Maraikkayar and S. Nadarasa, who were trying to stop the attack on KAS, were also seriously injured. All three were treated at the hospital for a long time. He later stayed in southern Sri Lanka for some time and received treatment. Comrade Kanzur, who helped him in this moment, is to be remembered. I can still remember Comrade KAS walking with great difficulty due to the physical injuries sustained during this May Day procession.



Jaffna lawyers have refused to appear in court for those detained by the courts during protests in areas such as <a href="Chankanai">Chankanai</a>, Achuveli, Manduvil and Matuvil . It is noteworthy that while the Jaffna lawyers refused and expressed their allegiance to the caste system, KAS was instrumental in bringing many of the best lawyers from the South to Jaffna in accordance with the party's resolution and freeing the oppressed from those cases.

It is necessary to point out here what role they played in preserving the feudal socio-caste sentiments when the fake masks of the Jaffna lawyers were torn off by this move.

Comrade KAS and <u>Sivathasan</u>, who were prominent figures in the Communist Party at the time, were close relatives. Both are residents of Kollankaladdy village near <u>Maviddapuram</u>. Both their families were patrons of the <u>temple</u> and received due respect during the <u>temple</u> festivities. While their relatives were marching under the leadership of C. Sundaralingam during the temple entry protest, Comrade KAS and <u>Sivathasan</u> marched with the oppressed people on the opposite side of the temple. Their commitment to policy and their firm stance in dismantling the caste system and their indiscriminate participation in policy and practice were evident.

During the struggle of the <u>Mass Movement for the Eradication of Untouchability</u> the feudal forces carried out various attacks on the oppressed masses. Demands for equality in tea shops such as shootings, grenades, arson of detainees, preventing the oppressed from leaving their homes for basic

necessities, destruction of their crops, firing on funerals and interfering with the disposal of dead bodies in cemeteries. ! Oppressed people were also forced to take up arms to face such repression.

The armed struggle of the oppressed people, which began with the October 1966 uprising, lasted until the end of 1969. Following this struggle, many temples, including the Mavittapuram Kandaswamy Temple and the Panrithalaichi Amman Temple in Madduvil, and all the tea shops in the north were opened to the oppressed and equality maintained. The Communist Party and Comrade K.A. Subramaniam, who guided the struggle during the uprising, will forever be remembered by the oppressed.

The armed struggle waged by the Communist Party under the leadeship of Comrade N. Shanmugathasan for the liberation of the oppressed masses was the first armed struggle in Sri Lanka. Comrade KAS has played a pivotal role in the history of the victory of the oppressed masses in the face of direct repression and intimidation by the dominant powers in the capitalist system following the feudal caste ideology.

Comrade KAS, certainly stood with the people of <a href="Chankanai">Chankanai</a>. Nitchamam who were brutally attacked in all possible ways and he made them world famous for the bravery of their heroism and the determination they showed in the struggle. MP of the <a href="Vaddukottai">Vaddukottai</a> constituency belonging to the <a href="Tamil\_Arasu">Tamil\_Arasu</a> Party (including <a href="Chankanai">Chankanai</a>) <a href="A. Amirthalingam">A. Amirthalingam</a> once spoke in parliament that the <a href="Chankanai">Chankanai</a>. Nitchamam people's struggle had intensified to the point where he said, <a href=""Chankanai">"Chankanai</a> has now become <a href="Shanghai">Shanghai</a>."

K.A. Subramaniam was also threatened by the Tamil fascist LTTE in early 1989 and was rescued by his long-time comrades who somehow learned of the news, despite the date and time of his assassination. However, while living in Kandy with his youngest son, unable to stay at home continuously, he fell ill and died at the hospital. Comrade KAS tied the Hammer and Sickle to his wife as a "thali" symbol of his mixed caste marriage. He has never compromised on his adopted policy even though it was touched by the threat of fascist forces, and it is no exaggeration to say that he was an ideal Purusha who lived a life of policy conquest and poverty.

## A6. Reported on 27th November 2012 about 1966 October 21st by N. Raveendran

At the previous meeting, an article about the 1966 October 21 uprising was the topic of discussion. Our discussion in between was interrupted due to several other commitments. This meeting is on a date that will be of importance once again. This day will have a different meaning for the racist forces who have a counter-racism to feed. That anti-people 'Karthikak Kodunkanavu' (November cruel dream) will soon be forgotten in the annals (those who fought in the LTTE along with the fighters of various organizations who fought for the right to self-determination of the Tamil nation should be remembered as heroes as a whole; it is not going to be remembered as the birthday of a fascist—quided regressive leader). On the contrary, for socialists who love the liberation of the people, this day will be an inspiration to revive the revolutionary spirit.

November 27, 1989, the day when KA Subramaniam, a prominent figure who sparked inspiration whenever we thought of the 1966 October 21 uprising, passed away.

Here are some memories that come to mind while we discuss about him. About Ten over years ago KAS's eldest son (Sathiarajan) said; "Appa felt that it was his biggest mistake to separate from N. Shanmugathasan leadership," I denied angrily . I said, "Do not misinterpret what might have been said in a different context." After Sathiarajan passed away in an accident, about four or five years later, Satheakeerthy, the youngest son of Comrade KAS, said the exact same thing. He did not know about the interaction I had with Sathiarajan.

Considering that both of them said the same thing, I couldn't continue to assume he couldn't have said it in that context. He has often told me that the <u>Ceylon Communist Party</u> generally makes the mistake of splitting from time to time and alienating the people. His wish was to write about his political activism as "A self-criticism of a communist." But unfortunately, he passed away before writing.

The idea of presenting his own political experience as a self-criticism stemmed from the fact that N. Shanmugathasan wrote about his experiences in politics as 'Political Memoirs of an Unrepentant

<u>Communist</u> '. Although Comrade KAS had great respect on N. <u>Shanmugathasan</u>, he has stated on several occasions that N. <u>Shanmugathasan</u> was responsible for <u>many divisions</u> of the <u>Revolutionary Communist Party</u>, which was furiously against the <u>revisionists</u>.

When Premalal Kumarasiri, Karthikevan and VA Kandasamy split in 1972, their political position was correct but their institutional approach was wrong; That split could have been avoided if N. Shanmugathasan had accepted his political austerities with certain introspection and maintained a democratic approach. At least after that, the expectation that N. Shanmugathasan would give up his austerity and maintain a party structure for mass mobilization was dashed. His writings for the "Worker" (කම්කරුවා / தொழிலாளி) newspaper and publications on the national ethnic issue have been the subject of much debate. He continued to write that Tamils were not a nationality; Inevitably he could only say 'growing as a nationality'.

His obstinacy in denying the right to self-determination on the grounds that it was not a <u>National Question</u> was just a matter of appeasing the Sinhalese; It was unnecessary for him to inquire objective reality, or to search for the denied rights of an oppressed <u>National Question</u> or what should be done to overcome them.

In such a context tertiary theory came up for discussion. N. Shanmugathasan is not ignorant of the fact that on many occasions Mao Zedong approached the relationship between country and country - people and people - party and party in tripartite theoretical approach. Just as there was no search for the welfare of the people in the national and ethnic issue, he failed to see the reality in international affairs as well and sought to comment against the Third World Doctrine in the guise of a great revolutionary. Unlike those who had waged such a struggle in the past, the struggle continued as an intra-party struggle and eventually culminated in a special conference. The vast majority of Tamil members adopted the Third World Doctrine; All but few of the Sinhala members accepted the N. Shanmugathasan leadership correctly. However, N. Shanmugathasan declared that the Party was opposed to the Third World Doctrine, in defiance of the Party's decision to run arbitrarily. Subsequently, the "Communist Party of Sri Lanka (Left)" emerged from him, as he came to the conclusion that he was incapable of leading the revolutionary party leading the joint decision. It is a well-known fact that the N. Shanmugathasan became paralyzed. This split affected him more than ever. When it was discovered that KAS had betrayed him like this, it was true. How could he

expect a faith that transcends doctrine and practice? In fact there was such a militant bond between N. Shanmugathasan-KAS. N. Shanmugathasan's leadership was unwavering in its commitment to the struggle for caste abolition and the subsequent building of the party. KAS was a man who understood the strength of the N. Shanmugathasan Party in other ideological matters, propaganda and various communications, while at the same time acting in a manner conducive to the proper application of the N. Shanmugathasan transcendentalism in practical terms. The high respect he had for it was on the N. Shanmugathasan. This is why KAS is confident that he will continue to be with him without noticing any of his dryness.

He concluded that separation from the N. Shanmugathasan was inevitable because the revolutionary party of the people was to be built rather than a personal relationship. He put forward radical revolutionary slogans and considered that the political direction of 'from people to people' could no longer be pursued without separation from the people. Accordingly, the party name was changed to "New Democratic Party".

Such a new style is essentially <u>Marxism–Leninism-Mao Zedong</u> thought. <u>Mao Zedong</u>, who introduced what appears to be a friendly conflict rather than just seeing it as a contradiction, also spoke of "dealing properly with conflicts among people"; The right-wing reactionary is the extreme minority — the Communists are also the minority; The vast majority are intermediaries, and <u>Mao Zedong</u>'s thought guidance on overcoming them also emerged in <u>Third World Doctrine</u>. On that basis he would say that getting out of <u>N. Shanmugathasan</u> was helpful in building a new party.

