Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, July 21, 1894, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

Present:—Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; Dr. F. Keyt.; H. J. Deslandes, Esq.; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; B. de Alwis, Esq.; Dr. J. T. Morgan.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 16 were read and confirmed.

2. The following statements were laid on the table:—General Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund; also separate statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1893 to June 30, 1894; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of June; also Health Officer's Report for the same month.

Resolved,—That the several statements, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting and Health Officer's report.

A question having arisen as to the fee for graves of persons dying in the general and other hospitals, it is resolved that, as the graves are dug by coolies employed on account of the hospital, the fee be reduced to one rupee.

6. Read application by Surgeon-Captain A. Perry, Health Officer, for six weeks' leave of absence from July 14. The paper had been circulated and seen by all the members.

Resolved,—That the leave of absence granted be confirmed, and that the Council approve of Dr. E. de Livera as Surgeon-Captain Perry's *locum tenens*.

7. The Chairman submitted the Annual Administration Report for 1893. In doing so he stated that the Government had requested, by letter No. 20 of 21st May, that the report be forwarded, though the Ordinance provided that it be sent not later than August 31.

Resolved,—That the report be forwarded, and the Government be requested to furnish the Council with twenty printed copies. The consideration of the report provided for under section 115 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance is deferred until after receipt of printed copies.

8. On proposal of Dr. Keyt, it was resolved that the following Members be appointed a Special Committee to inspect and report upon the carriages licensed to ply for hire, several of which are in bad order, viz., the Chairman, Dr. Keyt, Dr. Morgan, and Mr. H. J. Deslandes, of whom two to form a quorum.
