Australia—Moreton Bay—Extension of Shoal Water East of North Point.

The Port Master of Brisbane has given notice (No. 10 of 1895) that a recent examination discloses that the shoal water lying midway between Cape Moreton and North Point, Moreton island, has advanced about 2 cables to seaward.

Vessels in rounding Cape Moreton should not approach North Point within a distance of 5 to 6 cable lengths.

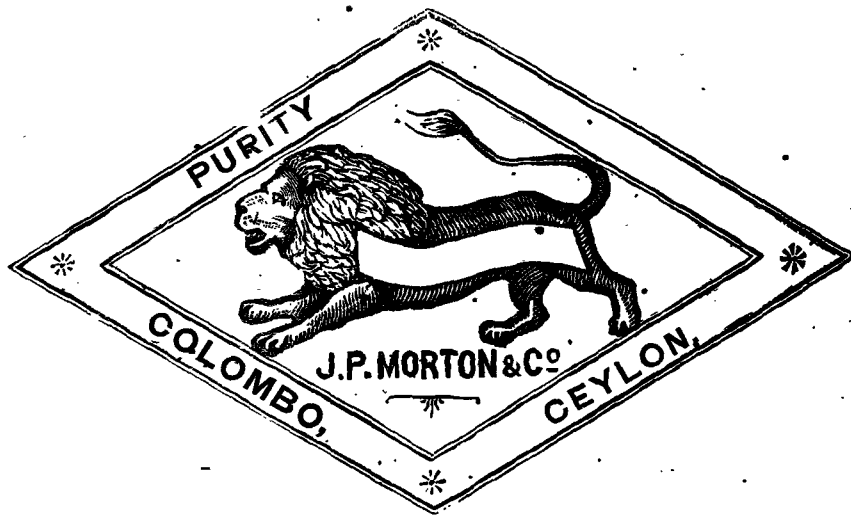