However, he did not get the new style of party structure he wanted. That is why he has told Sathiarajan and Satheakeerthy that it is wrong to stay away from N. Shanmugathasan. His persistent justification of the need for secession from me, however, basically makes me understand that his assumption that I should arrive at such a correct proletarian ideology past austerity is understandable. At the next meeting I learned about what I had learned from him through this new ideology and Third World Doctrine.

## A7. Some Records in the 25 Years of the Demise of Comrade KA Subramaniam - Lenin Mathivanam 2013



Comrade K.A. Subramaniam has made a unique contribution to the history of the Sri Lankan Left Movement. He should be looked at in the order of senior leftist comrades N. Shanmugathasan and M. Karthikeyan. K.A. Subramaniam was, in a sense, a continuation of the former and its next dimension.

The ideas, thoughts and activities of this comrade who fought on the side of a working people against the ruling class and the oppressors are still influential in many ways today. On the occasion of the 25th anniversary of his demise, these twenty-five years have witnessed massive changes in our country and in other parts of the world. Apart from the Commemorative Volume (Comrade KAS Memorial Book, published by KA Subramaniam Memorial Committee, Jaffna. 1989), Comrade KAS being one of the most important figures in the history of the Sri Lankan left movement, it does not appear to have come up with any other research.

It is the need of the hour to examine and evaluate Comrade KAS and to reconcile his characteristics and contribution to the external world. Attempts to evaluate him in the historical context should be exposed. They should take place in three main stages.

- First- Needs to come up with evaluations and studies that will approach him in a multidisciplinary way.
- Second- It is essential to study the generation that came his way and their specialties, and how
  the legacy of the KAS has remained unchanged.

• Thirdly- Although the ratings came out with are relatively low about him, criticisms of them are also necessary.

Seen in this light, his memoirs and book submissions are necessary, but beyond that, studies and evaluations of this talent are in need of time. His "I have to go" audio-video testifies to the fact that he was highly regarded for his invaluable work among the people beyond the celebrities, and is set to provide much more information about him. The voice of hope given by this force among the masses, in particular, is a strength for the development of the left-wing movement.

It is unfortunate that the well-respected public he served for were farmers and workers could not put their feelings into words. The above factor is seen as important for the concealment of many personalities who have acted among the public. Although there were no opportunities for me to interact directly with the comrade, the left-wing comrades he nurtured were able to get to know him with the views of his family and those influential in his personality.

The root cause of this comrade's political clarity and success is his activity with a scientific dynamic vision. His personality is versatile. The political vision and practical struggle expressed in him is seen as an easy nature without difficulty. The main reason for this is his pro-Marxist stance. He thus accepted Marxism, applied it to our changing environment and put forward the practice. In particular, the decisions of many Sri Lankan-Indian leftists to simply apply the European class ideology to the Tamil context have led to frustration and regression in our context. The way to mobilize the masses can be found only by understanding that caste, religion, race and language are all identities in the Tamil community. Comrade KAS understood this and carried out his establishment activities.

As such, the most important of the struggles he waged was the struggle against untouchability and caste. In India, <u>AK Gopalan</u> was the first to take up the struggle for temple entry on behalf of the oppressed people and to advance his struggles by presenting those experiences in a way that suits our environment.

During the struggle of the Mass Movement for the Eradication of Untouchability the feudal forces carried out various attacks on the oppressed masses. Demands for equality in tea shops such as shootings, grenades, arson of detainees, preventing the oppressed from leaving their homes for basic necessities, destruction of their crops, firing on funerals and interfering with the disposal of dead bodies in cemeteries. Oppressed people were also forced to take up arms to face such repression.

The armed struggle of the oppressed people, which began with the October 1966 uprising, lasted until the end of 1969. Following this struggle, many temples, including the Mavittapuram Kandaswamy Temple and the Panrithalaichi Amman Temple in Madduvil, and all the tea shops in the north were opened to the oppressed and equality maintained. The Communist Party and Comrade K.A. Subramaniam, who guided the struggle during the uprising, will forever be remembered by the oppressed. (K. Subbaiah)

It was possible to see echoes of two trends on caste issues during and shortly before KAS. A section of those who saw it from a casteist point of view. These are the majority. The anger that arose in the wake of the ensuing caste repression by clinging to the rituals and ceremonies that came along the way was simply burning like an unstoppable riot. And the upper middle class among the oppressed put forward a cultural struggle alienated from the working people in order to defend their class interests. Their struggle was for the emancipation of the Dalit middle class.

Another faction distinguished the caste issue from the class issue. Their arid class vision led to a kind of compromise. There is not even a hint of dynamics in their vision and thinking. They both deal with

their confidence as they choose to embark on their play activities. Comrade KAS saw the caste struggle as part of the class struggle in such an environment.

His main contribution was to clarify the political direction of complete liberation towards the unification of the dimensions and atrocities of the caste. His vital contribution was the mass mobilization of all democratic forces in the struggle against caste and untouchability. Thus, the Mass Movement for the Eradication of Untouchability is the result of the Sri Lankan left seeking to develop Marxism in our context.

One of the key features of KAS was his dialectical recognition of the fact that caste conflicts had become a class issue in the Tamil cultural context. His main contribution was to understand this contradiction in the political arena and to be involved in the organizational process. His life was marked by a desire to reform and change more than others.

The following statement by <u>Prof. S. Thillainathan</u>, who was in touch with him at the time, is noteworthy for his selfless contribution. "In a situation where many have resorted to the politics of power and position and prestige, he has devoted himself to a politics that seeks to liberate ordinary workers, peasants and the poor without resorting to them. He worked hard to strengthen that political norm, ignored indifference and disease, embraced others and encouraged efforts to adapt. Specialties of <u>K.A. Subramaniam</u>. Despite his sense of imminent death, he was overwhelmed by the urge to finish what he had taken".

India has been instrumental in creating Tamil-based liberation movements in Sri Lanka and misleading them. This has to be seen as part of the Indian expansionist argument. All of India's activities in relation to Sri Lanka were based on the regional hegemony that unites Sri Lanka into the states of India.

The Communist Party (Left) boycotted them until the 1977 elections. In response to the <a href="Indo-Sri Lanka Accord">Indo-Sri Lanka Accord</a> of 1987, the Indian Army spread the red carpet across the country and was welcomed by the government and the Tamil fascist forces. We know the humiliation, destruction and loss of the people who benefited from it. In that case, in 1989 Jaffna. The only reason why he welcomed <a href="Sirimavo Bandaranaike">Sirimavo Bandaranaike</a> to the meeting at the <a href="Pandatharippu Hindu College Play Grounds">Pandatharippu Hindu College Play Grounds</a> was because of the Indian expansionist argument. <a href="Kumar Ponnambalam">Kumar Ponnambalam</a>, Motilal Nehru and

others were present at the meeting which was chaired by KAS. Large numbers of people were attending the meeting. KAS spoke in this meeting - "What is the problem of the Tamil people? How to find a solution? Has raised such questions and we stand united with all the forces we are fighting for today. Besides, we are not standing here for our own ambitions or anything else. We hope that Sirimavo Bandaranaike will try to get rid of this Indo-Sri Lanka Accord, the Indian Army."

He was adamant that the solution to Sri Lanka's ethnic conflict was beyond the interests of Indian supremacy and that it should reflect the interests of the Sri Lankan people. I have heard my comrades and his wife say that he addressed the gathering amidst the <a href="LTTE">LTTE</a> threat and the atrocities of the Indian Army and went into hiding.

Then he fell seriously ill and was discharged from the hospital. At a meeting on Stanley Street on 1st May 1989, he said, "If the Premadasa government has come to negotiate with the LTTE, then it can understand that what we have already said is true. We accept negotiation. At the same time, it can not be a bouquet. It must truly pave the way for the establishment and preservation of unity where both races can live in freedom and sovereignty in our country. Before that, Weli Oya should abandon the formation of a separate district. In addition, the Communist Party of Sri Lanka (Left) is urging the suspension of the referendum in the Eastern Province and why it should be abandoned altogether. Only then will it give confidence to the institutions and the people who can go to the negotiations. A situation can also arise where mutual concessions can be negotiated. Apart from this, resolutions, decisions and weapons that can be made at the will of the Government of Sri Lanka, the Government of India or unilateral decisions cannot establish peace in our country. This is our position. We have opposed India's intervention from the beginning. The people of Sri Lanka have to make some concessions because of the agreement made by the Sri Lankan government. That concession was a tripartite negotiation that annexed India as well. The Government of Sri Lanka, the Government of India and the other Liberation Organizations should co-operate in these negotiations for a concerted and successful effort. Leaving it and doing strangulation work on each other would pose a great danger to our country and people. You already know our position on India. I have to say a few things back though. From the beginning, the Communist Party of Sri Lanka, led by the likes of Peter Keuneman and Wickremesinghe, and later after the split, our party has been warning of "foreign intervention". Political parties and liberation movements in Sri Lanka have failed to heed this. India began its expansion by taking advantage of the 1983 ethnic riots. The Sri Lankan government acted in support of it. The deal was struck. It's confusing in many ways. In some respects, there are certain aspects that can help the liberation and future of the Tamil people. But most of the issues in the agreement affect not only the Tamil people but all Sri Lankans. This must be resisted or modified.

India began its expansion by taking advantage of the 1983 ethnic riots. The Sri Lankan government acted in support of it. It was against this background that the agreement was formed. It was seen as a confusing one in many ways. In some respects, there are features that can help the liberation and future of the Tamil people. But most of the issues in the agreement affect not only the Tamil people but all Sri Lankans. Therefore, KAS is adamant that such disadvantages should be resisted or reversed.

Although the Left had opposed India's intervention from the outset, the Sri Lankan people had to make some concessions because of the <u>Agreement</u> made by the Sri Lankan government. After insisting that the compromise and the tripartite talks could be the solution, Comrade KAS resumed his absconding life and bid farewell while in <u>Kandy</u>.

He had such an involvement not only in politics but also in literature. He was also responsible for the series release of Motherland (Tāyakam) Magazine. I have also heard Mrs. Valliammai Subramaniam and Mrs. Raveendran (daughter) say that he continued to write editorials for the magazines of the Motherland (Tāyakam) until he died. If so, it would be a matter of time before they would be compiled and published to commemorate his 25th birthday.

He has also created the Art Literary Cultural Council, the National Arts and Literary Association, and has carried out a number of community-based activities. Through this organization, many people have spread their knowledge of the community and many new generations have entered the literature. Many have reported that they enjoyed reading liberation literature and then became a guide for others to learn it. Apart from politicians, he has maintained friendly relations with art and literature. Relationships with Prof. S. Thillainathan, Mauna Guru, B.C. Mani, K.Ganesh, etc. are exemplified. Records of this-R. Murugaiyan, K.Ganesh, S. Sivaseqaram, A. Shanmugadas, Mrs. Sarvamangalam Kailasapathy, C. Patgunam and A. J. Kanagaratna.

As such, <u>K.A. Subramaniam</u> has often said that literature is the lifeblood of a country's political development. He regretted the non-publication of Tamil texts by <u>China's Foreign Language Publishing</u> from 1976 and expressed interest in republishing them. Apparently, he attended an exhibition of books in Colombo two weeks before his death and urged the Chinese delegation to republish Chinese books in Tamil. (<u>K.Ganesh</u>)

R. Murugaiyan has recorded that KAS was responsible for the publication of the books of S. Sivasegaram, R. Murugaiyan, N. Ravcendran, K. Thanikasalam etc. through the National Arts and Literary Association during his lifetime. It is safe to say that his loss of literary honesty and efficiency had a profound effect on the literary field as well.

Born in Jaffna, he was able to transcend the land of his birth and influence far and wide through his knowledge, energy and activities. His political philosophy and practice took root in the hills. Through N. Raveendran he had formed a Marxist political faction in the hills. The following paragraph should be noted in the message issued by the Upcountry Committee of the Democratic Youth Front of Sri Lanka on his death:

"When the Youth Movement held their conference in <u>Talawakelle</u> in 1980, he attended and delivered the keynote address. Comrade KAS was the one who went to all the parts of the upcountry where the youth movement held preparatory meetings for the conference and made contact with the plantation workers. Comrade KAS was the one who pointed out the problems and guided the youth movement to solve many problems by giving proper advice when the youth movement presented its basic livelihood rights.

In this way, it can be observed that Mr. E. Thambiah, Johnson, V. Vijayaratnam and many others who later entered politics in the hills were influenced by him. In addition, the task of overcoming the political union conflicts in the upcountry and uniting the people in a mass political direction was built.

Comrade Peter Keuneman, Comrade Sarath Muttetuwegama, Comrade Dharmadasa and Comrade KAS, who was the Secretary of the Northern Youth Association, also addressed the procession for the Badulla Conference held in early 1964. (Information - Mrs. Valliammai Subramaniam)

There is no doubt that KAS has a high place in the development of the left movement in Sri Lanka. However, there are very few memoirs, reviews and studies about him. Everything in his writing should be threaded. Quests and studies about him should abound. Only then will the importance of Comrade KAS become widely perceived.

## A8. Commemorate the 25th anniversary of Comrade KAS and 25 Lessons Learned From Him - S. Thevaraja

Contemporaneity is governed by class division. The physical and brain workers, the workers, make up about 95 percent of the majority, and the capitalists, who prioritize capital, make up the vast minority of less than five percent.

The world's largest minority capitalists have adapted themselves to be the ruling elite of this vast earth. Their capital rules across the borders of all nations.

Do the dominant funds, through the maneuvering divisive maneuvers of these big bosses, feed the differences of caste, race, language, religion, region, gender and color into the antagonisms of the working class of the world and refute the idea of a 'people's society' through the media? We are all experiencing the contemporary conspiracy of international imperialism.

The working majority, on the other hand, is forced to immerse itself in narrow identities as a victim of the machinations of imperialism that has globalized capital beyond its worker identity.

Within these narrow identities, the 'big boss' class has prioritized itself over subjugation of leadership. As a result of this plunder, the working-class community, which has a monopoly majority, has temporarily lost its universal identity and has been plunged further into massive oppression into caste, race, religion, region, gender and color.

The meaning of 'production' and 'labor' has been blurred in a society of people caught up in the vortex of consumption culture, to the point of obliteration of the term worker.

While the possibility of global workers uniting in this unequal world is near, in reality, reports of a number of international efforts to cross the narrow mark of a fiery furnace give us hope.

That is why on the 25th anniversary of Comrade KAS we have the need and the compulsion to reclaim the lessons we have learned from him.

- First, we must boldly declare who we are as members of the working class.
- Second, the working class must identify itself in the form in which oppressed people (caste, race, etc.) are subjected to oppression and develop a program that will enrich its ability to fight universally and truly from the perspective of time, nation and the press.
- Third, the working class or parties must defend themselves against falling prey to the hypocritical agenda of the imperialist-capitalist-landlord alliance.
- Fourth, it must acquire the personality to function as a 'movement', not 'being' a working class
  party among the masses.
- Fifth, every Marxist and communist must have the capacity to work with a broad heart, like
  the great ocean that any great ship can reach, by engaging in work among the masses beyond
  monotheism, lockout, opportunism, liberalism and strainism.
- Sixth, the party must be an influential party operating in everyday life to see hope and success
  among the people who are reeling under despair, failure and hopelessness.
- Seventh, those within the Communist Party must not only be reduced to communists, but
  must also have the courage to identify the communists living in and out of other parties and
  on various platforms, knowingly and unknowingly, and to strengthen the establishment of the
  Marxist-Leninist establishment and expand its work.
- Eighth, the party must be activated with vigor by continuing to engage in critique-self-criticism, unity and struggle within the party establishment. Daily movement should take shape. Everything must be started and conducted from the keen interest for the unity of the party and should not lead to divisions.




Photo 80: With Comrade S. Thevaraja during their trip from Kandy to Colombo in 1989

Ninth, within the party, there is no sectarian attitude, no ambiguity, no preconceived notions, no conclusions, no preconceived notions, with an open mind and democratic centralism beyond the allegiance of the land grant leadership, manipulate material conditions, find out the facts, and conduct discussions without anger, likes, dislikes, successes and failures, everyone should have the ability to maintain a friendly relationship that is peaceful and relaxed with complete freedom.

Tenth, we must identify the crises, tragedies, discrimination and neglect that befall the people, stand with the people immediately, inspire and mobilize the people for proper action, strengthen them, identify and create combat environments where they can be liberated, protected and overcome.

Eleventh, the party must not be weakened as a "tent of the poor" but must be strengthened by the use of bourgeois democratic laws and regulations in the context in which the party

operates, by building the party's resources, infrastructure and machinery.

Twelfth, party politics must not only be satisfied with the party's slogans and the party's annual events, but must also have the power to create and carry out daily revolutionary activities among the people, like fish living in the sea on many platforms and on all fronts.

Thirteenth, every communist must be prepared to act boldly as the 'absolute materialist fearless', and to be able to sell party newspapers and mass media magazines to the general public, to ask for money, to listen to their grievances, and to communicate with writers and the party about them.

Fourteenth, the unity of word and deed is the focal point of a communist.

- Fifteenth, the communists must shine as new casts, subjecting themselves to self-criticism so that land-capitalist thoughts and actions do not occupy us on a daily basis.
- Sixteenth, the Communists must have the courage to think and act with a revolutionary attitude, not to allow surrender through concessions, awards, titles and positions so that no one can fall victim to class compromise.

Seventeenth, the communist must have the ability to lead the people in front of the people

without pulling the tail behind the people.

Eighteenth, the communist must exercise restraint in not confining himself to the landcapitalist ideology of himself, his family, his child, his relatives, his descendants.

Nineteenth, we must transcend beyond the ego of 'I' or 'mine' and possess the common denominator of "one for all, all for one."

Twenty, it is the behavior of communists to avoid things like duplicating and insulting others, to respect everyone, to understand their own character and to relate to them accordingly.

Twenty-first, party employees must understand whoever has the potential and use it for the benefit of the party and the public.

- Twenty-second, it is the responsibility of a communist to observe that every intellectual working in the party is surrounded by seven workers and that his ideas emerge from the daily practical movement and are not merely bookish. That is, practicallity is the text stone of a communist.
- Twenty-third, we must embrace the professional energy microcosm in various fields and focus on their potential and work tirelessly to eliminate differences between them and develop skills that work in unison for the benefit of the institution.
- Twenty-fourth, even if it is useful, if any activity disturbs the unity of the institution, it should not be allowed to rush into attempts to impose it, and comrades with alternative views should not hesitate to act patiently, quietly, and leisurely, until they have obtained the mood to accept it on their own.
- Twenty-fifth, any hard work, sacrifice and dedication should be for his own pleasure and should not be done under the compulsion or wage of anyone. If any decision of the establishment is decided by a majority, he should not deviate from his responsibility in implementing it even if he disagrees with that decision.

# Some Speeches, Statements and Works of K.A. Subramaniam

# B1. STATEMENT OF CHINA & CEYLON YOUTH GROUPS via Peking NCNA International Service in English 1632 GMT 14 November 1963

A joint statement by the All-China Youth Federation and the Ceylonese Federation of Communist and Progressive Youth Leagues was made public here today. It declares that both sides have reached agreement on further consolidating and developing the relations of friendship, unity, and cooperation between the two organizations, on the present international situation, and on major questions of the present world movement. The document, ratified recently by the two federations, was signed by Chieng Li-jen, vice president of the All-China Youth Federation; D.B. Alwis, member of the Secretariat of the Central Committee of the Ceylon Federation of Communist and Progressive Youth Leagues; and K.A. Subramaniam, member of the Central Committee of the federation. The two Ceylonese youth leaders paid a friendly visit to China from 18 June to 20 July at the invitation of the All-China Youth Federation.

The statement says that both sides unanimously agree that the present international situation is favorable to the national independence struggles of the people and youth of the Asian, African,

and Latin American countries: "The national democratic movement has become a great irresistible historical current of our tie, battering the foundations of the rule of imperialism and old and new colonialism, and making great contributions to the defense of World peace and the promotion of the cause of human progress. The youth and students of the countries in Asia, Africa, and Latin America constitute a very active force in fighting imperialism and safeguarding World peace."

The statement continues: "Both sides unanimously agree that imperialism and old and new colonialism will never allow Asia, Africa, and Latin America to act on their own accord. The aggressive nature of imperialism will not change. The more it approaches its doom, the more it will engage in frenzied struggles. The Kennedy administration of the United States is pursuing a policy even more adventurous and more cunning than before, and is vigorously pushing ahead with its counterrevolutionary global strategy. It is engaged in frenzied arms expansion and war preparations, carrying out activities of aggression and war everywhere, trying in a thousand and one ways to undermine and break up the socialist camp, and doing its utmost to suppress the national liberation movements in Asia, Africa and Latin America. All that U.S. imperialism has done shows ever more clearly that it is the international gendarme suppressing the Just struggle of the people of various countries, the mainstay of modern colonialism, the chief force of aggression and war, the archenemy of World peace, and the common enemy of the people and youth throughout the world."

The statement says: "It is now more than ever necessary that the people and youth of all countries should maintain sharp vigilance and cherish no illusions about imperialism, and that they should further expose imperialism and oppose prettifying imperialism and echoing its tones. It is now more than ever necessary for the people of all countries, including the youth, to strengthen their unity, form the broadest united front and Wage a tit-for-tat struggle against their common enemy." "Both sides express the firm belief," the statement says, "that in Our times, when the forces of socialism have surpassed those of imperialism and the forces of peace have surpassed those of war, it is possible to safeguard world peace and prevent a new world war and a nuclear war by relying on the unity and joint struggle of the masses of the people of all countries . . . . "The youth of both countries resolutely support the struggles of the youth of various countries in Asia, Africa and Latin America, considering this their lofty international duty. Both sides express their desire to join their efforts in every possible way to strengthen unity among the youth of Asian and African countries." The All-China Youth Federation firmly supports the Ceylonese people and youth in their struggle against imperialism, for the elimination of the remnants of colonialism, for the safeguarding of national independence, and in defence of the vital rights of youth and social progress; it wholeheartedly supports the legitimate and just stand of the Ceylonese people and youth in safeguarding independence and sovereignty, defending their national interests, and opposing U.S. intervention in Ceylon's internal affairs by way of suspending U.S. "aid." ## B2. An incident in China ..... K.A. Subramaniam 1963 (Secretary Communist and Progressive Youth Association Jaffna Division)

The <u>"Worker"</u> ("தொழிலாளி") news paper emerges as a special edition on the day of the Chinese Revolution. I was asked to have an article on it. How many things I have seen, known and gained experiences in China. Not everything can be summarized in this article. I have decided to continue writing about my experiences as much as possible. I am writing only one incident in this article.



The talk of China has reached its climax in the world today. The press and radio have been actively propagating that the Chinese government, unable to cope with the growing population, is descending into war of attrition and diverting public opinion. Our neighbor India in particular has been busy with this campaign. I visited China in mid-June at a time when the planned campaign (Communes) in China was being driven by industrial production — growing population — and poverty-starvation-starvation-death-dictatorship.

I stayed there for six weeks and got to know first-hand the working-class cities, the farms, the educational institutions, the cultural forums, the living conditions of the workers and the countryside, and so on. Foreign delegations visiting China at the same time were able to gain many more facts and experiences about China through discussions with journalists and embassy officials. The false propaganda of the enemy about China was so fast that even China did not make much progress - in the 59's, 60's and 61's there were natural disasters and great damage to crops. How can China stand alone and move forward? With that in mind, I began my journey by underestimating China's tremendous progress. But what I saw and knew there was completely different. China is making great strides' This view was shared by the delegations present. Some of

them were second-time visitors and acquaintances who had visited the West and witnessed the conditions there. We had the opportunity to talk to some of them and exchange our experiences.

Is there a poverty shortage among the Chinese people? How do you know that? These are the questions that arose in front of me as I was leaving. Having thought that I should come to a conclusion and go to the villages and labor houses as much as possible. Are there family fights going on around their homes? I thought I should notice that. My prediction is that if the husband and wife fight loudly even though we do not understand the language, it could be for deficiencies. I told this to Comrade Alwis who had come with me.

From the day we left China until the day we returned we went to as many rural houses and working houses as possible. Sometimes when we are going somewhere else we suddenly stop the car and go to those houses where we talk-inquire with them. Let's ask how many people are in the house. Let them ask the types of food. Take care of the clothes — live the happiest lives anywhere. Communes are proud to have just saved themselves. Men's Communes have been looking for success in their lives. Vegetables like eggplant, and tomatoes sell for half a pound a pound. Fruits Fish Egg Meat can be bought in sufficient quantities and it is also available at low prices.

<u>Communes</u> do not produce only vegetables, grains and fruits. They are also doing road construction, city building, irrigation and small scale industries that support agriculture. Facilities such as sports stadiums, hospitals, health centers, schools and art and culture forums have been set up in the <u>Communes</u>. Commune farmers also elect their representatives to oversee the administration. In plain language it can be said that in China every commune is located in every village government. In 1962-63 the country witnessed a massive increase in production and livestock farms also flourished. Now the Chinese are focusing on cotton production and the use of modern equipment in agriculture.

During the crisis in China in 1959, 1960 and 1961, the Chinese people did not ask for any help from abroad. They succeeded by the power of their labor and the proper guidance of the Chinese Communist Party. To mark the expansion of the industry, the 5 year plan for 1958-63 was completed in three years. I did not see any sign of family strife or any sign of it except that I was able to learn these things directly from the rural people and the workers.



Last day we flew from <u>Beijing</u> to <u>Guangzhou</u> to return home. Had to travel a little further by train. Coming from East Canton Railway Station and getting off at one station, Comrade Alwis and I walked for a while to board the next train as the three Chinese comrades narrated and laughed.

A Chinese man sweating on the platform is carrying a heavy load on both sides on a stick. A man goes to him and tells him something. He takes something out of his pocket. Abba! The man stood like a bondman. He rolled the coin and threw it. He said something with a loud noise. Immediately he left the load and went to beat the man. I was stunned. Incident that should not happen. There was an incident where I tried and disappeared all these days I stayed in China. My mind wanders. See! What! Are there still problems in China! Hmmm! Se! The only thought. My mind seeks comfort. China is a country of 65 crore people. Can everything be solved within 14 years? My mind seeks to comfort me whenever I need more time. The mind does not listen. The mind is the only struggle. I told Comrade Alwis, "Comrade have you seen the fight, the situation is not right yet." I looked up and saw that it was <a href="Hong Kong">Hong Kong</a> is a territory under British rule.

## B3. Colonial system is collapsing: The revisionists are opposing the liberation wars. Written by K.A. Subramaniam in 1964

The revolutions that erupted in the colonial and semi-colonial countries after the First World War suffered great losses due to the oppression of the imperialists and their henchmen. But they could not extinguish the flames of the war of national liberation after World War II.

So the colonial system began to crumble to the foundations of the system. To date, more than 50 Asian, African, and Latin American nations with a population of 170 million have been freed from colonial slavery. Among them China, North-Vietnam, North-Korea and Cuba followed the path of socialism.

In other countries, the national liberation revolution is beginning to spin like a hurricane. So the imperialist colonialists began to change their tactics and intrigues. They pretended to be good to the colonial powers, made a number of reforms and sought to preserve their interests.

### Modern colonial system

However, their nature has not changed. To continue their exploitation, they abandoned the old colonial policy and adopted the new colonial policy. They left their direct rule and exploited the colonial powers by handing them over to the bourgeois classes who did not compromise their interests.

For example, they handed over to the representative of the big bosses and landlords, India to <a href="Jawaharlal Nehru">Jawaharlal Nehru</a>, and Sri Lanka to the <a href="United National Party">United National Party</a> (UNP). In a few other places they gave nominal freedom and established their puppet regimes. They enslaved other liberated countries, especially in military alliances with <a href="SEATO">SEATO</a>, <a href="CENTO">CENTO</a>, <a href="NATO">NATO</a>, <a href="ANZUS">ANZUS</a>, etc. They set up military bases in those countries and sabotaged their independence.

They are trying to unite a few countries into a federation and keep them under their control. The best examples of this are the British colonial work of Malaysia and the <u>Southern Arabin League</u>. They are exploiting the wealth of those countries by giving them 'aid' with political and economic conditions.

They are still using the UN as a tool to interfere in the internal affairs of many countries and carry out military, economic and cultural occupations there.

Without saying much about these, one can only speculate somewhat on its universality if one hears what the <u>Havana Declaration</u> says about the new colony.

"Latin America is trapped under imperialism far more powerful than the <u>Spanish colonial empire</u>. After World War II, United States (USA) investment crossed the \$ 1 billion mark. Money for the USA is running rampant. \$ 4000 per minute, 50 lakh per day, 200 crore per year, 1000 crore per 5 years, for every 1000 dollars that leave us, a corpse is left. \$ 1000 per corpse. This is the gift that imperialism gives us is \$ 1000 per corpse, 4 corpses per minute."

### American imperialism

This is the essence of the new colony. Its main masterpiece is American imperialism. The Moscow statement said, "Today the United States is the main source of colonial power. The US-led imperialists are constantly making frantic attempts to exploit the old colonial people in new ways and in new forms. The monopoly bosses are trying to maintain their influence over the economies and politics of Asian, African and Latin American countries." Therefore, the anti-colonial struggle is an anti-imperialist struggle. There has always been a great difference between Marxist-Leninists and modern revisionists in how to conduct this, whether through revolutionary struggle or peace.

<u>Lenin</u>, a <u>Marxist</u>, claims that the oppressed people and classes must carry out a revolution if they are to liberate themselves completely. Such revolutions are inevitable. In his book, The War Plan of the Proletarian Revolution, he states that "the history of the 20th century is one of unbridled colonial wars in which unbridled imperialism prevails."

He goes on to say, "Denying the possibility of a national liberation war under imperialism is not only ideologically wrong but also historically erroneous."

### Anti-colonial wars and revisionists

Not all the <u>revisionists</u> who lived then and today could directly oppose the anti-colonial wars. Because they will have to lose the support of the oppressed masses. To that end, they literally supported the oppressed nations and peoples. But on the pretext of opposing the war, they opposed and even opposed the just wars waged by the oppressed people against all wars.

<u>Kautsky</u>, a fanatical member of the <u>Second International</u>, said that the danger posed by imperialism to world peace was minimal. The danger from liberation efforts in the lower countries is great."

Today's <u>revisionists</u>, <u>Khrushchev</u> and his entourage, follow the logic of the Second International Tripartite and indirectly liberate the nationalist war, claiming that "even a small territorial war can wreak havoc on world war, and that any war today could turn out to be a non-nuclear war, a destructive nuclear war." Yet thus, <u>Khrushchev</u> threatens to destroy Noah's ark, our planet.

Even during the Second International some <u>revisionists</u> said that the war of national liberation would turn into an imperialist war, a war in which many imperialists would intervene. <u>Junius (Rosa Luxemburg)</u>, for example, put forward this theory when she said, "This argument that every national liberation war will be transformed into an imperialist war is wrong." What is the response to the fact that the <u>Algerian National Liberation Revolution</u> and the <u>Cuban Revolution</u> (many more) did not cause world war?

### Cheat for help

Now the modern revisionists have given some methods to solve the problem of colonization. These, too, show blatantly their opposition to national liberation revolutions. One of them is help. The report of the Central Committee of the Soviet Communist Party, presented during the 22nd Congress, stated that 'the ill effects of colonialism must be eliminated. They need to be helped to grow as fast as they can at the level of economically and culturally developed countries."

In this, the leaders of the <u>Soviet Communist Party</u>, who are on the path of separatism, claim that the liberation of the colonial people is not by their liberation struggles but by aid, which is in fact a <u>Marxist</u> perspective beyond <u>Marxism-Leninism</u>. During his visit to the United States in 1959, <u>Khrushchev</u> said that the funny thing was that the United States' assistance to other countries, which were the stronghold of the colony, would help those countries to stand on their own two feet.

He said, "Both yours and our economic achievements will be admired by all the people of the world who have lagged behind in their economic development for centuries, and who will be able to stand on their own two feet and seek the help of our two superpowers" (1959-9-17).

This is with the help of the socialist countries, the aid of imperialism provided with political conditions. Not only balancing, but also aiding other countries with the help of <u>Soviet Communist Party</u> leaders raises suspicions that <u>Khrushchev's</u> word is that the colonial powers can be liberated with the help of the imperialists at the hands of the revisionists.

### The struggle is the only way for liberation

The next treatment Khrushchev would use to dismantle the colony was disarmament. Bernstein, a revisionist of the Second International, also said that "international treaty and disarmament can uphold equality between nations." Revisionist Kautsky also said that "Western European countries can reduce military spending by doing public works in China, Turkey, and South America, such as railroads, to help develop businesses."




Photo 85: With Comrade K. Thanikasalam (editor of Thayagam magazine) during their trip to the People's Republic of China in 1979

When <u>Lenin</u> criticized the disarmament of that day, he said that the main mistake of their demand for disarmament was to slip away from the material problems of the revolution. Or a new kind of disarming proponents of disarmament! Do you stand for revolution? "He asked in an article entitled 'War Plan'.

At this point, <u>Khrushchev</u>, who boasted of being <u>Lenin</u>'s successor, immersed himself in <u>Lenin</u>'s views on the armed revolution. Yet he has brought back to the forefront the reactionary view of the <u>Second International</u> revisionists that the liberation of the colonial people is possible only through disarmament.

"Disarmament means the disarmament of war forces, the elimination of military fanaticism, the elimination of armed interference in the internal affairs of another country, and the complete and final abolition of all forms of colonialism," <a href="https://khrushchev.ncbe/">Khrushchev</a> said.

Not only that, 'disarmament will greatly increase the chances of assisting new countries. Allocating 8-10 percent of the \$ 12 billion annually to military spending would help eradicate hunger, disease and illiteracy in the region within 20 years."

According to <a href="Khrushchev">Khrushchev</a>, the people of the oppressed countries did not engage in anticolonial and liberation struggles, and it seemed as if the imperialists could wait until they were merciful and agree to disarmament, but once the disarmament was over, they would be freed and slaughtered. It is utterly strained, nothing but the original opportunism, and yet waxing and waxing imperialism.

### **United Nations an Imperial Instrument**

Khrushchev's next call for the abolition of the colony is to implement it through the United Nations. "Who else but the UN can guide the abolition of colonial rule?" Khrushchev asks.

Today's UN They dominated the former 'League of Nations' just as the imperialists had taken over the council. In reference to this Stalin said that today the world is divided into two camps so that they 'cannot make the alley. One is the imperialist camp and the other is the socialist camp. Imperialism on the verge of death is holding the last trumpet of the 'League of Nations' and trying to save itself by siding with the thieves of other nations. This is a futile effort. Because time and circumstance work against it and in favor of socialism."

But the existence of one <u>League of Nations</u>, the old Revisionist <u>Kautsky</u> said, "represents a great achievement of the ambition for peace, a lever that no other institution can provide for the preservation of peace."

He did not stop with this. 'Today the United States is the most powerful power in the world. He said it was possible to prevent a war within the <u>League of Nations</u>, or work with it.

Today, Khrushchev also describes the United Nations-not accommodating the People Republic of China, home to a quarter of the world's population, as the father of peace. Today he is also promoting that the abolition of colonization can be accomplished with the help of the UN.

'We appeal to this high-level UN body for the rationality and foresight of the West. We appeal to their governments and representatives. Let us agree to the move to end colonial rule and accelerate the natural course of history", he told the UN.

But what has the UN really achieved? It helped to liberate the Congo from <u>Belgian imperialism</u> and turn it into a US colony.

It's good to have a little perspective on this. In the Congo, described as a "repository of global raw materials", Belgium carried out spontaneous exploitation.

Meanwhile, the UK joined. It is rich in all kinds of chemicals, metals such as gold, silver, uranium, cotton, cocoa, coffee, rubber, etc. This has aroused great appetite in the United States. Congo was liberated on June 30, 1960.

But in five days the United States created a state of chaos and prompted the UN to intervene. At this point, a 1959 research report by the U.S. Senate Foreign Relations Committee found that Congo's minerals were helping the U.S.'s industrial and military needs. Therefore, our future relationships must be such as to guarantee the continued availability of these provisions".

# Khrushchev, the guardian of the colonial system. The clown's policy killed Lumumba.

On the pretext of suppressing the Congolese insurgency, <a href="Khrushchev">Khrushchev</a> also supported the United States, which dreamed of eliminating the colony through the UN for its own needs. At the UN General Assembly on July 13, 1960. Russia joins <a href="UN Security Council">UN Security Council</a> Voted to send troops to the Congo. Not only that: on July 15, 1960 <a href="Khrushchev">Khrushchev</a> told <a href="Patrice Lumumba">Patrice Lumumba</a> by telegram that "the UN Security Council has taken effective action". But what happened? <a href="Lumumba">Lumumba</a> was murdered. <a href="Antoine Gizenga">Antoine Gizenga</a>, who came after him, was imprisoned. The Congo escaped from the wolf's mouth and was captured by the tiger. This is how <a href="Khrushchev">Khrushchev</a>'s policy of annihilating the colony through the UN ended.

The United States, still dreaming of building a stronghold in the Mediterranean, has provoked ethnic strife between Turkey and Greece in tiny Cyprus. (The role of the United States in the <u>Sri Lankan ethnic conflict</u> is significant.) <u>President Macarios</u> has also rejected US and British deployment of "peacekeeping forces".

The Cyprus issue was brought to the UN. Russia has failed to abide by its decision to send UN troops to Cyprus. This is <a href="Khrushchev">Khrushchev</a>'s second aid to the United States. Formerly in Congo, today in Cyprus, therefore, the United States has sent <a href="PS Gyani">PS Gyani</a>, from the American new colony of India, as <a href="UNEF">UNEF</a> Commander-in-Chief. We must not forget that Indian forces also helped the United States in the Congo.

Is this the abolition of colonies by the UN? Or create new colonies for America? Today is a critical time to think about that. Here we recall what Mario de Andrade, the leader of the people's movement for the liberation of Angola (MPLA), said.

"We are fighting today for those political rights that we have failed to achieve in a peaceful way. The gift of the Salazar regime to our demands for peace is to reject freedom and unleash repression. This is forcing the Angolan people to take up arms".

## B4 Mrs Parameswari Shanmugathasan's letter to Mrs Valliammai Subramaniam about 1969 May Day Rally in Jaffna



23/7 Schofield Place Kollupitiya, Colombo-3 . 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1969

My dear sister,

We were deeply saddened to learn of what happened on May Day in Jaffna last night. Importantly, we were immeasurably saddened to learn that our comrade KAS had been injured. If this is the case with us, I know how hard your mind will work. What to do? The struggle under the bourgeois regime we are in is not an easy path. We must be ready for any hardship and sacrifice. From this time on you should be in good spirits, comforting the bell and the children.

It should be our first job to heal the wounds of the wrist as soon as possible. If he is a police prisoner or in a government hospital where he is not being treated properly, or if he does not recover quickly, you should bring a good doctor from outside and treat him well. Doing so is permitted by law. Do not be afraid of police intimidation. They exercise dictatorship in violation of the law. We must strive to achieve our achievements. The best treatment for KAS should be done as soon as possible to protect his health. We will send the required cash assistance. Today is Liberation Day and the post office is closed. We will send the money by telegram tomorrow.

The amount of ava we have to come there right away and see the clock is past. But a case for the <u>Shan</u> tomorrow at nine o'clock in the morning. That too was put on hold by the police on May Day. <u>He</u> and I are leaving for <u>Albania</u> tomorrow morning. Will be back at the end of the month. So we are not in a position to come there.

Tell our wonderful comrade KAS that 'Shan' and I inquired very kindly. Do not be discouraged. Feed the power of Mao's thinking and tell him to be brave. Our main job is to get him to full recovery as soon as possible. If the treatment given to him is not right, bring in good doctors from outside and do what needs to be done without delay. There is a law that allows them to do that. Do not be afraid to fight if you refuse to break the law.

Inform our office by telegram or telephone. <u>S. D. Bandaranayake</u> can also be notified. He will be there soon. Let the children be happy without letting them be sad. Take care. These are all for the better. Our enemies are afraid to see our strength increase. So they are abusing repression.

What else to write? You can write as much as you want to write. We are very sorry for the inability to see you in person. Do not give up courage. Revolutionary greetings.

# B5. The Tamil people need a new path and leadership to liberate themselves from racial oppression .... 'Worker' 1971.01.19

For more than 20 years, the <u>Illankai Tamil Arasu Kachchi</u> (Sri Lankan <u>Tamil Arasu Party</u>) has been claiming that the Federal system of government, known as the Coalition, is the most appropriate for a multi-ethnic country like Sri Lanka.

The Tamil\_Arasu Party (ITAK) claimed that their ambition was to form a Federal government. In an agreement with SWRD Bandaranaike in 1957, they dropped the Federal slogan, agreeing to form Pradeshiya Sabhas and then to form district councils in an agreement reached with Dudley Senanayake in 1965.

Dudley-JR's UNP opposes formation of 'Pradeshiya Sabhas' when the party later agreed to the district councils, it was strongly opposed by the coalition, including Sirimavo Bandaranaike, NM Perera and Peter Keuneman. They strongly condemned not only the Federal Party but also the federal demand and Tamils. Now they demand that they have no hatred for the Tamil people and that the Tamil people must support and co-operate with them to create true socialism in this country.

### Arguments about Federal System.

With the aim of somehow gaining the support and co-operation of Tamils, these federalists, especially Peter Keuneman, Lankaratna and V. Ponnambalam, have been claiming that Federal is possible in socialism and that Federal will solve the problem in socialism.

At the same time, the ITAK responds that socialism will fall behind Federal. Arguments about Federal are now more important than ever in speech and writing. These arguments underscore the fact that the issue of <u>National Question</u> is one of the main contradictions in this country.

For the past several years, the ITAK has largely led the Tamil people. The ITAK has negotiated with the Senanayake and Bandaranaike families who have been in power in the past and obtained some concessions.

Bargaining and anti-government activities are carried out in the interest of their class. Despite its leadership today in compromises and concessions for the benefit of the class, the Tamil people still feel that they are being treated as second-class citizens and that their rights in this country should be as complete and free as any other.

The Tamil people have consistently resisted their opposition, regardless of their leadership, even as the ITAK leadership sought to bargain and win concessions with successive governments from time to time.

There have been many instances in the ITAK that have seen this reaction. The leadership of the Tamil state is now looking for socialism, realizing that the persistent, uncompromising opposition of the Tamil people is turning into an ongoing opposition to the ITAK itself.

Before dealing with the subject itself, I would like to thank the members of the K. A. Subramanian Memorial Committee for having invited me to deliver this Memorial Lecture in commemoration of the first death maniversary of the late Mr. K. A. Subramanian. The late Mr. K. A. Subramanian was one who stood for principles and spent almost his entire life fighting for the cause of the working class and the passentry of Sri Lanks, following the eath of Marxism-Leninian. Since he was one who was sufreeneered in the struggle for human rights, it is most appropriate that the subject of the lecture should be 'Recent Trends in Europ Sights'

Coming on to the subject itself, before I deal with the question of recent trends in human rights, I would like to deal with the rationale or remaining behind human rights. With the growth of national accurity states in Asia as well as in other regions, there is a growing control over the lives of people. The scope for human rights activities becomes limited. Con finds that there is a curb on human rights satisfiles. Basen rights activists are taken into custody under Mational Scentity legislation and kept on detention for long periods without being brought to trial, some are killed while still others have disappeared in various parts of the world. In spite of all this, people still indulge in human rights work. What is the responing or the rationale behind their commitment. It is hedsuse we have faith in the dignity of the human person. ### Samasti (Federal) and racial oppression in capitalist countries

At present there are countries in different parts of the world with different types of Federal system. The bourgeois nations have experienced the failure to build governments of many nationalities. The fall of the old Austrian and Hungarian empires tells of many experiences. Today, socialism alone can solve the problem if countries like the United States, Canada, and India (which they admire as following parliamentary democratic regimes) are not taken as examples by either side (the federalists and the Samasti), but by so-called socialist countries.

In the capitalist system of class divisions where man is exploited by man, the national ethnic problem can never be solved by the Federal system or any other organization.

In countries with a capitalist system, exploitation and discrimination continue. Village to village, village to city, race to race, man to man exploitation, difference, enmity, oppression will continue and thrive.

This is evidenced by the fact that for many years after the emergence of the Federal system in countries like the United States, India and Canada, there has been daily chaos, terror killings and ethnic riots.

### The Soviet Union, led by the great Lenin-Stalin, found a solution

Worse still, racial oppression prevailed in Tsarist Russia, shocking the world. It became a prison of nationalities. The October Revolution, led by the great leader Lenin and his ally Stalin, completely changed this situation and showed the world a new path, transforming the Soviet Union into a people of all races living in brotherhood.

The world praised the Soviet Union and its great leader, the late Stalin, for successfully resolving the national ethnic question. President Stalin received deep condolences from all over the world when they passed away. SJV Selvanayagam also sent a telegram from Sri Lanka. It is noteworthy that in his telegram he also mentioned the issue of national race.

### Why the repression in the Soviet Union?

What is the situation today? With the exception of the Soviet Union and other countries (Czechoslovakia and Yugoslavia that came its way (China, Albania), many years later, the ethnic issue is once again facing crisis.

The Soviet Union, led by the great leader Stalin, was initially a union of several nationalities. Such a union could have been established, stabilized and nurtured only under socialist conditions and on the basis of equality and volition. Then, as the counter-revolutionary change brought about by the traitor Khrushchev has been transferred back to the capitalist system, crises have arisen among the nationalities as well as other crises. Minority nationalities are suppressed. Conditions such as discrimination, forced immigration, segregation, and imprisonment have become commonplace. Today's Soviet Union is once again becoming a prison for all nationalities.

Other countries (China, Albania) claiming to be socialist have come to the same situation. Similar conditions prevail in these countries.

What do these countries teach us? In the capitalist feudal system, racial oppression is similar to other forms of oppression. The national race issue will not succeed in the capitalist system. At the same time as teaching that the national ethnic problem can only be solved by the socialist system or its predecessor, the People's Democratic Organization, the danger arises again if this system is endangered and a different bourgeois system is introduced into the socialist or populist system.

What does Marxism-Leninism - Mao Zedong thought teach?

What is the path of socialism and people's democracy?

An armed revolution can be waged in a country by the leadership of other non-working classes. But a socialist revolution or a people's democratic revolution can only be sustained by armed struggle with the support of the working class and the revolutionary section of the peasantry and other classes. Until socialism triumphs over the world and the emergence of communism, those countries must be defended by proletarian dictatorship. The Marxism-Leninism - Mao Zedong ideology teaches that one should always be vigilant against counter-revolution, as happened in the Soviet Union.

The Tamil people must unite nationally for a democratic revolution

Countries around the world today are based on these principles: the People's Republic of China, the People's Republic of Albania and the People's Republic of Korea. National ethnic issues in these countries have been completely resolved. In China, 92% of the Han people have all the rights of a very small minority of the other 8% of the nearly fifty nationalities. The four nationalities have territorial autonomy and the races have rights according to their geo-economic, ethnic and cultural structure. Thus even a small race of only 600 people in total enjoys the rights of the Han people.

The language of very small nationalities that do not have a written form has been facilitated to develop a written form. If Mao Zedong, the great leader of China, calls them the great leader of all nationalities in one voice, that voice is the voice of freedom, equality and unity of all nationalities!

Capitalism can never solve it

What is the situation in Sri Lanka? No matter how much those in power chanted the slogan of socialism, there was no revolution in Sri Lanka like the one in which they could exemplify themselves. Moreover, imperialism did not seize feudalism by its state apparatus, by force of arms. The dictatorship of the working class did not take place. Without these there is no socialism. This is the conclusion of Marxism-Leninism.

"The proletarian state cannot take the place of the bourgeois state in the process of self-destruction. As a general rule, it can only happen through a violent revolution." The bourgeois state apparatus, which is already defended by the colonialists and the brokerage bourgeoisie and the feudal class, is still being ruled by other sections of the same classes, with the support of its army, police and courts.

In this case, those who understand the Marxism-Leninism - Mao Zedong ideology will call those who seek to find socialism in this regime just plain innocent.

### Symbols of imperial praise and humiliation

Tamil people in this country are fighting for their language, ethnic, economic and cultural freedom. This struggle for absolute justice has unfortunately gone to the wrong leadership. In today's bourgeois social system, the Tamil people are beginning to realize that they have been subjected to many years of vain hardships and unnecessary sacrifices in their quest for parliamentary rights through the parliamentary path, and that instead of uniting with other ethnic minorities in their public struggle, they have developed a level of difference and enmity.

Once upon a time, the Jaffna Youth Congress, an organization of Tamil people and youth, raised the demand for complete independence against British imperialism. The Tamil people boycotted even the general election held under the Donoughmore Commission for not giving it full independence and expressed their anti-imperialist and national oath. Their pro-imperialist activities are a disgrace to the Tamil people of such a tradition as the leaders of the Tamil people.

The ITAK leadership, which claims to be fighting for language, ethnic and economic freedom, does not support the liberation struggle of Asian, African and Latin American countries such as Vietnam, Cambodia and Palestine, which are fighting for similar freedom and liberation from the clutches of imperialist plunder. Imperial praise is said by showing silence in response.

ITAK- All Ceylon Tamil Congress Head Bank, Major Companies. Rubber, belonging to the feudal bourgeoisie, who owned large tracts of property and large tracts of land in tea estates; Those who are bound by imperialism.

No matter how much they talk about freedom, they will not go against their class, against their class state system. That is why the Tamil people must follow a path that is completely different from the one they have followed so far and is a path to success. The Tamil people, like any other people, need to realize, as experienced and deeply as possible, President Mao Zedong's statement that "Political power grows out of the barrel of a gun".

### Democratic revolution is the way to liberation

The workers, peasants and other patriots of all nationalities in this country must unite and defeat the armed struggle of the ruling class and the state apparatus — the people's war, through a protracted struggle — to win the people's democratic revolution. Armed struggle is the only way to win the people's war.

In this country, the working class, among the oppressed and exploited majority Sinhalese and other Tamil and Muslim populations, will fight for the land against the great feudal class and foreign companies who have usurped the lands owned by thousands of rural peasants through their tearful

and bloody tragic wills. Existing plantation workers, students suffering from colonial education teachers, people under the oppression of the feudal Patham Pasali (Simpleton) caste, national bosses suffering from foreign domination, patriots opposing the imperialist plunderers who plunder billions of rupees from this country, enslaved foreigners. The Tamil people must give national shape to their struggle by uniting with the militants mobilizing in the Communist Party of Sri Lanka to advance towards a non-exploitative social organization through the people's democratic revolution, overthrowing the three mountains of the bourgeoisie and the repressive state apparatus that give the green light to imperialism through the people's war.




Photo 91: The original letter of Comrade N. Shanmugathasan in Tamil written on 4 August 1973

New Democracy! New life! New civilization!




Photo 92: Front cover of the January-February 1990, 'Thayagam' (Motherland) published after Comrade KAS's demise.

It is undeniable that any work in the field of art literature embodies a social perspective. Works are divided into two political directions. One is the political direction of the forces that will create the new democracy, the well-being of mankind, the world for a new civilization. This political direction is being promoted by the democratic forces led by the working class.

The second is the political direction that is the direct opposite of the previous right political direction and that is building the old exploitative social system that is being destroyed. It is led by the imperialist powers and the bourgeoisie.

In Sri Lanka it can be divided into three phases.




Photo 93: Comrade N. Shanmugathasan's family photo, preserved carefully by KAS's family for decades though they moved to various rental houses in the past.

#### Dear Comrades!

Let us call on the sincere Communists in the <u>Communist Party of Sri Lanka</u> to reject <u>N. Shanmugathasan</u>'s counter-revolutionary religious-destructive leadership and call on the Communist Party to build a strong Communist Party that will validate the universal truths of <u>Marxism–Leninism–Mao Zedong</u> ideology in line with the concrete practice of the Sri Lankan revolution. For this purpose we call on the party Central Committee, the Divisional Committees, and the responsible staff, on behalf of the other members, to mobilize at the Special Congress to be convened by Comrades Samal de Silva and <u>K. 

The people of the entire country are undergoing the painful effects resulting from the serious situations for which the present government has been responsible.

The national oppression committed particularly against the Tamil people has resulted in unbearable sufferings. The economy of the country has deteriorated and the living standard of the people has eroded considerably.

Defence expenditure incurred per day is approximately Rs. 20 million. The entire burden is borne by the working class. Several persons of the <u>UNP</u> have come to realise that the National Question cannot be solved by means of war.

The entire people including Tamils desire a peaceful life. They eagerly await an interim political solution. No one expects that such an interim political solution will be lasting solution to National Question. But failure to pay attention to a short-term solution as well as a long term solution may lead to more serious problems. To perceive Sri Lanka's National question merely as a racial problem between Tamils and Sinhalese will lead to a dangerous situation. National oppression by the present chauvinistic government leads to international threats to the country's independence through direct and indirect intervention by neighbouring countries. The <a href="UNP">UNP</a> since 1977 has been trying to barter our independence to American imperialism.

The intention of the <u>UNP</u> government to lease facilities of the <u>Trincomalee</u> harbour to America was thwarted by Indian intervention. Systematic and planned communal violence and pogroms in July 1983 against the Tamil people by the present government has resulted in direct Indian intervention in Sri Lanka's internal affairs.

The attempt of the Indian government to find a political solution to the National Question acceptable to both parties is appreciated. However, the Indian government should not impose a solution to meet its regional political interests.

The targets of liberation struggle should not be to worsen the country's National Question. It will lead to the loss of sovereignty and independence of our country. The threat to Sri Lanka's independence and sovereignty is increasing, and it is being felt by all sections of the people.

That is why all sections of the people are pressing the government for an urgent political solution to the problem without worsening the crisis. All forces fighting for the emancipation

of Tamils should take into account that an interim political solution through negotiations will thwart the emergence of a military dictatorship, put an end to genocidal military violence against the Tamils and also give a chance and time to build up a mass organisation by democratic forces and Tamil liberation forces against the <a href="UNP">UNP</a>'s right-wing parliamentary dictatorship.

The <u>SLCP(Left)</u> has acknowledged and stressed that the Tamils have a traditional homeland and that they constitute a distinct nationality. Our party recognizes the traditional homeland of the Tamils by rejecting the government sponsored planned Sinhala colonisation.

The Party Central Committee stresses that an interim political solution should incorporate the following proposals with a clear guarantee:

- 1 . The traditional homeland of the Tamils the Northern and Eastern Provinces should be granted regional autonomous status and autonomous bodies be set up.
- 2. These autonomous bodies should have the right to merge and if necessary, function separately if they so decide.
- 3. The regional autonomous bodies should have maximum independence to manage the affairs of economy, employment, internal security, education, culture, health, social services etc. without the intervention of the Central Government
- 4. The Muslims, the people of Indian Origin and Sinhalese who reside within these areas should be given the right to establish inner autonomous bodies and thereby ensure their basic human rights, and language and cultural rights.
- 5. The autonomous bodies should, in the absence of external aggression, be responsible for the security of the autonomous areas.
- 6. The autonomous bodies should have the freedom to set up colonisation schemes within the area. At the same time, the autonomous bodies should have the right to accept or reject any colonisation scheme of the Central Government within their area.
- Concrete steps should be taken to eradicate discrimination based on nationality, language or caste at the national and regional levels.
- 8. Basic rights of plantation workers, Tamils and Muslims who reside outside North and East should be recognised by setting up inner autonomous bodies.
- 9. There should be a guarantee to hold elections at the national and regional level without the intervention of the government, armed forces and others.
- 10. Depressed communities and backward sections of the society should be given institutional guarantee by way of concessions and facilities in the fields of economy, employment and education for their social uplift. While stressing the above proposals as

basis for arriving at an interim political solution, our party emphasizes the necessity of taking steps to solve the problems that arose in recent years owing to the warlike situation.

To ease the present turmoil in the country, our party emphasises that the following steps should be taken without any further delay:

- 1. The <u>Prevention of Terrorism Act</u> be withdrawn, the state of emergency be lifted and all persons detained under the act and regulations be released unconditionally.
- 2. Those persons who are wanted under <u>Prevention of Terrorism Act</u> and Emergency Regulations be pardoned unconditionally. Charges against them and those who were arrested prior to the enactment of the Act or its promulgation be withdrawn completely.
- 3: The freedom of expression of the Tamils be respected by withdrawing the Sixth Amendment to the Constitution.
- 4. Government troops be withdrawn from populated Tamil areas and the camps be closed based on a time table.
- 5. Home guards be disbanded and disarmed, and that establishment be scrapped.
- 6. Government should give compensation to those affected for losses caused by the troops and home guards by way of murder, arson, and burglary.
- 7. The government should give facilities to people who were forced to leave their homes and villages by the excesses committed by the government troops and home guards, and those displaced be allowed to return to their homes and restart their vocations peacefully.
- 8. Government troops and home guards who committed excesses be tried before an impartial commission of inquiry.

The above actions are minimum expectations of the Tamils for the security of their lives and property. If the government tries to keep its troops and political thugs in the Tamil areas, the interim solution will not be genuinely implemented.

The <u>SLCP(Left)</u> calls upon mass organisations, personages, patriotic forces, democrats and others to firmly press the government to take steps on these lives.

Our party is very clear that this interim solution will not be a lasting solution to the problems within the present social set up, and until the advent of power of the working class through a mass revolution there cannot be a lasting solution to the National Question. However, our Party's stand is that the solution we suggest will to an extent ensure that there will not be repetition of the present situation in the near future and bring about sanity for the present.

# B15. Our party completely rejects attempts by the Indian government to detain LTTE Chairman Mr. V. Prabhakaran. (Press release on 2 August 1987)

The Central Committee of the <u>Sri Lanka Communist Party (Left)</u> is continuing its in-depth study of the "<u>Peace Accord</u>" between the Governments of India and Sri Lanka. Although the agreement has seen some progress in resolving the plight of the Tamil people, the Central Committee believes that the agreement between the two governments will not bring a short-term or long-term solution to the <u>National Question</u>.

This is because an interim solution to the Tamil issue can only be reached through the participation, cooperation and consensus of all parties involved. It should not be a one-sided solution.

The forced threat solution should not be imposed on them. The LTTE claims to be forced to comply with their wishes. Our party completely rejects attempts by the Indian government to detain Mr. V. Prabhakaran. The Governments of Sri Lanka and India should take steps to enable Mr. Prabhakaran and the LTTE to present their views and participate freely and voluntarily in the negotiations for a solution. At the same time, youth militant groups and the Tamil United Liberation Front (TULF) and the Communist Party of Sri Lanka (Left) urges the Sri Lankan government to find a solution through negotiations.

The above is part of their statement issued by Mr. K.A. Subramaniam, the General Secretary of the Sri Lanka Communist Party (Left) on behalf of the Central Committee. The report also warns the Sri Lankan people that the call for an Indian peacekeeping force under the Indo-Sri Lanka Peace Accord has undermined the country's independence, sovereignty and integrity and posed a new threat to South Asian countries. Instead of resolving the national ethnic issue at every turn, the Jayewardene government is engaged in mortgaging the sovereignty of the country to every possible foreign power. The culmination of that operation was the summoning of the Indian Army in the guise of peacekeeping.

Our party has already expressed its acceptance of India's role with caution that India as a regional power should not prioritize its interests as India has interfered in our national ethnic issue in many ways and it is our closest neighbour.

Our party has submitted proposals for an interim solution to the national ethnic problem and stressed the need for a political solution. That is the will of all people, including Tamils. All militant youth organizations, the <u>TULF</u> and a conciliatory political solution can only be reached through protracted discussions between governments. It will correct the interim solution. Our party believes that this is the only way to achieve honest peace.

Motherland is overjoyed at the unveiling of the twentieth issue. The magazine expands with the pride of having published twenty magazines despite unlimited restrictions.

Not only are direct barriers to literary prosperity extinguished; Some of the limitations set by the people themselves can be a hindrance. Contemporary socio-economic and political activities are set to limit people within such limits.

The obligation to pave the way for the extermination of such beasts, which are locked up by external forces and by the people themselves, has the power to benefit the people. Literary - Art literary movements, can not deviate from this obligation.

The motherland has continued to fulfil this historic task of its own. From the outset, the homeland emphasized the need for a broad united front to defend the nation's independence, sovereignty and to build a new democratic culture. In its twentieth track, Motherland emphasizes the need for united action for any crisis facing the people.

In general, the relatively dominant social outlook among Sri Lankan Tamil writers, despite having different worldviews, has been arguably a good feature; In more than half a dozen Sri Lankan Tamil magazines published today, we find works depicting contemporary life. At the same time, it is necessary to emphasize the broad unity of all, based on the interests of the people. Although not explicitly emphasized so far, not all of them have ever commented against this principle.

Sri Lankan Tamil magazines are united on another point. Nothing was released in due course. Motherland Twentieth Magazine should have arrived at least three months ago. No need to explain because everyone knows the reason for the delay.

The Motherland still promotes the bi-monthly issue of a magazine. Continuing obstacles must lead. The motherland will continue its work for our own cultural development despite any difficulties.

# B17. The last speech of K.A. Subramaniam, after he came out of the hospital in a critical condition on Jaffna / Stanley Road on 01 May 1989

"If the <u>Premadasa</u> government has come to negotiate with the <u>LTTE</u>, then it can understand that what we have already said is true. We accept negotiation. At the same time, it cannot be a bouquet. It must truly pave the way for the establishment and preservation of unity where both races can live in freedom and sovereignty in our country. Before that, <u>Weli Oya</u> should abandon the formation of a separate district. In addition, the <u>Communist Party of Sri Lanka (Left)</u> is urging the suspension of the referendum in the Eastern Province and why it should be abandoned altogether. Only then will it give confidence to the institutions and the people who can go to the negotiations. A situation can also arise where mutual concessions can be negotiated. Apart from this, resolutions, decisions and weapons that can be made at the will of the Government of Sri Lanka, the Government of India or unilateral decisions cannot establish peace in our country. This is our position.

We have opposed India's intervention from the beginning. The people of Sri Lanka have to make some concessions because of the Accord made by the Sri Lankan government. That concession was a tripartite negotiation that annexed India as well. The Government of Sri Lanka, the Government of India and the other Liberation Organizations should co-operate in these negotiations for a concerted and successful effort. Leaving it and doing strangulation work on each other would pose a great danger to our country and people.

You already know our position on India. I have to say a few things back though. From the beginning, the Communist Party of Sri Lanka, led by the likes of Peter Keuneman and Wickremesinghe, and later after the split, our Party has been warning of "foreign intervention". Political Parties and liberation movements in Sri Lanka have failed to heed this. India began its expansion by taking advantage of the 1983 ethnic riots. The Sri Lankan government acted in support of it. The Accord was struck. It's confusing in many ways. In some respects, there are certain aspects that can help the liberation and future of the Tamil people. But most of the issues in the Accord affect not only the Tamil people but all Sri Lankans. This must be resisted or modified." -- K.A. Subramaniam Addressed after the long hospitalization. Meeting held at Stanley Road, Jaffna on 1989-05-01
